Rolling along

New bus to join transit fleet in 2020

TEMISKAMING SHORES – A new bus will replace an aging model in the Temiskaming Transit fleet.

The transit committee recommended the purchase of a new 30-foot accessible diesel transit bus, at a purchase price of \$423,430.

It has applied for funding from the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) which would cover about three-quarters of the cost.

That would leave the transit service, which is funded by user fees and subsidized by the municipalities of Temiskaming Shores and Cobalt, responsible for almost \$112,300 of the purchase price.

The application for ICIP funding has been processed, but notification of its approval has not yet been received, said Mitch Lafreniere, Temiskaming Shores’ manager of physical assets, at a city council meeting last week.

Heritage Fund supporting Temiskaming ag industry

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff/Special) – The Northern Ontario Heritage Fund is investing more than \$3 million in 13 agricultural operations in the Temiskaming area.

“By investing in agricultural projects that stimulate growth and innovation, we are reinforcing the north’s competitive

advantage and sending a signal to the world that Northern Ontario is open for business and open for jobs,” said Greg Rickford, minister of Energy, Northern Development and Mines, in a news release announcing the support.

The projects are expected to create or retain 39 jobs.

The list includes:

- \$607,462 for Golden Acres in Thornloe to expand its dairy farm by building a new barn, renovating the existing barn and purchasing equipment.
- \$546,843 for Loranlee Farms Ltd. in Earlton to expand its dairy farm by building a milking barn and heifer barn

and purchasing equipment.

- \$400,000 for Ferme Alfa-dair Ltee. in Earlton to expand its dairy farm by building a new barn and purchasing equipment
- \$400,000 for Flex Dairy Inc. in Armstrong to expand its dairy farm by upgrading a barn and purchasing equipment.
- \$345,216 for Jackson Valley Farms in Harley to expand its dairy farm by building a new barn and purchasing equipment.
- \$341,581 for Carnor Farms in Earlton to expand its dairy farm by building a new barn and purchasing equipment.
- \$199,808 for McLean’s in Temiskaming Shores to establish a cash crop farm and animal feed operation by building an equipment storage shed and mechanical repair shop and purchasing grain storage bins.
- \$148,806 for TECC Agriculture in New Liskeard to develop a mobile application to help farmers with their fertilizer and crop needs.
- \$61,226 for Lilley Bee Apiaries Ltd. in Earlton to expand its beekeeping operation by building a climate-controlled facility where bees can be placed for the winter months.
- \$59,494 for Charlton Angus Cattle Co. in Charlton to

expand its organic beef farm by purchasing equipment and building a hay storage shed, utility shed, cattle handling facility and cement barnyard.

- \$26,722 for Bear Path Farms in Matheson to establish a cattle farm.
- \$23,352 for Walker’s Honey in New Liskeard to establish a beekeeping operation.
- \$21,772 for Brad Noyes in Brethour to expand his forage-based beef farm by building an insulated farm equipment shop.

Asked whether the support was in the form of grants, loans or a combination of both, the ministry responded by email that the Heritage Fund provides both grants and loans through its funding programs.

“Each applicant’s request is unique, and as a result, the funding provided may be a loan, grant or a combination of both.”

Funding options will be determined by each program’s specifics.

The ministry said it does not generally release funding details because it may unintentionally compromise an organization’s competitiveness in the marketplace.

New bus to join transit fleet in 2020

However, he said specific sums have been allocated to municipalities operating transit systems over a 10-year period.

“So we’re more than likely getting the funding. It just hasn’t been officially announced yet.”

The new vehicle is part of the transit service’s 10-year fleet replacement plan, explained city manager Chris Oslund.

But the order is being placed now, in part because of the timelines required for vehicle construction.

It also had to be placed by the end of July in order to take advantage of a bulk tender arranged through Metrolinx, a provincial agency, in 2017.

The bus is being supplied by Alexander Dennis (Canada) Inc. of Vaughn.

It’ll replace a 35-foot bus that has a lot of mileage and “a lot of wear and tear,” Lafreniere said.

It’s due to arrive by the end of January.

That’ll leave the transit service with three 30-foot buses and one 35-foot vehicle.

Temiskaming Shores council approved the purchase July 23.

Councillor Danny Whalen was also in favour, but expressed concern over committing money from next year’s budget.

He noted that the purchase price does not include some \$55,000 in taxes and another

\$25,000 in add-ons.

Council is predetermining its 2020 budget when it hasn’t even started reviewing all the numbers yet, he said.

Cobalt council has approved the long-term fleet replacement plan.

Staying Safe as an Older Driver

How does age affect your driving?
Everyone ages differently so there is no hard and fast cut off as to when someone should stop driving. As we age, things like decreased vision, impaired hearing, slowed motor reflexes, and worsening health conditions can become a problem. Aging also tends to result in a reduction of strength, coordination and flexibility which can impact your ability to safely control a motor vehicle. For example:

- Neck pain or stiffness can make it harder to look over your shoulder
- Leg pain can make it difficult to move your foot from the gas to the brake pedal
- Reduced arm strength can make it hard to turn the steering wheel quickly
- Reaction times can slow down with age

Safety tips for older drivers:
Getting older doesn't automatically mean you're going to lose your ability to drive. There are many things you can do to continue driving safely, including staying on top of your health.

Regular check-ups are critical to keeping you in the best possible driving shape.


- Get your eyes checked every year
- Have your hearing checked every year
- Talk with your primary care provider about how certain conditions and/or medications may affect your driving ability. For example, if you have glaucoma, tinted eyeglasses can help to reduce glare.
- Get plenty of sleep.

