NORTH BAY - The Nipissing-Timiskaming federal election candidates took part in an online debate hosted by the Nipissing University Political Science Program and the Nipissing University Students' Union Tuesday evening, September 7.

Candidates Greg Galante of the People's Party of Canada, New Democrat Scott Robertson, Liberal incumbent Anthony Rota, and Conservative Steven Trahan all participated.

on best practices (real-time data, not models), take a holistic, whole-society approach to public health and wellness, we will abolish vaccine mandates and passports, and we will support Canadians' rights to make medical decisions for themselves and their children based on informed consent."

Robertson stated, have more and more people who can't afford basic housing, more and more people who can't afford prescription medication or child care. We have an overdose epidemic. We have a climate crisis that needs bold action."

Rota said that, "over the last number of years as your Member of Parliament, I have worked tirelessly with municipalities and local economic development departments to bring new funding, new businesses, and to keep existing businesses growing in the riding. I also made sure benefits from social programs arrived in the riding as well as infrastructure and investments and as we come out of the COVID-19 pandemic I want to see that the support continues to grow so that we can all prosper together."

Trahan outlined his background, stating he is the deputy mayor of the Municipality of East Ferris and has been a North Bay police officer for 21 years, serving the residents of North Bay and Callander.

"I believe deeply in public service and giving back to the community," said Trahan.

"I feel I can make an impact on the region and Canada, because today as a police officer I see the high crime rates, violence and drug abuse. That has to change."

GHG EMISSIONS

"We have been using public dollars to invest in fossil fuel infrastructure, when we should be redirecting those billions of dollars towards clean energy sector and moving toward a net-zero economy," said Robertson in response to a question on greenhouse gas emissions and climate change.

Rota stated, "One of the things we want to do is take a look at the technology that's out there. We want Canada to be on the leading edge, not following somebody else and just buying their technology. We have been putting a lot of money into research and development and we want to continue that."

Trahan said the Conservative Party has a plan to combat climate change which will "allow us to meet our targets and reduce our emissions by 2030." Using a proposed low-carbon savings account, Canadians could make "lifestyle choices while allowing them to decide what best works for them and their family."

A PPC government, said Galante, "will withdraw from the Paris Accord and its unrealistic goals and punishing effects on Canadians.... We will abolish the carbon tax and we will leave the regulatory freedom to the provinces to create a carbon pricing system should they choose. We will abolish subsidies for the green technology and we will let the private sector innovate, which is what they do best.... We will prioritize implementing practical solutions to ensure we have clean air, clean water and soil, and that includes clean drinking water on First Nations."

THE ECONOMY

In response to a question about the economy in the North and employment opportunities, Rota responded, "Northern Ontario does have a lot of potential, and that's something we have to look at....There is actually a lack of employees, and we're looking at developing that. FedNor is now an agency.... That will give us a lot more freedom to develop the com-Continued on 7

EDITORIAL

Bring back civility?

We've seen organized protestors dogging Liberal Leader Justin Trudeau of late on the federal election campaign trail.

Profane language, threats and harassment seem to be the calling card of a few groups these davs.

And likely other political leaders and people who are running in the September 20 election are receiving the same type of vitriol on the campaign trail.

Many people might be asking, "Where has the civility gone?"

This type of obscene behaviour is undermining our democratic process and we usually see these anger-based protests south of the border.

Whatever your political beliefs are, using profanity, threats and acts of intimidation towards people seeking public office is not acceptable.

Certainly the COVID-19 pandemic, the unstable economy and inconveniences of lockdowns have made people angry and upset.

Anyone can criticize a party's platform or a candidate's stance on an issue, but destroying election signs, disrupting public gatherings and promoting uncivil behaviour is not the Canadian way.

The blood of thousands of Canadian soldiers was spilled to protect our democracy and the actions of a few on the campaign trail seems like a slap in the face to our veterans' sacrifices.

Politicians across the globe and here at home have made missteps managing the economy and the pandemic, but those individuals have worked hard to manage the pandemic as best they can.

Public service is a thankless job and now a dangerous job as we have seen during this election.

Let us bring back the civility to municipal, provincial and federal politics to make this region, province and country as strong and as noble as possible.

And let's take a minute to thank the hard working politicians who continue to serve the public while being threatened and harassed in public and online.

The Township continues to encourage the use of internet payments through your financial institution, or by mailing cheques to the Municipal office. All garbage deposited at the Municipal Waste Site is subject to applicable tipping fees. Garbage: A maximum of three (3) regular sized garbage bags of household garbage will be picked-up weekly. Please ensure your garbage is out by 7 am.

