Challenge ready

Puckhounds hosting U9 tourney this weekend

TEMISKAMING SHORES — The rinks in Temiskaming Shores are the places to be for hockey action this weekend.

The Temiskaming Shores Minor Hockey Association (TSMHA) Puckhounds host the U9 Pioneer Diesel Challenge Cup from February 25-27.

"We are very excited to host the tournament this coming weekend," said TSMHA tournament coordinator Trevor Desrosiers in an email interview.

"We have 15 teams participating and there will be a total of 35 games played in both our arenas starting Friday at 11 a.m."



Action will be seen at the Don Shepherdson Memorial Arena in New Liskeard and the Shelley Herbert-Shea Memorial Arena in Haileybury.

COVID-19 protocols in place for the hockey tournament include wearing of masks, social distancing and proof of vaccination status.

The three divisions of the tournament are the Kenworth Division, the Tier 1 Freightliner Division and the Tier 2 Peterbilt Division.

The event gets underway on Friday at 11 a.m. with the Iroquois Falls Eskimos facing off against Kirkland Lake KLVFB at The Shep.

At 12:10 the TSMHA Grant Puckhounds take on the Smooth Rock Falls Lightning, also in New Liskeard.

hounds playing the Eskimos at 6 p.m. at The Shep.

Play resumes on Saturday at 11 a.m. when Hearst Hince Transport plays TSMHA Grant Puckhounds.

The last game of the day features two Puckhound teams – Findlays vs. Leisure Inn at 5:30 p.m.

On Sunday, the finals begin at 8 a.m. when the sixth-place team plays fifth.

The championship game will take place at 3:20 p.m. in New Liskeard.

"We are excited as this will be the first real tournament for most of these young players and we are hoping to make it a fun weekend for them. I would like to thank Pioneer Diesel and the TSMHA volunteers and parents that have worked hard on this event," noted Desrosiers.

