



## Townships get development help

TEMISKAMING SHORES –Harley, Hudson, Casey and Kerns now have the help of an economic development officer.

Jordan Kemp, originally from Temiskaming Shores, began work in mid-June.

"He's going to be busy for the next three years," said Michel Lachapelle, clerk-treasurer for the four municipalities.

A leading priority, he said, is the extension of natural gas service to the Nine Mile area and grain mill complexes in the vicinity.

But the list includes a sewer project in Belle-Vallée, replacement of the Seymour Bridge in Kerns and the Belanger Bridge in Casey, and the development of ATV trails in Kerns and Casey.

Kemp, who has worked in the private sector, said he's looking forward to the public sector experience.

It is "definitely different," he said, describing it as "a whole new beast."



The application proposes to rezone the subject land from Medium Density Residential (R3) to Medium Density Residential Exception (R3-E) to add a 4-unit townhouse as a permitted use on the property and to recognize the following considerations specific to the proposed development:

Lot frontage, 4-unit townhouse (minimum)	20m

### Local help

A new report by the Canadian Cancer Society says nearly half of Canadians will develop some form of cancer in their lifetime.

patients face the financial and emotional challenges of a cancer diagnosis.

We must surely label the situation existing in Northern Ontario concerning rates of cancer as an "epidemic."

It is called the Community Cancer Care (CCC) program, with offices in New Liskeard and Englehart.

We know cancer rates in the north are often higher than the provincial average, and that certainly holds true for the Temiskaming region.

The program has been largely funded by the former July long weekend Bikers Reunion and private donors.

For men, the risk of developing cancer in a lifetime is now 49 per cent and for females it is 45 per cent.

The CCC program provides money for drugs, wigs, medications, travel and accommodations and also provides information about how to cope with a cancer diagnosis.

Why are cancer rates increasing?

There are no other programs like it in Canada.

Health care professionals point the finger at lifestyle choices as part of the problem.

And in many instances, you may get a hug and comforting words when you access the program and its amazing volunteers.

So why aren't more resources being directed at ways to help people improve their lifestyle?

We should be extremely thankful for this program, which we will need more and more given the findings of the Canadian Cancer Society's report on increasing cancer rates.

Poverty is a crushing factor in the north and it affects people's health in dramatic ways.

How fortunate cancer patients and their families are to have access to this regional program.

When you don't have enough money to eat nutritious foods or you face homelessness or are unemployed and you can't readily access doctors or mental health counselors then these things contribute to a decline in overall health.

The Bikers Reunion may have ended, but the CCC program will go on forever.

The good news is there is a local program dedicated to helping cancer

Help is only a phone call away.



# Igniting safely

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special) – Regular rainfall has left the forest fire hazard rated low to moderate across much of the Northeast.

But with a long weekend approaching, the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry offers the following tips for a safe campfire:

- Choose your site carefully. Select a site with easy access to water and one that's sheltered from high winds.
- Build the fire on bare rock or other non-combustible material.
- Clear a one-metre space around the campfire site. Remove all pine needles, twigs, grasses and leaves.
- Keep your fire small. By law, a campfire can't exceed one metre in height and one metre in diameter.
- Stay nearby. Never leave a campfire unattended.
- Extinguish your fire by soaking it with water. Ensure it's out by stirring the ashes with a stick to uncover any embers.

## Flower power Englehart Area Artists' annual show has floral theme

ENGLEHART — The Englehart and Area Historical Museum gallery has been transformed into a garden of sorts.

The Englehart Area Artist (EAA) *Flowers* art exhibition opened Sunday, June 25.

As the title of the show implies, 34 floral art works are displayed in genres of mixed media, photography and sculpture dominating the exhibition.

Flowers and floral patterns have been included in the art world since ancient times.

The EAA artists recognize the importance of flowers.

“Everyone can draw flowers,” said EAA member Lionel Venne as he welcomed fellow artists and members of the public to the exhibition.

“We have 35 members and I choose a different theme for the annual show. I am proud of the show. Each artist interpreted the theme in his or her own special way. Thank you to the museum, the artists. All the paintings are for sale. There are lots of poor artists,” he said with a chuckle. Nipissing-Timskaming MPP John Vanthof stopped by the museum to take in the exhibition as his wife Ria is an avid flower gardener.

“It is amazing to have this much quality coming from such a small art club. It is a beautiful show,” he said.

EAA artist Alice Y. Séguin Sawicki said her paper sculpture flowers in a box called “Bountiful Beauties” were an attempt to think outside the box.

“He gave us the theme and I thought, why not do something I had never done before?” she said.

She cut coloured paper into petal shapes and then glued several layers together to create the flowers in her artwork.

“I hadn’t done this method before, it took a long time and was hard work, but I am pleased with the result,” she said.

If you missed the opening of *Flowers* you have until July 12 and then the Museum welcomes Christian Paquette’s *Rodeo Experience* exhibition from July 12 to August 6 (opening reception July 16).



## LIVESTOCK FARMING

### What are the dangers related to antibiotic resistance?

Antibiotics play a critical role in keeping both humans and animals healthy. In agriculture, they're used to treat and prevent various diseases that threaten livestock populations. However, the misuse of these often-unregulated medications represents a source of contention for world health, food safety and global development.

#### WHAT IS ANTIBIOTIC RESISTANCE?

Antibiotic resistance occurs when bacteria become immune to the drugs commonly used to kill them. For example, when you take antibiotics to cure a bout of pneumonia, a few bacteria might survive the treatment. Over time, the surviving bacteria could potentially develop into a new kind of pneumonia that typical antibiotics can't cure. Scenarios like this pose a real threat to humans and animals alike.

#### PREVENTIVE MEASURES

To combat the spread of antibiotic resistance, there are a number of precautionary measures that farmers can take.

- Only administer medication to livestock according to a veterinarian's recommendations.
- Avoid using antibiotics solely to prevent disease.
- Regularly vaccinate livestock to reduce the need for antibiotics.
- Practice and promote healthy practices at every stage of production and transformation of animal and plant products.
- Adopt a sustainable system that favours biosecurity.
- Prioritize farming conditions that respect the well-being of animals.

**Staying Safe as an Older Driver**

**How does age affect your driving?**

Everyone ages differently so there is no hard and fast cut off as to when someone should stop driving. As we age, things like decreased vision, impaired hearing, slowed motor reflexes, and worsening health conditions can become a problem. Aging also tends to result in a reduction of strength, coordination and flexibility which can impact your ability to safely control a motor vehicle. For example:

- Neck pain or stiffness can make it harder to look over your shoulder
- Leg pain can make it difficult to move your foot from the gas to the brake pedal
- Reduced arm strength can make it hard to turn the steering wheel quickly
- Reaction times can slow down with age

**Safety tips for older drivers:**

Getting older does not automatically mean a total loss of driving ability. There are many things you can do to continue driving safely, including staying on top of your health.

Regular check-ups are critical to keeping you in the best possible driving shape.

- Get your eyes checked every year
- Have your hearing checked every year
- Talk with your primary care provider about how certain conditions and/or medications may affect your driving ability. For example, if you have glaucoma, tinted eyeglasses can help to reduce glare.
- Get plenty of sleep.

**Know your limitations:**

If a driving situation makes you uncomfortable, don't do it. Many of us voluntarily begin to make changes in our driving practices as we get older by:

- Only driving during daylight hours if seeing well at night is a problem
- Staying off busy highways to avoid fast-moving traffic
- Not driving in bad weather
