Hospital setting table for operating room upgrade

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special) – Temiskaming Hospital Foundation takes to the air February 24.

And the goal for this year's fundraiser is \$50,000 for a new operating table.

Some 1,000 surgeries are performed each year at the hospital as well as some 150 Caesarean sections.

Its two operating tables are each 12 years old.

In a press release, the foundation said they're due for replacement within the next few years, but it hopes the radiothon will enable the acquisition of one new table sooner.

"Having a surgical program at Temiskaming Hospital is extremely important for our community," said Mike Baker, hospital CEO and foundation secretary.

"Throughout the pandemic, we saw the impact of postponed surgeries and continue to tackle the backlog while looking at ways that we can continue with, and eventually expand, the surgical services provided to our community."

This year's radiothon is the eighth and, like the

2021 event, will be held virtually.
The on-air radiothon will run on CJTT 104.5 FM from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Foundation board members will provide live updates each hour at the 15-minute, 30-minute and 45-minute marks.

An online event page featuring information about the operating table will go live February 18. It will also accept donations, beginning February 23.

A link to the radiothon will be found on the foundation's website, at temiskaminghospitalfoundation.org.

Donations can also be mailed to the foundation at 421 Shephardson Road, New Liskeard, P0J 1P0.

To date, the foundation has raised more than \$5.37 million towards its latest goal of \$6.5 million.

With pandemic-related cancellations of traditional fundraisers, the foundation has relied on its monthly 50/50 draws. They'll continue until December.

"Fundraising is a continual process for all hospitals and Temiskaming Hospital is no different," said foundation president Jim Rowe.

"We are thrilled to continue working on raising funds in a variety of ways, including our Radiothon, in order to purchase equipment that allows our local hospital to offer the exceptional level of service we have come to expect."

Electra receives another permit for North Cobalt refinery

NORTH COBALT (Staff/Special) - Electra has received an Industrial Sewage Works permit for its refinery located east of North Cobalt.

The company has also filed its final closure plan for its refinery expansion project, Electra announced in a February 10 release.

“Completion of these regulatory milestones ... is an important step in the execution of Electra’s strategic business plan, which includes the integration of the refinery into a larger battery materials park,” said the company.

The approval was issued by the Ontario Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks, the company said.

Electra also submitted its final closure plan for the refinery on January 19. This is subject to a 45-day review period by the ministry. The company will amend its existing permit

to take water to ensure alignment of volumes across all operating permits, the company also explained.

“Achieving these important regulatory milestones is a critical step as we bring North America’s only cobalt sulfate refinery online this year,” chief executive officer Trent Mell said in the release.

“Throughout the permitting process, we have consulted and worked closely with our stakeholders including Indigenous communities, neighbours, and local governments. Electra is committed to being an industry leader with respect to environment, social and government practices, which will be reflected in how we engage with stakeholders and how we run our operations with a view to minimizing our impact on the environment.”

Electra’s closure plan will outline how the affected land

will be rehabilitated and the costs associated with doing so. As part of the formal filing process, financial assurance covering the total estimated costs of all future closure activities has been posted with the ministry. Electra does not anticipate that any substantive issues will be raised during the 45-day review period.

The industrial sewage approval will govern how process water and tailings will be managed to ensure the environment is protected. Electra will also be filing an amendment to its current permit to take water. The amendment will align the volumes in the water permit to those included in the final approval.

The company’s cobalt sulfate refinery is on schedule to

commence commissioning in 2022. This facility is the first phase in Electra’s four-phase battery materials park strategy. In the coming years, Electra intends to build further processing capacity for the recycling or primary and secondary battery scrap materials, production of nickel sulfate and precursor cathode active material production, the company stated.

On Monday, February 7, the Ontario Provincial Police closed Highway 11 from New Liskeard to North Bay due to six vehicle mishaps.

The road, a major highway in the province, was closed in both directions for seven hours thus stranding hundreds of motorists travelling along Highway 11 north and south.

Once again, the road conditions on that day were snow covered, icy and unsafe.

Thank goodness there are no fatalities reported from those mishaps, but there were injuries, damage to vehicles and time lost on the day.

Northerners deserve better road maintenance.

It was reported the OPP had called for those roads to be salted three times that day as was heard by citizens in and around Temagami who heard the request via a police scanner.

That means the people of Northern Ontario are being treated like second-class citizens when it comes to winter road maintenance.

And it would also appear that the almighty dollar is playing a part in the fact that lives are being lost and people are being seriously injured to save money.

There is another pandemic happening and it has to do with the unsatisfactory level of winter road maintenance in the region.

This is completely unacceptable and it must stop.

It is time the government treated all citizens of this province fairly.

Maintain our roads Mr. Ford and change the way your government assigns maintenance contracts for winter road maintenance.

