Hilliardton Marsh prepares to open to the public

HILLIARD TOWNSHIP — There is nothing more exciting for some folks than holding a bird in the hand and learning about its characteristics and habitat.

The Hilliardton Marsh Research and Education Centre (HMREC) is preparing to open its bird banding station to the public for visits in August as the fall songbird migration begins.

HMREC offers school groups and the general public a fun, educational experience to learn about birds and the importance of wetlands.

Visitors will be asked to abide by COVID-19 protocols

of wearing masks and go through a COVID screening upon arrival.

The Marsh volunteers band birds in the spring when thousands of birds flock to the Boreal forest to nest and raise their young during springtime, and on their return in the fall to southern destinations that could include places in the U.S., Mexico and South America in the fall.

Owl banding will be scheduled on pre-set dates during the months of September and October.

The owl banding visits must be booked through the HMREC website at thehilliardton-marsh.com and will become

available in early August.

Spring songbird migration banding took place slightly earlier this year because of an early spring, but generally takes place beginning May 1 to mid-June on weekdays and Saturday mornings from

8 a.m. to 11 a.m.

The fall songbird migration banding takes place from August 1 to August 30 on weekdays and Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 11 p.m.

Private bookings are available during this time.

Northern Ontario is a land of lakes and so it makes sense that people know how to swim and that they take safety precautions around water.

COVID-19 has increased the popularity of being on the water, unfortunately there are those who may not have the skills or safety information required to be safe.

Experts say preparation is the key to water safety, including making a plan about what to do in case of emergency including wearing life jackets, even for strong swimmers.

The Canadian Red Cross says it is a good idea to swim in areas

where there are lifeguards.

Police advise boaters to read the Safe Boating Guides and make sure all safety gear is working and for boaters to avoid drugs or alcohol while on the water.

A report by the World Health Organization (WHO) says drowning is one of the leading causes of death in children worldwide.

As more people head to the beach to cool off during the summer heat wave, crowded beaches may present a false image of safety. With more people working from home trying to supervise kids, experts worry backyard pool drownings could spike.

Always keep a close eye on children around water.

privilege of travelling over their traditional territory.

I took a nap under a big white pine tree and thought I had died and gone to heaven.

When I awoke I came face to face with an eastern garter snake eyeing up the woman who had invaded its island paradise.

I forget there was a moment before or after that and that feeling is what I have been craving.

In all of my bliss, I had a nasty experience with an allergic reaction when welts the size of quarters developed all over my body.

This left me with no alternative but to cut my trip short.

But in between the time I pushed off from the shore in a canoe I rented from some amazing folks in Temagami, until I hit my campsite, and back, it was all so beautiful.

And as I paddled back down the glass-like lake in the early morning hours I thought of this Mary Oliver quote: “It is a serious thing...just to be alive, on this fresh morning, in this broken world.”

Many people miss out on themselves as they rush through life.

Our minds have been programmed to absorb all kinds of useless information, but to know the world you have to live in the world.

To know nature you have to experience nature.

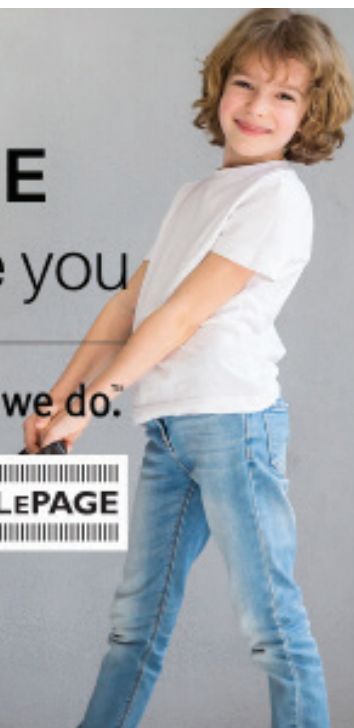

Former Sault Ste. Marie residential school named historic site

OTTAWA (Special) – Amid the continued discoveries of unmarked graves at former Indian residential schools, the federal government is formally recognizing an institution in Sault Ste. Marie.

Shingwauk Indian Residential School, which operated for almost a century, a national historic site.

“We have had a painful reminder recently, with the location of unmarked graves at the former Kamloops, Marieval,

and other residential schools, that the residential school system is a tragic and shameful period in Canada’s history that continues to have profound impacts to this day,” said Jonathan Wilkinson, the minister responsible for Parks Canada, in a news release.

As one of the few remaining residential school buildings in Canada, the former Shingwauk school “stands as a testament to its impact on survivors, their families and the community,” Wilkinson continued.

The government is “acknowledging the past and, in collaboration with Indigenous peoples and communities, is committed to sharing the experiences of Indigenous children in these schools to ensure that this history is remembered and these stories are told.”

