



## Recovering costs

### Program helps communities when they help each other

DISTRICT - Since the summer of 2018 there has been a question hanging in the air locally about how municipalities should be compensated when their firefighters respond to emergency situations in neighbouring unincorporated townships.

The question came to light when the James Township (Elk Lake) volunteer firefighters were asked to assist the Emergency Measures Services (EMS) to bring a patient out of a wilderness setting in an unincorporated township neighbouring Elk Lake.

Firefighters were able to reach the patient and were able to successfully deliver her to the paramedics waiting at the road.

EMS is administered by the District of Timiskaming Social Services Administration Board (DTSS-AB), and DTSSAB also receives funding through the provincial government for provision of services to the unincorporated townships.

James Township sent a bill to DTSSAB for its services that day, but the claim was denied by DTSSAB and has been a matter of ongoing discussion since that time.

Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM) president Danny Whalen said he was approached last year by Doug Jelly, who was the chair of DTSSAB at that time, who outlined the issue.

"It was his understanding that (DTSSAB) didn't have the authority to pay it out, but you can't expect your volunteers to go out in the unincorporated (townships) and not recoup their cost," said Whalen in a telephone interview.

Jelly asked Whalen if he could take the matter to the provincial ministers through FONOM. Whalen raised the matter with the provincial ministers last summer at a meeting on a number of issues.

"Our volunteers will never deny service to anybody but it's not fair that they're risking themselves when they do it," said Whalen.

He added that it was also discovered that when

the volunteer firefighters travelled into unincorporated townships on response work, their Workplace Safety and Insurance Board benefits would stop.

Whalen said the provincial ministers indicated that they understood the issue and promised to look into it.

He reminded them of it in January at the Rural Ontario Municipal Association meeting and was told that an announcement was forthcoming.

The newly announced Northern Fire Protection Program will provide compensation when firefighters attend events such as structure fires, car-

bon monoxide related incidents, search and rescue operations, emergency medical care, vehicle collisions occurring on roads that are not provincial highways, and hazardous materials requests.

"Through this reimbursement program, the province is allocating funds to help northern municipalities recover costs associated with responses into areas without fire protection services such as search and rescue, medical, motor vehicle collision and property fires that are not covered by any other funding agreements," the government announced in its press release.




EJ Harnden will join Team Gushue as fifth in Vegas at the Worlds.



# Winged wonders

I saw a flock of 30 to 40 snow buntings at the New Liskeard waterfront, near the parked ice huts.

They shimmered as they rose up in the air happily flitting here and there.

I thought of Indigenous author Richard Wagamese's quote about birds: "My people say the birds are child spirits, the song of them is the innocent, exuberant joy of children. In the splash of late winter sunshine they're gleeful."

The birds lifted my spirits as I watched them gleefully flying around searching for food.

Snow buntings are called Nomads of the North because they move about so much and

they originate in the Arctic regions.

During the winter months they migrate to southern destinations for food sources and warmer temperatures.

I love the gold, black and white characteristics of their plumage and the tiny, soft eyes they have.

We must always keep ourselves open to the presence of wonder, which can happen at any time. In my world, wonder often involves watching birds or the sound of children's laughter.

The national bird of Ukraine is the white stork and as I watched the snow buntings my mind went to human matters.

Just as the birds are migrating so are the people of Ukraine, but not willingly.

Watching the birds brought home to me the idea of freedom and how we take it for granted here in Canada.

We cannot imagine what it would be like to be forced from our homes and have our communities bombed into ruins.

Ordinary Ukrainians are seeking the simplest of things - freedom from fear, food and a safe place to live.

I have spoken with many people who are rightfully concerned about the war in Ukraine and the ongoing civilian casualties, many of them

children.

One friend told me she was worried about the world in which her grandson is growing up in. Another said they did not understand why NATO is not taking a stronger stance against the Russian aggression.

The mechanisms of war are not within our capacity of understanding and it is like singing in the rain isn't it?

You can't stop the wind and rain but you can still find happiness in the midst of absurdity.

