# Charlton celebrating with a bang

CHARLTON-DACK - Things are shaping up for a day of fun-filled activities in Charlton on September 4, culminating in a fireworks display by Northstar Fireworks of Waterloo, Ontario.

Councillors Sandra Parkin, Jim Huff, municipal chief administrative officer Dan Thibeault and deputy clerk-treasurer Gisele Belanger have been organizing the event which will be centred at the Legion hall parking lot and nearby waterfront. There will also be a grand opening ceremony for the upgraded beach park which has recently had a new playground set added, thanks to the donation of the Charlton-Englehart Lions Club. The municipality is also hoping to hold a grand opening ceremony for the rink which has been undergoing reconstruction after it collapsed under a heavy snowfall in early 2019.

Running from 2 p.m. to 7 p.m. there will be many activities at the waterfront September 4 including live music at the waterfront, inflatables, food, and free hot dogs courtesy of the municipality.

The fireworks are scheduled for 8:30 that night.

COVID-19 guidelines will be observed throughout the day.

The fireworks display ordinarily held on Canada Day was postponed due to COVID-19 restrictions and a new date set for September 4. With a budget of \$20,000, "it should be a dandy," said Reeve Merrill Bond in a telephone interview.

Social distancing will be observed, and the municipality is encouraging people to wear masks, said Parkin. Regulations could be subject to change, and

# Haileybury museum taking new look at the past

**TEMISKAMING SHORES** – The Haileybury Heritage Museum has been closed for almost two years.

But the pandemic-forced shutdown has enabled the museum to hit “refresh.”

It turned into “a great opportunity for us to get everything torn apart,” said Curt Arthur, vice-chair of the museum board, in a recent interview.

Outside, the roof has been replaced.

And inside, an office at the entrance has been turned into a book and gift shop named for the late historian and writer Peter Fancy.

The kitchen in the west end that houses a streetcar-turned-home for survivors of the 1922 fire has been removed.

Arthur said the space will house a model train exhibit recreating the route from Cobalt through Haileybury to New Liskeard.

Lumber to build the base is now on site.

He's inviting model train enthusiasts and builders of miniatures to get on board a new club that will work on the exhibit.

It will feature local landmarks and some fun elements. “Thomas the Tank Engine never drove between New Liskeard and Cobalt, but he will now,” he said.


The museum's entrance gallery has also been redesigned, based on input from its summer staff.

The four students hired under provincial and federal student employment programs were encouraged “to take a look at the museum through their eyes,” explained Arthur.

They represent, he said, future visitors to the museum.

It has the feel of a railway waiting room, which suits a display focusing on the modes of transportation and their role in opening the North to outside settlement.

One section of the gallery focuses on Indigenous history, and includes a small collec-

tion of Arctic artifacts from a donor with ties to the area.

But Arthur said the museum wants to expand the exhibit, with input from local First Nations and Métis groups and a focus on reconciliation. Other displays look at the founding of Haileybury and

# Electors encouraged to register online

TORONTO (Special) - Registering for the federal election online is being made possible for electors.

Electors can register or check their registration online.

To vote in the federal election, electors must be registered at their current address.

Electors can use Elections Canada's Online Voter Registration Service to register, check their registration or update their address. Given the current pandemic, Elections Canada strongly encourages electors to take advantage of its online services. Electors can also contact the Elections Canada office in their riding or call 1-800-463-6868 for more information.

Elections Canada will mail a voter information card to all registered electors. The vast majority of electors are already correctly registered and will receive a voter information card by the first day of advance polls on September 10, though there may be delays, depending on when polling locations are identified. "We encourage electors to use our Online Voter Registration Service. By registering, checking and updating their information early, electors will be sure to get a voter information card. Because of the pandemic, we may be using non-traditional polling locations. The voter information card will give electors all the information they need to plan their safe voting experience," says Chief Electoral Officer Stéphane Perreault.

# Election signs

With the federal election well underway, election signs are popping up across our region.

It didn't take long for the various political parties fielding candidates in the September 20 federal election to place their election signs around the South Temiskaming region.

Election signs are costly and most candidates running for political office don't have huge resources to draw upon for things like election literature.

Political advertising is anything that can be seen, heard or read promoting a candidate.

If you see an election sign that you don't particularly like on public property, do not remove it, but rather contact your municipality and find out the bylaws pertaining to election sign placements.

However, you are entitled to remove unwelcome election signs on your own private property.

Simply contact the party and tell them you have one of their signs

This is common courtesy.

If someone chooses to destroy or deface an election sign at an approved location, this is a criminal offence.

