
Sharrows

What are Sharrows?
A bicycle sharrow, two chevrons painted above a bicycle symbol on the road, indicates the lane is shared by both bicyclists and motorists.

Vehicle and bicycle traffic may be in the lane. Remember sharrows do not mean that the indicated space is exclusively for bicyclists.

Bicyclists
Bicyclists should "take the lane" by riding closer to the middle of the lane to reduce the risk of vehicles passing too closely.

Motorists
Sharrows closer to the middle of the lane remind you that it is unsafe to drive side-by-side with bicyclists. When bicyclists claim the lane, be patient and share the road.

Councillor Doug Wilcox expressed his view that there would be "better results when you have two representatives."

But Councillor Mike Harrison had reservations, and said that if there were two representatives, "then we would have an ad hoc committee."

Harrison was a member of the previous council which went through a restructuring after an integrity commissioner was hired to review council's ability to work under the previous structure.

As a result of his suggestions, that council made the decision to disband committees, and if a committee were needed for any reason, it would only be an ad hoc committee. Otherwise, all committee business would be conducted by the entire council as a committee-of-the-whole.

The new council, elected in 2018, only has two members from the previous term - Mayor George Othmer, who was then a councillor, and Harrison.

Today's council is still operating under the structure put in place last term.

Adshead pointed out at the August 6 meeting that if an ad hoc committee were put in place, under the current structure three residents would also be required to join.

Othmer said that would be "a little too much."

Harrison suggested that the council rescind the decisions made as a result of the integrity commissioner's report.

Othmer expressed frustration with the structure that does not allow committees, and noted that other municipalities are able to work within committee structures. He stated he does not believe that the integrity commissioner ordered that a committee structure cannot be used.

Johnson agreed, saying he had read the commissioner's report and "he did not say specifically to do so."

Walker noted that the town's current integrity commissioner will be available in the near future, and the town could get some advice from her on the matter.

Adshead asked if she could reach out to the police commissioner in the interim, and council agreed that she is the town's liaison, and is authorized to meet with the OPP on the town's behalf "to discuss items of interest to the Town of Cobalt."

Delirium Information for Older Adults

Delirium should be treated as a medical emergency! Prompt recognition and treatment may reduce the likelihood of long-term complications.

What is Delirium?

Delirium is a sudden and severe disturbance in thinking. It can cause changes in a person's ability to stay alert, remember, be oriented to time or place, speak or reason clearly.

A person with dementia can experience delirium too. Sometimes, delirium can look like dementia. The difference is that delirium comes on quickly. See or talk to a health care provider right away if any of the following signs suddenly appear – even if the signs come and go.

- Having trouble paying attention
- Being distracted or unable to follow a conversation
- Saying or doing things that do not make sense
- Hearing voices or seeing things that other people don't
- Developing strange beliefs or thinking people are trying to cause you harm
- Being withdrawn, quieter or slower than usual
- Being restless, worried, annoyed or angry
- Having trouble staying awake during the day and/or not sleeping at night

How can delirium be prevented?

- Make sure you know all of your medications and how to take them. They should be taken as prescribed. Pay extra attention to how you are feeling if starting or stopping a medication or when changing the dosage of a medication.
- Stay physically active
- Get enough to eat and drink
- Try to sleep at night (without the help of sleep aids, if possible)
- Wear your glasses and hearing aids
- doing hobbies and activities that you enjoy
- Reduce how much alcohol you drink (don't stop abruptly if you are a heavy drinker)
- If you're going to the hospital for surgery or other treatment, speak to your healthcare provider about your risk of delirium

If you are experiencing a sudden onset of the signs noted above and are a patient of the Temagami Family Health Team, please call (705) 569-3244 to schedule an appointment with your primary care provider. Same day and next day appointments are often available.

Care Close to Home campaign hits \$4.5 million mark

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff/Special) – Temiskaming Hospital Foundation’s fundraising campaign is 70 per cent of the way home.

Its capital fundraising Care Close to Home campaign has to date raised \$4.63 million, including \$1.8 million in the 2018-19 fiscal year alone.

It launched the campaign in 2016 with a fundraising target of \$6.5 million.

In the last fiscal year, the Foundation funded a little over \$2 million in new equipment.

Coupled with money from the province and the hospital’s own revenue, Temiskaming Hospital was able to purchase \$3.2 million in new equipment and upgraded facilities.

Major capital projects included refurbished diagnostic imaging suites, a new pharmacy compounding cleanroom for the mixing of medications, new ultrasound equipment and an upgraded telemetry system used in cardiac care.

Donations from individuals, businesses and service clubs continue to come in.

The Foundation is also planning further fundraising events, building on the success of last year’s Dancing with the Docs gala that raised \$26,000 for the cause.

Zero percent increase for Cobalt tax rates

COBALT - Cobalt council has approved its 2019 budget.

Chief administrative officer Brian Walker stated that rate-payers will see the same tax rates and tax ratios as they had in 2018.

"That's great news for Cobalt," he commented at the town's committee-of-the-whole meeting Tuesday, July 2.

Residents whose property assessments have gone up this year will see increases in their tax bills, while those whose assessments declined will see their tax bills lowered, he explained.

Staff "worked very hard to get this budget ready," he said.

Council spent four hours reviewing the budget draft and then approved it after a four-hour meeting.

The 2019 budget will mean higher spending than in 2018, but that is made possible through outside funding sources.

In a later telephone interview with The Speaker, Walker said "the budget has increased from last year simply because of the projects we are undertaking."

One of those is the upgrading of the water treatment plant, said Walker.

The \$1.6 million project has been funded with federal and provincial funding through the Clean Water Waste Water Fund (CWWF.), as well as a contribution from Coleman Township, and gas tax funding available to the Town of Cobalt.

Walker says the town has been able to keep the water and sewage fees for ratepayers at the same level with no increase "which is something we were very proud to accomplish."

"We spent several weeks working on the budget as administrative staff," said Walker. The town is able to cover the expenses of the capital projects with monies available from funding partners, he explained.




