# **Improving Connectivity**

### **Temagami looking at** better internet service

TEMAGAMI – Temagami council agreed to provide a letter in support of Xplornet's application to Stage 1 of the Improving Connectivity for Ontario program at its regular meeting on August 6.

Recently, the Province of Ontario opened the first intake of the Improving Connectivity in Ontario (ICON) program. Stage 1 applications are due August 21. The municipality has had a call with Xplornet which intends to apply to the program.

Throughout Central and Northern Ontario, Xplornet is proposing to install 2,650 kilometres of fibre lines. This includes installing fibre lines to their existing tower situated north of Temagami.

"What it would do to our tower is it would be able to supply, to its current coverage, a hundred (megabits) per second to residents," treasurer-administrator Craig Davidson told council at the meeting.

"But also it could expand the range as well. When you're looking at the route the fibre wants to take, or what they want the fibre to take, it would basically leave Highway 11 around Sturgeon Falls and come up Highway 64. So, over time it would be a lot easier to service the Marten River area, as well."

Xplornet is estimating that the cost of this project would be \$200-\$220 million.

Xplornet already possesses a Long-Term Evolution (LTE) tower and will be installing fibre lines to increase

the strength of the tower, so they are looking at the Temagami extension to be one of the first stages of the overall project.

The Improving Connectivity for Ontario program was created to provide Ontarians with reliable highspeed internet and cellular connections at home, at work and along major highways.

The province is investing \$150 million in the new program so that, when leveraged with partner funding, it has the potential to result in a total investment of \$500 million to improve broadband and cellular coverage in underserved and unserved communities.

The province also is inviting telecommunication service providers, municipal governments, Indigenous communities and non-profits to submit innovative proposals to lend their investment, expertise and experience to improve connectivity in communities across Ontario.

Xplornet asked the municipality of Temagami to consider providing a letter of support they can include in their application to the ICON fund.

Davidson provided a draft letter that council reviewed and approved at the Aug. 6 meeting.

"If this (application) goes through, I guess it's a feather in our cap where we will get a better infrastructure to work from that we can build on in the future,"Temagami Mayor Dan O'Mara commented.

"So it is a start. It's not everything, but at least we're on their agenda and they are looking to try to work with us to try to get better (internet) service in our particular area."

# Most Canadians believe pandemic is far from over

SUDBURY - Most Canadians and indeed most residents of Ontario believe the coronavirus pandemic is far from over, and things will get bad again come fall or winter

Those are just some of the results reflected in a poll carried out by Canadian accounting and management firm KPMG.

The poll involved 1,010 Canadians in all parts of the country. The results were broken down by national responses, as well as responses from British Columbia, Alberta, combined Saskatchewan and Manitoba, Ontario, Quebec and the Atlantic Provinces. Ontario had the largest number of responses with 398.

#### FAR TO GO

Ontario residents believed by 94 per cent that the pandemic "is far from over," a figure that was matched by the national response.

Another statement that most Ontarians agreed with was: "I'm ok with going back to the workplace now because COVID cases are relatively low, but I think a second wave this fall and/or winter will shut down workplac-

es all over again." The Ontario response was 76 per cent while the national response was 72 per

With respect to getting back to work, the poll also revealed that Ontario residents believed more than other Canadians that they "feel much or somewhat better about returning to the workplace safely if their employer kept them updated in real-time about the level of health risk in their office and provided resources to foster their health and well-being." The number was 69 per cent for Ontario and 64 per cent nationally. B.C. was also 69 per cent.

That being said, Ontario residents responded by 78 per cent that they are most worried about colleagues coming to work sick or asymptomatic. The national response was 77 per cent. Ontario residents were 55 per cent worried about having to share common spaces like meeting rooms or lunch rooms. That national response was a bit higher at 57 per cent.

Some of the other work-related concerns were sharing air ventilation (50 per cent), workplace washrooms (38 per cent), and sharing the office coffee machine/water cooler (24 per cent).

For going back to work, the poll also revealed the "least concerning" issues. This included having to wear a face mask in the workplace and the responses were 54 per cent for Ontario and 56 per cent for all of Canada.

