Anonymous donor

Benefactor providing \$20,000 for NL park upgrade

TEMISKAMING SHORES – An anonymous donor has offered to pay the lion's share of the cost of new playground equipment for a New Liskeard park.

The park on Rebecca Street, north of the Wabi, now offers four swings, a picnic table, and a garbage container.

A city resident has offered to donate \$20,000 to offset the cost of new equipment.

"It's very nice when a resident donates \$20,000 towards playground equipment," said Mayor Carman Kidd when council met May 3.

"Unbelievable," commented Councillor Doug Jelly.

"I don't know who is providing the funding for Rebecca Street, but if they're listening, 'thank you,"" Jelly said.

To be installed is a Smart Play Motion set of equipment.

It's designed for kids aged two to five and incorporates 16 features, including a mini slide, climbing steps and a bongo drum panel.

The cost of the equipment is estimated at \$25,560. Together with preparation work at the site, the estimated cost of the total park project is \$30,000.

The project was not included in this year's budget.

But in a report to council, city recreation director Matt Bahm said money could be allocated in the 2023 budget while staff investigates grant opportunities for possible installation this year.


DID YOU GET The Speaker THIS WEEK? Here are some May 18, 2022 stories...

Frank Henebery's Story

Frank Henebery was eight years old when the Fire of 1922 took place. Frank lived in Robillard Township and went to the Robillard School, which was located on the Elk Lake highway.

Friday, May 20, 2022

On that day, Oct 4th 1922, fires started to burn all over and Frank's mother decided to get the kids out of school. Hastily she took the horse and buggy and raced toward the school building.

After gathering the children, she sped away with them through the raging fires surrounded by smoke and hungry flames. So close were they to the towering inferno that fire kept breaking out on the buggy. The frightened kids and their brave mother were afraid they would be consumed by the roaring flames, going at neck-breaking speed and shouting to go faster, faster.

They headed toward the Tough farm, where close to a hundred people were gathered because it had the biggest clearing of any place around.

Since Mr. Tough had experienced the big fire in Timmins, he had cleared the land on his Robillard farm. He had also witnessed the Matheson Fire.

When the Hensbery's finally got there, the harness caught fire as Mrs. Henebery was taking it off. Both the harness and the buggy burned. Henebery's dog was barking continuously in front of the buildings because he thought the family should be at their own place. The barking, shouting, moaning and roar of the fire added to the confusion. All the cows at Tough's place burned in the fire. All the people survived.

But the people, who found shelter at the Tough place, all survived.

When the Henebury went home after a few days, they were amazed to find their own house had not burned down after all...although the shingles had big holes in them from the fire.

The other buildings were all destroyed and so was the livestock. They had tried to get the pigs out from their pens but they did not want to budge, being scared to move away into the hellish surroundings.

Mr. Henebery was busy helping the people who were in need because there was no food for three days.

When Frank and his sister, Sue, were on the way to Charlton, somebody treated them to pork and beans. They were so hungry and it tasted so good. It was the first time Frank ever tasted pork and beans and he still remembers how good it tasted then.

The government sent help; food, clothing and railroad cars. Many people had lost their homes and lived in those railroad cars...some of them for years. [87 old T.T.C. streetcars were sent north for the people to use as temporary shelters.]

The memory of the Great Fire is still vivid in Frank's mind, at 83 years of age.

He expressed the hope there will never be another fire of that magnitude again.

EDITORIAL

Price gouging?

Gas prices in the South Temiskaming region exceeded two dollars a litre last over the course of just a few months. week.

The price of gas is putting pressure on the average consumer and also straining the profit margins of businesses who operate fleets of vehicles such as bus companies, trucking and shipping companies and on and on

The oil and gas companies could be taking advantage of consumers by passing along absolutely outrageous increases in gas prices to Canadians, and yet our provincial and federal governments sit on their hands.

Governments benefit from taxes and price increases at the pumps so it goes without saying that higher gas prices are being aided by government silence.

Oil and gas companies across the world are being accused of taking advantage of the war in Ukraine and the political situation in that country.

