# Over the limit

### Tracking speeding, sign by sign

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff) - A small sign can produce big data.

A mobile speed sign recently installed on Lakeshore at Radley Hill Road found that almost 80 per cent of the vehicles heading north into New Liskeard were over the speed limit.

The information was presented to a meeting of Temiskaming Shores' public works committee in mid-June, and will also be shared with the Temiskaming Ontario Provincial Police.

The city purchased the mobile speed indicator sign earlier this year in an effort to combat speeding.

The sign flashes a motorist's speed the council table. as the driver approaches it. Because it's mobile, it can be installed at trouble spots around the municipal-

The data from the Lakeshore Road location, where the speed limit drops from 80 km/h to 50 km/h, was collected from 22,321 vehicles.

Just under 80 per cent, or 17,833, were detected to be violating speed

Concerns over safety and speeding in several areas around the municipality have recently been brought to

Proposed remedies have included lower speed limits, the elimination of traffic lanes, the installation of turning lanes, and the addition of pedestrian crosswalks.

At the same June 16 meeting, the public works committee reviewed the number of speed limits within the municipality. It found there are six, when there should ideally be no more than three.

The map is to be circulated to city staff and the Timiskaming District Road Safety Coalition for feedback.

Based on additional response, the committee said it may consider recommending to council that the speed limit on Lakeshore Road between Haileybury and New Liskeard be lowered to 60 km/h.

The committee is also investigating the possibility of installing raised crosswalks at various locations as traffic calming measures.

At an elevated crosswalk, the road ramps upwards on either side of the crossing, making pedestrians more visible to oncoming vehicles.



We must continue to encourage the unvaccinated to vaccinate.


Many school-aged children will be returning to class this fall and so far, the under 17 age group largely won't be vaccinated.

# Tribute to a mother loon

She sat patiently for almost a month on her nest of two eggs, through some challenging times of wind, torrential rain, thunder, lightning, fireworks, intense heat and people in her face with cellphones.

Such was the case at Bass Lake in Coleman Township when a mother loon nested in a marshy section between the first and second beach.

I'd been observing her and her mate since the spring as they sought nesting sites around the lake.

Cottagers and visitors alike all happily observed the mother loon faithfully sitting on her nest.

We were all cheering for the loons to have a successful hatch. It had been 2016 since a loon chick was raised on the lake.

Oddly enough, Momma loon chose one of the busiest places on the lake as her nesting site, the public beach area.

I think she sensed that predators were less likely to raid the nest of her precious eggs near a place where humans were.

I would often swim and canoe past her nest calling softly to her. I felt like I was her midwife watching over the incubation of her eggs.

But sadly, on the morning of July 21, a predator dragged her off the nest and killed her.

Nature can be incredibly beautiful and wickedly cruel at the same time.

Campground manager Dan Hackett found her that morning and gave her a proper burial away from the campground.

This created another issue with the two eggs now vulnerable to the predator, who was surely intent on getting the eggs in the first place.

Cobalt resident Mita Gibson kindly stepped in and called the Woodlands Wildlife Sanctuary in Minden to see if they could help hatch the eggs.

She drove to North Bay and turned over the two precious eggs to them.

A miracle occurred on the morning of July 22 when at 6:30 a.m. one baby loon hatched, but the second chick did not survive.

The loon chick is now eating minnows and happily swimming in a pool at the sanctuary.

Eerily, the day after the mother loon died, upwards of 11 loons appeared on the lake. It looked to me like they were in mourning and holding a memorial for her. Did they arrive to comfort the daddy loon also? He wailed and wailed for days on end and repeatedly came to the empty nest looking for her. It sent shivers down my spine and brought tears to me eyes.

However, this story ended in triumph thanks to some big-hearted people who understand all living things deserve respect and protection.

As we break away from the screens that dominate our lives, we could all learn a lesson or two from our loon friends about devotion and unconditional love.

**Reminder:** Open air burning is considered to be any fire set outside, other than a small confined fire for obtaining warmth and cooking. Small confined fires for cooking and warmth, that comply with the regulations and are contained to your own property, or a property in which an individual has permission to use, are exempt from requiring a Fire Permit under the Open Air Burning By-law. No. 13-23. There are size limits, clearance requirements, and provisions respecting fire control measures that you must have in place, if you decide to burn.

# Home Fire Safety Checklist



#### Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Alarms

- ☐ Install working smoke alarms on **every storey** of the home and outside all sleeping areas. Install carbon monoxide alarms outside all sleeping areas. It's the law.
- For extra protection, install a smoke alarm in every bedroom and a carbon monoxide alarm on every storey.
- ☐ Test your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms once a month.
- ☐ Change alarm batteries annually or whenever the low-battery warning sounds.
- ☐ Always follow the manufacturer's instructions for installing, testing, maintaining and replacing smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.

#### Home Fire Escape Planning

- ☐ Develop a home fire escape plan and practice it with the entire family.
- each room, if possible.
- ☐ Determine who will be responsible for helping young children, older adults or anyone else that may need assistance when escaping.
- ☐ Choose a **meeting place** outside, such as a tree or lamp post, where everyone can be accounted for.
- ☐ Call the fire department from outside the home, from a cell phone or neighbour's home.
- Once out, stay out. *Never* re-enter a burning
- Make sure exit doors and windows open easily and are kept clear of obstructions.

#### **Cooking Fire Safety**

- ☐ Always stay in the kitchen and stay alert when cooking.
- ☐ Keep anything that can catch fire—oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains—away from your stovetop.
- ☐ Keep a proper fitting pot lid near the stove when cooking. If a pot catches fire slide the lid over the pot and turn off the stove. Do not move the pot.
- ☐ Wear tight-fitting or rolled up sleeves when using the stove. Loose dangling clothing can easily catch fire. If your clothing catches fire, stop, drop to the ground and roll over and over to put out the fire.

