Traffic enforcement a priority on long weekend

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special) – Another long weekend means another focus on highway safety.

As the Thanksgiving long weekend begins, Temiskaming Ontario Provincial Police will be targeting the so-called

Big Four offences in an effort to reduce injuries and deaths.

And what are the Big Four?

Impairment, be it by drugs or alcohol; speeding; distracted driving; and failure to wear seatbelts and other occupant restraints.

In a news release, police say they will practise zero tolerance in their enforcement of laws related to, among others, speeding and stunt driving, seatbelt use, driving with a handheld communi-

cations device, and commercial drivers who follow other vehicles too closely.

To date this year, Temiskaming OPP have investigated about 190 collisions involving vehicles, off-road vehicles, and snow machines.

Three people were killed and several were injured.

Police say 53 of the collisions involved inattention and 32 were speed-related. Impairment was cited as a factor in five, and 18 involved animals.

In a news release, police advised drivers to take a few minutes prior to departure to ensure they're fully prepared, including consideration of changing weather conditions. Operators were urged to wear a helmet if necessary, and to never drive if impaired.

"Expect higher volumes of traffic and never risk anyone's life due to unsafe operating or driving behaviour," police said.

October is Occupational Therapy Month

What is Occupational Therapy?

Occupational therapy is a type of health care that helps to solve the problems that interfere with a person's ability to do the things that are important to them.

An Occupational Therapist (OT) may check:

- Your physical abilities like strength, balance and coordination
- Your mental abilities like memory, coping strategies, organizational skills
- What materials or devices you use to participate in activities like furniture, utensils, tools or clothes
- What social and emotional support is available to you at home, school, work or in the community, and
- The physical setup of your house, classroom, workplace or other environment

Depending on the problem, the OT can help you solve it by:

1. Helping you overcome your disability. OTs do this by:
 - educating or instructing you on how to do things with the abilities you have - e.g. getting around your community in a wheelchair
 - suggesting activities that will help you improve or maintain the abilities you have - e.g. improving your coping strategies
2. Adapting the materials you use. OTs do this by changing the things you use:
 - around the house - e.g. a special key holder to make turning keys easier
 - in sports or leisure activities - e.g. a playing cards holder
 - at work or school - e.g. special tools that help prevent injury to hands and back
 - to take care of yourself - e.g. special bath or toilet seats
 - to get from place to place - e.g. car modifications such as one-handed steering wheels
3. Recommending changes to the environments where you do your everyday activities. OTs do this by recommending that you:
 - change the physical layout of your workplace, home or school - e.g. lowering/raising desk tops, countertops or cupboards
 - find out about the supports in your community - e.g. specialized public transportation
 - work with the people in your community - e.g. providing education about a disability to the teacher or employer
 - work with the government to encourage health living - e.g. request funding for special equipment

Shared services works, says Charlton-Dack reeve

CHARLTON-DACK - Many area municipal leaders are advocating shared service agreements in which municipalities retain their own voices through their own councils, but work cooperatively for public works and administration services and more.

When implemented, the agreements are helping municipalities find efficiencies in both cost and speed of getting projects done.

The reeve of the Municipality of Charlton and Dack, Merrill Bond, is a strong advocate of shared services.

His municipality is now in an agreement with the neighbouring Township of Chamberlain.

He and Chamberlain Reeve Kerry Stewart have a good working relationship, as do the councils of the two municipalities, he noted.

Their administrative and public works staffs are now working on the same projects, and it is making a difference to the communities, said Bond.

Shared services has been something Bond has been pursuing for 11 years, he said, and he continues to work on more opportunities through that system.

He noted that staff are an important part of ensuring shared services can work together.

A report is being prepared to determine if there could be more benefits through shared services with Englehart and Evanturel Township.

In a separate interview, Stewart said government funding was received for the study, and a consultant was contracted to look at whether there could be advantages for the four municipalities in more shared services.

A second study is being conducted to determine if there could be an opportunity for Charlton-Dack and Chamberlain Township to work with the neighbouring unincorporated townships of Savard, Robillard and Pacaud to share services.

OPPORTUNITIES

Stewart said there have not yet been any discussions with the roads boards of these townships, but Charlton-Dack and Chamberlain think there could be opportunities in the areas of roads services, fire response and administration.

Stewart said when first considering their shared services agreement, one of the examples they looked at was that of Harley Township and the surrounding townships of Casey, Hudson and Kerns which have shared administrative staff for the past 20 years under now retired CAO Michel Lachapelle.

Latchford Mayor George Lefebvre, also speaking in a separate interview, pointed to that central Temiskaming shared services agreement as a prime example of how it can work for municipalities. Jordan Kemp is now the lead administrator for Harley, Casey, Hudson and Kerns.