If you are unsure about an election sign placement, contact Elections Ontario and ask about the rules governing election signage.

Or you can contact the political party named on the sign to find out why the sign was placed in that location.

You cannot however remove or deface election signs, no matter what political party you favour.

Election signs are subject to the Canada Elections Act and local municipal bylaws.

Election signs can be placed on private property so long as the homeowner has given the political party permission to do so.

If someone wishes to have an election sign placed at their home they need only contact the political party they favour.

Please give all the election candidates your full respect as they work hard to have their voices heard before September 20.

**Council Meetings:** Council meetings will be going back to the regular schedule of every 2 weeks beginning in September. Monday, September 6, 2021 is Labour Day and the office will be closed. The next Regular Council meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 7, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. Details of the meeting will be posted in advance of the meeting. Anyone interested in attending the meeting can call the Office to register as there is a capacity limit for indoor gatherings.

**Municipal Office:** The Office is open to in-person transactions with limitations. 1 person or members of the same household are allowed in the reception area at a time to access services. This will allow staff an opportunity to disinfect between customers in accordance with Public Health Guidelines. The Province is in Step 3 of the Roadmap to Reopen on July 16, 2021. Additional information regarding the Roadmap to Reopen can be found on the Province's website at <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/public-health-measures>. The Township continues to encourage the use of internet payments through your financial institution, or by mailing cheques to the Municipal office. Residents can call the office at 705-679-8833 for assistance.

**Municipal Waste Site:** Hours of Operation Tuesday and Saturday - 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Closed: Statutory Holidays

All garbage deposited at the Municipal Waste Site is subject to applicable tipping fees.

**Garbage:** A maximum of three (3) regular sized garbage bags of household garbage will be picked-up weekly. Please ensure your garbage is out by 7 am.

**Fall Amnesty Week:** Landfill Site: The amnesty program (no tipping fees) at the Coleman Landfill site will occur from **Tuesday, September 7 to Saturday, September 11, 2021 from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.** Vehicle access within the landfill site will be restricted to support physical distancing. Names and addresses from those depositing material will be required.

Curbside Collection: Collection of bulky items will occur from **Wednesday, September 8 to Friday, September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021.** Please have waste set out for collection no later than 7:00 a.m. on September 8, 2021; no return trips will be made.

- All small or loose materials must be securely bagged or bundled/tied appropriately to facilitate efficient collection.
- No brush or construction material will be

collected.

- As outlined in the Clean Yards By-law, No. 12-06, no Freon containing appliances will be collected, unless the Freon Gas was removed by a qualified technician and the appliance is tagged.

**Recycling:** The next collection date is on Tuesday, September 7, 2021.

**Building Permits** are required for all construction in the Township of Coleman. Please allow sufficient processing time for your application.

**By-law Enforcement:** To report a property standards issue or if you want to report some illegal dumping or other by-law infraction, please contact the municipal office or Pete Gilboe directly at 705-648-3750.

**Animal Control:** For emergency animal control services, please contact the Animal Control Service Provider at 705-648-4583.

**Burning Permits - Reminder:** No fire permits for open air burning will be issued during the months of July and August. Burning permits can be applied for on our website at <https://www.colemantownship.ca/fire-permit-application/>. Burning permits are required for burning during the months of September and October.

**Reminder:** Open air burning is considered to be any fire set outside, other than a small confined fire for obtaining warmth and cooking. Small confined fires for cooking and warmth, that comply with the regulations and are contained to your own property, or a property in which an individual has permission to use, are exempt from requiring a Fire Permit under the Open Air Burning By-law, No. 13-23. There are size limits, clearance requirements, and provisions respecting fire control measures

that you must have in place, if you decide to burn.

**Water Conservation Notice:** Coleman Residents connected to the water system are asked to conserve water to facilitate improvements to the Town of Cobalt's water tower. The Town of Cobalt will begin repairs to the Water Tower on August 23, 2021. These repairs are anticipated to take a minimum of 2 weeks. All municipal water supply customers are asked to exercise good water conservation practices during this time. These practices are imperative to maintain adequate water levels to deal with emergencies, including fire protection.

Ways to conserve water outdoors:

- Discontinue all non-essential outdoor water use—for example, cleaning driveways or decks, watering lawn or washing cars.

Ways to conserve water indoors:

- Keep a supply of drinking water in the refrigerator rather than running the tap until the water turns cold.
- Use your dishwasher and washing machine only when there are full loads.
- Turn the water off while brushing your teeth.
- Install water saving shower heads and faucets.
- Check for leaks and fix them.
- Make sure that faucets are turned off tightly to prevent dripping.