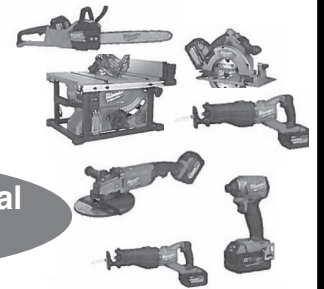

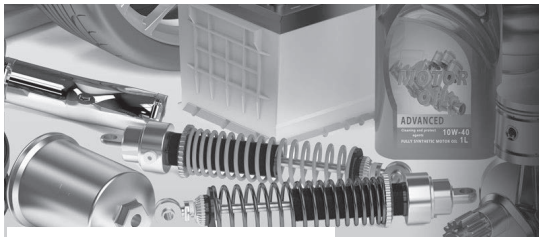

Support for seniors who received pandemic benefits

DISTRICT (Special) - The federal government has announced a plan to compensate seniors who saw their pensions impacted if they had drawn pandemic benefits.

A February 8 release states that the government recognizes “that some Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) and Allowance recipients may face lower benefit payments because of the income they received” from the Canada

Emergency Response Benefit (CERB) and the Canada Recovery Benefit (CRB). Those plans were intended to support people who lost their jobs through the onset of the pandemic.

The federal government will provide up to \$742.4 million for one-time payments. These payments will alleviate the financial hardship of those seniors who qualified and received CERB and CRB

in 2020 but who subsequently saw that they counted as income and impacted their GIS or Allowance benefits. This automatic, one-time payment will compensate them for the full, annualized loss amount. Seniors would not need to take any action to receive the one-time payment.”

To ensure that this issue does not reoccur, Canada’s Minister of Seniors, Kamal Khera, introduced Bill C-12

in Parliament February 8 to amend the Old Age Security Act to exclude any income received under CERB, CRB, the Canada Recovery Caregiving Benefit, the Canada Recovery Sickness Benefit, and the Canada Worker Lockdown Benefit for the purposes of calculating the amount of GIS and Allowance payable beginning in July 2022.

Khera stated in a release, “Low-income seniors should not be penalized for accessing income support they needed during the pandemic crisis,” said Khera.

“We will be fully compensating those seniors who are now facing financial hardship as a result of receiving pandemic benefits in 2020.”

Report assesses climate change impacts on health

OTTAWA (Special) – A new report will help the federal government in its efforts to develop policies aimed at protecting Canadians from the effects of climate change.

Health of Canadians in a Changing Climate: Advancing our Knowledge for Action provides a comprehensive assessment of the latest research on how climate-related hazards (including extreme heat events, wildfires, floods, and ice storms) are affecting our health and wellbeing.

“Climate change continues to negatively impact the health and wellbeing of Canadians, however we know that some communities are more vulnerable than others,” said Federal Minister of Health Jean-Yves Duclos.

“The report’s new findings on Indigenous health impacts, health equity and mental health, amongst others, will help us ensure that our adaptation strategies are efficient and equitable. I also want to thank all of the experts who contributed to this new source of knowledge which will help inform our government’s action on climate change adaptation.”

The report documents the increasing risks from infectious diseases and from climate impacts on food and water safety and security.

The report’s findings will help decision-makers be more prepared for the health effects of climate change and take action to reduce risks as well as to empower individuals to protect themselves and their loved ones.

In developing the report, Health Canada engaged experts from academic, government, and non-governmental organizations across Canada, who assessed and synthesized knowledge from peer-reviewed literature, government reports, and Indigenous-led studies.

The report is part of *Canada in a Changing Climate: Advancing our Knowledge for Action*, a collaborative national assessment process led by Natural Resources Canada, which forms the foundation for the action needed as the federal government develops Canada’s National Adaptation Strategy.

Funding available in honour of Platinum Jubilee

TIMMINS (Special) – Timmins-James Bay MP Charlie Angus is encouraging groups to apply for funding through the Platinum Jubilee program, celebrating the 70th anniversary of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Applications for the program are being accepted until February 22.

Angus says there isn't much time but groups should try to get applications in quickly.

The following organizations are eligible for funding:

- Canadian not-for-profit organizations, such as a corporation, trust, cooperative, unincorporated associations, etc.
- Canadian business corporations where projects are non-commercial in nature
- Canadian educational institutions
- Canadian provincial or ter-

ritorial governments, municipal governments, local band councils, local tribal councils or other local Indigenous governments or organizations (First Nations, Inuit or Metis) and other municipal, provincial or territorial institutions of Canada.

To be eligible for funding, your initiative must be:

- held between January 1 and December 31, 2022
- held in Canada

Bullying is a major problem in our schools, workplaces, homes, and over the Internet!

Bullying happens in many different forms. It's doing, saying or acting in a way that hurts someone else or makes him or her feel bad on purpose.

Words hurt! We all seem to recognize physical bullying, but sometimes other forms of bullying are not as easy to identify. Being called names can hurt someone else's feelings. All forms of bullying are harmful, but VERBAL bullying, including name-calling, happens more often than any other kind of bullying.

