Salvation Army Church welcomes new pastors to **Temiskaming Shores**

TEMISKAMING SHORES — The New Liskeard Salvation Army Temiskaming Community Church congregation welcomed its new pastors, Lieutenants Brandon and April Keeping, to the Temiskaming Shores community this past August.

"We came to New Liskeard with a desire to get to know our community and see how our congregation and its expressions of ministry can best serve this community with its own unique joys and challenges," said April in an email interview. "There is a verse in the Bible that speaks to Jesus who "moved into the neighbourhood" (John 1:14, MSG). I love this because it speaks to our desire, the church, we are not here to simply invite people into our church building on a Sunday morning. Rather we believe that we are called to be a transforming influence "out there" in the neighbourhood. The Salvation Army exists to share the love of Jesus Christ, meet human needs, and be a transforming influence in the community of the world."

The pastors had come from Winnipeg where they competed their two-year training to be pastors with The Salvation Army in Winnipeg.

Brandon Keeping formerly was a police officer for ten years in Southern Ontario, and before the couple had children, April worked in long term-care.

The couple has three boys aged 8, 6 and 3 years.

The Whitewood Avenue Thrift Store is open Monday to Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The Thrift Store is accepting all donations except furniture. Donations can be dropped off at the back door during business hours.

The Christmas Hamper Program is being resurrected this year serving the communities of Kenabeek, Elk Lake, Latchford, Cobalt and New Liskeard. Each registered household receives a food hamper containing all the necessary items for a Christmas dinner. If anyone is interested in donating items for the hampers they can call the church office at 705-647-

For those in need of a hamper they can call the church office any day after Monday, November 2 to book an appointment to come and register at the church building on appointed dates. Once registered they will be given a time slot to pick up their hamper on Tuesday, December 22.

The couple continues to look forward to offering necessary programs while getting to know the people in their new community.

"Our family is settling into Temiskaming very well. We have enjoyed getting to know our neighbours, settling into the boys' school and daycare, walking the boardwalk and, of course, enjoying the great outdoors. This is a beautiful place to live and we are excited to call it home."

Making Halloween a little less COVID-scary

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special) - Can Halloween 2020 still be a treat?

The Timiskaming Health Unit has offered guidelines to keep COVID-19 at bay on Halloween.

"While we are still navigating our first Halloween in a global pandemic, I think we can all agree that we want everyone to be safe," said Dr. Glenn Corneil, acting medical officer of health at the health unit.

In a media release, he said celebrants could try a new twist on Halloween.


Suggestions include a neighbourhood house-decorating contest, a scary story-telling session via Zoom or Facetime, a virtual costume party, or spooky gatherings with your family and social circle.

Public health officials will continue to consider provincial direction, the local COVID-19 status, and the possibility of changing conditions in the lead-up to October 31.

While it is safest to stay home, Corneil said, "If you do choose to trick or treat you must take extra precautions."

The health unit offers the following:

- Don't trick-or-treat or hand out goodies if you're sick.
- Only trick-or-treat with members of your household.
- Trick-or-treat outside and maintain distance from people outside your household.
- Wear a face covering when going door-to-door or distributing treats. (A conventional Halloween costume mask cannot double as a face covering.)
 - Don't congregate or linger at doorsteps.
- When handing out treats, stay near your door so youngsters can avoid high-touch surfaces like doorbells.
- Don't leave treats in a bucket for kids to take. Consider using tongs or long spoons to hand out treats, or set up a table with bagged treats that kids can grab.
- Wash your hands often and thoroughly or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Respect the wishes of residents and stay away from homes where the lights aren't on.
- Consider printing a poster advising kids if you're handing out
- While gatherings of up to 10 people indoors and 25 outdoors are permitted under provincial legislation, non-essential gatherings of any size should be limited. Stick with members of your own household for indoor activities.
- Don't attend a gathering if you have any symptoms or you're self-isolating.
- If you host a gathering, keep a guest list in case contact tracing is required.
- Avoid buffet-style food service and plan how to physically distance when distributing food and cleaning up.
- Serve food on individual plates to prevent guests passing uten-
- Enable everyone to wash their hands before and after eating.
- Consider participating virtually, rather than in person, if you are 70 or older, immunocompromised, or have underlying health conditions.



New book explores the Historical Map of Temagami

TEMAGAMI - There is a new book in the works that is diving into all aspects of the making of the Historical Map of Temagami.