The constantly changing global energy situation can hardly be the cause of gas prices to jump by 50 to 60 cents per litre

It might be time for Canadians to wean themselves off of Russian gas and oil after the invasion of Ukraine ends, but also for us to consider weaning ourselves off of fossil fuels, period.

Most Canadians might say they are happy to pay a few cents more at the pumps if it would indeed help end the war in Ukraine. But we know the war is completely out of our control.

And certainly a 50 to 60 cent per litre price increase in just a few short months have some people scratching their heads

Yes, the average consumer can accept the fact that gas prices will rise due to the Covid-19 pandemic and the war in Ukraine, but this is no excuse for large oil companies to line their pockets with warfueled profits.

While we use a small amount of Russian produced oil and gas, why are gas prices rising so steeply here in Canada?

Small is beautiful

When I think about how I want to live my life, I refer to the first chapter of Mary Oliver's book *Upstream* as my guide.

The writing is so joyful and lovely and speaks to me of things out beyond ideas of right and wrong, and violence and hate, and who we can and can't love.

Oliver's books are the literary equivalent of Prozac.

It is sometimes difficult to find perspective these days with the war in Ukraine, the mass shooting in Buffalo and the pandemic.

I was taking photos of birds this past weekend and observed a ruby throated hummingbird perched high up in a tree.

It would repeatedly drop down from the tree branches to a feeder and then fly away again.

When I looked up at one point, the bird was hovering very close to my car window staring in at me.

And then it flew away.

I thought the bird was saying something like "Hello, how are you?" in one of those rare nature moments.

Hence, I have learned the symbolism of these tiny gifts.

These delightful birds are called "joyas voladaros" or "flying jewels" as they have an iridescent quality to their plumage.

They are a symbol of the sun and a sign of love, life and creation.

Hummingbirds have been known to make long migrations of 2,500 miles from Alaska to Central America.

Scientists don't know how the birds

store enough energy to make those mega flights. If small is mighty, then this bird is definitely a symbol of how a small body can accomplish big things.

The ancient Aztecs of Central America viewed the hummingbird as soulcarriers. The nice thing about hummingbirds is they can be viewed at the Hilliardton Marsh Research and Education Centre during the annual Hummingbird Garden Party later in the summer.

I should point out that it is never a good idea to fill a hummingbird feeder with a red food colouring mixture. Instead, use a simple combination of boiled water with one part white sugar and four parts water. Allow the mixture to cool before filling your feeder and don't use molasses, honey, brown

or raw sugar as it can harm humming-

As I get older I prefer small things, littleness is good.

Of course I am generalizing here. I still love big things like the ocean, paycheques and my daughter's generous laugh.

When it comes to birding, the goal is to be small and invisible so as not to disturb the birds.

Hummingbirds remind us to find the sweetness and joy in life.

I intend on seeking the nectar of life and the small things that make me happy.

Home Fire **Safety Checklist**

Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Alarms

- ☐ Install working smoke alarms on **every storey** of the home and outside all sleeping areas. Install carbon monoxide alarms outside all sleeping areas. It's the law.
- ☐ For extra protection, install a smoke alarm in every bedroom and a carbon monoxide alarm on every storey.
- ☐ Test your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms **once a month**.
- ☐ Change alarm batteries annually or whenever the low-battery warning sounds.
- ☐ Always follow the manufacturer's instructions for installing, testing, maintaining and replacing smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.

Home Fire Escape Planning

- ☐ Develop a home fire escape plan and practice it with the
- ☐ Make sure everyone knows **two ways out** of each room, if possible.
- ☐ Determine who will be responsible for helping young children, older adults or anyone else that may need assistance when escaping.
- ☐ Choose a **meeting place** outside, such as a tree or lamp post, where everyone can be accounted for
- ☐ Call the fire department from outside the home, from a cell phone or neighbour's home.
- Once out, stay out. Never re-enter a burning building.
- ☐ Make sure exit doors and windows open easily and are kept clear of obstructions.

