Forest board

Former councillor nominated for corporation

TEMAGAMI - Temagami has nominated John Kenrick to be the municipality's representative on the Temagami Local Forest Management Corporation's board of directors.

The decision was made at Temagami's regular meeting on Thursday, October 8.

Kenrick had expressed his desire to be Temagami's nominee to sit on the board through a letter and a resume, treasurer-administrator Craig Davidson noted.

Local nominees and evaluation of those nominees must be completed by late November.

"He's been involved in this process over the past seven years, as well (he) has extensive Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry experience," Davidson to establish the corporation. said of Kenrick.

"He also has experience working on the provincial side in First Nation consultation."

Council had received a presentation from Kenrick September 17 that provided an update on the work that is being completed by the Task Force attempting

Protect Against the Flu

Getting a flu vaccine is more important than ever this year to protect yourself, your family, and your community from flu.

What is the Difference between the Flu and COVID-19?

Influenza (Flu) and COVID-19 are both contagious respiratory illnesses, but they are caused by different viruses. COVID-19 is caused by infection with a new coronavirus (called SARS-CoV-2) and flu is caused by infection with influenza viruses

Both COVID-19 and the flu can have varying degrees of signs and symptoms, ranging from no symptoms (asymptomatic) to severe symptoms. Common symptoms that COVID-19 and flu share include:

- Fever or feeling feverish/chills
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue (tiredness)
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache

Some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults

Because many of the symptoms of flu and COVID-19 are similar, it may be hard to tell the difference between them based on symptoms alone, and testing may be needed to help confirm a diagnosis.

Tips to Avoid Getting and Spreading the Flu and COVID-19:

- Wash your hands often
- Cover your mouth when you cough or sneeze
- Don't touch your face
- Stay at home when you're sick
- Wear a mask when unable to maintain a 6-foot distance from anyone outside your bubble
- Clean (and disinfect) surfaces and shared items

Flu shot clinic dates will be held in various locations throughout the District of Temiskaming – watch for further details from the Timiskaming Health Unit. The Temagami Family Health Team will be hosting drive-thru flu clinics in October. Watch for further details specific to dates and times. Appointments will be required so please call the office at (705) 569-3244 to schedule yours.

Temagami sees financial impact of COVID-19

TEMAGAMI - The picture is becoming clear for the municipality of Temagami when it comes to financial impacts stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Council received the COVID financial report up to September 25, prepared by treasurer-administrator Craig Davidson, at the October 8 regular meeting.

Temagami received \$175,600 in Safe Restart Agreement funding from the province of which it has used \$57,096.57.

A reserve will be established for the additional \$118,503.43 of funds in accordance with the direction given by the province.

The Safe Restart Agreement funding was provided by the

province to help municipalities offset costs incurred from the impact of COVID-19.

The municipality used \$7,500 of the funding to offset rental revenue loss, \$943.45 went to meeting modifications, control group meetings and messaging accounted for \$18,460.21, personal protective equipment and sanitizers totalled \$12,221.33 and costs for wages and benefits equalled \$17,971.58.

"In the wages and benefit area, this is a net total of additional costs associated with meetings and additional duties, less the amounts not paid to employees who chose to be laid off during the Provincial Emergency," Davidson wrote in his report to

"Included in the costs are loss revenues, mostly from rental payments from the train station tenants but also rental fees that were refunded when the arena was shut down and membership fees not received from the Fitness Centre since it is not operating."

Davidson said that the report of Temagami's COVID financial costs is due to the province at the end of October, but that they had not yet provided the municipality with a template for the report.

Northern College working on new long-term plan

TEMISKAMING SHORES -And now the review begins.

More than 800 responses have been received to an online survey as Northern College drafts a new long-term strategic plan.

"We're getting phenomenal feedback," said Audrey Penner, the college's president and CEO, in an interview last week.

Responses over the monthlong survey period exceeded the approximately 500 the college received in its last online consultation prior to 2014, she said.

"I think in many ways COVID has helped us with that. They're getting used to doing things online, and they're taking advantage of the opportunity to have their voices heard."

Penner and senior managers from the college have also approached municipal councils and organizations, both in person and through teleconferences and videoconferences.

(Her first presentation was to Temiskaming Shores council September 1.)

"The volume of data is now the big challenge," she said. "Don't get me wrong, it's a great challenge to have."

She said the comments are being reviewed to pull out emerging themes.

She anticipated a draft plan will be presented to the college's board of governors in November. She didn't expect that a document would be ready for presentation to the public until some time this winter, but said she may be "pleasantly surprised" by an earlier release.

The consultation period ran for a single month. It was a tight timeframe, she said, but that too may reflect the fact that COVID-19 has spurred a general acceptance that things are being done differently.

Among the facets of education that the college is taking into consideration are digital learning, trades-related programming, micro-credentialling (short, focused courses or endorsements of

specific skills), and student recruitment, both domestic and internationally.



The Canadian 99s is a group of professional and independent female pilots. It was founded by 99 women in 1929 to provide mutual support and to advance aviation. It is the largest international organization of women pilots with upwards of 5,000 members in 40 countries.

American aviator Amelia Earhart was elected the first president in 1931.

The Gold Cup Rally is not a race but is a challenge involving aviation-related questions, ground photos, calculation of fuel consumption, spot landing and more. It requires a minimum of two people per aircraft, a pilot and co-pilot.

Participants are not limited to membership in the 99s.

"I began taking flying lessons in Grade six. My father was taking flying lessons at the time and he thought it was a good idea that I took them as well," said pilot Kirsten Kelly.

"I've flown all over North America and even took my mother to Providence, Rhode Island. It's great to get together with other women during these events. The people of Earlton have been so friendly to us."

Despite the weather being a bit on the chilly side, the women brought their tents and camped outside at the Earlton airport.

Why did they come to Earlton?

"Well, this year being a COVID nightmare, I thought hotels would not be a great idea, from what was known back in April and that perhaps camping

would enable us to have our annual Air Rally. I began phoning airports that we have not been to on our rallies, to find out if they allowed camping," said 99s member/Air Rally organizer Susan Begg in an email interview.

AIRPORT AMENITIES

The group was searching for a facility with a sizeable runway and one that could accommodate not only a large number of aircraft but camping, too.

"Earlton Timiskaming Regional Airport permitted camping and has a huge runway. Jamie Smith, airport manager and Max, airport maintenance, went above and beyond our expectations to accommodate us. I would recommend Earlton Timiskaming Airport to every aviation organization," said Begg.

This year marked the 20th anniversary of the Gold Cup Rallies that have a different destination each year.

The Rallies are comprised of a series of challenges and the pilots who garner the most points win a first, second or third place finish - and bragging rights.

The Gold Cup winners were Mary Norman and Akky Mansikka, with Rani Tolton and Laureen Nelson placing second. Jocelyn Lecluse and Janet Chesterfield earned a third place finish.

The 23 women pilots had spot landings at the Muskoka Airport where the rally actually began, with another stop on Manitoulin Island before landing in Earlton.

"In Earlton, our finale dinner was ordered from Dida's Restaurant, respecting COVID rules. Dida's delivered our orders to the airport for us. Excellent service and food."

Begg mentioned the pilots arriving in Earlton were members of the East Canada Section 99s.

"They had a good time," said airport manager Jamie Smith in a telephone interview.

"The pilots toured around the region, we provided a couple

of buildings for their usage and they bought fuel from us which really helps us."

During their stay at the Earl-

ton airport, the pilots took a tour of the Bison du Nord farm, travelled around the Earlton countryside and enjoyed meals from

locally based restaurants.

They noted the region was beautiful to fly over and view from the wide-open skies.