“As we move forward in this important time, with this important story, the story of so many survivors and inter-generational survivors, and sadly, those who never made it home, we believe the national recognition of the Shingwauk site will help preserve that story, so it is never lost,” said Jay Jones, president of the Children of Shingwauk Alumni Association, in the release.

HISTORY

The former Shingwauk (pronounced “Zhing-waak”) Indian Residential School is located on Robinson-Huron Treaty territory within the traditional homelands of Anishinaabe and Métis peoples.

From 1875 to 1970, more

than a thousand Indigenous children from Ontario, Quebec, the Prairies, and the Northwest Territories attended the Shingwauk school.

The federal government describes it as one of the few locations where a number of preserved built and landscape elements continue to testify to the long history of the residential school system in Canada.

The Shingwauk Cemetery contains 109 known burials, including 72 students who died between 1875 and 1956.

Since the institution’s closure, its site and main building (Shingwauk Hall) have been used for cultural reclamation, cross-cultural education and learning, and reinterpreted as a place for healing and reconciliation.

The former residential school property encompasses the present campus of Shin-

gawauk Kinooamaage Gamig and Algoma University.

The government described the national historic site designations a response to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

Specifically, it referred to Call to Action number 79. It includes the development and implementation of a plan to commemorate residential school sites, their history and legacy, and the contribution of Aboriginal peoples to Canada’s history.

A second location, the former Muscowequan residential school in Saskatchewan, was also awarded national historic designation earlier this month.

They join the first school sites named almost a year ago – the former Shubenacadie school in Nova Scotia and the former Portage LaPrairie school in Manitoba.

Melanoma Skin Cancer Awareness

Melanoma skin cancer often starts as an abnormal mole on the skin. A mole is a common non-cancerous growth. It’s normally a small, round, or oval spot that is usually brown, tan or pink. It may be raised or flat. Melanoma is most frequently found on the back of men and on the back and legs of women. It is the least common, but most serious, type of skin cancer.

Risk Factors:

- Personal or family history of melanoma.
- Presence of moles--especially if there are many, or if they are unusual or large.
- Sun sensitivity--sun burning easily, or difficulty tanning.
- Light colored skin, eyes, and hair.
- History of excessive sun exposure.
- Diseases that suppress the immune system.
- Occupational exposure to coal tar, pitch, creosote, arsenic compounds, or radium.

The ABCDE rule below can help you look for the common signs and symptoms of melanoma skin cancer:

A is for asymmetry – one half of a mole does not have the same shape as the other half.

B is for border – the edge of a mole is uneven (irregular). It can look jagged, notched, or blurry. The colour may spread into the area around the mole.

C is for colour – the colour of a mole is not the same throughout. It could have shades of tan, brown and black. Sometimes areas of blue, grey, red, pink, or white are also seen.

D is for diameter – the size of a mole is larger than 6mm (1/4 inch) across, which is about the size of a pencil eraser.

E is for evolving – there is a change in the colour, size, shape or feel of the mole. The mole may become itchy or you may have a burning or tingling feeling.

Other signs and symptoms of melanoma skin cancer include:

- an area that does not heal
- a mole or sore that oozes or bleeds
- broken skin with an open wound (ulceration)

Melanoma is an aggressive form of cancer that can be life-threatening. Schedule an appointment with your primary care provider if you have any of these skin changes.

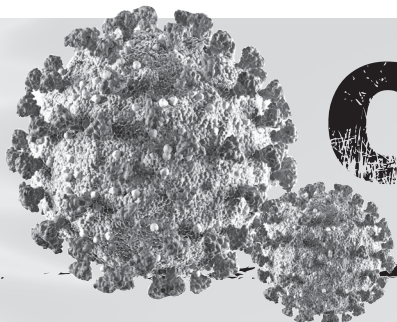

Firefighter training on rescuing animals left in vehicles

TORONTO (Special) – New online training is available for firefighters who may be called upon to rescue animals left in hot – or cold – vehicles.

The free half-hour online training module was developed by staff of the Ontario Ministry of the Solicitor General and was recently released through the Office of the Fire Marshal.

It covers the risks of heat stroke, hypothermia and frostbite to animals left in motor vehicles, how to recognize the signs of distress, and how to relieve them.

The course covers the legislative authority and protection provided to firefighters who take action under the Fire Protection and Prevention Act. But it also notes that municipal councils set the levels of fire protection services their departments will offer, and may opt to include the rescue of animals in vehicles.

If someone is concerned that an animal may be in danger, “they should call 911 immediately as it is an emergency,” writes Solicitor General Sylvia Jones in a recent letter to municipal councils.

“Members of the public are not encouraged to enter a vehicle in these situations,” Jones said.