Cooking Fire Safety

- Always stay in the kitchen and stay alert when cooking.
- ☐ Keep anything that can catch fire—oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains—away from your stovetop.
- ☐ Keep a proper fitting pot lid near the stove when cooking. If a pot catches fire slide the lid over the pot and turn off the stove. Do not move the pot.
- ☐ Wear tight-fitting or rolled up sleeves when using the stove. Loose dangling clothing can easily catch fire. If your clothing catches fire, stop, drop to the ground and roll over and over to put out the fire.

Other Things to Consider to Prevent Fire in Your Home

- Keep matches and lighters out of the sight and reach of children.
- ☐ Always **blow out candles** before leaving the room.
- ☐ If anyone in the home smokes, **smoke outside**.
- ☐ Ensure items that can burn are **one metre** away from space heaters.
- Avoid overloading the electrical outlets. Extension cords should be used only as a temporary connection.

Memoir introduces author to new generations

HAILEYBURY - As many area people know, the famed Hardy Boys novels were published under the equally fictional name of Franklin W. Dixon.

The Stratemeyer syndicate, under Edward Stratemeyer, created the brilliant concept of employing writers to pen numerous books under given pseudonyms. Numerous writers have contributed to the Hardy Boys series since the 1920s, but the earliest was also the most frequent and his writings were the engine that propelled the characters into a world-renowned and beloved series of stories which inspired youth everywhere.

That writer was Leslie Mc-Farlane and he grew up in Haileybury.

While McFarlane wrote the Hardy Boys stories on the side, his own writing career took him to new heights, writing for the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation and the National

Film Board of Canada, among other things.

"He did it with a high school education," said his son Brian McFarlane in a telephone interview.

Toward the end of Leslie McFarlane's life, after the truth of his identity as the author of many of the original Hardy Boys stories had become public, he wrote his memoir titled Ghost of the Hardy Boys.

First published in 1976, it is now being reprinted and will be released this June.

Along with the wit, humour and energy evident in those original Hardy Boys stories, McFarlane's memoir reveals other depths of the author's character and intelligence.

It shows McFarlane's joy of writing for its own sake, the struggles involved with freelance writing, and the craft that is involved in writing for your audience, whether they be children or adults.

STARTED WITH PAPERS

McFarlane started his career as a journalist, working at a number of newspapers,

of society with an equally observant eye.

Brian McFarlane, who is known in his own right for his broadcasting career in hockey, speaks with admiration about the spirit of his father who, at the age of 17, rode off on the trolley to Cobalt to take a job as a reporter at the Cobalt Nugget.

The senior McFarlane's journalism career took him from Cobalt to the Sudbury Star, the Ottawa Journal, and the Montreal Herald.

It was evident to the editors and other staff on the newspapers where he worked that he seemed to be accomplishing a dream which many journalists had, but never reached. He was writing manuscripts on the side. Over the past years, his son has been collecting and digitizing all the articles that he can find ever written by his father.

He wasn't long into his journalism career when Leslie McFarlane began his long association with Edward Stratemeyer who started using McFarlane as one of his writers for his syndicated stories.

Stratemeyer would McFarlane two-page lines for the stories, and from there, McFarlane would use his many talents, including his writing skills and imagination, to flesh out and bring to life

the basic outlines that were presented to him.

His memoir tells of how he sought to liven up the stories, and how the introduction of characters such as Aunt Gertrude helped to add interest to the series.

McFarlane's first foray into ghostwriting was with the Dave Fearless stories, and he even penned a couple of the Dana Girls series.

His son reflected in the telephone interview about the time he learned his father was the true writer behind the by-then famous Hardy Boys stories.

"I WROTE THEM"

It was about 1941 and the family had just moved to Ottawa.

"I was about ten years old and I saw those books on the shelves in his office. I guess I made a query. 'Why do you have those books up there?' and he said, 'Well, I wrote them."

McFarlane went on to instruct his son not to tell any-

The younger McFarlane commented, "'Dad, all the kids are reading those books. We trade them!" Whenever he was home from school he would read a Hardy Boys story, sometimes in a day, not realizing they were written by his own father.