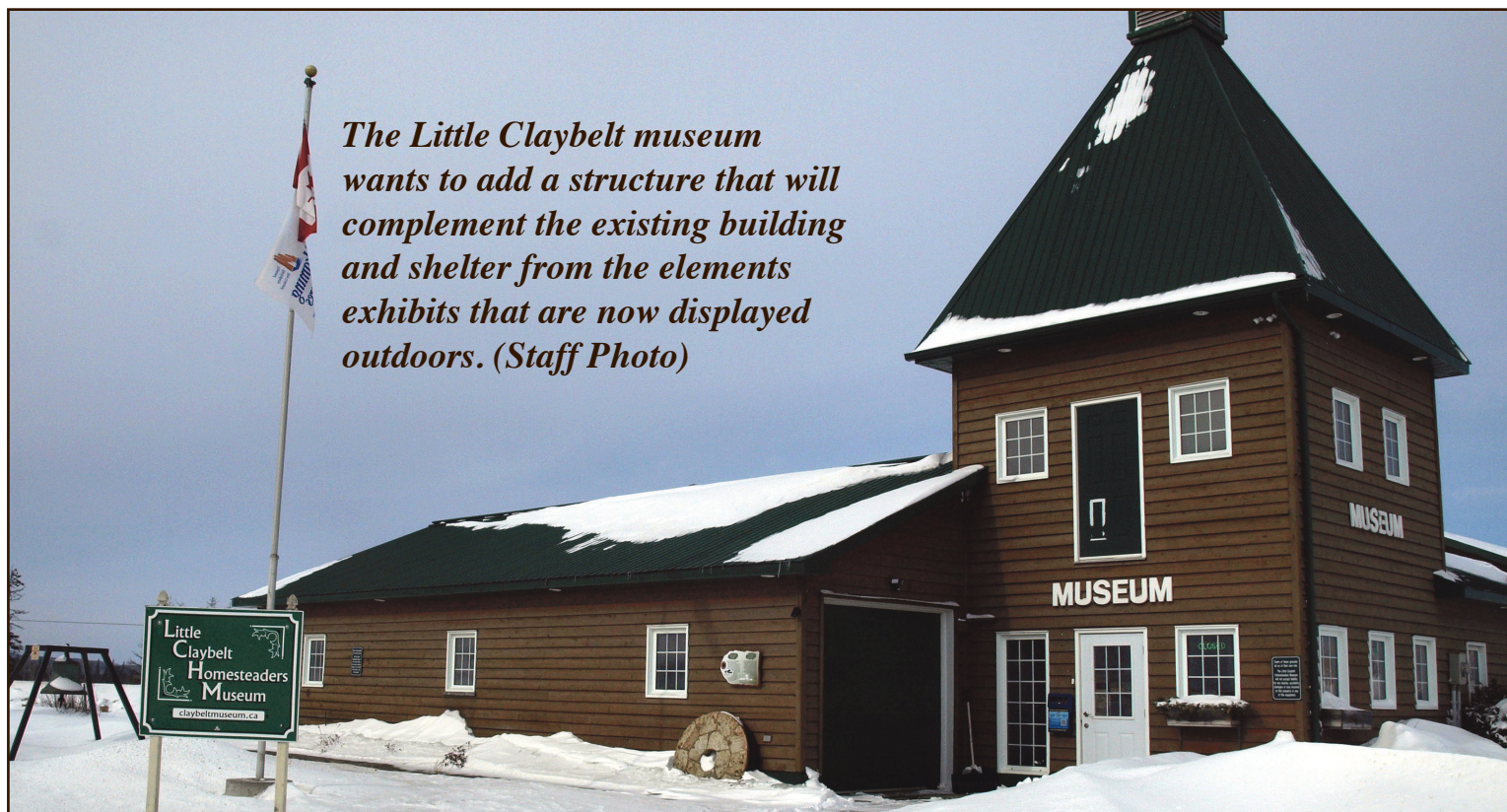

Museum proposes moving outdoor collection indoors

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff) – The Little Claybelt museum wants to expand.

The new structure would be built at the south end of the property, facing Highway 11.

In a letter to Temiskaming Shores council, museum board chair Dick Farrow said the new building would serve two purposes.

It would protect some pieces that are now outdoors from the weather while also adding more display space.

Farrow said the new structure's roof profile and siding would be consistent with the existing building.

City council's approval was needed because it owns the building.

With that approval, he said the museum

could estimate the cost of the new structure and seek funding for the project.

The addition will be "kind of a nice little project," commented Mayor Carman Kidd.

Council approved the request, with the condition that the project is undertaken at the museum board's expense and on its own time.

Ontario funding will assist with \$700,000 study

NORTH COBALT (Staff) - Electra Battery Materials Corporation is launching a battery materials park study in partnership with the Ontario government, Glencore plc and Talon Metals.

The consortium will collaborate on engineering, permitting, socio-economic and cost studies associated with the construction of the nickel sulfate plant as well as a battery precursor cathode active materials plant adjacent to Electra's cobalt refinery and recycling plant east of North Cobalt.

The \$700,000 study will be funded by the Ontario government with a \$250,000 investment, which will be matched by Electra with a \$250,000 investment, and an additional \$100,000 each from Glencore plc and Talon Metals.

Electra states that it is pursuing a four-phased approach to build North America's first battery materials park, with a battery grade cobalt sulfate refinery to be commissioned in December 2022 and a battery recycling circuit scheduled for 2023, followed by battery grade nickel sulfate and precursor cathode active materials by mid-decade.

"The objective of the joint study is to assess the technical, financial and permitting requirements for the construction of a battery grade nickel sulfate refinery and a precursor cathode active materials facility located near the company's hydrometallurgical facility. Emerging best practice in the electric vehicle supply chain is to co-locate chemical refining and precursor cathode active materials production on a common site to eliminate conventional processing steps, resulting in lower unit costs, a shorter supply chain and a smaller carbon footprint," Electra added.

The study will be completed in phases, with results expected in the third and fourth quarters of 2022.

Electra's business strategy is to produce sufficient battery material to supply 1.5 million electric vehicle batteries on an annual basis, the company states. In coming years, Electra intends to build further processing capacity for nickel sulfate, recycling of primary and secondary battery scrap materials and precursor production, the company added.