Explorer and author James Raffan of Guelph is in the process of writing the book, tentatively entitled Styx Macdonald's Map, that he says "will be the story of the inspiration, making and significance of the map as wrapped into and around the story" of Craig Macdonald's life.

Macdonald created the Historical Map of Temagami over the span of 30 years that provides a glimpse into the lives of the Anishinaabeg people of Temagami as he spoke with First Nation elders, trappers, loggers and canoeists. He was working for the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry at the time but carried the map project out separate from that work.

The map was published by the Ontario Geographical Names Board in 1993 and has the names of 660 features - including lakes, rivers, creeks, islands and highlands - all written out in the language of the Anishinaabeg.


Raffan said that he first met Macdonald in the 1960s at Camp Kandalore that was owned by by Kirk Wipper, who founded the Canadian Canoe Museum.

"Craig was a trip leader at that camp who I first met in the early 60s," Raffan explained in an email interview.

"Since then, we have travelled together on a number of canoe trips and also winter snowshoe trips in various places."

Raffan said that readers can think of the new book as a biography of Macdonald and "how this remarkable map came to be.

"Interestingly, as compelling as his Historical Map of Temagami is, an even richer source of stories and fascination for readers will be the map that is inside (his) head, which covers a much wider swath of terrain and a broader set of topics. Although Craig's work on



snowshoes, sleds, toboggans and winter travel techniques is really a whole separate topic (and probably a totally separate book) I'm hoping the book that we are creating together will be a wonderful and informative companion to Craig's detailed documentation of winter tech and travel techniques."

Raffan said that Styx Macdonald's Map is expected to be released sometime around 2023 but that he currently has agreed to produce a publishable manuscript for Macdonald and the Temagami Community Foundation by the spring of 2022.

"We/they have not, as yet, found a publisher (for the book)," he noted.

"But with this kind of lead time in the creation of the manuscript, I'm hoping that we will have a publisher lined up and ready to go by the time the manuscript is finished."

TRAIN STATION TALK

The Historical Map Temagami project is being supported and promoted by the Temagami Community Foundation, which hosted a map unveiling talk at the train station back on September 28.

The public was able to meet both Raffan and Macdonald, which was well received by those who attended.

"The talk at the train station took my breath away, it was a seriously crappy fall day—cold and wet," Raffan recounted.

"And with the (social) distancing thing, we had to be outdoors, under canvas tarps. But still, there were a couple of dozen people there, hanging on Craig's every word, asking questions, buying maps, as if oblivious to the nastiness of the weather." Raffan said there was also similarly enthusiastic receptions from the Chiefs and councils at Bear Island, as well as at the Elder's Lodge.

"It was about as close as I've ever been to travelling with a genuine rock star," he added.

Copies of the Historical Map of Temagami are available at the train station for \$50 each.

Protect Against the Flu

Getting a flu vaccine is more important than ever this year to protect yourself, your family, and your community from flu.

What is the Difference between the Flu and COVID-19?

Influenza (Flu) and COVID-19 are both contagious respiratory illnesses, but they are caused by different viruses. COVID-19 is caused by infection with a new coronavirus (called SARS-CoV-2) and flu is caused by infection with influenza viruses.

Both COVID-19 and the flu can have varying degrees of signs and symptoms, ranging from no symptoms (asymptomatic) to severe symptoms. Common symptoms that COVID-19 and flu share include:

- · Fever or feeling feverish/chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue (tiredness)
- Sore throat
- · Runny or stuffy nose
- · Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache

Some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults

Because many of the symptoms of flu and COVID-19 are similar, it may be hard to tell the difference between them based on symptoms alone, and testing may be needed to help confirm a diagnosis.

Tips to Avoid Getting and Spreading the Flu and COVID-19:

- Wash your hands often
- Cover your mouth when you cough or sneeze
- · Don't touch your face
- Stay at home when you're sick
- Wear a mask when unable to maintain a 6-foot distance from anyone outside your bubble
- · Clean (and disinfect) surfaces and shared items

Flu shot clinic dates will be held in various locations throughout the District of Temiskaming – watch for further details from the Timiskaming Health Unit. The Temagami Family Health Team will be hosting drive-thru flu clinics in October. Watch for further details specific to dates and times. Appointments will be required so please call the office at (705) 569-3244 to schedule yours.



TEMISKAMING SHORES - Winter's coming, and an army of knitters is warming kids' hands and heads.

The Temiskaming Shores Lioness Lions Club recently bagged 500 hat-and-mitt sets crafted by a handful of local knitters.

