

# Bunker open seven days a week

One of the most striking exhibits at the museum is a collection of dozens of mannequins wearing the uniforms of soldiers in many different aspects of past wars.

Harrison noted that the Bunker is "a multinational military museum."

Unlike other museums, which occasionally present artifacts relating to other countries, the Bunker Military Museum showcases multinational war artifacts every day of the year.

The museum's summer hours started June 24 and the three summer students have been busy becoming acquainted with the many items collected over the years.

"They are just soaking up the atmosphere," said Harrison. "They're getting pretty familiar with the facility already. They're very eager."

The late Jim Jones initiated the collection which has continued to grow in recent decades.

## PARADE

Among later additions is a Bren gun carrier which will be seen in the Canada Day parade in Cobalt which begins at 11 a.m. on Monday, July 1.

The summer students will also be taking part in the parade, and will be dressed in military uniform.

The Cobalt Mining Museum will also have representatives in garb from the days of the Cobalt Silver Boom.

"We will have a joint presence in the parade," said Harrison. "That ties both of us in with the terrific history in our area."

The Bunker is hoping to raise funding to install two permanent walls in the gallery to provide space for special exhibitions, as well as support for heavy items which could be mounted on a wall.

However, the project depends on funds, which are difficult for small museums to secure.

"We're not sure we're going to get that done this summer," Harrison said. The project's timeline will depend on available funds.

The Bunker Military Museum is managing on a \$10,000 municipal grant, admissions, and donations.

Dan Larocque has served as the museum's manager for several years, and works on a part-time basis for the museum.


Volunteers make up the remainder of the workforce, along with the summer stu-

dent staff.

School groups from throughout the area, and as far as North Bay, have visited in recent weeks. The Algonquin Army Cadet Corps also recently visited with over 60 cadets in attendance.

Tourists from other parts of the world have put the Bunker Military Museum on their list of destinations, and recent visitors have come from Holland and Switzerland.

## Englehart sets budget for 2019

ENGLEHART - Englehart council has approved the town's 2019 budget.

"The Mayor and Council of the Town of Englehart passed the 2019 budget with no increase to municipal tax rates," deputy-clerk Malorie Robinson outlined in an email, "however residents will see increased tax levies due to the increase in MPAC (Municipal Property Assessment Corporation) assessment values. MPAC assessment values have increased over five per cent from 2018 to 2019 so residents and businesses will definitely see an increase although the increase is not uniform across all properties so some residents and businesses will see more of an increase than others."

Water, sewer and garbage rates will increase "by 10 per cent starting with the August 1 billing," Robinson explained,

"Normal residential quar-

terly utility bills will include a \$12.44 increase to help cover future water and sewer projects. The Town has completed several water and sewer projects over the past 10 years which have resulted in some large deficits. All the projects were funded at 90 per cent by the Ontario Government but the municipal contribution on the projects is still 10 per cent, or \$222,200 per project.

"As of December 31, 2017, the water deficit was at (\$354,798), sewer deficit is (\$980,304) and garbage deficit amounted to (\$445,229). Overall municipal reserves are still positive at \$1,434,360, however, our auditors have recommended increasing the utility rates to help reduce or eliminate both current and future deficits."

The town will be raising \$348,435 from ratepayers to pass on to the school board.

For the town's own municipal purposes, the town will be raising \$1,732,450 from ratepayers.

Along with municipal taxa-

tion and water, sewer and garbage charges, the town's 2019 budget is supplemented by federal and provincial grants, as well as revenue from other municipalities, investment income, and revenue from provincial offences.

The 2019 budget is \$4,208,718, which is down from the 2018 budget of \$4,241,565.

"I have worked in the consulting end of the municipal world from a corporate standpoint. I have worked directly with municipalities over ten years as a consultant."

He explained that he has "worked from an aspect of meeting management and records management, supporting municipalities in technology in those areas as well as asset management and capital planning from an engineering perspective, and helping municipalities in those areas. I have a lot of experience working directly with the various departments

within municipalities from the CAO and clerks' offices, treasury, public works, engineering and then sub-categories within. I've worked with municipalities clear across the country."

Walker said he has engaged with over 3,000 municipalities, with more focus in Ontario and even more focus in Northern Ontario.

While working with municipalities across Ontario and the rest of Canada, he has mainly resided in London, Ontario.

In the last two years, his work has been focused in Northern Ontario.

Prior to taking up his role with the Town of Cobalt, he was with Infrastructure Solutions (Engineering) Incorporated as a business development manager and as a marketing director.

### HOME AND FAMILY

He and his partner Monia moved to Cobalt in November 2017 to the Buffalo Mill home previously owned by Vivian Hylands.

Walker noted that Hylands was well known in the community for her service and her

activities, and he sees this new position as an opportunity for him to do some similar things for the community, but from an administrative role.

Walker has an interesting connection to the Cobalt area history. His father is Ken Walker, "a telephone engineering pioneer from Northern Telephone with a long history there."

His grandfather, J.B. Walker, had many claims through Cobalt and outlying areas in Coleman and Lorrain Valley, which continued through the 1950s. J.B. Walker's brother-in-law (and therefore great-uncle to Brian Walker) was Angus McKelvie. McKelvie and Thomas McCamus established a sawmill on the shore of the Wabi River in New Liskeard in its early days. The two men then established the Temiskaming Telephone Company which went on to become Northern Telephone Ltd. McKelvie also was the cofounder of the Temiskaming and Nipissing Mines and was one of the original members of the Millionaires' Club in the early 1900s.

Walker said he returned to

the area in 2016 to help his father care for his mother, Wynn Walker (nee Wark, of the Hilliard Township area), who died in August 2018.

Walker said he always felt that his parents had given their children so many opportunities that he wanted to be sure that he could return to be with them in

their later years.

"One of the things that most of the kids in my era did was as soon as we graduated we all left the area, got our education and life experience. Not many have returned but I've always had a heart for the North and always desired to come back to the North."

### New FIT (Fecal Immunochemical Test) Colorectal Screening Test

Colorectal adenoma (CRC) is the second most common cause of cancer deaths in Canadian men and women. Colorectal adenoma incidence and mortality rates in Ontario are among the highest in the world.

The good news is that there is now a new and simpler colorectal screening test that will soon be available!! The fecal immunoblot test (FIT) will be available in Ontario as part of Cancer Care Ontario's ColonCancerCheck program as of **June 24, 2019**.

FIT will replace the fecal occult blood test (FOBT) for people at average risk of getting colorectal adenoma. Average risk is defined as people ages 50 to 74 with no first-degree relative who has been diagnosed with colorectal adenoma. First degree relative refers to a parent, brother or sister or a child.

FIT offers several advantages over FOBT:

- FIT is a more sensitive screening test, which means it is better at detecting colorectal adenoma and pre-adenomatous polyps;
- There are no medication or dietary restrictions (including anti-coagulants and vitamin C);
- FIT is simple to use and helps reduce contact with stool; and
- Only one stool sample is needed compared to the previous 3 sample requirement

#### What do You Have to Do?

Your primary care provider will fax a requisition to LifeLabs for you when you are due for this screening test and LifeLabs will mail a FIT kit to you directly.

Once completed, it's important to either drop it off or mail it to Lifelabs within two days of collecting it. It's that easy!