A press release from the Ontario government on its investment of \$250,000 in the study, stated that "the proposed battery materials park facility could supply more than 1.5 million EVs and employ up to 250 people, becoming a key pillar of the EV battery supply chain for battery-grade nickel sulfate and precursor cathode active materials."

Accountability and transparency

It was interesting to see a Temiskaming Shores councillor recently question the city about contracts handed out without following the city's procurement policy.

Councillor Jeff Laferriere questioned why a contract had been awarded to Markey Consulting in relation to services provided for the annual Northern Ontario Mining Showcase at the Prospectors and Developers Association of Canada Conference for 2022, '23 and '24.

It was refreshing to see that councillor question a policy that is designed to protect hard-earned taxpayer dollars.

Perhaps councillors may fall in line with the comings and goings of council and forget that they have an obligation to get the best value for the taxpayer dollar.

And it is in the best interests of accountability and transparency that councillors question any and all contracts handed out and policies put in place around tendering processes.

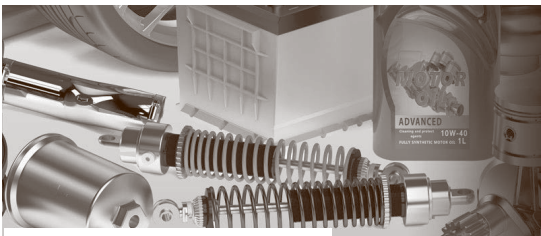

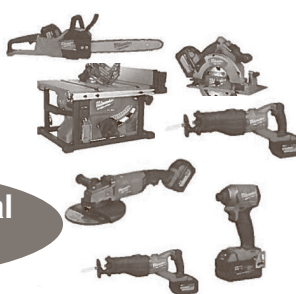

Efforts growing to re-open Charlton Legion building

CHARLTON - The Charlton Legion Branch 227 is organizing a fundraiser as a first step to bringing its Legion hall back to something that can be used.

In recent years, the building has experienced water damage and is still closed due to a health restriction because of mould.

Branch 227 president Gisele Belanger and other executive members are spearheading efforts to get the building re-opened.

In a telephone interview, Belanger stated that the places with mould must be cleaned and sealed and then pass an inspection.

The building has been closed for over a year, she said.

Belanger has been preparing applications for government funding for the four-stage project to return the building to its full potential.

"We have a lot of repairs to do but our priority is to get it cleaned up, pass the health inspection, and then get us back in the building," she said.

Once the building can be used again, it can begin generating its own funds, enough to pay the bills, she pointed out.

"We're hoping to renovate the building not only as a Legion hall, but also as a community centre where events and activities can take place and where people as a community can go and participate in what the Legion is promot-

ing," she added.

At this time, Legions are promoting activities, recreation, youth and sport, she said.

By bringing people to the building, it is hoped they will either choose to join the Legion, or to simply volunteer.

A raffle is being planned which will include a YETI insulated cooler valued at \$1,500, and a \$500 LCBO gift card. Tickets will be \$10 each and will be available through the Friends of Charlton Dack and Area Facebook page, and through Legion executive members. The draw will be held April 30.

"We need funds in the bank in order to continue paying utilities and the expenses in the building until larger amounts of funding can be received," said Belanger.

"We're going to at least bring it up to the current codes. It needs lots of work.

"There's a lot of volunteer support that's going to jump in. That's why I think this will work because we've got a good backbone for it."

She noted Chamberlain Township, which has been renovating its community hall, has donated its kitchen cupboards to the Legion renovation.

"We're getting positive feedback from those we've reached out to so far," said Belanger. "We've got really good plans going forward."

She said she will be calling a public meeting in the next couple of weeks to share with the public all that has been done so far.

What is Glaucoma?

Glaucoma is a chronic progressive eye disease characterized by a degeneration of the optic nerve. This can lead to serious vision loss if not detected and treated early. Glaucoma is one of the leading causes of blindness in Canada.