Did you know:

- One in seven Canadian children aged 11 to 16 are victims of bullying
- Bullying occurs once every 7 minutes on the playground and once every 25 minutes in the classroom
- Other kids are watching 85% of the time when one kid bullies another kid. Adults like teachers or parents hardly ever see a bully being mean to someone else.
- In majority of cases, bullying stops within 10 seconds when peers intervene, or do not support the bullying behaviour

Dangers for Children and Adolescents Who Are Bullied:

- Depression
- Social anxiety, loneliness, isolation
- Stress related health problems (e.g., headaches, stomach aches)
- Low self esteem
- School absenteeism and academic problems
- Aggressive behaviours
- Contemplating, attempting, or committing suicide

The plain-language online

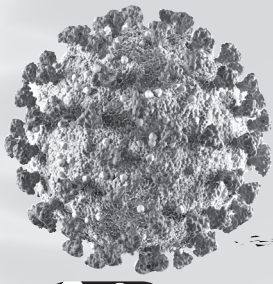

OTTAWA (Special) - The Government of Canada is encouraging young people to develop their skills of civic engagement through service projects.

The Canada Service Corps (CSC) is promoting civic engagement among young people aged 15 to 30 through access to meaningful volunteer service opportunities. Young people can also receive micro-grant funding to lead their own service projects.

The Canada Service Corps is one of many federal initiatives aimed at helping youth create a better future for themselves, their families and their communities.

Under-served youth is defined by CSC as: visible minority/ racialized populations, LGBTQ2 people, persons with disabilities, people from Official Language Minority Communities, youth living in rural or remote areas, and youth from lower-income households.

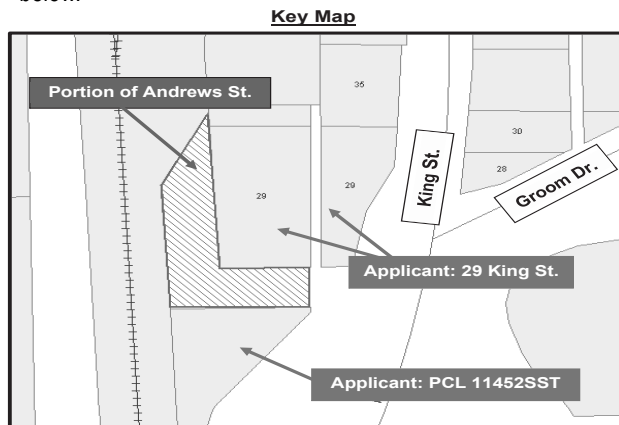

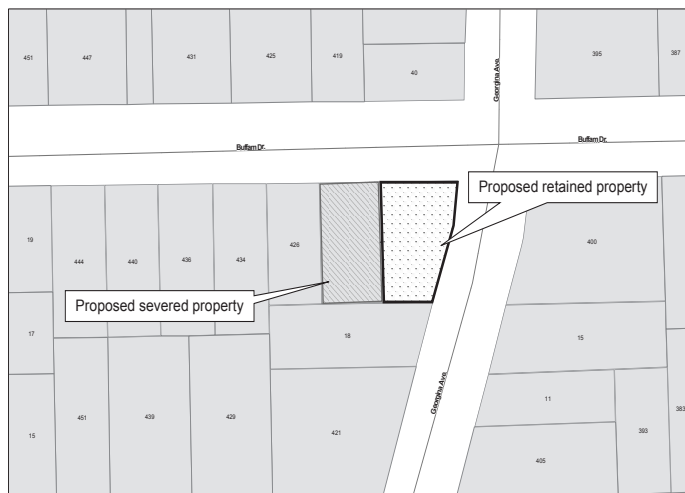

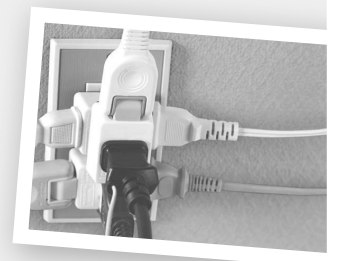
PULL THE PLUG ON ELECTRICAL FIRES



Electrical equipment is a leading cause of home fires in Ontario.

How do I keep myself and my loved ones safe?

- **Avoid running cords under rugs** which can damage the cord and cause a fire.
- **Avoid overloading a circuit with "octopus outlets"**. If additional outlets or circuits are required, have them installed by a licensed electrician.
- Extension cords should be used only as a **temporary connection**. If permanent wiring is required, have additional outlets installed by a licensed electrician. **Extension cords should not be linked together**—use an extension cord that is long enough to do the job.



Install smoke and carbon monoxide alarms on every storey of your home.

Test them every month.



- Air conditioners and other heavy appliances should be plugged **directly into an outlet**.
- **Ground fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs)** should be installed in bathrooms, kitchens, and garages. GFCIs shut off an electrical circuit when it becomes a shock hazard.

- **Check electrical cords for damage such as fraying or nicks**. A damaged cord can expose wires and result in a potential shock or fire hazard.