#### Other Things to Consider to Prevent **Fire in Your Home**

- ☐ Keep matches and lighters out of the sight and reach of children.
- ☐ Always **blow out candles** before leaving the room.
- ☐ If anyone in the home smokes, **smoke outside**.
- ☐ Ensure items that can burn are **one metre** away from space heaters.



# First Cobalt continues to progress on refinery

NORTH COBALT (Special) -First Cobalt Corp. says it is on track with its cobalt refinery in Temiskaming Shores. It will be the only refiner of battery-grade cobalt sulfate in North America and the second largest outside of China, the company reports.

"Being located in Canada's largest mining and mineral processing corridor has allowed us to build a strong project team,

most of whom are local and will remain with First Cobalt through commissioning and into operations," said project development vice president Mark Trevisiol in a press re-

"We continue to build the refinery expansion utilizing much of the existing physical asset. The equipment and processes

# Planting a plan for two billion trees

DISTRICT (Special) - There is no path to net-zero emissions that does not involve Canada's forests. Planting trees is a natural climate solution that removes and stores carbon from the atmosphere while providing other benefits such as better air and water quality, particularly in urban settings, and decreases risk of wildland fire to rural communities and supports biodiversity. It also provides spaces for recreational opportunities that improve our wellbeing and our connection to nature.

The Two Billion Trees program continues efforts to advance tree planting as an important part of the solution to climate change. Canada's plan to plant two billion trees is projected to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by up to 12 megatonnes annually by 2050. It will create up to 4,300 green jobs.

Natural Resources Canada is implementing this plan with support from Environment and Climate Change Canada and Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada. The Two Billion Trees program represents a 40 per cent increase in the number of trees typically planted over a decade and will see trees planted in both urban and rural areas across the country.

In 10 years, the new trees will cover the equivalent of over 1.1 million hectares, an area twice the size of Prince Edward Island.

# First Cobalt continues to progress on refinery

Continued from 10 selected are designed around our feedstock using known chemical processing methods employed in various other refining operations around the world," he continued.

First Cobalt president and CEO Trent Mell commented, "This is the first major battery-grade cobalt sulfate refinery to be built outside China in over 20 years, so this is not only an exciting project for us but also for the western battery supply chain. Cobalt prices are up more than 20 per cent over the past four weeks and we are witnessing stronger interest in offtake contracts as the battery supply chain shifts its focus from Europe to new investments in North America."

Procurement, detailed engineering and additional metallurgical test work are ongoing, the company reported. Boart Longyear carried out a 10-day drilling program to collect geotechnical information for design of the foundations for the new solvent extraction building and the cobalt sulfate crystallizer.

Contractors are onsite to inspect and perform maintenance on the electric power supply systems, to remove chemicals that will not be required for restart of the refinery, and a four-person diving crew inspected existing lake water intake screening which feeds the main supply water pumping and piping network to the refinery.

Two additional employees have been hired and will be working alongside EPCM contractor Ausenco Engineering Canada. A health, safety and logistics superintendent and a health, safety, environment and training coordinator have been hired. Both are local residents and are expected to transition to the operations leadership team once the refinery has been commissioned, the company stated in its press release. Addi-

tional team members will be recruited in the coming months.

The planned US\$45 million debt facility is in the due diligence phase and combined with current working capital and committed government investments, is expected to supply the remaining funding required to bring the project to completion, the press release continued. The company has \$14 million in working capital, in addition to \$10 million in federal and provincial funding commitments.

Preliminary discussions have been held with government officials on the creation of a Battery Park on site.

First Cobalt envisions refining nickel and cobalt, in addition to recycling black mass from spent lithium-ion batteries. Hydrometallurgical test work conducted by SGS on black mass samples resulted in high recoveries of both cobalt and nickel. All three feed types could be refined into battery materials using First Cobalt's hydrometallurgical process and expertise, the company added. An integrated refining operation will help attract a precursor manufacturer to establish operations on site. Precursor manufacturing is the final step in chemical processing prior to the battery being mechanically fitted within a cathode and anode casing for electric vehicles. The mutual advantages for an integrated approach include lower operating costs, lower logistics costs and a smaller environmental footprint, the company stated in its press release.

The First Cobalt Refinery operated from 1996 to 2015, producing cobalt, nickel, copper and silver products. The company is expanding the facility and modifying the flow sheet to refine third party cobalt hydroxide intermediate product into a high purity, battery grade cobalt sulfate suitable for the electric vehicle market.



## **Clarification** sought on camper trailers on residential lots

COLEMAN TOWNSHIP (Staff) - Coleman Township council will be looking at its property standards bylaw.



Municipal bylaw enforcement officer Pete Gilboe pointed out to council how vague its bylaw is when it comes to using travel trailers or camper trailers as living accommodations on properties zoned residential.

He was speaking at the council's July 12 meeting.

"In my opinion the bylaw as you have it written is very ambiguous," he said.

The bylaw states that a travel trailer or camper trailer may be used temporarily as a residence or cottage. Then, it states that while a permanent residence is being constructed, the travel trailer or camper trailer can be used temporarily as a residence.

"The first part seems to suggest that travel trailers may be used temporarily as a residence or cottage and you can do it seasonally forever more," said Gilboe.

"I don't know if that was the intent or that wording needs to be cleaned up a little bit."

Mayor Dan Cleroux replied that council would have its chief administrative officer Patrick Cormier bring council a recommendation for some new word-

The matter will be moved to the next council meeting for discussion.