Know your limitations:
If a driving situation makes you uncomfortable, don't do it. Many of us voluntarily begin to make changes in our driving practices as we get older by:

- Only driving during daylight hours if seeing well at night is a problem
- Staying off busy highways to avoid fast-moving traffic
- Not driving in bad weather

Many visitors come to Cobalt Mining Museum

COBALT - People who enjoy history and understanding key parts of the development of Ontario and Canada are making sure they visit the Cobalt Mining Museum.

Museum curator Peter Greyson says people are visiting from Southern Ontario, Europe and the States.

They are also taking the tour into the Colonial Mine Adit, led by trained summer students to show visitors the conditions which miners worked in 100 years ago. The horizontal adit provides a relatively easy but revealing experience for visitors.

“It was very challenging, and it’s very interesting to go down there,” said Greyson.

The adit tours take place daily at 10 and 11 a.m., 1 and 2 p.m., and will continue through the month of August.

During the summer, the Cobalt Mining Museum is open seven days a week, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The museum has four summer students this year, and all are trained to conduct the tours, and have also been building their knowledge about the Cobalt silver boom by visiting other sites.

“They’re very good and very knowledgeable about the mining of the area,” said Greyson.

Visitors coming to the museum also bring insights with them, Greyson noted.

“What I find is I’m always learning as well,” he commented, “because very frequently people come in here and they had a grandparent or somebody who worked in the mines, and they have individual stories. I talked with somebody just last week who had been in sections of the mine that are now closed off.”

Greyson said he was told that there is an area inside the Silver Cliff mine, which prob-

ably is connected to the Colonial Mine, that has been opened up. Miners burned their names on a rock wall there using their carbide lamps and also included the dates, said Greyson. He was also told that there is a very large portrait of a princess on the wall.

The site is no longer accessible however.

“It would take a lot for people to be able to go back into some of those areas because they haven’t been maintained for over a century, and they’re very unsafe,” said Greyson.

THREE COMPONENTS

The Mining Museum itself offers visitors insights into three aspects of the history of the Cobalt Mining Camp, said Greyson.

Visitors will learn more about the silver mining, the history of the Town of Cobalt, and the unique geology of the area.

A new show, titled *Red Co-*

balt, which has been put together by Charlie Angus, is now on display at the museum and depicts the history of union organization in the North, and particularly in Cobalt, about a century ago, said Greyson.

Angus will be at the museum on the afternoon of Saturday, August 17, at which time he will be giving a talk about the topic in conjunction with the museum’s annual fundraiser, the Silver Nugget Race. Nugget tickets are now on sale at the museum.

Greyson expressed gratitude for the support of the Town of Cobalt’s mayor, council and staff who, he said, have made a strong effort to support the museum and the Cobalt Bunker Military Museum. So many people who come to Cobalt come to the museums, he commented.

Blue-green algae confirmed near Matachewan

DISTRICT (Staff/Special) - The Temiskaming Health Unit has issued a public statement that it has recently received reports from the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks about blue-green algae blooms on the Montreal River near Matachewan.

The Health Unit is advising people using lakes and rivers to be on the lookout for algal blooms.

It is advising people that if you see a bloom near your property or water intake line avoid using the water for drinking, bathing, or showering, and do not allow people, pets, or livestock to drink or swim in the bloom.

Do not boil the water or treat it with a disinfectant, like bleach, because it breaks open the algae cells, which releases more toxins into the water, the Health Unit states.

People should not rely on water jug filtration systems as they may not protect against the toxins, and avoid cooking with the water because food may absorb toxins from the water during cooking.

Regarding fish consumption, the Health Unit advises that people should follow the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks Guide to Eating Ontario Fish. The guide advises people to exercise caution with respect to eating fish caught in water where blue-green algal blooms occur, and do not eat the liver, kidneys, and other organs of fish.

The Health Unit suggests that where blue-green algal blooms are confirmed, people who use the surface water for their private drinking water supply may wish to consider an alternate, protected source of water.

People are being advised that blue-green algae can cause illness such as diarrhea, stomach cramps, and eye and skin irritation.

They are also being advised that if green water or scum is visible, do not swim or wade in the affected areas.



Here we help cut through the hype about engine power to find the size that's right for you.

Tractor Horsepower Explained

A lot of folks think that all they need to know about purchasing a tractor is how much horsepower, but that, in a sense, is putting the cart before the horse. What the prospective buyer should do instead is list what he/she actually needs and wants to do with the machine and let that help determine the power needed. More horsepower than you need costs more to purchase and to operate. Less horsepower leads to frustration and, quite possibly, damage if you try pushing your machine beyond its limits; or even unable to perform the task at hand.

Manufacturers often compete with one another by bragging that their tractor has the highest horsepower in its class. That's potentially useful information if you need the power, but marketing hype nonetheless. In many of these advertisements, mention of which measure of horsepower is often overlooked, or, at most, relegated to a tiny footnote.

What you need to know about horsepower is that the engine provides the power and that some of that power is used up running the tractor's accessories and operations. The unencumbered engine might make 100 HP at the flywheel at a specific rpm value. Set that engine into the tractor and hook up the hydraulic pump, transmission, alternator, air-conditioning, power steering pump, and even with the tractor running but parked, there will be less than 100 HP available to perform the work you require. There will be even less available when operating the loader and driving the machine. So, while the engine horsepower value is useful to a point, there's a more meaningful number: the power takeoff horsepower (PTO-HP).

Horsepower at the PTO is generally based on a measurement with the engine set at the speed that turns the PTO at either of the standard speeds of 540 or 1,000 rpm. Also, know that some tractors create more PTO HP than others so you may not need to purchase as large of tractor to do the same job. This measure is more useful to you as a new tractor buyer because it lets you know how much energy your tractor has for running PTO-powered implements such as mowers, balers and augers. Your dealer and a quick Internet search can help you understand what PTO-horsepower you need to satisfactorily operate the implements you wish to employ at your place.