Special efforts are being made to maintain normal water service during this program, however, some residents may experience pressure fluctuations. Thank you for your assistance and we apologize for the inconvenience.

# Hydro One: smart devices are smart investments

DISTRICT (Special) - Hydro One recently announced that it is investing in a smarter, more reliable electricity system by installing smart devices on its system.

These devices will help reduce the impact of power outages by an average of approximately 40 per cent in areas where they are deployed. This is part of Hydro One's grid modernization program, which leverages digital technology including smart switches and sensors to automate the electricity system and improve power reliability.

Since implementing the program in 2018, Hydro One has added more than 2,300 smart devices to its system, with plans to install approximately 500 devices this year. Energizing these smart devices in communities across the province has avoided 20 million customer minutes of power interruptions, says the electricity provider. Currently, smart devices are deployed in 10 per cent of Hydro One's service territory.

"Storms are getting stronger and we need to be ready to respond to power outages faster and smarter than before. Our grid modernization program leverages digital solutions to reduce the number and duration of power outages, minimizing disruptions to the daily lives of customers, businesses and communities," said David Lebeter, chief operating officer at Hydro One in a June 28 release announcing the devices.

"By investing in this new technology, we are building a grid for the future that will serve our customers better and strengthen Ontario's economy."

"Hydro One's modernization initiative is a critical step in building a smarter power grid that benefits electricity ratepayers," said Todd Smith, Minister of Energy.

"Using the newest technology to build a smarter grid will ensure Ontarians have access to an efficient, clean and reliable

# Anxiety in Children

Does any of this sound like your child or teen?

- Clinging, crying and/or tantrums when you separate
- Excessive shyness, avoiding social situations
- Constant worry
- Avoiding situations or places because of fears
- Complaints of frequent stomach aches or headaches
- Experiencing sudden and frequent panic attacks

If you answered yes to any of these statements your child may be experiencing anxiety.

**As a parent of an anxious child, you are not alone.**

Anxiety is one of the most common mental health concerns for children and adults, affecting upwards of 20% of children and adolescents over the lifespan. Anxious youth are often quiet and well behaved, and thus frequently go unnoticed by their parents, teachers, and coaches. Alternatively, others can be disruptive and act out, being labeled as having attention deficit disorder or being a "bad" kid. Both scenarios result in children failing to receive the help they desperately need. Sadly, untreated anxiety can lead to depression, missed opportunities in career and relationships, increased substance use, and a decreased quality of life.

**Pointers for Helping Children Escape the Cycle of Anxiety**

1. **The goal is not to eliminate anxiety, but to help a child manage it**

The best way to help kids overcome anxiety isn't to try to remove stressors that trigger it. It's to help them learn to tolerate their anxiety and function as well as they can, even when they're anxious.

2. **Don't avoid things just because they make a child anxious**

Helping children avoid the things they are afraid of will make them feel better in the short term, but it reinforces the anxiety over the long run. If a child in an uncomfortable situation gets upset, starts to cry and her parents whisk her out of there, or remove the thing she's afraid of, she's learned that coping mechanism, and that cycle has the potential to repeat itself.

3. **Express positive but realistic expectations**

You can't promise a child that his fears are unrealistic but you can express confidence that he's going to be okay, he will be able to manage it, and that, as he faces his fears, the anxiety level will drop over time. This gives him confidence that your expectations are realistic, and that you're not going to ask him to do something he can't handle.

# Support for ongoing virtual health care

TORONTO (Special) - According to a recent survey conducted for Canada Health Infoway and the Canadian Medical Association, almost all Canadian physicians say they will continue to use virtual care after the pandemic, and 64 percent say they will maintain or increase their use.

The survey was conducted online in April and May with more than 2,000 physicians - general practitioners/family physicians, specialists and residents.

Ninety-four percent of physicians said they currently use virtual care, with 93 percent offering telephone visits, 51 percent offering video visits, 36 percent offering email/messaging and five percent offering remote patient/home health monitoring. More than 70

percent believe virtual care improves patient access and enables quality care and efficient care for their patients.

Seven out of ten were satisfied with telephone/video and about 50 percent were satisfied with email/messaging and remote monitoring. More than 70 percent said they have the knowledge and skills needed to use virtual care, are satisfied with time spent with patients, and found it easy to integrate into their workflow.

In addition, 93 percent of GPs are now using electronic medical records, up from 86 percent in 2019.

"It's clear from these findings that virtual care is here to stay in Canada," said Infoway president and CEO Michael Green. "Physicians are satisfied with it and they recognize the benefits

to their patients and their practice. It's also good to see that almost all GPs are using EMRs, which can really help enable virtual care."

