Enbridge Gas feeds setting up in Cobalt

COBALT - Enbridge Gas will be undertaking maintenance work on a section of exposed natural gas pipeline in the South Wabi Creek waterway west of Haileybury.

"This pipeline serves the communities of Haileybury and Cobalt," said Andrea Stass, Enbridge Gas manager of external communications and media relations in an email interview.

Enbridge has told the City of Temiskaming Shores and the Town of Haileybury that it has a plan to ensure natural gas demand in the two communities will continue to be met during the project.

"As the spring thaw approaches, we have developed a three-stage plan to address potential impacts to the pipeline from water and ice," said Stass.

"Public safety and maintaining customer gas service are our top priorities.

"First, we have implemented temporary safety measures while we execute on a longer-term solution, including working with an engineering consultant and other partners to implement a continuous monitoring program for this section of exposed pipeline."

She said the company's engineering and operations teams "have developed a plan for a permanent solution which we will begin to implement within the coming weeks. This plan involves: tak-*Continued on page 3*

Thoughts, feelings and behaviours related to managing food and weight can begin to interfere with everyday activities. When we focus too much attention on our bodies and our eating, these thoughts can quickly lead to missed opportunities in other parts of our lives.

DID YOU KNOW?

- The most common age of onset is between 14 and 25 years of age, however the disorders are being seen more and more in children as young as 10 years of
- It's estimated that 3% of women will be affected by eating disorders in their lifetime;
- In a recent study, 27% of Ontario girls 12-18 years of age were reported to be engaged in severely problematic food and weight behaviour;
- Eating disorders are now the third most common chronic illness in adolescent girls;
- The death rate associated with anorexia nervosa alone is more than 12 times higher than the overall death rate among young women in the general population;
- Recent studies show that 25% of eating disorder cases occur in young boys and men

If the way you eat and think about food interferes with your life and keeps you from enjoying life and moving forward, then that is disordered eating. Take it seriously and talk to someone who can help.

ing the exposed section of pipeline out of service; maintaining customers' gas service with a mobile supply of compressed natural gas which will feed into the local distribution system from another location.

"The final step will be to install a new section of pipeline beneath the required depth of soil cover, connect it to the existing pipeline and return the pipeline back into service. This work is expected to take place through the spring and summer of 2022. This plan will not require an interruption in customers' gas service."

Stass noted that Enbridge is working closely with the communities of Haileybury

and Cobalt to coordinate and will supply compressed their plan.

COMPRESSED GAS

The project will be taking place on the Enbridge line on the west side of Highway 11, off Mowat Landing Road.

Enbridge Gas will be setting up an alternative site to deliver natural gas to the line through portable compressed gas feeds which will be set up behind the former Cobalt arena.

In her report to Temiskaming Shores city manager Chris Oslund, which was shared with council, city municipal clerk Logan Belanger stated that "trucks operated by Certus (based in Timmins), will be parked outside of the former Cobalt arena,

gas to feed the demands of each community, to ensure there are no interruptions in service. During colder weather there will be three trucks daily, and during warmer weather one truck per day.

"They are currently in the process of gaining TSSA (Technical Standards and Safety Authority) approval. Certus will be providing 24/7 remote monitoring, and Enbridge would be part of the emergency response. Enbridge ensured the safety and security of the system (robust locks on the trucks, etc.); however, (we) will be investigating temporary fencing and/or security."

Gas price pressures

The cost of living in Canada and in this region is upward trending as gas and food prices soar in 2022.

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

In most cases, the best thing to do in a home fire is to get everyone out of the home immediately and call the fire department from outside:

- · Make sure working smoke alarms are installed on every storey of the home and outside all sleeping areas.
- Everyone in the home should practice a home fire escape plan so everyone knows what to do BEFORE a fire occurs.

Many people who decide to purchase a fire extinguisher might not know how or when to use them.

Fire extinguishers should be used only by people who have been trained to use them. People are encouraged to contact their local fire department if they would like fire extinguisher training or have any questions.

The following tips can help people who are thinking about buying a fire extinguisher for their home:

- Consider purchasing a fire extinguisher that has an ABC rating. This type can be used for most types of fires.
- Choose a fire extinguisher that has the logo of an independent, accredited product safety testing agency such as ULC.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions regarding where the extinguisher should be placed in the home.
- · Inspect the fire extinguisher once a month and have it serviced by a certified technician every year.
- Fire extinguishers should be used only on small, contained fires. Never let the fire get between you and the exit.

To operate a fire extinguisher, remember the acronym PASS:

- Pull the pin;
- · Aim the nozzle at the base of the fire;
- Squeeze the trigger;
- Sweep the extinguisher from side to side until the extinguisher is empty.
- Know when to go. If the fire does not go out after using one fire extinguisher, back out of the area, close the door if possible, and safely get outside and call 9-1-1.
- Remember that many stovetop fires can be safely extinguished without the use of a fire extinguisher. If a pot on the stove starts on fire, slide a lid over the pot to smother the flames and turn off the stove. Leave the pot in place until it has cooled completely.


March Break Scavenger Hunt at the Library