Another question asked how many would be ok to use an employer's smartphone app that would let them know how busy office areas are, so they could better manage their time and avoid such areas. Ontario residents responded "Yes that would be helpful" by 39 per cent and "Yes, but I'd be concerned about app geo-tracking and privacy" at 25 per cent.

Ontario residents also showed the highest satisfaction for their "virtual work environment" at 80 per cent with 64 per cent who said they feel more productive in a virtual working environment.

The poll also showed 53 per cent of Ontario respondents felt their company could have done a better job communicating on how to work from home. A similar number, 52 per cent in Ontario, said they wished their company was doing a better job communicating how the workers would be returning to work safely.

### **BUCKE-ROO CAMPING**

With covid-19 still with us in Ontario, Temiskaming must keep on track with the medical experts' advice on social distancing, face coverings and washing/sanitizing your hands often.

Camper repairs are important to RV'ers, trailer and 5thwheel owners to stay up on them before they make a small problem into a larger one. This can be done by the seasoned camper or a competent camper technician. The roof should be treated every two years with special roof sealant that can be bought at a camper repair shop.

Another thing to keep an eye on is looking for any small openings in your camper's exterior envelope especially the under carriage where small visitors may enter your trailer unexpectedly. Inspecting your trailer once a month should be enough to spot any openings. Water lines inside and out should also be inspected by camper owners along with awnings, jacks and tires.

Let's remember why we camp; the great Temiskaming outdoor fresh air, campfires under the stars eating smores and spider wieners, meeting new people and getting together with old friends, going down to the beach for a swim with the kids, and grandchildren, being together with family enjoying a picnic outside.

Some people take up gardening while they camp. Some grow flowers, others grow vegetables like tomatoes, carrots, little green onions, radishes, and leaf lettuce, makes for a good salad. Some spend their time bird watching. Temiskaming has many indigenous species of birds and some new arrivals in the past ten years like cranes, turkey vultures, bald eagles and more. Others watch the playful scampering of chipmunks and squirrels or happen to come across a rabbit eating mother nature's own salad. Still others watch the butterflies go from flower to flower and the dragonflies cleaning up the mosquitoes.

# School safety?

The excitement is building as educators and administrators prepare to welcome students back to class in the South Temiskaming region.

The coronavirus pandemic drastically affected the school year when in-class learning was cancelled in March due to the pandemic.

Premier Ford and his minister of education, Stephen Lecce, have announced a plan for students returning to school that includes social distancing, wearing of masks and limited movement of students and staff.

The government has unveiled its cautious school reopening approach while leaning heavily on advice from public health officials.

Elementary students will return five days per week and class sizes will remain at the mandated maximum levels in place before the pandemic.

This is where things get dicey.

Why would the government and school board administrators not reduce class sizes in relation to social distancing thereby reducing potential infection rates among students?

Are we suddenly expected to believe anywhere from 250 to 700 people are able to safely be together in a school building for six hours a day, five days per week?

Parents have expressed safety concerns about sending their children back to school in September. For the most part it seems like it will be business as usual in Ontario's schools this fall, with the exception of mandatory masks for children from Grade 4 and up.

For high school students, three quarters of their learning will be online as new online curriculum is being offered.

Students and staff are not to congregate in groups of 50 or more.

Are there going to be additional support staff assigned to students who may need extra help with online learning?

Students returning to school this fall will have been out of the class for six months and they have been coping with the uncertainty of the pandemic.

It has been noted that students are dealing with mental health issues and what some describe as a "learning loss" due to the pandemic.

They should not have to worry about whether they will get sick when they return to class.

And it is not only the students who are worrying about getting sick it is educators themselves who are concerned about their own health and

Let's see the Ministry of Education provide more monies to school boards which must spend more taxpayer dollars on pandemic sanitizing issues.

We don't want money being taken away from the classrooms intended to support learning.

Maybe a look around the world at best practices for school re-openings is a good idea?

