On August 4th, 2020 many municipal buildings and facilities in the City of Temiskaming Shores, including the Fire Administration Office at the Dymond Fire Station, will be reopening to the public.

The Fire Department would like to advise all residents that no member of the public will be permitted to enter the office unless they are wearing a mask or face covering in a manner that covers their nose, mouth and chin. Also, during this time, only one member of the public at a time will be permitted to enter the Fire Department Office until further notice. The City and Fire Department will continue to follow the directions of our Medical Officer of Health in order to help reduce the spread of COVID-19, and we appreciate your everyone's cooperation during these difficult times.

Residents requiring a new Burning Permit may once again obtain a burning permit at City Hall in Haileybury or at the Fire Department Administration office at the Dymond Fire Station at no cost. You may also contact the Fire Department by calling (705) 672-3363 ext. 4702 or 4703 and leave a detailed message and someone will contact you to arrange an inspection. Those residents who obtained a Burning Permit in 2019 may still continue to burn in accordance with the conditions as outlined on the open air-burning

Residents are also reminded that you may only burn if conditions allow the fire to burn safely and all necessary steps are taken to control and extinguish the fire. All other conditions as outlined on the burning permit must be followed. Please ensure you adhere to the following burning safety tips so you can enjoy your fire and help reduce the risks to our Firefighters:

No Day Burning - You may only burn from 6pm - 8am. Only Burn Dry, Woody Type Materials - Household trash, plastic or tires are illegal to burn. You may not burn grass or leaves or anything that may cause excessive smoke. Always Stay with Your Fire - A responsible person of 18 years of age or older must be

Respect Your Neighbour - Don't burn where smoke will bother your neighbour or blow across roadways or hamper visibility.

Control Your Fire - Only burn what you can effectively control. Don't even consider

# Bike safety

After the horrific crash last week in which two cyclists were killed while riding on Lakeshore Road, and a letter to the editor from a local rider/physician, the spotlight is on bike safety.

In light of energy efficiency and health and wellness, cycling is a terrific option for children, adults and seniors to move around their communities.

But there are three groups that must buy into bike safety: drivers of vehicles, cyclists themselves and municipalities.

Well thought-out cycling routes can change the culture of cycling in a region where people choose active transportation over cars for better health outcomes.

Europe has long been the model for cycling safety and we should pay attention to what they are doing.

Changes in urban design including more bike lanes, more car-free zones and educational campaigns on cycling safety and sharing the road would help active travellers.

The sharrows located on the roadway going across the Wabi River Bridge can be confusing for drivers. Some drivers may wonder do they share the lane with cyclists and if so how can that be done safely when someone is driving a three thousand pound automobile in a confined space at noon hour with a cyclist? Or is the lane only for cyclists? How about we create more divided sidewalks, which cyclists and walkers can use?

Perhaps designated bike lanes going across the Wabi River Bridge is the safer answer rather than the sharrows?

# Food producers thinking outside the box, in the box

TEMISKAMING SHORES – Among the enterprises facing an uncertain future as Ontario moved into lockdown in mid-March were farmers' markets.

So too were the growers who supply the markets and the customers who count on them for local food.

The COVID-19 pandemic spurred two vendors at Riverside Farmers' Market to try a new business model – community-supported agriculture (CSA).

The owners-operators of Garden Pleasures in Harley and Marsh and Meadows Farm (with farms in Kerns and Henwood) now have more than a month of CSA delivery experience.

And they're both contemplating expansion.

In the classic CSA model, customers pay at the beginning of the season for regular deliveries of locally grown foods.

The revenue offsets producers' up-front costs as they prepare to plant. In return, customers pick up boxes of in-season foods from *Continued on 7*








early summer through fall.

The two local CSA newcomers have tweaked the approach to suit their customers and their operations.

#### **GARDEN PLEASURES**

At Garden Pleasures, Bev Brubacher said her husband Ross had suggested a CSA some time ago.

She'd been less enthusiastic, because customers wouldn't be able to select the specific produce they wanted.

But she agreed this spring to give it a try.

With COVID-19 leaving traditional farmers' markets in question, "we felt there was still a need for local veggies in the community," she said.

They'd hoped that 40 customers would sign up for an 18-week season. They're currently at 70, drawing from as far away as Earlton, Elk Lake and Haileybury.

They offer a box suited for one or two people, and a larger box designed to feed three or four. Customers pick up their boxes at specified times on Wednesdays at Leis Landscaping on Highway 11 and at Co-Worx in downtown Haileybury.

She described the timing as "ideal" - the Brubachers pick produce for the CSA boxes on Mondays and Tuesdays, and for the Saturday market later in the week.

And while she'd worried that customers would miss choosing their own produce, she said the element of surprise in the weekly box has been a hit.

"The challenge is to have an exciting box every week," she said. While produce is now "bountiful," she said little was available in

late June other than early greens and green onions.

She has supplemented the boxes with products from other local growers. She also includes samples of less familiar vegetables and includes a recipe, adding "a little personal touch."

For producers, she said the CSA lets them better plan what they'll raise, with the knowledge they'll also have a customer for it.

Customers too can learn about the risks facing agricultural producers.

"We do our best," she said. "But they have to be understanding if there is a crop failure."