I wonder about the hubris of the western world to believe we can rid the planet of predators like Vladimir Putin.

However, at the same time, we see heroes emerge like Ukrainian president Volodymyr Zelenskyy.

People need to be encouraged and reminded of how wonderful and brave they are.

Please, let's just take good care of each other, hold each other tight because none of us likes living in fear. It is not a healthy way to live.

Be kind to the folks who love and lift you up and champion those around you as if humanity depends on it. Because it does.

Organizers say they have provided the best and most enjoyable craft beer festival in the region for the last four years and this year's event will live up to the previous events and promises to be better than ever.


The event is held to raise funds for local not-for-profit charities in the region with the







## Public library services return to Haileybury

TEMISKAMING SHORES

– Looking for a veterinary or geology textbook? A specialized health publication? How about a picture book for a

youngster or a DVD for family movie night?

They're all available at the Northern College campus in Haileybury, where a satellite branch of the Temiskaming Shores Public Library is now open.

Thanks to a new and unique partnership, all holders of a city library card – including college staff and students – can access the collections of both institutions.

The re-opening of a public library branch in Haileybury has been a long time coming.

The former branch on Lakeshore Road, together with the downtown branch in New Liskeard, were closed as operations were consolidated in a single location in the former New Liskeard medical clinic on Whitewood Avenue.

The new library opened in the fall of 2020.

However, discussions had begun in 2018 on the possibility of the college hosting a satellite library location in Haileybury, and an agreement

with the city was reached late in 2019.

Plans were put on hold just weeks later, however, when the pandemic struck in March 2020.

But earlier this month, the Haileybury branch reopened in the college's library.

Brigid Wilkinson, now chair of the Temiskaming Shores library board, had taken part in community consultations on the future of the city's library.

"One of the biggest things we wanted to ensure was that the libraries remained in the core of the communities and were open and accessible to everyone, that we're not building a new mega-complex on the edge of town that people need to drive to get to," she told the audience at the March 7 grand opening.

When the college campus was proposed, "I said, 'well, let's stop looking, this has got to be it, this is what makes the most sense.'"

The arrangement is "a collaboration between publicly

funded organizations," she said.

In addition to an efficient use of resources, "we're creating beautiful spaces that are open to our communities and accessible to everyone," she said.

"We're about community," said Audrey Penner, president and CEO of Northern College, after the formal ribbon cutting.

The arrangement has already sparked discussions on a similar arrangement involving the Timmins campus, she said.

### RESOURCES

Users will have access to both the college's resources and the public library's.

The latter's collection numbers about 4,000 items at the Haileybury location, said Rebecca Hunt, library CEO and head librarian.

They include English-language fiction and non-fiction and French-language fiction; books for children, junior readers and young adults; and about 400 DVDs.

# Ice huts must be off Lake Temiskaming by March 31

DISTRICT (Staff) — Anglers have until Thursday, March 31, to remove their ice huts from Lake Temiskaming, which is in Fisheries Management Zone 12.

Ice huts must be removed from area waterways by March 31, with the exception of portable ice huts made of cloth or synthetic fabric that are seven metres in size or less.

There could be fines for ice huts left on area lakes that fall through the ice and create an en-

vironmental disaster for aquatic life and pose a hazard to area boaters.

Anglers are being asked to remove their huts while the ice conditions are still safe to do so.

# Enbridge Gas beginning work on gas line

DISTRICT (Staff) - Enbridge Gas is currently undertaking maintenance-related work on a section of natural gas pipeline serving Haileybury and Cobalt, area municipalities have been advised.

“Public safety and maintaining customer gas service are our top priorities,” the company stated in an email issued March 21.

Enbridge Gas will be using a mobile supply of compressed natural gas to ensure there is no interruption in the gas service to the public during the work process.

“A temporary compressed natural gas site has been established at the former Cobalt arena, and compressed natural gas will be shipped to the site by truck as needed. The mobile compressed natural gas site is on standby to be placed in operation when needed. The area will be fenced and monitored as a safety precaution while in operation,” Enbridge Gas stated in its email.