They're being distributed to 26 schools and daycares in the South Temiskaming

"We have knitters who have been knitting all through COVID, keeping busy," said club president Janet Spencer.

They'll be given to kids who lack the necessary winter wear, who lose items, or whose outerwear becomes unusable over the course of the day.

The club has been coordinating the hatand-mitt endeavour for about 10 years. But the craftsmanship began some 10 years earlier still with blankets made by members calling themselves the Happy Hookers.

Over the years, the sewing initiative has helped clients of organizations including Victim Services of Temiskaming and District, the Pavilion Women's Centre and the Literacy Council of South Temiskaming.

The club also assembles up to 150 "clean kits" of personal hygiene supplies each year for distribution as needed.

It welcomes donations of materials for all its work.

It's also looking for more knitters.

They supply the expertise, and the club provides the materials - Spencer guesses she currently has some 16 large plastic crates filled with donated wool.



Carnegie building process concerns

TEMISKAMING SHORES - The City of Temiskaming Shores is calling for tenders from parties interested in purchasing either the former New Liskeard public library Carnegie building, or the former Haileybury library building on Ferguson Avenue at the north end of the business section in Haileybury.

The Carnegie building request for tenders includes a minimum bid price of \$200,000 and the Haileybury building request for tenders includes a minimum bid price of \$100,000.

One party which has expressed a strong interest in the Carnegie building in New Liskeard is the Ontario Centre for Archaeological Research and Education (OCARE).

Ryan Primrose, representing that organization, made a presentation to council at its Tuesday, October 20 council meeting, asking for council to consider several other factors beside price when evaluating the tenders which are received.

Primrose appeared in person before the council and also submitted a letter in which he stated, "Given the particular historical and social context of the Carnegie building in New Liskeard, I would like to propose that the tenders received for its purchase be evaluated using a rubric which considers not only the proposed purchase amount, but also the benefit to the public, and the commitment to maintaining the heritage character of the building."

Need for Community Safety and Well Being plan raised again

DISTRICT - Attention has turned again to developing a Community Safety and Well Being plan for the region.

The Community Safety and Well Being Plan is a concept of the provincial government through the Police Services Act and has the goal of creating a framework for municipalities, First Nations and their partners to find solutions to address issues regarding social development, risk prevention and risk intervention.

Prior to the emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic, municipalities had received the directive from the provincial government to develop plans to address this need, and locally, a proposal had been put forward to develop a regional plan, with the option for municipalities to alter the plan individually to personalize it to the closer problems within those communities.

The District of Timiskaming Social Services Administration Board (DTSSAB) was identified as a possible resource which could assist in the process of coming up with a regional plan. Prior to the beginning of the pandemic, 16 of 23 partnering municipalities in DTSSAB expressed an

interest in having DTSSAB examine the proposal.

However, with the onset of the pandemic, the initial January 1, 2021 deadline for plans to be created was set aside. Whether the majority of the municipalities are still interested is not known.

At the Monday, October 19 meeting of the Temiskaming Shores Police Services Board, chair Doug Jelly (Temiskaming Shores councillor and also chair of DTSSAB) expressed the need for municipalities to respond in the near future whether they are interested in working together through DTSSAB for the creation of a district plan. "We need all municipalities to be involved in this," Jelly commented.

If a regional plan is to be created through DTSSAB, it needs to be included in the DTSSAB 2021 budget which is finalized at the end of March. "It does not give us a lot of time," Jelly commented at the police services board meeting.


DTSSAB chief administrative officer Kelly Black commented through an email that before COVID-19 had become an issue, DTSSAB had heard from 16 of its 23 member municipalities "asking for DTSSAB to oversee the creation of one

plan that can be tweaked to meet individual municipal needs."

However, she added, that "DTSSAB has not made any decision as to whether they agree to oversee the creation of the plans or not." She noted, "This is a municipal requirement and not a DTSSAB requirement." An agreement and definition of the roles and the work to be done have yet to be concluded, she pointed out.

At this time, municipalities need to decide if they want to be included in a collective development of a plan, she commented. "Then the municipalities involved would need to work with DTSSAB and any other community partner that would be appropriate to have at the table to establish a pathway formward and etermine who is leading the project. I have suggested that the municipalities should appoint a smaller committee to be the working advisory group for this project who would report back to all municipalities as the plan is developed and when input or consultation is required. There is quite a bit of work that needs to be done at this point."

She also said that due to the pandemic, municipalities may feel they have other priorities at this time.




