Busy year ahead

Armstrong planning infrastructure improvements

ARMSTRONG TOWNSHIP - Two - possibly three - large projects are in the works for Armstrong Township in 2022.

The township is planning for improvements at its municipal park in Earlton, including the replacement of one of its pavilions with a more modern design.

Armstrong is also planning for upgrades to its municipal office building. Improvements will also overflow into the library area with improved heating and ventilation and lighting.

The third major project, which could be pushed back to another year, is the reconstruction of the building attached to the municipal pool.

A funding application for the park project has been made to FedNor, said township clerk-treasurer administrator Amy Vickery-Menard in a telephone interview.

The project includes the rehabilitation of park pathways, and the rehabilitation of the ballpark bleachers and benches, she said.

Englehart High School students under the guidance of teacher Marc Gorecki have constructed four dugouts for the park. The dugouts will provide shade for kids between innings at baseball games, as well as a place to hang their belongings, Vickery-Menard outlined.

The pavilion nearest the main playground structure will be replaced with an open-sided structure on a concrete foundation. There will also be lighting and electrical hook-ups in the new pavilion which will be 16 feet by 40 feet in size.

"We're hoping it's going to be constructed before the end of this season. We're working on the final design of the pavilion. Hopefully the design will go out for bid shortly."

The pavilion is being designed by Francis Rivard Drafting and Design. It's estimated cost is

approximately \$182,000, which could be impacted by inflation and other factors.

MUNI OFFICE

The municipality is also planning improvements at its municipal office building, which also houses the township's library.

Armstrong is currently waiting for the HVAC (Heating, ventilation and air conditioning) design before the contract is finalized, said Vickery-Menard.

The township will use its COVID-19 Resiliency

Fund of \$100,000, made available through the federal government, toward the ventilation improvements in the building. The furnaces need to be replaced as well, said Vickery-Menard.

A service delivery review, which included an information technology plan, was conducted. A staffing restructuring was also carried out under an organization review. The space in the building is being reconfigured with that in mind, and to improve privacy. Continued on page 6



Don McKelvey's Story

Friday, May 6, 2022

I was a school kid at that time and at 3:30pm we were all sent home because the smoke was so thick you could hardly see across the school room. At that time we lived in a large, 13 room house on Welllington street with expansive lawns – so a lot of neighbours congregated on the lawn (It was a very hot day). We were joined by some neighbours including the Wesley McKnights, the C.B. Stevenson family and others. My parents, Angus and Jessie McKelvie and my three sisters, Jean Helen and Winnifred.

My father who was chairman of the hospital board left to try to save the hospital. He and Dr. A.C. Farlinger and the McCollough brothers [both doctors], amongst others, got on the roof of the hospital and sprayed water on the roof. It was a dangerous exercise as they were completely surrounded by a roaring fire with very strong winds. In fact most of the buildings west of the railway tracks were completely burned, but they did save the hospital. It was a blessing as it quickly filled the next day with patients suffering from typhoid fever and burn cases. The buildings of the Wabi Iron Works were also saved.

However, when my father left he instructed us to run for the lake "when the back kitchen was on fire". He was a very jovial character, who always looked on the brighter side of things.

Mrs. S.C. MacDonald who lived on Paget St. suddenly remembered that she meant to save her fur coat and she commissioned young Jonny Stevenson and me to rush to her house and return with her coat. Well we rushed away, but not to her house, bur rather to the Railway Station to the scene of action. When we returned two hours later we were severely reprimanded.

The scene at the railroad was an inferno. The air was filled with flying ember which ignited dozens of wooden shingled roofs on the east side of the tracks. No sooner would a roof catch on fire when you would see firemen climbing ladders and extinguishing the flames. Consequently only two homes on the east side of the tracks were lost.

New Liskeard was spared the devastation that hit Haileybury for two reasons: First the water pressure was maintained in New Liskeard, while it failed in Haileybury. Secondly the roaring winds suddenly changed direction from west to north. The result was almost instantaneous and the embers and flying debris changed direction and New Liskeard was saved.

Many homes in New Liskeard opened their doors to refugees as quoted by Mrs. Wright [in Temiskaming Speaker on September 28, 1994] I believe we sheltered almost 20 people from as far away as Boston Creek. In those days everyone pitched in to help.

A new HVAC system will require replacing ductwork in the library, which means replacing the library ceiling,

and a decision has been benefit with a new heating made to replace the library lighting at the same time.

The library will have a new ceiling, new lighting, and system and improved ventilation, she outlined.

The proposed construction start is the middle of December with work over the following three months, said Vickery-Menard. "We will be looking at probably setting up a temporary work space," she said. "It is likely the library is going to be impacted but not the entire time. They may be able to have a shorter timeline," she said.

The project also includes installation of accessible washroom for the building on the main floor, which will be accessible from the library with a lift.