### MAKING WAY



#### Cervical Cancer—What You Should Know

Each year in Canada, more than 1,300 women are diagnosed with cervical cancer and over 400 die from the disease. Almost all cases of cervical cancer are caused by the human papillomavirus (HPV), which is preventable through the HPV vaccine. The publicly funded vaccine is provided to male and female students in every province and territory through school-based programs. Regular screening of adult women is also vital as cervical cancer caught at an earlier stage has a high survival rate. Most cervical cancer (67% occurs in women aged 30-59.

#### **Rick Factors**

The main risk factor for developing cervical cancer is the sexually transmitted human papilloma virus (HPV) that infects the cervix.

Other risk factors for developing cervical cancer include:

- Becoming sexually active at a young age; having many sexual partners or having a sexual partner that has had many sexual partners.
- The use of birth control pills for a long period of time.
- Giving birth to many children.
- · Having taken diethylstilbestrol (DES), or being the daughter of a mother who took DES.

#### Prevention

Getting screened regularly is important because it can find abnormal cells that could become cancer (called pre-cancers). Finding pre-cancers and treating them can prevent you from getting cancer. Treating pre-cancers is much easier than treating cancer. It also has a better chance of working than treating cancer after it develops.

#### Who Should Be Screened:

- Women 21 and older who are or ever have been sexually active, should be screened regularly for cervical cancer.
- Based on the latest clinical evidence, most women should be screened every 3 years.
- Regular screening can stop at the age of 70 if a woman has had 3 or more normal tests in the previous 10 years.

If you are due or overdue for cervical cancer screening, call your primary care provider today to schedule an appointment. Screening is the only way to find the early changes that might lead to cervical cancer.







# Temagami makes draft strategic plan available

TEMAGAMI - The municipality of Temagami will be making its draft strategic plan available for public viewing.

Treasurer-administrator Craig Davidson noted at the August 6 council meeting that council would typically have held the meeting by this time where they could discuss priorities of the strategic plan, but that fell by the wayside due to the COVID-19 pandemic response and council is just getting back to it now.

Council has received a few requests for copies of the draft strategic plan, but there are many recommendations put forth by the consultant that council has not yet had the opportunity to discuss.

"In my opinion, yes it can be released provided that it goes with a huge mark that it's draft and that until council actually says 'this is what our priorities are' that that's all this is, something that's there for council to consider," Davidson said.

"It shouldn't be considered, if we put (the plan) out, that this is what council is going to do because council hasn't had the opportunity to weigh in as of what they want to have done with the strategic plan."

The purpose of Temagami's strategic plan is to provide the municipality with a structured approach to achieving the long-term (10-year) goals of the community, local stakeholders, and agencies.

The plan is a living document that builds on the work already being conducted locally and within the region, but gives clarity to the specific roles that council and the community can play.

Council has experienced an abnormally long time between when the initial draft was received on January 28 to now and the process of attempting to have a special meeting to discuss the recommendations made.

Should council not adopt some of the recommendations made in the draft plan, premature release could lead to confusion in the community as to what the strategic plan contains.

On the other hand, if the draft plan was released, especially with the communicate@temagami.ca email address being used to receive comments, there may be comments received from the public that could further direct council's priority decision making process.

"We'd put (the draft strategic plan) on our website, we would circulate to communicate that it is available from our website. If somebody wanted to have a copy of it, we would produce a hard copy and find a way to get it to them,' Davidson said.

"That would be the normal way of doing things. Just right now, we haven't been handing it out because it's not really something that we can say 'this is what council's objectives

Council unanimously approved a resolution that would make the draft strategic plan public.

In September, council expects to be receiving reports from the Waste Management Master Plan and the Service Delivery Review.

They also hope to hold meetings to discuss the recommendations made in the draft plan prior to Labour Day that would allow all three to inform the other municipal processes, including the budget, as the municipality moves toward 2021.



No Day Burning - You may only burn from 6pm-8am.

Only Burn Dry, Woody Type Materials - Household trash, plastic or tires are illegal to burn. You may not burn grass or leaves or anything that may cause excessive smoke.

Always Stay with Your Fire - A responsible person of 18 years of age or older must be present to supervise the fire at all times.

Respect Your Neighbour - Don't burn where smoke will bother your neighbour or blow across roadways or hamper visibility.

Control Your Fire - Only burn what you can effectively control. Don't even consider burning when it is windy.