This work is expected to continue through the spring and summer of 2022. Enbridge Gas has assured that it will keep the communities apprised as the project goes forward.

The work will be taking place west of Highway 11 in the South Wabi Creek waterway, which is located off Mowat Landing Road.

The company explained that “compressed natural gas is compressed using pressure so that it takes up less space and can be used as a portable energy supply. Compressed natural gas has many uses, including as a low-carbon fuel for vehicles, to supply affordable energy to industries in remote locations that are not served by transmission pipelines, or as a temporary supply of natural gas into existing distribution systems to maintain service during maintenance work. This is a safe and established mobile energy distribution process, which is governed by safety standards and practices.”

New materials will be brought in over time. But users can also request items from the New Liskeard library, and they’ll be delivered to Haileybury.

Card holders will have access to all the public library’s resources, Hunt said.

Materials can be borrowed

from and returned to either location.

The campus location also offers three computer stations for public access, and signs will be installed indicating three parking spots for library use.

The Haileybury satellite branch will be open during the college library’s regular hours.

Brenda Morissette, library technician at the college campus, is looking forward to seeing new faces.

“It’s awesome to meet people,” she said.

A grand opening for the New Liskeard library, meanwhile, has yet to be scheduled.

### Mediterranean Diet – Clarification Provided

It’s come to my attention that last week’s article regarding the Mediterranean Diet being a healthy option for some may require some correction and/or clarification. Please accept my apologies if this article offended anyone and remember that this is simply one lifestyle (way of eating) that is said to be suitable for individuals suffering from depressive symptoms and other disorders.

Several points that I have been asked to provide clarification on are:

- Eggs;
- Sweets and Treats; and
- Red Meats

According to the Dietitians of Canada, following a Mediterranean diet has many health benefits and may help to:

- Reduce your risk of developing heart disease
- Lower blood cholesterol levels
- Lower blood pressure
- Improve blood glucose control for individuals with type 2 diabetes; and
- Early research shows that it may prevent or improve symptoms of rheumatoid arthritis, Alzheimer’s, dementia, and glaucoma. It may also help maintain brain health.

Specific to eggs and this particular way of eating, the recommendation is up to two to four eggs every week.

Choose red meat and processed meat less often.

- Include no more than two servings (2 ½ oz) of red meat each week or no more than 16 oz per month. Examples of red meat include goat, beef, pork and lamb.
- Limit processed meat to a maximum of one serving each week, i.e., hot dogs, sausages, deli meats, salami and bacon

Limit sweets such as candies, pastries, desserts and sweetened pop or sweetened juice to two servings per week or less or save them for special occasions.

The foods in a typical Mediterranean diet – fish, nuts, plant oils, fruits and vegetables – help lower inflammation in your body and improve blood vessel function. These benefits help to keep your heart healthy and your mind sharp.

— A healing ceremony inside a tee pee involving cedar, tobacco, water, smudging, drumming, singing and prayers marked International Women's Day at Keeper's of the Circle Aboriginal Family Learning Centre in New Liskeard on March 8.

It's a globally recognized day to celebrate the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women.

Matachewan First Nation member/Indigenous knowledge carrier Lynne Cormier led the ceremony with approximately 20 women in attendance.

"I follow the seven grandfather teachings, we are here today to hold a healing ceremony to honour our elder who has been sick and to honour all women today," said Cormier.

Darlene Skani, the New Liskeard Keepers of the Circle

Indigenous Family Support Worker, helped to organize the healing ceremony.

"I was asked to plan an event for International Women's Day (IWD), so immediately a ceremony came to mind," explained Skani.

Keepers of the Circle has locations in New Liskeard and Kirkland Lake providing services such as early learning and childcare, family support, cultural activities with a focus on Indigenous Women's Leadership and economic security.

Skani asked her coworkers from Kirkland Lake and New Liskeard to help collaborate on the idea for IWD to honour all women, "Our sisters in spirit and our elder who has been ill recently."