The area at the back of the building, which is currently being used by the Temiskaming Municipal Building Association, will also be redesigned for better security.

The third project, which is that of the municipal pool facility, is still in the design stage, she said.

The new site will be fully accessible, she said, and will include a ramp leading from the front of the building up to the deck.

Funding is being made available through the Investing Canada Infrastructure program's Canadian Culture and Recreation Stream. federal government funding 40 per cent of eligible expenditures, while the provincial government will fund 33.3 per cent of the project. In 2019-2020, the project had an estimated cost of \$473,000. Inflation is expected to result in additional costs.

The township will be making some capital investments this year in gravel, and will be choosing three or four kilometres of roadway for a lift of gravel, she said.

The township has also been approved under the Municipal Modernization Plan intake three for 75 per cent funding from the provincial government for electronic records and management and operational software modernization.

"We were successful in getting our service delivery review paid for and this is

intake three where we are taking some initiatives from the service delivery report," said Vickery-Menard.

She said Armstrong "is in a very good position. All their long-term debt was paid off in 2021. This is a perfect opportunity to have a look at things and make some investments. Their projects are all partially funded. This is their opportunity to improve their infrastructure with some form of funding."



Physician burnout nearly doubles during pandemic

OTTAWA (Special) - Preliminary data from the Canadian Medical Association's (CMA) National Physician Health Survey offers a concerning outlook on the health of physicians, battered from over two years of a global pandemic.

The survey, conducted in November 2021, shows more than half of physicians and medical learners (53 per cent) have experienced high levels of burnout, compared to 30 per cent in a similar survey conducted in 2017. As well, nearly half (46 per cent) of Canadian physicians who responded are con-

Charlton-Dack sees three per cent levy increase

CHARLTON-DACK - The 2022 budget for the Municipality of Charlton and Dack has been passed with a three per cent increase in this year's municipal levy.

The council fully supported the budget.

The total 2022 municipal levy is \$699,904. The municipality also collects the levies for four school boards, which means the total levy billed to taxpayers this year will be \$828,839.

Charlton-Dack chief administrative officer Dan Thibeault told council he adjusted the budget to a three per cent increase. Asked by Councillor Debbie Veerman if he had had a chance to look to see if the budget could be reduced any further, Thibeault said he had adjusted it downward to three per cent but did not want to go lower, fearing anything less would be unrealistic.

The discussion took place at council's April 4 meeting.

Thibeault noted the rising costs of things such as propane and hydro.

"You have to keep it realistic," said Reeve Merrill Bond.

Councillor Bill Laurila noted the rising cost of fuel alone.

Thibeault pointed out that the municipality will see at least one land sale this year and possibly more. Those possible sales are not included in the budget so that could create a small cushion, he said.

The municipal levy will result in a tax increase of between \$100 and \$200 for 19 properties, he summarized. The remainder of the properties will see an increase in their taxes from 2021 in amounts ranging up to \$100.

On an average house assessed at \$123,000, taxes would increase \$42 from last year, and taxes would increase \$52 on an average farmhouse assessed at \$152,000.

Charlton and Bradley Subdivision water users will see their water bills increase \$25 to \$1,000 annually.

Continued from 6 sidering reducing their clinical work in the next 24 months.

"We should be deeply alarmed that half of the physician workforce is considering reducing their clinical workload. The downstream impact to patient care will be significant as we are already experiencing access to care issues," says Dr. Katharine Smart, CMA president.

"There is no question that the pandemic has greatly affected our health workforce. As we look to rebuild our health care system, we need to prioritize the people who work within it and call on all governments to take action now."

The preliminary survey data has been released following an emergency meeting of close to 40 national and provincial health organizations representing Canada's health workforce. vey reveal that: The organizations were united in their call for urgent action to address the worsening health workforce crisis, with key priorities focused on creating a robust source of data, implementing a national human health resources strategy and rebuilding Canada's health care system for the future.

Additional insights from the National Physician Health Sur-

- 59 per cent of physicians indicated that their mental health has worsened since the onset of the pandemic. This worsened mental health has been attributed to: increased workload and lack of work-life integration (57 per cent), rapidly changing policies/processes (55 per cent), and other challenges.
- Nearly half of physicians (47 per cent) reported low lev-

els of social wellbeing, which has increased from 2017 data (29 per cent). Emotional and psychological wellbeing have also suffered compared to prepandemic levels.

The CMA National Physician Health Survey was conducted in the fall of 2021. The survey was open for five weeks and received more than 4,000 responses from Canadian physicians and medical learners.



- Provincial Park Passes can be checked out for 7 days.
- ☐ There is a limit of one pass per library card.
- You may place a hold to reserve your pass in order to plan for trips.
- The day pass entitles one vehicle to enter any provincial park subject to park regulations.
- Overdue fees for late returns and replacement fees for lost passes will apply.
