## Huge hike DTSSAB seeing 29 per cent increase in premiums

DISTRICT - Municipalities and their ratepayers continue to feel the weight of high settlements being awarded by the courts in liability claims.

The District of Timiskaming Social Services Administration Board (DTSSAB), which is partially funded through a partnership of area municipalities, has just accepted its new insurance premium quote.

The cost will jump 29 per cent starting October 1. This will be an increase of \$27,000 from last year, reported treasurer Janice Loranger at DTSSAB's September 15 virtual meeting.

"Most of you are aware the insurance industry is pretty tough this year," said Loranger.

She said \$16,000 of the amount is due to an open liability claim that exists. DTSSAB's automobile premium is also increasing about \$10,000 "and that's just something the agent told me is happening across the board." DTSSAB administers the district's Emergency Medical Services (ambulance service).

Later in the meeting DTSSAB chair Doug Jelly noted that amount for automobile insurance may change if the EMS adds or deletes any vehicles in its fleet.

Loranger said DTSSAB is investigating options for its policy and will have more information soon.

She noted there "aren't a lot of competitive places" for municipal insurance, which leaves DTSSAB "kind of stuck with limited options."

She said DTSSAB did anticipate increases and budgeted for them in the 2021 budget, but because it takes effect on October 1, the majority of the increase will impact the 2022 budget.

Jelly commented that increases of this nature are being felt "pretty much across the municipal world."

### PROVINCIAL ISSUE

Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM) president Danny Whalen, who is also on the executive of the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO), said the issue of rapidly rising insur-

ance premiums for municipalities has been brought to the provincial government several times.

"One of the problems is that there are becoming fewer and fewer underwriters for insurance," Whalen commented in a telephone interview the next day.

Whalen acknowledges the changing weather which is creating fires and flooding, impacting homes in some cases.

"We have to do something about the excessive fires and weather we're experiencing," he said. "Nobody is disputing that."

But in other incidents occurring within a municipality, because of the use of joint and several liability, courts can force the municipality to pay the majority of the settlement to a victim, when the municipality had very little to do with the incident.

"That's not fair," said Whalen.

Through joint and several liability, the municipality can be forced to make large payments into a settlement "simply because it has the best ability to pay."

Whalen explained that FONOM and AMO plan to continue to address the issue until it is changed.

"The only way we're going to change joint and several liability is to continue pushing and having our voices heard," he said.

FONOM is constantly addressing the issue, at every opportunity, and recently sent a report to the Attorney General, who oversees the judicial system,

- The 41st Terry Fox Run was held under sunny skies in Temiskaming Shores and Englehart Sunday, September 18.




**BOOM TIMES**

# Friday is final day for OPP ID clinic

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff) — September 24 is the final day to get your OPP EZ Child ID kit.

The Temiskaming Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police invites the public to register children and vulnerable persons to get the kit on September 24 from 4:30 p.m. to 8 p.m.

The purpose of the ID kit is to collect information and photos of a child or vulnerable person identified as being at a higher risk of becoming lost or wandering.

It consists of a laptop containing preloaded child ID information forms, a fingerprint scanner, a camera and a carrying case.

They say no personal information is stored in the kit laptop, but the information about the person is stored on a USB stick and given to the parent or caregiver at the time of registration.

The information could later be used to present to police in the event of an abduction or missing person.

The public is welcome to attend this free event by appointment only.

that included data showing the insurance premiums being experienced by the municipalities, he noted.

"What we're saying is that some of these settlements that are being awarded are just so exorbitant. There has to be a limit to the amount of these awards.... Our judicial system has to start to take responsibility for some of these decisions. I want to know how they can justify some of these settlements," he stated.

Whalen added that AMO has a memorandum of understanding with the provincial government which allows executive members to sit down with government representatives and discuss

matters on a regular basis.

On the issue of joint and several liability, "We will keep bringing it up," said Whalen.

# Getting up close to Hilliardton Marsh inhabitants

HILLIARDTON - The virtual world is opening opportunities, and an up-close moment immersed in nature is now one of them.

Local photographer, author, and bird enthusiast Mike Werner has created several minute-long video clips of birds and other inhabitants who make their homes deep in the Hilliardton Marsh.

Many episodes titled Marsh Minute are now available on the Facebook page of the Hilliardton Marsh Research and Education Centre.

Werner built a custom-made blind which allowed him to wade around in the marsh with his camera equipment firmly mounted on a platform in front of him and almost at water level for close, high definition captures of moments in their lives.

"I was seeing behaviour that was new to me," said Werner, as the blind allowed him to get closer to wildlife than previously possible.

He observed the interactions between the parents and nestlings, for example, and "some of the harsh realities of nature," such as the situation where an adult lost almost all her clutch but one, mostly to predators, and had time to make a second nesting attempt but had to abandon the last nestling from the first clutch to do it.

But there were other moments of witnessing "the tenderness that exists between parents and babies."

Being immersed in that environment, which is another world that is rarely seen that closely, was "almost spiritual," he said.

The first Marsh Minute was posted on the Hilliardton Marsh Facebook page in June and the response from viewers has been enthusiastic. Both new and intermediate birders are commenting that the videos provide them with opportunities to have close views of species they don't get to see from land. They also get to hear the songs of birds, increasing their ability to identify birdsongs, he added.

With the custom-built floating blind, and his Panasonic Lumix camera GH4, Werner has been able to capture enough source material to continue to provide more Marsh Minutes for viewers well into the new year.

