# Record revenues

# **City renews** agreement for Bucke Park operation in '22

TEMISKAMING SHORES - Bucke Park recorded a successful 2021 season, with a financial surplus on the operating side, high occupancy rates, and a full marina.

It came only two years after the city had contemplated closing the campground and selling the property in the face of operating shortfalls and the need for capital improvements.

On March 1, council opted to renew the agreement for the 2022 season with Sylvain Gelineau, who ran it for the 2020 and '21 seasons.

"The park has operated with restrictions due to COVID-19 for each of those two years and despite those barriers, the park has seen record revenues and occupancy," wrote recreation director Matt Bahm in a report to city council.

"Sylvain and his designates have been excellent stewards of the park providing an increased level of maintenance and cleaning to the grounds which was noticed by users and staff."

Bahm noted that boats were also docked at the marina for the entire season.

It's a turnaround from 2019, when the city planned to sell the property.

After public outcry to keep the park in public the following year to a \$25,000 surplus. hands, council put the proposed sale on hold.

Negotiations between the municipality and the park's recreation committee resulted in an agreement under which Gelineau, a local business operator and committee member, has operated the park for the past two seasons.

Bucke Park also figured prominently in the municipality's 2020 recreation master plan, in which it was described as "an important regional and nature destination."

But the plan said that it also presents operational challenges. Among its recommendations was a long-term lease to experienced and stable operators.

#### said the park did well last season, both financially and from campers' perspectives.

The city must however still decide on the fate of the chalet, which remains closed.

A 2018 evaluation of the building found that exposure to moisture had caused "advanced deterioration" to the floor in the north section of the chalet.

Kidd said the city must decide whether the chalet should be torn down or repaired.



# NOSM, Université de Hearst to become independent universities

TORONTO (Special) - The Northern Ontario School of Medicine University (NOSM University) and Université de Hearst (Hearst) will become new, independent universities with degree-granting authority effective April 1.

"The Ontario government is committed to supporting high-quality post-secondary education in Northern Ontario," said Colleges and Universities Minister Jill Dunlop in a news release last week.

It recognizes, she said, that Northern institutions "are essential to ensuring we have a skilled workforce in the North, and by establishing NOSM University and Hearst as independent, publicly assisted universities, we will enable them to grow in ways that best serve their students and local communities."

NOSM, which had been affiliated with Laurentian University in Sudbury and Lakehead University in Thunder Bay, becomes Canada's first independent medical university.

Since its creation in 2005, it has to date produced 780 doctors, 55 of whom identify as Indigenous and 165 as francophone. Almost 700 residents have completed NOSM programs.

NOSM students complete more than 40 per cent of their training in Indigenous, small rural and larger urban Northern Ontario communities.

More than half of these medical practitioners have stayed in Northern Ontario. Hearst had been an affiliate of Laurentian University.

It's now one of only two Ontario universities that offer full-time degree programs and services exclusively in French and is the only university offering French-language programs in smaller Northern communities.

It becomes the second university in Ontario, since Université de l'Ontario français (UOF) opened its doors in September 2021, that is governed by and for

Since 2008-09, NOSM's student enrolment has increased by 58 per cent and Hearst's full-time student enrolment has nearly doubled.

As stand-alone, degree-granting institutions, NOSM University and Hearst now have independent governance and administration.

The province said it gives them the flexibility to expand and explore offering more programs in communities across Northern Ontario.

By providing more options for students, it said the institutions can support greater access to post-secondary education in the North, specifically medical training at NOSM University and French-language education at Hearst.

"This is a profound and historic moment for the NOSM community, and its impact will be felt across Northern Ontario and beyond," said Dr. Sarita Verma, president, vice chancellor and dean of NOSM University.

"All of us at the Université de Hearst are overjoyed by today's announcement," said university president Luc Bussières.

"Becoming fully independent, an important aspiration for our establishment, is a significant milestone. We will pursue the work we started 70 years ago with the entire Francophonie."

You don't have to be Irish to enjoy St. Patrick's Day with your family — you just have to be willing to have a little fun.







#### **March is Nutrition Month**

Diet is such an important part of mental health that is has inspired an entire field of medicine called nutritional psychiatry. What it boils down is that what we eat matters for every aspect of our health, but especially our mental

The following is referred to as the Mediterranean Diet (lifestyle) and is said to relieve depressive symptoms:

Physical Activity should be part of your everyday life.