"He said, 'Don't tell anybody,' and of course I told all of my friends. I don't think anyone believed me."

McFarlane had three children - Brian, Norah and Patricia. Growing up as the son of a prolific children's fiction writer resulted in a childhood sprinkled with humour and plenty of adventure, particularly fishing and the visits back to Northern Ontario where McFarlane had grown up and family still lived.

Trout-fishing trips with his father led to a lifetime of love

for the sport.

Haileybury and Cobalt were still major hockey communities at that time, which the younger McFarlane enjoyed.

"The best players in the world grew up there and played for a thousand dollars a game or a weekend."

This also was reflected in his father's writing.

"My dad wrote the best hockey fiction I ever read," said McFarlane. Some of those hockey stories are in the Maclean's magazine archives, along with stories about min-

Be Safe in the Sun

So when you're outside, be safe and protect yourself and your family from getting too much sun.

Sun Safety Tips:

Check the UV index daily

A UV index of 3 or higher means that you need to use extra caution to protect your skin. The sun's rays are strongest between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. so try to reduce your time in the sun during these hours. In Canada between April and September. the UV Index can be 3 or more from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., even when it's cloudy.

Seek Shade

If your shadow is shorter than you are, it's time to find some shade.

Cover Up

Cover up as much of your skin as you can - clothes provide better protection than sunscreen; wear a hat. Many skin cancers happen on the face and neck so be sure to put sunscreen on your ears, chin and neck even when you're wearing a hat.

Wear sunglasses

Sunglasses can help prevent damage to your eyes so keep your shades on and make sure your children do too. Close-fitting ones with UVA and UVB protection in a wraparound style are the best option.

Use Sunscreeen properly

- Use an SPF of 30 or higher.
- Make sure the sunscreen is labelled broad-spectrum (offers both UVA and UVB protection).
- If you're in the water, make sure your sunscreen is water-resistant
- Apply a generous amount and put it on before make-up
- Use a lip balm with SPF your lips need protection too

Talk to your health care provider about any changes to your skin like:

- a birthmark or a mole that changes shape, colour, size or
- any new growth on your skin pale, pearly nodules that may grow larger and crust, or red, scaly, sharply defined patches
- any sore that doesn't heal
- · any patch of skin that bleeds, oozes, swells, itches or becomes red and bumpy

ing, adventure and even love stories.

His sister Norah Perez added in an email about growing up with Leslie Mc-Farlane as her father: "Laughter was so frequent in our household that we paid little attention to the trials of poverty, and like my jokey Dad, I am also often unable to quell inappropriate giggles, even during the most solemn occasions. It must be an Irish affliction."

FILMMAKER

By the 1940s McFarlane's career was starting to gain momentum, and his son, who has a lifetime of broadcasting experience himself, reflected with amazement that his father - with no experience in filmmaking - was able to secure a job with the National Film Board where he began creating films. He spent 15 years travelling across Canada working on documentary films as a writer/director. On the side, he was still writing the Hardy Boys stories.

McFarlane's skills allowed him to rise to fame in his own right, aside from his sideline as the ghostwriter for the Hardy Boys stories. He and actor Lorne Greene were friends, and his son believes that it was Greene who convinced McFarlane to move to Hollywood later in his career and write for some productions there.

McFarlane was an award-winning writer in other areas of his career, working with the National Film Board of Canada, the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation where he was a drama editor, and producing short stories, radio plays and television plays.

His son says he was pleased that his father wrote his memoir.

Perez related, "Once, when I was a small-town librarian new to the job, I discovered the beauty and quality of books published by Godine Press, so years later I was surprised and pleased when Joshua Bodwell, the editorial director of Godine/Black Sparrow, offered to republish The Ghost of the Hardy Boys.... My brother and I are confident that Dad's charming 1977 memoir is in the best hands. In the reissue Mr. Bodwell warmly recalls his childhood fascination with the boys who were the friends of his youth, and of ours. It is satisfying to know that Frank and Joe (Hardy), adventurers who have never grown up and will never grow old, have inspired generations of kids to become lifelong readers."