Kerns Reeve Terry Phillips commented shared services has worked well for his municipality. "It's a big cost saving."

By joining their hiring power, four municipalities can afford to employ people with more experience, Phillips pointed out.

The four municipalities had the additional benefit of being able to employ Kemp for a number of years while he trained under Lachapelle, Phillips added.

With the already incorporated municipalities in the Englehart area, Bond is confident sharing services can work for the municipalities.

Bond acknowledges entering a shared service agreement won't work if the municipalities are not in agreement.

"Everybody has to be in agreement if this is what you want to do," he said. "There's always pitfalls that you have to work your way through." For that reason, a cooperative approach is needed, and the people at the table have to

be willing to work through problems together, he explained. This includes staff and council members.

CATCHING MISTAKES

The benefit of shared services is that by working together on projects, more people (members of both councils) are reviewing agreements.

"You have a better chance of catching a mistake," said Bond.

When it comes to public works projects, "You're able to do more work with the equipment you have."

A combined manpower improves the flow and speed of projects, he added.

Efficiencies can also make it possible to add more staff, he continued, noting Charlton-Dack and Chamberlain are hiring a new employee to add to the combined public works staff.

The administrative department is also benefiting, with an expanded staff that is able to pick up work if one person is sick or is taking holidays. The other benefit is better bidding power for supplies, he added.

Stewart said that as a result of the shared services agreement "we are going to be able to accomplish a lot of things that we were trying to do."

Latchford's Lefebvre, who is a member of the Temiskaming Municipal Association and the Temiskaming Mayors Action Group, sees a clear opportunity for municipalities in shared services agreements.

While he was not prepared to go into detail, he said there is an opportunity being discussed between Cobalt and Latchford

to share an employee currently working for Latchford.

Sharing services "has a lot of merit," he said.

He pointed to bylaw officer Pete Gilboe who is providing services for Cobalt, Latchford and Coleman Township, and now is

also providing services for Armstrong Township. None of those municipalities could afford to hire a person alone, but with a contract from each of the municipalities, an employment opportunity develops for one person, he commented.

It is with a heavy heart that I write this tribute to my dear friend Tina Sartoretto.

She passed away last week, with her beloved brother Albert by her side.

Tina's life would involve a vast array of academic achievements, lasting friendships and endless dedication to the best ole town we know, Cobalt.

We go back a long way as teammates on the Cobalt Silver Belles girls hockey team.

She played defence and I was the goalie and those coming down the ice on her side of the rink had to be fast and skilled to get past her.

We were bandmates together when Cobalt Recreation director Harold Ribson recruited Cobalt youth for a teen band that marched in the first Cobalt Miner's Festival when 10,000 people came to town.

I will never forget seeing Tina on stage at the Cobalt Arena singing Anne Murray's *Snowbird* song in front of thousands of people.

She loved music, she loved to sing and perform.

Later on when I moved to Espanola I would run into Tina at the big box stores in Sudbury. She came to see my Espanola

team take on her College Boreal squash team in the finals one year.

She was a positive force at the college and in the greater community of Sudbury as a well-known philanthropist and volunteer.

We served two terms, eight years together, on Cobalt council. We didn't always see eye-to-eye, she lovingly referred to me as her "Achilles heel." One thing we agreed on though was our love, respect and dedication to the people of Cobalt.

We fought side-by-side to save the Cobalt Coleman Public School. We worked together to organize Canada Day celebrations and we established the Cobalt Community Spirit Awards recognizing long serving volunteers in our town. We stood proudly together as the Franco-Ontarian Flag was raised in Cobalt.

Tina was a proud Francophone attending Laurentian University when the flag was first flown 45 years ago.

She established the Cobalt Legacy Fund with Jack Birtch helping to provide funds to not-for-profit groups in our town.

She was a skilled orator and could address a room of five people or a gathering of a thousand and get her message across

with humour, candor and grace.

Tina, unlike many, always saw the bigger picture and helped to unite the three southern Temiskaming communities of Latchford, Cobalt and Coleman Township.

In order to survive and prosper in the north, you must work together and Tina knew this.