Grains - You should choose whole grains over white grain products more often.

Fruits & Vegetables - Fresh fruits and vegetables are the best, but frozen and canned are also good choices during certain seasons or if you're on a budget.

**Legumes** (beans, peas and lentils) are also an excellent source of fibre which helps to lower blood sugars and cholesterol.

Nuts & Seeds help reduce LDL (bad cholesterol) and increase HDL (good cholesterol). A healthy portion of nuts is 10 almonds, 5 walnuts or 15 shelled pistachios.

Olive Oil is the major source of added fat rather than butter or lard.

Cheese and Yogurt are great sources of dairy to compliment daily milk consumption. It's important to choose low fat dairy products. Try 0-2% milk, 0-3% yogurt and less than 25% cheese more often.

Fish and Seafood should be eaten 2-3 times/week. **Poultry** is an excellent protein source.

Eggs contain a large amount of saturated fat (found in the yolk) so should not be eaten daily, but a few times per week is okay.

Sweets & treats are okay in moderation for most people with the exception of those with diabetes or cardiovascular disease.

Red meats include beef, pork, goat and lamb. These should only be eaten 1-2 times per month. Red meat is hard for our bodies to digest and is high in saturated fat.

**Alcohol in moderation** — men should limit drinks to no more than 1-2 per day and women 0-1 drink per day. (1 drink =1 beer, 4 oz of wine or 1.5 oz of liquor)

Regardless of what is IN your favorite diet, make sure you get the junk OUT. Your brain, your metabolism, and your whole body will be happier and healthier.

# **Battery Materials Park** study gets FedNor funding

NORTH COBALT (Staff) -FedNor is investing \$250,000 to assist with a study on expanding the cobalt refinery east of North Cobalt to create a battery materials park.

The announcement that Electra Battery Materials Corporation will be receiving the funding assistance to complete a scoping study to expand the refinery was made February 23 by Nipissing-Timiskaming MP Anthony Rota, along with Patty Hajdu, the Minister of Indigenous Services and Minister responsible for FedNor, accompanied by François-Philippe Champagne, the Minister of Innovation, Science and Industry.

The funding is being flowed through FedNor's Regional Economic Growth through Innovation program, and will enable Electra to evaluate the technical requirements, risks and benefits associated with continued development and completion of the battery materials park over the next three

# DTSSAB gets increased funding to deal with homelessness

TORONTO (Special) - April 1 will see the launch of the Homelessness Prevention Program in Ontario.

It includes an investment of \$727,900 into the District of Timiskaming Social Services Administration Board to help more people experiencing or at risk of homelessness find the right housing services and other supports. This funding is an increase of over \$73,000 from the 2021-22 year.

The Homelessness Prevention Program (HPP) will combine three programs: Community Homelessness Prevention Initiative, Home for Good, and the Strong Communities Rent Supplement Program.

Vic Fedeli, Nipissing MPP and Minister of Economic Development, Job Creation and Trade, made the announcement in a press release March 7.

The new investments can be used to fund the operation of supportive housing units created through the province's \$1 billion Social Services Relief

"Through the Social Services Relief Fund, the provincial government is helping to create approximately 1,200 new supportive housing units," according to the statement.

The Ontario government is also providing the Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness with up to \$600,000 in 2022-2023 to deliver by-name list training and implementation support related to the HPP.

The program is a direct response to feedback from the 2020-2021 Supportive Housing Consultation. The changes made through the creation of the new program address recommendations in the Auditor General's 2021 value-formoney audit on homelessness.


"The new program will simplify and streamline operations so municipal service managers can spend less time on paperwork and more time working with their clients," it was noted.

Access to this funding will be based on having in place a by-name list that meets the provincial requirements and contains detailed, up-to-date information from individuals experiencing homelessness to help connect them to local sup-

The government is also investing an additional \$6.7 million in the Indigenous Supportive Housing Program, bringing the total annual investment to \$30 million.

additional funding The brings Ontario's total yearly investment in the program to close to \$464 million.

"By simplifying the delivery of services and increasing funding, our government is helping our municipal partners spend more time focusing on providing vulnerable people in our Northern communities with the supports they need to stay in their homes or find housing," said Fedeli.