Recycling: The next collection date is on Tuesday, September 21, 2021.

Building Permits are required for all construction in the Township of Coleman. Please allow sufficient processing time for your application.

By-law Enforcement: To report a property standards issue or if you want to report some illegal dumping or other by-law infraction, please contact the municipal office or Pete Gilboe directly at 705-648-3750.

Animal Control: For emergency animal control services, please contact the Animal Control Service Provider at 705-648-0040.

Burning Permits - Reminder: Burning permits can be applied for on our website at https://www.colemantownship.ca/fire-permitapplication/. Burning permits are required for burning during the months of September and

Reminder: Open air burning is considered to be any fire set outside, other than a small confined fire for obtaining warmth and cooking. Small confined fires for cooking and warmth, that comply with the regulations and are contained to your own property, or a property in which an individual has permission to use, are exempt from requiring a Fire Permit under the Open Air Burning By-law. No. 13-23. There are size limits, clearance requirements, and provisions respecting fire control measures that you must have in place, if you decide to burn.

Water Conservation Notice: Coleman Residents connected to the water system are asked to conserve water to facilitate improvements to the Town of Cobalt's water tower. The Town of Cobalt began repairs to the Water Tower on August 23, 2021. These repairs are anticipated to take a minimum of 2 weeks. All municipal water supply customers are asked to exercise good water conservation practices during this time. These practices are imperative to maintain adequate water levels to deal with emergencies, including fire protection.

Ways to conserve water outdoors:

Discontinue all non-essential outdoor water use—for example, cleaning driveways or decks, watering lawn or washing cars.

Ways to conserve water indoors:

- Keep a supply of drinking water in the refrigerator rather than running the tap until the water turns cold.
- Use your dishwasher and washing machine only when there are full loads.
- Turn the water off while brushing your
- Install water saving shower heads and faucets.
- Check for leaks and fix them.
- Make sure that faucets are turned off tightly to prevent dripping.

Special efforts are being made to maintain normal water service during this program, however, some residents may experience pressure fluctuations. Thank you for your assistance and we apologize for the inconvenience.

Continued from 2 panies that are growing here in Northern Ontario."

Trahan stated, "Canada's Conservatives have a detailed plan to get inflation under control, lower prices and make life more affordable for families.... There's some criminal penalties, including jail times for executives convicted of price fixing." He said the Conservative Party would stand up against "mergers that substantially reduce competition that lead to layoffs and higher prices.... With Canada's recovery plan, we will implement a monthlong GST holiday this fall while purchases at retail will be GST-free for the month of December." He added, "Canadians continue to pay some of the highest prices in the world accessing the internet both at homes and mobile phones. These giant companies have too much power."

Galante said, "We have to take the drag off productivity and increase innovation. We do that by removing subsidies and bailouts and punishing taxes on Canadians' personal wealth. It's killing investment in the business sector and it's driving prices up here. We have got to eliminate all corporate subsidies, government bailouts that pick winners and losers.... We have to reduce the corporate tax rate gradually from 15 to 10 per cent, freeing up capital for investment in businesses that want to invest in the North, because we have so much potential up here. We want to abolish the capital gains tax on Canadians' personal wealth."

"I think what we have to do is incentivize hiring by helping businesses provide better wages and better work places," said Robertson.

"The NDP wants to make long-term deals with small businesses and want to pay their portion of the CPP and the El premiums so that they can offer higher wages." He added, "We are going to help (small business) by making sure we have reliable broadband and cellphone everywhere across the district and across the country." He added, "We want to tax the super rich.... We want to close loopholes for tax cheats. We want to put a 20 per cent foreign ownership tax on buyers. We want to make sure corporations who profited from the pandemic are paying their taxes, so we can invest in affordable housing, so that we can invest in affordable childcare which is going to put more people in the workplace and help those small businesses and that's going to make life more affordable for Canadians which makes us more stable, more resilient, which makes our communities more healthy, which is good for the economy."

HOUSING

A question on the student housing crisis was posed to the candidates, and housing in general was discussed at the same time.

"I think we have to look at cooperation with the provinces and maybe even trilateral with the municipalities, provinces and federal government to improve," said Galante.

"We could look at zoning improvements to create incentives for the private sector to look at student housing."

Robertson stated, "It is not just students who are facing a serious crisis in housing affordability.... We have people in North Bay who are in bidding wars for rent." He said, "What we want to do

of supply.... Our government wants to raise tens of billions of dollars over a parliamentary session through taxation on the very rich and the corporations who are seeing the greatest profits they have ever seen. We want to build 500,000 affordable housing units across the country."


