Three new cases **COVID-19 confirmed at Young-Davidson mine**

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special/Staff) - Three employees of the Young-Davidson Mine located outside Matachewan have tested positive for COVID-19.

The outbreak connected to the mine was declared November 4 by Dr. Glenn Corneil, acting medical officer of health and CEO of the Timiskaming Health Unit.

In a news release, the health unit said it has been working closely with mine management to ensure all necessary contact tracing is being completed.

It said the mine's management is taking all necessary precautions to reduce the risk of COVID-19 infection and prevent transmission.

The health unit said the three employees all reside primarily outside the district of Timiskaming, and the cases will not be attributed to the district's case count.

The district's official case tally therefore remains at 17.

The outbreak continues to be under investigation, and the health unit said it will provide more information as needed.

It said anyone who has been identified as a local close contact of a positive case has been contacted or will be contacted by public

"Everyone involved in this investigation has provided valuable support," said Corneil.

"COVID-19 can appear quickly in an area at any given time and everyone needs to remain vigilant in order to ensure we do everything we can to reduce the spread of COVID."

The health unit reminded the public to reduce the risk of transmission by physical distancing, mask wearing, frequent hand washing, refraining from gathering in large groups, and limiting non-essential travel.

It advised anyone who is unwell to stay home and contact the local assessment centre in Temiskaming Shores, Englehart, Temagami or Kirkland Lake to schedule a COVID-19 test.


The sites offer a variety of resources for seniors.

Senator to speak on truth and reconciliation

TIMMINS (Special) - Local residents can learn about repairing relationships with Indigenous peoples from the man who headed the national Truth and Reconciliation Commis-

Senator Murray Sinclair will lead an online presentation on truth and reconciliation November 12.

The event is co-hosted by District School Board Ontario North East (ONE) and Northern College.

Sinclair was the first Indigenous judge appointed in Manitoba and the second in Canada.

He was co-commissioner of the Aboriginal Justice Inquiry in Manitoba some three decades ago.

In 2009, he was named chief commissioner of the Truth and Commission, Reconciliation which looked at the history and legacy of Indian Residential Schools. It released its final report in 2015.

Sinclair was appointed to the Senate in 2016.

His presentation will be streamed live and at no charge on November 12, beginning at 6:30 p.m. For further information, go to https://bit.ly/3mw3qsU.

Drivers reminded of less familiar offences

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special/Staff) – Drivers know it's against the law to speed or to use a handheld cellphone while behind the wheel.

But what about the legality of tinted windows?

Temiskaming OPP recently issued a reminder about some less familiar offences under the Highway Traffic Act.

- Tinted windows: No person shall drive on a highway a motor vehicle on which the surface of the windshield or any window to the direct left or right of the driver's seat has been coated with any coloured spray or other coloured or reflective material that substantially obscures the interior of the motor vehicle when viewed from outside the motor vehicle.
- Loud mufflers: It's an offence to have an aftermarket muffler that is loud or to run a

vehicle in such disrepair that the sound of the muffler is loud.

- Licence plates: You must display two plates in a correct manner. They cannot be covered by coloured covers and must be kept clean.
- Trailers: You must be able to provide a permit (ownership) for your trailer. It must be plated, have a secondary means of attachment, and all the lights must be in working order.
- Loads: When transporting items, whether from the local hardware store, to the dump or helping a friend move, your load must be properly secured.
- Trucks: Trucks with large tires must have fenders that extend far enough to cover the tire and mudguards are always required.
- Signs and lights: A stop sign means stop, not roll through it. If you can stop for a yellow

light you must. Flashing yellow lights mean proceed with caution, no stop is required. A flashing red light means the same as a stop sign.

- Lanes: When driving slower than the traffic behind you, pull over to the right lane. Let the other vehicles through to avoid impeding or blocking the normal and reasonable movement of traffic.
- Turning lanes: When entering a turning lane, do so with the intention of turning a short distance away.

Don't drive in the turning lane for lengthy periods of time, knowing that you will eventually be turning. When driving in a lane that has a marked arrow for turning, it is for turning, not for passing other vehicles. Do not remain in a turning lane if you will be going straight.

Essential service

The World Wide Web went live in 1991 and was not received with a great deal of fanfare by the average person at the time.

However, in more modern times the internet, or shall we say a lack of access to the internet, affects everything from where a person can locate a business to whether one can work from home during a pandemic and what entertainment options you have (Netflix, high speed cable) or whether you can successfully learn from a distance.

The internet has moved from a novelty to an essential service, especially for those of us living in Northern rural re-

As landline telephone service becomes more obsolete in favour of cellphone usage, having adequate high-speed internet access is not a luxury, but a necessity in Northern Ontario.

It is crucial that governments realize that land-based internet access is not suited to Northern Ontario and its vast geographic regions.

Recently the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities called on the federal and provincial governments to allow satellite operator Starlink, a satellite service created by American inventor Elon Musk, an operating license.

Satellite service seems to be the viable option for rural areas and it is more imperative than ever that governments treat internet access as a vital service and to do everything in their power to assist in providing this service at reason-

Armstrong to support **Active School Travel** Charter project

EARLTON - Armstrong Township council is throwing its support behind the THU's Active School Travel Charter project.

