FedNor money for Cobalt attraction

COBALT - FedNor is investing approximately \$93,000 in a project to upgrade Cobalt's Teck Park.

Nipissing-Timiskaming MP Anthony Rota announced the project virtually May 12 with Cobalt Mayor George Othmer.

Othmer outlined the project which will include the installation of permanent bases in the baseball diamond, new bleachers, enhancements to the miniputt including improvements to the playing field and some of the miniature replica Cobalt buildings which are featured on the playing surface.

The investment will enable the town to upgrade to LED lighting and install additional lighting around trails in the park.

Low-impact exercise equipment will be added in

the park. There will also be a new toddlers' playground. There are already picnic tables at the park, but shelters will now be installed for the tables. The town also has some barbecues which will be put in place so that people can cook their own hotdogs and hamburgers while enjoying a picnic setting. The park includes a small bridge which is going to be landscaped and improved to make it more accessible. Nets for a soccer field will be put up as well and the tennis court will be upgraded.

"It's a very exciting project. It's going to enhance the town greatly," said Othmer.

The park already includes playground equipment and a splash-pad.

"It's important to support our green spaces," said Rota. "People are coming out and want to get active again, and if we have nice parks it gets them outside and talking to each other."

Rota also noted that people are moving out of the More on 3



large centres to the north, and "Cobalt is a prime example of where they want to go - somewhere peaceful, somewhere where they can kick up their heels and relax a bit, and I think that's something people can appreciate. The quality of life we can afford in Northern Ontario is not something that's available in other parts of the country so let's keep improving it. Now is the time to invest in areas like the park and make sure we all have communities we can grow in and that will allow us to thrive in the future."

Town intern Evan Franks, who is coordinating the project, said Teck Park is "a place we want to have as a hub, especially for the summer

months, an awesome spot for people of all ages to go. There's things that everybody can do

Othmer said that the work at the park will begin this spring, and be completed "as quickly as possible."

The mayor commented that his goal, and the goal of this council, has been to attract new residents to Cobalt.

"We have a lot of people here who have relocated from out of town," he noted, adding that there are many small and unique businesses in downtown Cobalt that people would be impressed to see if they stop to have a visit.

"Building up community infrastructure is vital to the long-term success of Nipissing-Timiskaming," Rota commented in a later press release.

Town manager Steve Dalley commented that "the project will serve as a way to bring people together. The redevelopment and energizing of our outdoor municipal park will offer something for everyone."

The grant has been made available through FedNor's Canada Community Revitalization Fund.


Norma (86) also joins her mother Violet (née Tubman) and stepfather



The Temiskaming Shores and Area Chamber of Commerce board of directors and staff went to a great deal of trouble to host a Candidate's Night on May 11 at the New Liskeard Riverside Place.

Half of the candidates - four out of eight running in the June 2 provincial election - did not bother to show up for the event.

Who doesn't show up for a candidate's night?

Well, the no show candidates were Ontario Party Geoffrey **Progressive** Aitchison. Conservative Bill Foy, Liberal Brian Johnson and None of the Above Direct Democracy Party Jeff Wilkinson.

Certainly if you want to get your message out, if you want to be seen by as many voters as possible (and who doesn't) then you attend candidate nights at every opportunity.

It would appear that leadership escapes the no-show candidates and it speaks volumes as to the credibility of the people who did show up to the candidate's night.

Those people were incumbent **MPP** John Vanthof of the NDP, Green Party candidate Kris Rivard, Libertarian Eric Cummings and New Blue's Garry Andrade.

The fact that half the provincial election candidates did not show up for the candidate's night is unacceptable.

How does the average voter trust anything someone says who hides behind the fear of facing certain questions on certain issues?

Car interiors can be deadly in the summer

OTTAWA (Special) - The traditional mental image we make for ourselves of a hot day tends to involve a bright. shining sun and a cloudless

Yet, as most Canadians are aware, summer months in Canada can be deceptively hot even when the sun appears to be out of sight.