Who Gets Glaucoma?

Glaucoma most often occurs in people over the age of 40. There is also a greater risk of developing glaucoma when you have diabetes, high blood pressure or a history of eye injuries.

Will You Go Blind from Glaucoma?

If diagnosed at an early stage, eyedrops and laser treatment can control glaucoma and little or no further vision loss should occur. If eyedrops are prescribed, they must be used always to control the eye pressure. If left untreated, peripheral vision is affected first, followed by central vision loss during late stages of the disease. Complete blindness may occur.

How is Glaucoma Detected?

A thorough eye examination is the first step to detecting glaucoma. Your optometrist will do a simple and painless procedure called tonometry during your routine eye exam, which measures the internal pressure of your eye.

How is Glaucoma Treated?

Treatment will depend on the type, severity and progress of the disease. It cannot be cured, but it can be controlled with daily eyedrops. Laser surgery is also an effective way to control glaucoma and maintain your remaining vision.

In more complicated cases, surgery may be needed to completely bypass the eye's natural drainage system. Once vision is lost due to glaucoma, it cannot be restored. This is why **regular preventive eye exams with your optometrist are important.**

How Often Should You Have an Eye Exam?

Most eye care professionals recommend a comprehensive eye exam every one to two years, depending on your age, risk factors and whether you currently wear eyeglasses or contact lenses. Children need regular eye exams to detect vision problems that may interfere with learning.

Poll finds Canadians cutting back on giving

DISTRICT (Special) – With inflation as a contributing factor, a new poll has found many Canadians plan to give less to charities in 2022.

CanadaHelps, the country's largest platform for donating and fundraising online, on February 23 announced the findings of a new Ipsos poll that highlights the impact of rising inflation on charitable giving.

According to the poll, most Canadians (74 per cent) are concerned about inflation and 17 per cent plan to give less to charities in 2022, citing the effects of inflation on their finances.

The number of Canadians that rely on charitable services in 2022 to meet their basic needs because of the pandemic or inflation could balloon from 11 per cent today to one in four (26 per cent).

Among the poll's findings:

- 25 per cent of Canadians plan to give less to charities in 2022 compared to 2021, including more than one in ten (12 per cent) who indicate that they will be donating less because they are specifically concerned about the effects of the pandemic on their finances.

- By comparison, just 15 per cent plan to give more to charities in 2022 than they did in 2021. Of those planning to give more, six per cent note their decision is influenced by the impact of inflation.

"The charitable sector is at a critical inflection point as rising inflation rates and pandemic challenges collide. Inflation is straining the most vulnerable communities in Canada, which also drives further demand for

charitable services," says Marina Glogovac, president and CEO of CanadaHelps. "These findings reveal inflation concerns will likely impact charitable giving when it is needed most."

With inflation reaching its highest level in 30 years, reaching 5.1 per cent in January 2022 (according to Statistics Canada) it is having a profound effect on Canadians. The vast majority (82 per cent) of Canadians expect their financial situation to be negatively impacted in some way. A sizeable proportion (15 per cent) of Canadians say they won't be able to afford necessities such as groceries, medicine, and gas, and 29 per cent would need to cut back on these essentials if the inflation rate continues to rise.

A majority (52 per cent) would need to reduce spending on non-essentials such as travel, entertainment, and eating out; while 33 per cent would need to reduce the amount they save, and 15 per cent would have to start using their savings to cover basic expenses. Around one in five (19 per cent) would have to reduce debt repayments.

- **To prevent smoking fires, you must be alert.** You will not be alert if you are sleepy, have consumed alcohol, drugs or medicine that makes you drowsy.
- **Never smoke in bed.**
- If people have been smoking in your home, **check behind chair and sofa cushions** for cigarette butts before going to bed.
- Use **large deep ashtrays** that cannot be knocked over.
- Empty ashes into a **metal container**—*not the garbage can*—and put it outside.
- **Do not extinguish cigarettes in plant pots**, which may contain a mixture of peat moss, shredded wood and bark that can easily ignite.
- Encourage smokers to **smoke outside.**