At the Wednesday, October 28, regular meeting council listened to a presentation on the initiative from Erika Aelterman, who works as a public health promoter for the Timiskaming Health Unit

Aelterman noted that in 2019 the health unit received a \$60,000 grant from Green Communities Canada to offer Active School Travel (AST)

She said in using the funding, the health unit started the project and organized a regional steering committee to support project direction and implementation.

"Our goal with this project is to make walking and cycling to school the norm for many more children in Timiskaming," Aelterman explained.

She said that active travel can be any form of human-powered transportation, such as walking, cycling, skateboarding or using a wheelchair.

"In October 2019 we began working with four private schools, including (École catholique) Assomption, to identify and address areas for walking and cycling to school," Aelterman noted.

"We collected data on student travel loads, parental concerns and attitudes, we also did traffic observations and of the walkability habits of the school zones in the neighbourhood."

Aelterman said that from using all of that data, the health unit worked with the steering committee and the school's parent council to "develop an action plan tailored to their school."

BENEFITS OF ACTIVE TRAVEL

There are health benefits associated with active school travel, which Aelterman said has been found through research.

"Children who walk or cycle to school get on average 17 more minutes of physical activity per day than their bused or driven counterparts," she

"They also experience improved mental and emotional well-being, as well as better concentration in class leading to stronger grades. The more kids walk, the less parents are driving and there's less traffic at bell times, making school zones safer for everybody."

Aelterman also added that by improving walking and cycling routes to school, it "enhances the safety, mobility and quality of life for the community as a whole."

CHARTER

Aelterman said that the charter itself is built upon the statement of principles that recognizes the value of active travel to school.

She says the charter is not legally binding but that it "really serves to guide school boards, municipalities, busing and other project partners to consider how their activities and decisions might encourage active travel.

"The charter development was initiated by our project steering committee this past February and involved consultation with all four school boards, busing, our municipal acts as well as the MTO."

Aelterman said that the first guiding principle is focused on building walking and cycling into the school and community culture.

"This encourages everyone to get more active," she reasoned.

To make that happen, she said that Armstrong could support the development and implementation of school travel plans in all schools. Council can also provide a representative to sit on the regional steering committee, which Aelterman noted currently is Mayor Jean Marc Boileau, to provide a voice and direction on travel issues in the community.

"The town can also consider how their various encourage active travel," Aelterman said.

When it comes to making sure students are able to get to school safely and enjoy the benefits of active travel, Aelterman said that everybody has an important role to play.

"Getting home students, whether they are walking, biking to school, it needs the municipality, school and the community to work together," she stressed.

"To support this, the town can work with the school and project partners to find solutions to safety concerns in the school neighbourhood. For example in Earlton, this might include continuing the crosswalk, adding school zone signage, or assessing the speed limit and using different traffic calming tools."

Aelterman said the township could also work with staff at the THU to find and apply for funding to support safer routes and promote active travel in general in the community.

She noted that Armstrong Township is well positioned to promote active travel as a "safe and healthy way to get around in the community."

She says Armstrong is committed to supporting active travel in its official plan, with records to promote all travel modes.

Aelterman noted that the Active School Travel Charter project had already received endorsement from all four school boards in the district and the THU Board of Health. It also secured endorsement from Englehart town council on October 28.

Armstrong council voted unanimously to endorse the project and will support it moving for-



Of note, Englehart Area Artists Berdina Beaven and Lionel Venne also had their work accepted into the 2020 Juried Show.





Province pledges new Hwy. 11/64 rest stop

THUNDER BAY (Special/Staff) - A new roadside rest stop in the Temiskaming area is part of a multi-year plan to add and upgrade pull-off areas in Northern Ontario.

In a news release, the province said a new rest area/pull-off area will be built at Highway 11 and Highway 64 south of Temagami.

The estimated completion date is 2023.

It's one of four new rest areas and 10 existing locations in the North that will be repaired or expanded over the next five years.

"In these extraordinary times, we recognize that there is a significant need for better facilities at rest areas in Northern Ontario for our province's travellers and truck drivers," said Transportation Minister Caroline Mulroney in a news release announcing the up-

"Building more rest areas with better facilities will make travelling safer and more comfortable, especially for those who need to drive long distances.

"Through these improvements we are also taking steps to raise awareness of human trafficking to help put an end to this serious problem."

The anti-trafficking efforts the province said it's exploring for rest areas include improved lighting, security cameras, and posting information about resources such as a support hotline.

There are about 200 rest areas across Ontario.

In announcing the upgrades, the province said research confirms that driver fatigue contributes to a "significant number" of truck collisions.

Providing more opportunities for trucks and other vehicles to stop and safely park so drivers can rest will help keep Ontario's roads among the safest in North America, it said.

To support the trucking industry in particular, it said it has provided portable washrooms at 32 truck inspection stations. It said parking and washrooms remain available at all 23 ONroute travel plazas on highways 400 and 401.

Move over to the right lane when safe to do so and make sure to signal your intention to change lanes.

• Move over for emergency vehicles: Slow down and move over if you see an emergency vehicle with its lights flashing.

If the emergency vehicle is stopped on the side of the highway and on the same side of the highway as you're driving, slow down and pass with caution. If the road has two or more lanes, move over to allow for emergency vehicles to pass safely.

In a press release highlighting some of the offences seldom discussed, Temiskaming OPP say drivers are responsible for ensuring they follow the rules of the road.

"Whether it's maintaining your vehicle or knowing the rules for the type of vehicle you drive on Ontario highways, it all comes down to responsibility. Ignorance of the law is no excuse," police






