Poetry anthology to raise funds for Ukraine

COBALT (Staff) - Two volumes of poetry - *Poets for Ukraine*, Volumes 1 and 2 - are being produced locally as a fundraiser to supply aid to Ukraine.

The poetry anthology project is being coordinated by David Brydges of Cobalt. All book sales will go to A Second Front Ukraine Foundation, a non-profit organization in Toronto that is raising funds to send aid to Ukraine.

In a press release, Brydges said that 51 poets from eight countries have submitted poems for both anthology volumes.

Poets are also posting poetry on social media sites in Ukraine, and Brydges has set up a Facebook page, Poets for Ukraine, where he has been posting poetry as other poets from around the

world also share their work.

"As the Ukraine crisis was unfolding, I was looking for ways poets could be engaged when I heard Penn Kemp, London's former poet laureate, was creating an anthology, *Poems in Response to Peril*," Brydges related.

The volumes of poetry include poems by local poets Jerry Jordison, Marvyn Morrison and Brydges, along with others who have submitted works.

Haileybury artist Laura Landers has donated her artwork, *Flowers for Peace*, for the book cover.

A local creative team has been assembled to produce the book.

War Amps 2022 key tag mailing begins

DISTRICT (Special) - The War Amps begins its 2022 key tag mailing to Northeastern Ontario this week with the theme "You Make Our Programs Possible."

This is illustrated through the story of 12-year-old Cooper Tidmarsh who lost part of his right leg in a lawn mower accident. Cooper, a member of The War Amps Child Amputee (CHAMP) Program,

receives financial assistance for artificial limbs and devices and also attends regional seminars where Champs and their parents learn about the latest in artificial limbs, dealing with teasing and staring, as well as parenting an amputee child.

The Key Tag Service was launched in 1946 so that returning war amputee veterans could not only work for competitive wages, but also

provide a service to Canadians that would generate funds for the Association's many programs, including CHAMP.

The Key Tag Service continues to employ amputees and people with disabilities, and has returned more than 1.5 million sets of lost keys to their owners.

Each key tag has a confidentially coded number. If you lose your keys, the finder can call the toll-free number on the back of the tag or place them in any mailbox in Canada, and The War Amps will return them to you by courier, free of charge.

The War Amps receives no government grants and its programs are possible through public support of the Key Tag and Address Label Service.





May is Bladder Cancer Awareness Month

DID YOU KNOW?

- There are more than 80,000 Canadians living with bladder cancer
- Bladder cancer is the fifth most common cancer in Canada
- 8,700 Canadians will be diagnosed with bladder cancer this year
- The biggest warning sign of bladder cancer is blood in the urine
- Smoking is a common risk factor, as are age and work related exposure to specific chemicals

SYMPTOMS:

The most common symptom of bladder cancer is blood in the urine. The colour may vary from pale yellow-red to bright or rusty red. Blood may always be in the urine, or it may come and go. Sometimes the blood can only be seen with a microscope or found with other urine tests.

Other symptoms include:

- The need to pee often (also called urinary frequency)
- An intense need to pee (also called urinary urgency)
- Trouble peeing
- A burning sensation or pain when you pee
- Back, pelvic or groin pain

Because the disease may have progressed unnoticed, it is critical to see a health care provider once you begin to experience symptoms. Since many symptoms are similar to other medical conditions, bladder cancer is often misdiagnosed as, for example, a urinary tract infection. If you are concerned, ask your health care provider for a referral to a urologist to rule out bladder cancer.

If you are a patient of the Temagami FHT and are having symptoms, please call to schedule an appointment with your primary care provider— (705) 569-3244. It may very well not be bladder cancer, but these symptoms could be the result of a urinary tract infection which also needs to be diagnosed and treated accordingly.

Some not exercising restraint: OPP

NORTH BAY (Special/Staff) – Some people still aren't buckling up.

During the four-day enforcement campaign on the Easter weekend, the OPP across Northeastern Ontario paid special attention to the use of seatbelts, car seats and boosters.

Officers conducted 1,330 traffic stops and issued 48 seatbelt-related charges.

“While the majority of drivers and passengers understand the lifesaving value of seatbelts, we continue to see drivers and passengers who choose not to buckle up,” said acting traffic inspector Ray St-Pierre, regional traffic manager, in a news release.

“It’s important to remember that seatbelts assist in preventing fatalities as well as minimizing injuries in the event of a collision,” St-Pierre continued.

He said a seatbelt used properly plays “a key role” in keeping you within the so-called engineered life space of the vehicle, which is designed to handle collisions and protect occupants.

That in turn “increases your chances of survival,” he said.

The OPP said everyone in a vehicle must wear a seatbelt properly and children must be secured in a child car seat or booster, depending on their age and size.

Drivers are also responsible for ensuring all passengers under the age of 16 are properly secured.





Nomination forms must be filed, either in person or by your agent, with the Returning Officer of the appropriate Municipality during normal office hours between the first business day of May in 2022 to Thursday August 18, 2022. On Nomination Day (Friday August 19, 2022) forms must be filed between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Candidates for municipal council in municipalities with more than 4,000 electors, must submit original endorsement signatures from 25 people who are eligible to vote in the municipality, made on the prescribed form available at your Municipal Office. Candidates for municipal council in municipalities with 4,000 or fewer electors do not have to submit endorsement signatures.