This year, the Canada Safety Council is reminding Canadians about the impact that a hot day can have on the interior cabin of a vehicle.

"I think we would all agree that a hot car can be a hazardous and potentially deadly environment for anyone," said Gareth Jones, president and CEO of the Canada Safety Council.

"And yet too often, we hear of children being left in vehicles. Let's be clear, there is no acceptable period of time where a person should be subjected to excessive heat or heat suffocation in a vehicle. This is simply unsafe behaviour." THE ISSUE

At an ambient temperature of 35 C, it takes only 10 minutes parked in the sun for the vehicle's internal temperature to rise by 10 degrees. In the span of one hour, that same

vehicle's internal temperature spikes to 59 degrees.

This issue is only exacerbated when we consider that young children are frequently victims of these circumstances - while the human body is able to regulate its internal temperature through sweating, infants and younger children do not yet have fully formed body cooling systems and are affected by the sudden rise in heat even more so than their

adult counterparts.

Most often, these fatalities are accidental. The Americanbased KidsandCars.org states that 56 per cent of all child hot car deaths were a result of being unknowingly left in the vehicle, while an additional 26 per cent of children gained access to the vehicle on their

PREVENTION TIPS

Often, incidents like these occur due to simple forgetfulness owing to the child not being in the parent or guardian's line of sight. As such, it is important to take deliberate steps to ensure an accident like this will not happen on your watch. Get into the habit of leaving an item you cannot do without a wallet, a cell phone, a scan card - in the back seat with your child.

A common aggravating factor lies in a change of routine. A parent or guardian who is used to leaving home and heading straight for work may forget that it is their day to leave their child at daycare, for instance. Lapses in memory can happen too easily in such circumstances, though apps exist that can send a reminder to your phone to check the backseat once you're out of range of your vehicle's Bluetooth system.

Beaverhouse First Nation achieves historic recognition

KIRKLAND LAKE - Beaverhouse First Nation made history on May 21 when leadership announced to their community members that it had achieved formal recognition as a First Nation from the government of Canada.

The historic announcement was sent by the government on April 19, 2022, as an official letter from the Honourable Marc Miller, Minister of Crown-Indigenous Relations (ISC), stating that "Beaverhouse First Nation has demonstrated it is a section 35 rights-bearing First Nation

collectivity." This means that Beaverhouse First Nation is now a recognized First Nation community with rights under the Canadian Constitution.

"It's been a whirlwind of emotions for all of us in the community," said Chief Wayne Wabie.

"I have been involved in this fight for most of my life alongside many of our past leaders such as the late Chief Roy Meaniss, who was a longtime advocate for the community. It's been an honour to carry on his legacy and to work with our community to achieve this goal," he said.

The event was led with a prayer and ceremony by Wabie, along with messages of support by his father and community Elder Tom Wabie.

The legal process for recognition was started by the late Chief Roy Meaniss in the 1980s. Successive Beaver-

house chiefs who continued the process were Chief Gloria McKenzie and Chief Sally Susan Mathias Martel (Marcia Brown-Martel). The community and its leaders had fought for recognition for the past three decades with the major support and expertise of Nishnawbe-Aski Nation (NAN), the regional political organization that represents First Nations in the Treaty #9 area. Beaverhouse FN, as a member of Wabun Tribal Council, also had the support of Wabun.

"This is a very emotional and proud moment for the people of Beaverhouse First Nation," said Grand Chief Derek Fox, Nishnawbe-Aski Nation.

"To have this recognition from the government, from your partners within NAN, from townships and from neighbouring communities means that it is a powerful foundation to build upon. We will be there to support Beaverhouse First Nation and help their nation continue to grow. I am extremely happy to be here with the community today," said Fox in speaking to event participants.

The lead legal representative for Beaverhouse FN, Kim Fullerton, was instrumental in representing the First Nation over the years. He is a long-time advocate for First Nation communities and organizations primarily in land claims against Canada and Ontario.