#### MARSH AND MEADOWS

Christine Harrison suspects that the pandemic has provided "a bit of an awakening" as to the complexity of the food supply chain and the importance of local foods.

Harrison and her partner Vic Galley raise certified organic produce and meats on Marsh and Meadows Farm.

Amid news reports of abattoirs closing because of virus outbreaks among workers, she said people were driving to their farm hoping to buy meat.

This is the first year, she said, that she ran out of chicken.

Labour shortages and virus outbreaks among temporary foreign workers in Southern Ontario fruit and vegetable farms have also sparked concerns about potential shortages and higher prices.

The short-term disruptions demonstrate that "it actually takes quite a bit for you to have food here all the time," she said.

The farm is a weekly vendor at the Riverside market, where Harrison sits on the board with the Brubachers.

Even after markets got approval to open, she said vendors weren't certain whether the public would turn out.

(People have, she said, and vendors "really appreciate the sup-

She'd contemplated launching a CSA a couple of years ago, but shelved the idea when other career obligations came up.

However, she said some of their regular customers hadn't for-

As pandemic concerns grew this spring, she said some older customers who were apprehensive about venturing out in public asked her about food delivery.

When she spread the word, her initial list of eight interested customers quickly doubled to 16. Younger families make up about half.

She's had to turn down later requests because she wants to ensure the farm has enough product to satisfy demand.

It was difficult to source some seed this year because of skyrocketing demand from home gardeners, she said.

That's one reason why Marsh and Meadows' CSA is following





a pay-as-you-go model, with prices varying according to what's in season.

Paying by the box "takes the pressure off of us a bit," she

And given the number of clients, the farm can deliver to their homes.

They also tailor boxes to meet clients' specific requests.

Customization adds some work, she acknowledged.

But she discovered that some clients who had tried a CSA in the past discontinued it because it lacked flexibility.

"We wanted to make sure that, first of all, people were happy with it, and, second of all, that we knew we could supply it and support it.

They've also showcased other local products, such as haskap berries, honey and maple syrup, "to make the box more interesting."

As an added touch, every box includes a bouquet of fresh flowers grown by her mother.

"People just love it," she said. Harrison said she's added less common garden offerings, such as lemon balm herb, with recipes. She's also included products, such as a chive blossom vinaigrette, to show how a plant can be used through all stages of

She hopes to introduce consumers to the range of foods produced in Northeastern Ontario, and how to use them.

With that knowledge, "they'll come back and ask for it again," she said.

#### NEXT SEASON

Harrison hopes to expand Marsh and Meadows' CSA clientele to 20 boxes next year.

A stable client base will help the farm plan for the 2021 season, she said.

If pandemic restrictions permit, she said it's considering making the market the pick-up location for boxes, with clients able to select some of their favourites on site that day.

The Brubachers, meanwhile, are so heartened by the response that they plan to launch a CSA meat box this fall offering a variety of beef cuts and chicken over a four-month period.

COVID-19 had also hit the livestock side of their operation.

She said they couldn't ship animals for processing as planned when outbreaks at a couple of large meat processing plants caused bottlenecks throughout the entire system.


There is a demand for meat in the immediate area, she said.

For customers, a CSA offers "peace of mind knowing where your food is coming from," she

She plans to survey CSA clientele later this year to see what they liked and what they'd

"If we have happy customers, we are definitely interested in doing it again."

#### **Overdose Awareness**

An overdose means having more of a drug (or combination of drugs) than your body can handle. All drugs can cause an overdose, including prescription medication. It's important to know the right amount and the right time to take your medication. It's also extremely important to know what drugs should not be mixed, and to get help if you feel you are not in control of your drug use.

#### **Depressants and Opioids**

A depressant is a drug that slows the vital activities of the body including breathing and heart rate. Depressants may also be known as sedatives. Opioids (such as heroin and pharmaceutical opioids like hydrocodone), medications like Xanax or Valium and alcohol all slow the central nervous system to produce a calming effect. When taken in large amounts or in combination with other medications and/or alcohol, these medications can weaken normal functions like breathing and lower heart rate until breathing and heart rate eventually stop, resulting in death.

#### Alcohol

Usually people don't think of alcohol when they think of an overdose, but alcohol is a depressant and it is possible to overdose on it. Acute alcohol poisoning, usually a result of binge drinking, is an example.

If you drink a large amount of alcohol quickly, the level of alcohol in your bloodstream can become dangerously high. Alcohol poisoning could stop you from breathing, stop your heart or cause you to choke on your own vomit.

#### **Stimulants**

It is possible to overdose on amphetamines. Adderall and Dexedrine are both examples of prescription stimulants. Amphetamine overdose increases the risk of heart attack, stroke, seizure or drug-induced psychotic episodes.

#### When to Call an Ambulance

Seeking emergency help isn't just for when someone is unconscious. You should also seek help when someone is:

- Having a seizure
- · Experiencing severe headache
- Experiencing chest pain
- · Having a hard time breathing
- · Extremely paranoid, agitated and/or confused

It is not necessary for someone to have all of these signs or symptoms for them to be overdosing. Showing signs of one or more could still mean they are in trouble and need emergency help.