CMA president Dr. Ann Collins stated, "The use of virtual care has increased greatly since the beginning of the pandemic but work is still required to ensure quality care and equitable access. We still have work to do such as creating national licensure, developing quality standards, addressing interoperability as well as ensuring digital health literacy, education and training. These are crucial elements to the successful integration of virtual care into our health care system and should be part of our post-pandemic roadmap."

The survey also found that physicians believe some patients may need

additional support to access virtual care. In particular, they mentioned patients with: low levels of technology literacy, disabilities, language barriers, low incomes, chronic conditions, and those who are from remote locations and Indigenous communities. "We will continue to collaborate with the CMA, governments and other health system stakeholders, including patients, to overcome any barriers associated with virtual care," Green said. Infoway is developing programs to address digital health literacy and clinician change management and we are enhancing our work on interoperability and standards. Together, we can ensure that virtual care is effectively integrated into the health care system and that all Canadians have equitable access to it."

## Additional communication tower proposed for Earlington

ARMSTRONG TOWNSHIP - At its next council meeting on September 8, Armstrong Township will consider an agreement to allow Quantum Xpress to install an additional communication tower in Earlington.

The tower, which is slightly taller than the one already in downtown Earlington, "will bring additional internet capacity for future packages," Quantum Xpress owner Patrick Miron stated in a telephone interview.

Parolink is a division of Quantum Xpress.

Miron was present at Armstrong's August 11 council meeting and asked for a ten-year contract and permission to install the tower near the municipal garage site at 90 11th Street.

The objective is to have more bandwidth in Earlington, he said.

Having the larger tower "is a key component to have that happen," he said.

Miron requested a ten-year agreement due to the increased investment he is making in installing the larger tower.

The company has the gear to erect the tower

and only require the township's signature to go ahead, Miron stated.

He told The Speaker his intention is to have the tower erected by late fall.

Miron pointed out at the council meeting that the larger tower will provide income for the municipality over the next ten years, and will provide residents with internet options as more technology becomes available.

The site has been chosen "to be able to put the tower in a spot where the majority of homes will be able to see it," Miron explained to council.

Township clerk-treasurer Amy Vickery-Menard stated the township has already consulted with its planner about the proposal. Approval from Transport Canada and NavCan are also required.

Miron acknowledged "this place is a little special because of the airport" when it comes to required approvals. He said Quantum Xpress has been communicating with the airport and NavCan, and Transport Canada will visit the site.

He noted a tower has just recently been installed in Kerns Township.

## Cleaning up in Coleman Township

COLEMAN TOWNSHIP - Coleman Township's bylaw enforcement officer Pete Gilboe is optimistic that word will spread that dumping garbage is not tolerated.

Speaking at Coleman Township's August 9 council meeting, Gilboe noted a number of sites in the township where people have decided they can dump their garbage without penalty.

He said the township's public works department has been assisting in getting the illegal dump sites cleaned up.

There is one at Cross Lake, and a proposal to block access to the site was briefly mentioned, but Gilboe was not in favour of that approach.

Closing the site off completely

to prevent the dumping would mean eliminating access to "a fairly popular recreational spot. Do we want to restrict access for the sins of a couple of people?"

There is another site that will require significant manpower as well as hydraulic equipment to clean it up, he said. It is important to "get it cleaned up so it doesn't look like a dump," he explained. If it looks like a dump "people will continue to use it.... If we can get it cleaned up we can work on keeping it that way."

The township will be holding its fall clean-up days between September 7 and September 11 at which time there will be no tipping fees.

Gilboe said he will be encouraging people to take advantage of those times to clean their properties.







some of the interesting people in its past.

Small displays highlight the Algonquin Regiment and the Cobalt mining camp.

But Arthur said it doesn't want to duplicate what is available at the Bunker Military Museum, the Cobalt Mining Museum and the Little Clay-belt Homesteaders Museum.

It plans to stock brochures from other local museums. "We want to get more people

into all of them," said student Angelica Bradley.

Fellow student André Dalcourt took on another project.

Drawing from old photos in the museum's collection, the photographer shot new images of the same buildings and streets to illustrate Hailey-bury's evolution.

Meanwhile, plans are under-way for a second gallery that will display slices of domestic life in Haileybury through the decades.

Volunteers will work on that display in the coming months, going through the museum's collection of household artifacts.

Arthur said the museum is still very much a work in progress but visits can be arranged, with COVID-19 limits and protective measures in place. For further information, call 705-672-1922.




## BUT HE DOES!