"This is a very significant event because Canada is recognizing a new First Nation in the country, which does not happen very often. This is a very proud day for all of us, the community members, their leaders and Nishnawbe-Aski Nation who supported the First Nation. It's been a long time coming and it is very satisfying to be able to assist this wonderful group of people,"

said Fullerton.

His wife, Christine Dernoi, was one of the key researchers that worked with Beaverhouse FN and NAN to prepare the legal case with the government. Luke Hunter, Director of Governance, Treaty Implementation for NAN, was also instrumental in advocating for and assisting Beaverhouse FN leadership in this process over many years.

First Nation recognition for Beaverhouse FN is the first step in starting the process of creating a new relationship with government. The community leadership and its members will now take the time to plan for the future direction of the First Nation and negotiate with federal and provincial governments. The federal government has appointed a federal negotiator to start discussions on this process with a meeting planned for June.

The lack of official First Nation recognition by the government in the past meant a lot of difficulty for the First Nation leadership in establishing, developing and maintaining social, health, education and administrative activities for its membership.

Chief Wabie gave thanks to the community members, El-

ders and past leaders who supported the efforts and provided the information, research, historical documentation and input critical in establishing the record of their people's history.

"This is a very emotional event for all of us as it makes me realize what is next for our community. This new stage of development will bring healing not just in body, but in mind and spirit and as a whole for all our families," said Councillor Brianna Moore.

First Nation leadership is now hopeful for positive future growth for the community.

"This is going to change Beaverhouse First Nation because nobody can say that we are not a First Nation any more. There is lots of work to be done but I have full faith in our community that we are going to do great things," said Councillor Kayla Batisse.

Councillor Rob Meaniss joined the event via live stream along with other officials and community participants who were not able to attend in person.

"It feels great to be here today. We are a strong community that has managed to hang on to our language and our history through our Elders. Now we will be able to move forward with our youth to build

our community and make us stronger," said Councillor Diane Meaniss.





USE BBQS OUTDOORS ONLY! They produce carbon monoxide, a poisonous gas that can lead to unconsciousness and even death. Never use or store propane cylinders inside any structure, including garages.

Take these steps when starting a BBQ:

- Open the hood.
- Turn on the gas release valve on the tank.
- Turn on the grill controls or heat settings.
- Take a step back.
- Push the igniter button.
- If there is no igniter button, insert a long match or BBQ lighter through the side burner hole first, then turn on the heat control knob.
- If the burner does not ignite right away, turn the gas off and wait five minutes, keeping the hood open, before repeating the procedure.

At the start of the BBQ season, do this THREE-STEP SAFETY CHECK of your BBQ:

- **CLEAN** Use a pipe cleaner or wire to ensure burner ports are free of rust, dirt, spider webs or other debris.
- **CHECK** Examine the hose leading from the tank to the burners. Replace it if cracked or damaged.
- **3 TEST** Find leaks by applying a 50/50 solution of water and dish soap to propane cylinder connections and hoses. If bubbles appear, tighten the connection and/or replace the damaged parts and retest.

Stay Fire Safe!

Never leave the BBQ unattended when in use.

Make sure grease does not build up on the burners or at the base of the BBQ. This could cause a grease fire.

Never throw water on a grease fire – this will only spread the flame.

DO NOT place the BBQ close to wooden fences or walls, vinyl siding, or anything that can burn. The area behind your BBQ must be free of anything that can ignite – this is where hot gases escape.

Keep loose clothing away from a hot BBQ.

Keep children and pets at least one metre (three feet) away from a hot BBQ.

When finished barbecuing, turn the gas valve off first, then turn off the burner controls so no gas is left in the connecting hose.

Allow the BBQ to cool completely before closing the cover.

If you live in an apartment or condo building, check with the building owner or property manager, or the Condominium Act of your building, regarding the use of BBQs on your building's balconies.