Skani said she felt a healing ceremony was a good idea after she had just dealt with the loss of her father and she recognized the need for healing for so many others going through difficult issues in their lives.

"I reached out to Lynne Cormier and asked if she could host the healing ceremony for us and she completely agreed we were in need of one as well. She said yes right away and did a truly amazing job. We would love to thank the community for their support."

Cormier asked each woman in attendance to talk about why they had come to the event.

She smudged each participant and passed around cedar and tobacco to the women as part of a prayer offering to be placed in a yellow piece of cloth on the ground.

She also performed a water ceremony talking about the spirituality of water.

She led a drumming and singing session with several of the women helping out, which was both emotional and moving.

For those in attendance mask and hand sanitizer were offered and attendees were asked to observe social distancing practices and sign in.







## Enbridge Gas Notice of Maintenance Work

Enbridge Gas is currently undertaking maintenance-related work on a section of natural gas pipeline serving Haileybury and Cobalt.

Public safety and maintaining customer gas service are our top priorities.

A mobile supply of compressed natural gas (CNG) will be used to serve customers through the local pipeline system and avoid interruption as we undertake this work. A temporary CNG site has been established at the former Cobalt Arena, and CNG will be shipped to the site by truck as needed. The mobile CNG site is on standby to be placed in operation when needed. The area will be fenced and monitored as a safety precaution while in operation.

This work is expected to continue through the spring and summer of 2022. Enbridge will provide updates as the work progresses.

### Q&A

Will this work impact my natural gas service?

This plan will not require an interruption in customers gas service, and customers do not need to take any action.

### What is Compressed Natural Gas and is it safe?

Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) is natural gas that has been compressed using pressure so that it takes up less space and can be used as a portable energy supply. CNG has many uses, including as a low-carbon fuel for vehicles, to supply affordable energy to industries in remote locations that are not served by transmission pipelines, or as a temporary supply of natural gas into existing distribution systems to maintain service during maintenance work. This is safe and established mobile energy distribution process, which is governed by safety standards and practices.

### Is the CNG site secure?

Public safety is a top priority for Enbridge. The CNG site will be fenced and monitored as a safety precaution, while it is in operation.

To minimize the risk of fire and burn injury, the fire service recommends the following cottage fire safety tips:

Install smoke alarms on every storey and outside all sleeping areas. It's the law for all Ontario homes, cottages, cabins and seasonal homes to have working smoke alarms on every storey and outside all sleeping areas.

Test smoke alarms at least monthly or each time you return to the cottage. Pack a new smoke alarm and extra smoke alarm batteries in case they need replacement.

- 🕒 Install and ensure carbon monoxide alarms in your cottage if it has a fuel-burning appliance.
- 🕒 Develop and practice a home fire escape plan to ensure everyone knows what to do if the smoke alarm sounds.
- 🕒 Know the telephone number for the local fire department and your cottage's emergency sign number, in case of emergency.
- 🕒 Clean barbecues before using them. Keep an eye on lit barbecues and ensure all combustibles, as well as children and pets are kept well away from them. Fires can happen when barbecues are left unattended.
- 🕒 Keep barbecue lighters and matches out of sight and reach of children.
- 🕒 Remember to bring a flashlight with extra batteries.
- 🕒 Check heating appliances and chimneys before using them.
- 🕒 Check with your local fire department, municipality, or Ministry of Natural Resources to determine whether open air burning is permitted before having a campfire or burning brush. If open burning is allowed, fires should be built on bare soil or on exposed rock. Remove leaves and twigs from around the fire to keep it from spreading. Always keep a bucket of water, sand, or even a shovel close by and supervise the fire at all times.
- 🕒 If you must smoke, do so outside. Keep a large can with water nearby so cigarette butts can be safely discarded. If you drink, do so responsibly. Tobacco use and excessive alcohol consumption are contributing factors in many fires and can lead to serious injuries.
- 🕒 Burn candles in sturdy candleholders that will not tip and are covered with a glass shade. When you go out, blow out!




# BUT HE DOES!
