Cobalt opens the taps on water plant upgrades

COBALT — The Town of Cobalt, along with EXP Services Inc., held a grand opening barbecue luncheon on October 8 to showcase major upgrades that have been completed at the Cobalt Water Treatment Plant.

It's located on Pumphouse Road on Sasaginiga Lake in Coleman Township.

Mayor George Othmer described it as a state-ofthe-art plant designed "for the future."

EXP provided engineering services and the Ontario Clean Water Agency (OCWA) provides the town with ongoing Overall Responsible Operator (ORO) oversight.

This event was an opportunity for members of the public to take a tour of the plant and learn about the upgrades, which began in May of 2019 and wrapped up this September, with a price tag of \$1.5 million.

The town's share of the project's costs comes in at \$20,000.

The bulk of the funding for the upgrades have come from the federal and provincial governments, says Cobalt clerk treasurer John Hodgson.

The Cobalt Public Works crew operates the facility which also supplies water to 45 nearby households in Coleman.

Public works foreman David Adshead gave tours

of the plant to interested parties, proudly explaining the upgrades.

He emphasized the importance of stainless steel piping, saying, "We had plastic piping in here and noticed at one point a pipe had literally melted when overheated, which won't happen now."

"This has been a long time coming, we are proud of this facility and all these upgrades are now mandated by the province of Ontario. If you don't want another Walkerton, you have to complete these upgrades," noted Othmer.

UPGRADES

Features include two new high-lift pumps, two new low-lift pumps and two new variable frequency drives to control the flow of the pumps.

The large blue structure that dominates the landscape is the new water tower, or standpipe, which provides additional storage of potable water and increases the robustness of the distribution system.

"These upgrades significantly improve our fire fighting capabilities with the extra water in the new Continued on 2



It also allows for maintenance to be done on the main water tower in the north end of town, which had a new interior coat-

ing upgrade, a fall arrest system upgrade and various minor maintenance items taken care of.

The water treatment plant's piping has all been upgraded to stainless steel piping with new valves for additional control.

Osteoporosis and Bone Mineral Density Testing

Osteoporosis is a condition that causes bones to become thin and porous, decreasing bone strength and leading to broken bones, especially the hip, spine, wrist and shoulder. Osteoporosis is sometimes confused with osteoarthritis. Just to be clear, osteoporosis is a bone disease and osteoarthritis is a disease of the joints and surrounding tissue.

Fast Facts:

- Osteoporosis can strike at any age and affects both men and women
- Building strong bones during childhood and adolescence can be the best defence against developing osteoporosis later in life
- Both men and women begin to lose bone in their mid 30s.
 As they approach menopause, women lose bone at a greater rate, from 2-3% per year
- At least 1 in 3 women and 1 in 5 men will suffer from an osteoporotic fracture during their lifetime
- Over 80% of all fractures in people 50+ are caused by osteoporosis

Testing

Bone Mineral Density (BMD) testing is very important. This test is safe, painless and accurately measures the density of your bones. A BMD test can tell you whether or not you have osteoporosis and how likely you are to develop it in the future. It can help you to make decisions that may prevent fractures or further bone loss.

Who Should Get a BMD test?

- all women and men 65 years or older
- postmenopausal women and men 50-64 with risk factors for fracture including:
 - o low bone mass identified on x-ray
 - parental hip fracture
 - high alcohol intake
 - current smoker
 - low body weight, i.e. less than 132 lbs or 60 kg
 - rheumatoid arthritis
- younger men or women (under 50) with a disease or condition associated with low bone mass or bone loss:
 - high risk medication (steroid use, aromatase inhibitors, androgen deprivation therapy)
 - uncontrolled hyperthyroidism
 - early menopause (younger than 45)

vironment.


I wanted desperately to vote for a green candidate in the recent federal election but the Green Party of Canada is a mess.



TFN entrepreneur making grand finale pitch

TEMISKAMING SHORES -

For a Timiskaming First Nation entrepreneur, it all comes down to one final pitch to a panel of judges next week.

Weesanin Homestyle Cooking, founded by Kelly Mc-Bride, is one of four entrants from Quebec to reach the finals of Pow Wow Pitch 2021.

"Seeing my business come fourth was amazing," said Mc-Bride as she served customers at Riverside Farmers' Market on a recent Saturday morning.

On October 20, she'll be among 29 Indigenous entrepreneurs from across Canada and the U.S. to make her case live online for up to \$25,000.

Pow Wow Pitch is a showcase and mentorship opportunity for Indigenous enterprises.

Using an approach akin to that of the popular Dragon's Den TV series, small business owners make their case for their operations to be awarded cash.

The initiative was founded by Sunshine Tenasco from Kitigan Zibi Anishinabeg near Maniwaki, Quebec. In 2015, Tenasco appeared on *Dragon's* Den and received a \$20,000 loan to help expand her company, which made beaded baby moccasins of deer hide.

She has credited her appearance on the CBC series for giving her the confidence to continue as an entrepreneur.

More than 1,600 vendors, artists, business builders and innovators applied for the 2021 edition of Pow Wow

The field was narrowed to 156, and included three applicants from Timiskaming First Nation and one from Temagami First Nation.

Weesanin Homestyle Cooking provides home-cooked meals that incorporate trad-

itional Algonquin foods and family favourites. McBride became a vendor at the Riverside market this year, and recently began serving meals from the Riverside Place kitchen during the Saturday morning markets.

She wants to expand the business, with plans that include a lunch truck and hiring employees.

At the Pow Wow Pitch online semifinals, she made her minute-long pitch to a panel of judges and then responded to questions.

"It was intimidating," she

Now it's on to the finals, where she'll make her pitch one more time.

The grand finale will be broadcast live online October 20 beginning at 6 p.m. To register for free to watch, go to www.powwowpitch.org.



Smoking is the #1 cause of fatal home fires in Ontario. Alcohol is a factor in many smoking related fires.

Install smoke and carbon monoxide alarms on every storey of your home. Test them



How do I prevent a smoking fire?

 To prevent smoking fires, you must be alert. You will not be alert if you are sleepy, have consumed alcohol, drugs or medicine that makes you drowsy.



- · Never smoke in bed.
- If people have been smoking in your home, check behind chair and sofa cushions for cigarette butts before going to bed.
- Use large deep ashtrays that cannot be knocked over.
- Empty ashes into a metal container—not the garbage can—and put it outside.
- Do not extinguish cigarettes in plant pots, which may contain a mixture of peat moss, shredded wood and bark that can easily ignite.
- Encourage smokers to **smoke outside**.


