# **City library service** expected to open on campus in January

TEMISKAMING SHORES – After an 18-month wait, city library services are expected to be available in Haileybury in January.

Public library services at the Haileybury campus of Northern College were slated to launch in mid-2020, but pandemic precautions at the college forced its postponement.

"The books are there," said Temiskaming library CEO Rebecca Hunt earlier this week.

The arrangement was drafted to enable the continued provision of public library services in Haileybury as Temiskaming Shores consolidated operations in a new location in New Liskeard.

Under the reciprocal agreement with Northern College, anyone with a city library membership will be able to borrow from collections held on campus or in New Liskeard.

City library members will also be able to access the college's library.

And on the college side, "if they're a student in good standing at Northern College then they can get a Temiskaming Shores Public Library membership for free," Hunt said.

About 5,000 city library resources will be kept on cam-

They include collections of English-language fiction and non-fiction, as well as some French adult fiction, DVDs and materials for children, juniors and young

adults.

However, library members can request materials located at either site, and they'll be delivered to the closest branch for pick-up.

In her discussions with Ontario counterparts in the library field, Hunt said the arrangement - in which the city is in effect paying the college to circulate materials on its behalf - appears to be unique.

The library has been waiting "anxiously" for some time for the new arrangement to become reality, she said.

On October 5, city council approved a revised memorandum of understanding with the college that takes into account a January start-up date.

The five-year agreement will now run from 2022 through 2026. The cost - \$18,000 a year, with annual increases of three per cent – remains the same.


# DID YOU GET The Speaker THIS WEEK? Here are some October 6 stories...



# **October is Occupational Therapy Month**

# What is Occupational Therapy?

Occupational therapy is a type of health care that helps to solve the problems that interfere with a person's ability to do the things that are important to them.

## An Occupational Therapist (OT) may check:

- Your physical abilities like strength, balance and coordination
- Your mental abilities like memory, coping strategies, organizational skills
- What materials or devices you use to participate in activities like furniture, utensils, tools or clothes
- What social and emotional support is available to you at home, school, work or in the community, and
- The physical setup of your house, classroom, workplace or other environment

# Depending on the problem, the OT can help you solve it

- 1. Helping you overcome your disability. OTs do this by:
- educating or instructing you on how to do things with the abilities you have - e.g. getting around your community in a
- suggesting activities that will help you improve or maintain the abilities you have - e.g. improving your coping strategies
- 2. Adapting the materials you use. OTs do this by changing the things you use:
- around the house e.g. a special key holder to make turning keys easier
- in sports or leisure activities e.g. a playing cards holder
- at work or school e.g. special tools that help prevent injury to hands and back
- to take care of yourself e.g. special bath or toilet seats
  to get from place to place e.g. car modifications such as one-handed steering wheels
- 3. Recommending changes to the environments where you do your everyday activities. OTs do this by recommending
- change the physical layout of your workplace, home or school – e.g. lowering/raising desktops, countertops or cupboards
- find out about the supports in your community e.g. specialized public transportation
- work with the people in your community e.g. providing education about a disability to the teacher or employer
- work with the government to encourage health living e.g. request funding for special equipment



# Growing North Bay software enterprise latest in video series

NORTH BAY (Staff) – The latest video in a series profiling business success stories and opportunities in Northeastern Ontario takes its tag line to heart.

The GoNorth online videos bill the region as "a healthy place to grow your business."

MetricAid in North Bay is video number seven in the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM) initiative.

MetricAid, founded in 2012, is a software enterprise launched by Les Blackwell and Dr. Scott Daley to solve a persistent local hospital problem – how to schedule work to manage rising patient numbers.

In the video, company CEO Blackwell said they used Microsoft Excel "and a lot of elbow grease" to develop a performance-based scheduling tool.

As the North Bay Health Centre expanded, he said patient volumes went up but wait-times went down.

Blackwell said the project won an award that year and Southern Ontario hospitals began making inquiries.

MetricAid is now moving from the health care field into other sectors.

# Moratorium ends for drivers needing renewals

DISTRICT (Special) - The use online option. Ontario government is reinstating renewal requirements for driver's licences, licence plate stickers, Ontario Photo Cards, Ontario health cards, and other products that would have expired on or after March 1, 2020, but were extended to provide immediate relief to Ontarians during the COV-ID-19 pandemic.

Those needing to renew their provincial documents are encouraged to use ServiceOntario's convenient and easy-to-

To ensure everyone has enough time to renew, Ontario has extended the renewal deadlines for most driver's licences, licence plate stickers, and Ontario Photo Cards and health cards until February 28,

"I strongly encourage those who have deferred their renewals - approximately 17 per cent of Ontarians - to plan ahead and renew their documents online," said Caroline Mulroney, Minister of Transportation.

Heavy commercial vehicle owners will need to renew their vehicle validations by December 31, 2021. Novice licence holders (class G1, G2, M1 or M2) will have until December 31, 2022, to re-qualify for or upgrade their novice driver's licence.

People who have not renewed their products during the Extended Validity period will be required to pay the fee

for previous years, in addition to the current year renewal fee.

Friday, October 8, 2021

To make it easier for people to renew their driver's licences online, Ontario has temporarily waived requirements for people to renew their driver's licences in person, including those for senior drivers. Eligible drivers can renew their driver's licence online at ServiceOntario.ca, including those aged 80 and over.

In the video, company staffers highlight the existence of local talent in the North Bay area, including post-secondary grads as a workforce source, and the availability of government support.

The cost of doing business is "a small fraction" of that in larger centres, Blackwell said.

Lifestyle factors – from short commutes and lack of traffic to the outdoors and a downtown location with easy access to restaurants - were also cited.

"It makes so much sense to start a company here. This is just a great place to do it, you won't regret it," Blackwell concluded.

The videos are produced by the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities with financial assistance from FedNor.



# Charlton water treatment plant upgrades considered

CHARLTON-DACK - The Municipality of Charlton and Dack is working on securing funding to improve its water treatment plant.

It's in the second intake

phase with the joint federal and provincial Green Stream program.

At Charlton-Dack's September 1 meeting, municipal chief administrative officer Dan Thibeault noted the municipal share of the project would be 26.67 per cent. He

later explained in a telephone interview that would be less than \$20,000 and could be provided through the municipality's available funding from the Ontario Community Infrastructure Funding.

The proposed upgrades include the replacement of some of the pumps, an exhaust fan and a main breaker.

Funding has already been received for upgrades to the water treatment plant's computer system.

Thibeault told council he has been in discussion with the Ontario Clean Water Agency (OCWA), which manages the water treatment plant, about needs at the plant.

"A lot of our plant is original to the late 1980s when it was built," he commented.

The municipality is also considering whether it would be practical to add an automatic water station, but initial cost estimates place the project at approximately \$110,000.

"None of the water plants up here have one," Thibeault added.

The \$110,000 quote was "a lot more than I expected," he said.

About ten times a year, a request comes in to the municipality for water in large bulk amounts, but public works staff must be on hand for the transaction. The municipality

is considering turning it into an automatic system.

The potential demand for water could be increasing in the future, council believes.

"There are more vehicles running around with water tanks than ever before," commented Councillor Jim Huff.

However, council is not prepared to spend \$110,000 to automate the system, it was concluded.

Thibeault suggested that if the municipality put the project out for tender, it would likely get a better quote on an automated water station system.


"We can look a little more into it," said Thibeault.