The required filing fee is \$200.00 for the Head of Council, and \$100.00 for all other offices. Payments can be made in cash, **debit/credit (if available)**, cheque or money order made payable to the appropriate municipality (or by an **electronic method of payment that the Clerk specifies**) and must accompany the signed form. Full details on the procedures to be followed may be obtained from the appropriate Municipal Clerk.

Hospital maintaining visitor restrictions for now

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special) – The COVID-19 outbreak is over at Temiskaming Hospital, but visitor restrictions remain in place for now.

“While the news that the outbreak cases have been resolved is welcomed, our hospital continues to see increasing hospitalizations for COVID patients,” said hospital president and CEO Mike Baker in a press release earlier this week.

“As a result, we will retain our current temporary restrictions on care partner visitations and patient leaves and re-assess removing some or all of those restrictions next Monday, May 2.”

- All in-patient areas of the hospital are temporarily closed to visitors and designated care partners for long-term care and acute-care patients until further notice.

- Designated care partners are still allowed for palliative, obstetrical and pediatric patients.

- Care partners are also allowed to accompany out-patients who need support due to physical, intellectual, cognitive and emotional conditions or who need a substitute decision-maker while at the hospital for appointments, tests, procedures or emergency care.

- Care partners must show proof of vaccination and identification prior to entering the facility.

- All designated care partners must pass the screening questionnaire administered by screening agents prior to entry.

“I continue to urge the public to be kind and respectful of all our staff as we do everything we can to protect you, your loved ones and our staff,” Baker continued.

The hospital noted that it’s working with the Timiskaming Health Unit to ensure best practices are being followed.

Hilliardton Marsh hosts bird banding and tours

beak is yellow in colour and they have a dark spot in the middle of their grayish white breast,” explained Murphy.

He said the tiny birds would only be staying in the area near the Marsh for two to three weeks and then they head to the Arctic to breed during summer months.

Murphy had the morning crowd laughing when he told them the most unusual things they have caught in the mist nets at the Marsh.

“We found a hot dog and one of our Grade 9 students got part of her clothing caught in the net. The hot dog likely came from a trapped birds mouth.”

Gignac began banding the tree sparrows outside, while visitors looked on.

She has a Master’s Degree

in Marsh Management and was hired as the lead intern for 2022.

WINGED SYMPHONY

“Today a symphony of birds will come together. The bands we use have come in nine different numbers and the data we collect goes into a national registry.”

The age of the birds is determined by looking at the shape of the tail feathers “but not the sex of a tree swallow,” said Gignac.

Visitors learned the tiny bands placed on the birds legs are like license plates on a car, so when they show up at other banding stations there will be data already collected on them.

Probably one of the most joyous parts of a banding session is when visitors can hold a bird and then release it back into the wild.

Murphy instructed participants on how to properly hold a bird by the legs in a scissor-like fashion using their fingers.

Murphy said one of the most unusual birds caught in the nets at the Marsh includes a yellow-headed blackbird normally found on the west coast of Canada.

He mentioned that the Marsh is entirely man-made and a unique feature of the berms is that people can look down into the waters and see a variety of species of ducks, red winged blackbirds, kingfisher, swallow, black terns, bitterns and other birds who make the Marsh their summer home.

Marsh volunteers will be tending to bar duties at the upcoming Temiskaming Shores Ducks Unlimited Canada Conservation Dinner and Auction April 30 at the Horne Gran-

ite Club. As a result of COVID-19, important fundrais-

ers for the Marsh were put on hold, so the Ducks Unlimited event is a feather in the cap of the Marsh members.



RVs, Trailers and Campers: Propane and Barbecue Safety Tips

When Transporting Cylinders:

- Ensure propane cylinders are upright and secure during transport.
- Keep cylinder valves closed and protected during transport.
- Plug or cap cylinder outlets during transport.

When Using Cylinders:

- Ensure cylinders are upright and secure on a firm footing.
- Check cylinder connections and hoses for leaks by brushing a 50/50 mix of liquid soap and water onto all connections and hoses. Rising bubbles when you turn on the valve indicate a leak. Tighten connections or repair the hose until there are no bubbles.
- Keep cylinders away from flame, heat, and exits.

Using Propane in your RV or Camper:

- Keep all combustion exhaust vents on the exterior wall of your RV or camper clear of obstructions.
- Use stovetop burners or ovens only for cooking and not as a source of heat.
- Propane appliances require an adequate supply of fresh air for proper combustion. Ensure your RV or camper is properly ventilated to prevent build-up of carbon monoxide.
- Install a carbon monoxide alarm and propane leak detector.

Barbecue Safety:

- Ensure barbecues are on firm, level footing.
- Keep barbecues well away from the side of your RV, camper or tent, and other combustibles.
- Make sure igniter buttons work properly before turning the gas on. If there is no igniter, insert a long match or barbecue lighter through the side burner hole before you turn on the grill controls.
- Keep barbecues clean of grease to prevent flare-ups.
- Stay by the grill when cooking and keep kids and pets at a safe distance.
- Turn off all burner controls and tank valves after each use.