Rota stated, "There is a shortage of supply. What we need to do is increase it. We want to decrease the demand as well that is coming from foreign countries. One

right now is address the issue of the things that is part of our platform is to stop foreigners coming in who buy land and just sit on it. We're proposing a two-year block on foreign ownership on properties. Some of the other things we are looking at is a bill of rights for people buying houses." He explained a practice occurring in real estate in which bids are invited for a house when it is on the market, causing people to bid high in an effort to purchase the property.

"We want to put a tax on

people who speculate."

Trahan stated the Conservative Party would "make homes more affordable for owners as well as renters." He said the party has a plan to build one million homes in the next three years. Investments in affordable housing will be encouraged, with the goal of creating more rental housing for Canadians, he said. Partnerships with municipalities and the private sector will be sought for the development of new rental

Arthritis Awareness

Arthritis is Canada's most prevalent chronic health condition – for which there is no cure

Fast Facts:

- Arthritis strikes people of every age, from infants to adults, and stays for life.
- Arthritis is a complex disease with over 100 different types. Major types are inflammatory arthritis (like rheumatoid arthritis, childhood arthritis, ankylosing spondylitis, psoriatic arthritis, and gout), and the most common form, osteoarthritis. Fibromyalgia has similar symptoms to arthritis
- Arthritis results in painful inflammation and stiffness in joints, limiting the ability to move.
- Left untreated, arthritis can cause permanent joint damage and/or changes.
- A significant proportion of people with arthritis are overweight or obese and are physically inactive, adding undue stress to their joints.
- Some types of arthritis can affect the heart, eyes, lungs, kidneys and eyen the skin.
- A significant proportion of people with arthritis also have other serious diseases like heart disease or diabetes.

Warning Signs of Inflammatory Arthritis

There are many forms of inflammatory arthritis; signs that are typical for most include:

- Pain, swelling and stiffness in one or multiple joints
- Morning stiffness in and around the affected joints lasting at least one hour
- Pain and stiffness that worsens with inactivity and improves with physical activity
- Reduced range of motion
- Sometimes fever, weight loss, fatigue and/or anemia

Treatment

Arthritis affects everyone differently so treatment planning should be tailored to individual needs with guidance from members of your healthcare team (e.g. family doctor, rheumatologist, surgeon, physiotherapist, occupational therapist etc.).

For the over 6 million Canadians living with arthritis, pain is one of the many challenges they face on a daily basis. And though medication is only one option in terms of arthritis treatment, it can provide pain relief (and slow joint damage in many cases of inflammatory forms of arthritis). Keep in mind that many lifestyle changes, such as healthy eating, exercise and treatments such as physical therapy, should also be explored.





SUSPICIOUS FIRE UNDER INVESTIGATION

Police have deemed suspicious the fire that destroyed an old schoolhouse in Hilliard Township. Temiskaming OPP and Earlton-Armstrong firefighters responded to the blaze on Mini Farm Road shortly after 7:30 a.m. September 1. According to the book The History of Hilliard 1910 – 2004, Hilliard SS #1B – more commonly known as "Knott's School" or "Roach's School" – opened in the fall of 1924. It had been vacant since its closure in the mid to late 1960s. Only days before fire left the schoolhouse a pile of smouldering ashes, neighbour Jessica Knott took a photo of her children Jamie and Jordan, in the stroller, in front of the building. COVID-19 UPDATE

As of September 22, 2021, Ontarians will need to be fully vaccinated (two doses plus 14 days) and provide their proof of vaccination and photo ID to access certain public settings and facilities. This approach focuses on higherrisk indoor public settings where face masks cannot always be worn and includes:

- Restaurants and bars (excluding outdoor patios, delivery, and takeout)
- Nightclubs
- Meeting and event spaces, such as banquet halls and conference/convention centres
- Sports and fitness facilities, with the exception of youth recreational sport
- Sporting events
- · Casinos, bingo halls, and gaming establishments
- Concerts, music festivals, theatres, and cinemas

- Strip clubs, bathhouses, and sex clubs
- Racing venues (e.g., horse racing). These mandatory requirements will not apply to outdoor settings, except outdoor nightclubs. These requirements will not apply to settings where people receive medical care, food from grocery stores, medical supplies, and the like.

People who cannot receive the vaccine due to medical exemptions will be permitted entry with a doctor's note. Children who are 11 years of age and younger and unable to be vaccinated will also be exempted from these requirements.