Beavers, blackbirds, grebes, coots, rails, sandpipers, dragonflies, ducks and terns are some of the creatures that can be observed in very personal moments through the Marsh Minute clips.

### Eye Damage and Diabetes

Many people living with diabetes have some form of eye damage or "diabetic retinopathy". Diabetic retinopathy can lead to vision changes or blindness.

#### How diabetes affects the eyes

Having too much sugar in your blood can damage the blood vessels in the part of the eye called the retina. The retina is the tissue lining the back of the eye. High sugar levels cause the blood vessels to swell and leak into the retina and cause blurred vision or blind spots. If left untreated, new blood vessels may grow and cause further damage to your vision.

#### When to get an eye exam

Once a year, unless your ophthalmologist or optometrist has suggested something different. Remember, you may not be aware of changes to your vision and many problems can be treated when caught early.

If you notice any of the following changes to your vision, see an eye doctor immediately:

- blurred vision
- flashes of light in the field of vision
- sudden loss of vision
- blotches or spots in vision

#### Reducing your risk of diabetic retinopathy

To prevent retinopathy or prevent it from getting worse, keep your blood sugar, blood pressure, and blood cholesterol within a healthy range.

Follow the **ABCDEs** of staying healthy with diabetes to reduce the risk of eye damage:

**A – A1C** – Most people should aim for an A1C of 7%\* or less by managing blood sugars well. A1C is a blood test that is a measure of your average blood sugar level over the past 120 days.

**B – Blood pressure** – Control your blood pressure to less than 130/80\* mmHg.

**C – Cholesterol** – The LDL (bad) cholesterol target is less than 2.0\* mmol/L.

**D – Drugs** to protect your heart – Speak with your health-care team about medications.

**E – Exercise & Eating** – Regular physical activity, healthy eating, and maintain a healthy body weight.

**S – Screening for complications** – Ask your health-care team about tests for your heart, feet, kidneys, and eyes.

**S – Smoking cessation** – Stop smoking and seek support for help with quitting.

**S – Self management**, stress, and other barriers – Set goals for yourself to reach the targets and live well with diabetes, such as managing stress effectively.

# Scouts Canada launching Around the World challenge

DISTRICT (Staff) - Talking to children about complex issues, like sustainability, can be daunting. Many young people are becoming exposed to climate change and its impacts through social media and conversations around them, making it an important discussion for families to have to help kids understand and address future challenges.

The challenge runs October 4 - November 28, with a video released every Monday to launch each weekly challenge at [scouts.ca/around-the-world](https://scouts.ca/around-the-world).

Through fun and engaging activities rooted in sustainability, children and youth will embark on exciting story-driven adventures set virtually in eight different countries. The activities will introduce topics such as inequality, food security, melting icecaps, mental and physical health; and encourage creative problem solving and reflection to drive awareness and development outcomes.

Girls, boys and young adults ages 5-26 can also join Scouts

to participate as part of a group. Visit [scouts.ca](https://scouts.ca) to register.

## SEVEN TIPS

Scouts Canada is sharing seven tips to help families drive understanding and motivation, and help kids develop critical thinking, problem solving and leadership skills.

- Encourage sustainable habits through play. Making a difference can be fun. While a documentary about climate change may not interest a five-year-old, making a game of it, play and interactive activities are great ways to engage children, educate them about important issues and also take action to make a positive impact on the environment or community. Try a game of climate charades to learn about the causes and impacts of climate change or explore clean energy by building a miniature wind turbine. Scouts Canada has 265 activities themed around sustainability at [scouts.ca/resources/activity-finder](https://scouts.ca/resources/activity-finder).

- Focus on their interests. The United Nation’s 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) offer families a variety of avenues to plan activities that engage their children’s interests. For those who love the water, “life below water” is a great SDG to focus on. Try reading books or watching television shows and movies that feature sea creatures, then plan a shoreline cleanup, observe the health of a local pond and focus on forming sustainable habits that benefit waterways. If your child is more of a people person, “no poverty” might be an SDG to focus on. Plan a few activities that support those in your community, like creating

care packages for individuals experiencing homelessness or spend a day performing random acts of kindness.

- Foster critical thinking. Asking questions helps identify what children already think and know, and provides a starting point to discuss their ideas. Engage their problem solving skills to encourage them to develop solutions.

- Use examples to offer context. Matching examples of scenarios that impact their lives, or lives of kids their own age, helps make an issue relatable and understandable. Use an example they can see close to home, and then connect it to

a global issue.

- Focus on the positive. Sustainability can be overwhelming and scary if the focus is solely on the problems. Having a solutions-oriented mindset enables families to take a positive approach and help young people feel empowered to take action rather than be discouraged by problems that seem insurmountable.

- Learn together. Sustainability is a journey for everyone, and can be an enjoyable way to spend time together as a family. Whether volunteering at a local food bank or going zero waste camping, working together builds social con-

nection, community spirit and shared values.

- Track your progress. Making impact measurable helps underscore the value of every action and fosters a growth mindset. Create a chart or scrapbook and track any actions towards sustainable outcomes. Set goals and arrange celebrations for achieving milestones - like a special treat or fun activity. Small actions may not seem like much on their own, but looking back over a year of activities demonstrates a bigger picture. Kids will feel proud of their accomplishments and motivated to continue making a difference.