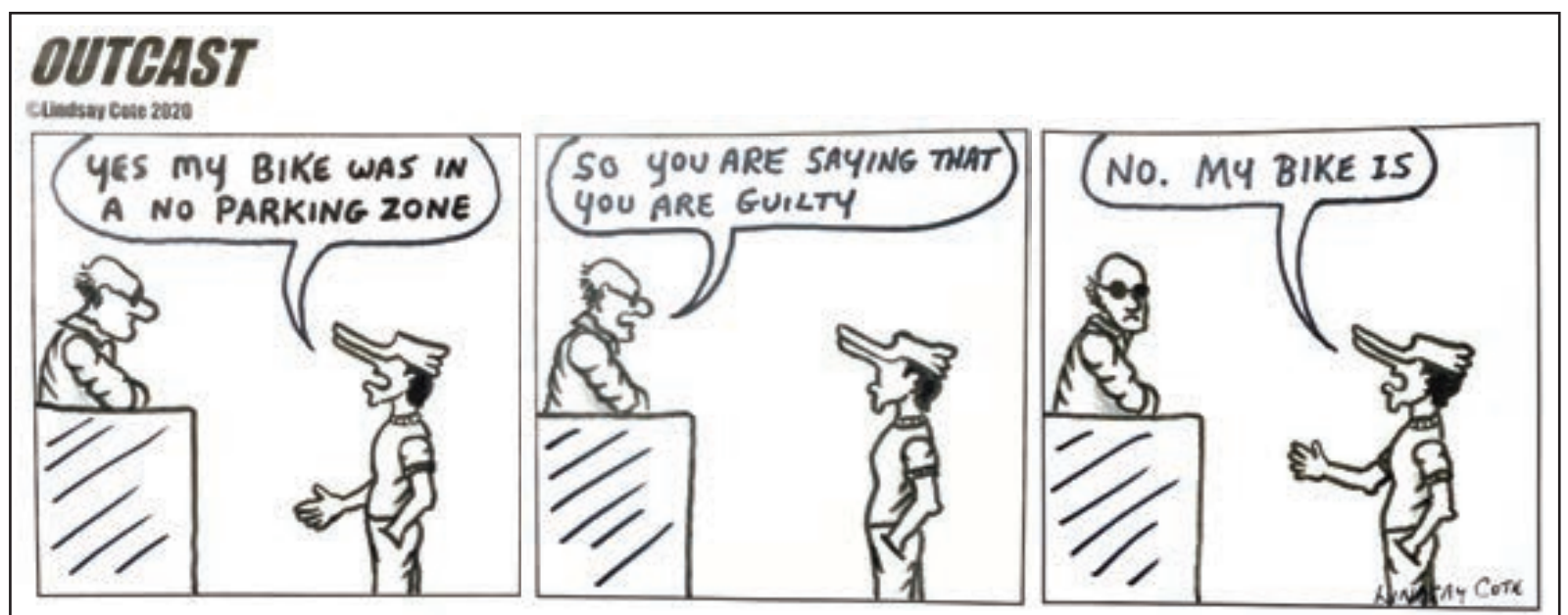
Her idea of a two-tier regional governance system for Temiskaming fell on deaf ears but someday it might prove to be a wise path.

I recall after one particularly stressful council meeting I informed her of my wish to resign. She invited me over to her house for a drink and a chat. Well, she served the most delicious spaghetti dinner, we popped the cork on a bottle of wine and we talked about everything but council.

That was Tina.

She loved people and best of all she loved Cobalt with all her heart and soul.

Rest in power and peace my dear friend. She is singing with the angels and giving St. Peter hell.



New bursary celebrating legacy of late MPP

KIRKLAND LAKE (Special) – A new bursary has been established at Northern College in memory of the late David Ramsay, the area’s long-time MPP.

Ramsay, who died July 29 at the age of 72, had served as the area’s MPP for 26 years. He held a variety of cabinet posts during his time at Queen’s Park, including serving as minister of Correctional Affairs, Agriculture and Food, Aboriginal Affairs, and Natural Resources.

He retired from politics in 2011, and moved to Chester,

Nova Scotia, with his wife Kathy.

“David was an outstanding individual and a tremendous asset to our region,” said Sean O’Connor, a Kirkland Lake businessman and long-time supporter, in a news release announcing the new bursary.

“He served with distinction and integrity. His passing, both sudden and too early, is an opportunity to honour his service appropriately.”

This bursary will be awarded each year to a student at the

Haileybury or Kirkland Lake campus who demonstrates leadership in school or community life, together with financial need.

“We are grateful for the establishment of this bursary that honours the life of someone who was impactful to so many lives in the region,” said Susan Hunter, the college’s director of marketing, communications and external relations who also oversees the Northern College Foundation.

“By giving to students in this

way, David Ramsay’s legacy can live on as students who merit this award receive support in their studies and continue to embody the leadership he displayed in his lifetime.”

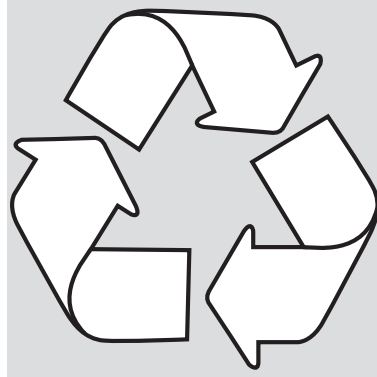
