With warm weather and great fishing, here is a little refresher on how to



When it comes to walleye fishing, jigs are the most consistent type of fishing lure. They are effective in either shallow or deep water, in warm and cold conditions such as ours, fishing during the day or night, and literally the whole vear round.

Successful walleye catchers know how to work a jig. Keeping the following in mind can help you accumulate great catches or at least add to your fish stories:

Jigs come in various shapes, designed for specifically different fishing situations. Choosing the right one can make all the difference.

The most common shape is the ball-style jig. These are very versatile and can be used in the current or in still water. If in doubt, this is almost always a good walleye lure option. Ball-style jigs can be casted or trolled and are great for vertical jigging as well.

When you're fishing in the weeds for walleye, try a swimming snagging and tempts those walleye to come out from their hiding spots.

Pancake jigs are designed to cut through moving water (also called "current cutters"), and are best used while walleye fishing in rivers and streams.

Fishing lure size is another important factor. A 1/8 oz. jig is a pretty good place to start in most fishing conditions. The most important thing to consider is whether you are getting all the way to the bottom. If you can, try going lighter with a 1/16 oz. Or you may need to go a bit bigger with a 1/4 oz. or 3/8 oz. These four walleye lure sizes should cover most situations, but other options in your tackle box are great too.

If you're fishing at night or in murky water you might try a bulkier walleye lure with fluorescent colors for increased visibility. No matter what, it is always a good policy to keep trying new fishing lure colors. Light conditions change very quickly underwater and good part of walleye fishing will always be a game of chance.



After you have the right walleye lure picked out, consider tipping it with either live bait or a plastic substitute. Both options have their advantages and you're better off having both available to you. When it comes to live walleye bait, minnows, leeches, and night crawlers will work best. Generally minnows work best in cooler water (spring and fall), leeches in warmer, and night crawlers in either. You should experiment, however, with all three regardless of when you are walleye fishing.

Plastic substitutes are nice because they require less maintenance and can be just as effective as live bait. This will make it more comfortable on your hands when the weather is chilly and you don't want to be fumbling with minnows.

Of course, you still need to find the fish. Electronic fish finders can be a fisherman's best friend. Once you've found them and your lure is in the water, you should vary the lure motion on your retrieve. First, let the walleye lure sink all the way down. Try popping it off the bottom then let it sink, dragging the fishing lure along the bottom with subtle shakes, and slowly lifting and dropping it as you reel in. These methods take some practice to perfect but will help make your fishing lure look more natural and attractive to 'the big one'.

Have passport, will tour... Lake Temiskaming loop

TEMISKAMING SHORES – Some travel this summer requires no official documentation.

But flashing a passport unique to Lake Temiskaming communities can open the door to local adventures and the chance to win prizes.

The Lake Temiskaming Tour passport lists 20 attractions on a loop covering the region.

On the Ontario side, it includes 14 stops in Mattawa and North Bay, Temagami and Marten River, Latchford, Cobalt and Temiskaming Shores. In Quebec, six stops are offered in Notre-Dame-du-Nord, Saint-Bruno-de-Guigues, Ville-Marie and Témiscaming.

They include museums and galleries, parks, information centres, historic sites and trails.

Visitors who punch their passports at 12 stops can submit them for a chance to win one of three vacation packages in North Bay, Ville-Marie and Mattawa.

If stickers are affixed from six locations with paid admission, collectors can be entered in a draw for a \$500 basket of local products.

Natalie Chartrand, economic development coordinator for Temiskaming Shores, describes the Lake Temiskaming Tour passport as one of the best tourism products ever created for the region.

Visitors "can become ambassadors for our area," she said.

The passport and associated website – www.laketemiskaming.com – were launched in 2017.

It's a collaborative effort involving economic development and tourism organizations and municipalities in Ontario and Quebec, as well as support from FedNor.

The passport itself has been revamped this year.

It's the size of a conventional passport, with a map, photos and details about each participating community.

But the bilingual listing for each stop now includes info about farmers' markets, local foods, events and other attractions in the area.

A virtual passport and contest are also available online at www.laketemiskaming.com/visit.

Chartrand said the festivals listed in the passport are also marked by geofencing, a virtual boundary drawn around the event.

She said the electronic system can trigger targeted promotions about the region to the passport holder's cellphone, for example, or collect general data about visitor numbers for tour organizers.

"With that we'll be able to track how well this product is doing," she said.

The website too has been expanded. It now lists 150 attractions, restaurants and accommodation providers in the region.

Chartrand said listings remain free for this year, and businesses are welcome to register to be included.

Passports are available online, at the various stops on the tour and, in Temiskaming Shores, at the Temiskaming Shores and Area Chamber of Commerce office.

The contest opened May 1 and runs until September 30.
