Little Claybelt Museum offering a glimpse of royalty, on and off the ice

TEMISKAMING SHORES - Visitors to the Little Claybelt Homesteaders Museum this summer can learn a little about hockey and Her Highness.

The history of the New Liskeard Cubs and a local take on the Queen's Platinum Jubilee are two of the special exhibits at the New Liskeard museum.

It's the museum's first regular season since 2019. It opens June 25 with an opportunity to meet members of the Cubs, past and present.

The meet-and-greet, from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m., will officially open a new exhibit about the hockey club.

More than 1,000 teenagers have played for the team since its founding in 1953.

The exhibit was to have been the centrepiece of the museum's 2020 season, but COVID-19 put those plans on ice.

As attractions reopen, visitors can now see team sweaters, trophies, photos, scrapbooks and other club memorabilia drawn from the collection of Rolly and Lois Forget.

Also on display are photos and memorabilia from other hockey teams in the area dating back to the early 1900s.

After perusing the Cubs' display, visitors can move on to smaller exhibitions.

Two of the museum's smaller galleries are dedi-More on 3








- The Riverside Farmers Market is preparing to move to a new location.

cated to the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Railway, and a third focuses on New Liskeard grocery stores through the decades.

QUEEN'S JUBILEE

And for this year only there's an exhibition inspired by the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II.

In addition to a collection

of publications featuring the Queen, there's a display case of china on loan from area residents that commemorate milestones in the lives of the royal family.

A focal point of the exhibit, which is staged with support from the federal government, is a portrait of the Queen and Prince Philip, painted in 1959 by Stan Logan of Harris Town-

The museum's gift shop will also be open. Among its offerings are local histories and memoirs.

The museum itself has compiled nine volumes of Claybelt Chronicles, featuring interviews with area seniors who remember the region's earlier era.

FedNor making tourism investments

DISTRICT (Special/Staff) – Several tourism enterprises in the Temiskaming and Temagami areas have received some FedNor help to upgrade and expand.

"We will support Canada's tourism sector as it recovers from the historic disruption COVID-19 presented," said Patty Hajdu, federal minister of Indigenous Services and the minister responsible for FedNor.

The financial assistance, announced in a news release earlier this month, comes from the Tourism Relief Fund.

The fund was launched in July 2021 to help tourism enterprises adapt their operations to meet public health requirements,

I recall fondly the smell of the wood stove as I peeked out from under my warm blankets in the early morning hours. Thousands of images later, Bass Lake and Wild Temiskaming are still my most inspirational subjects.

Whether it is loons, ducks, eagles, spawning fish, turtles, frogs, butterflies, and countless songbirds, it is one of the most beautiful places in this region.

My deep love for canoeing began in and around 2005 when I moved back home to Cobalt.

My mother was living on her own and it was not going well, so to keep her out of a long term care home, I moved back into her home. The arrangement worked for both of us and we got along very well.

My affection for the canoe deepened after my mother passed away and my daughter went off to explore the world.

I filled up my well of grief and loneliness with canoe outings.

I frequented the lake, the place where my mother had taken us as children. She loved the lake.

I feel a deep connection to her at the lake.

I spent hours on the water paddling around the shoreline dealing with my grief and learning to be present in the moment.

It's hard to be affected by the stresses of the world when you are meditatively paddling along listening to birdsong.

For this wild woman it is always about healthy, natural, spiritual living on my own terms in my own way.

My love of the water and land helped me to develop a conservationist mindset and when I see clear cutting, garbage in the backcountry and yahoos making a mess of shorelines, I know there is a better way.

Please do not wish and hope for someone to give your life to you.



Hyperthyroid and Hypothyroid **Disorder Awareness**

According to the Thyroid Foundation of Canada, 1 in 10 Canadians suffer from a thyroid condition of one type or another. And as many as 50% of those are undiagnosed.

Thyroid Disease is a Family Affair

The two most common types of thyroid disease are:

- Hypothyroidism (underactive thyroid)
- Hyperthyroidism (overactive thyroid)

Clinical features of hypothyroidism may include: poor appetite; intolerance to cold; dry, coarse skin; brittle hair; fatigue; constipation; muscle weakness; and poor memory retention. Sometimes the voice becomes croaky and hoarse. Examination may reveal dry, scaly, cold, pale skin; a thickening of the skin and underlying tissues; very slow reflexes; and a slow heart rate.

Clinical features of hyperthyroidism may include: weight loss, nervousness, irritability, intolerance to hot weather, excessive sweating, shakiness, and muscle weakness. Other signs include a rapid pulse, loss of body fat and muscle bulk, thyroid enlargement (goitre), fine tremors of the fingers and hot, moist, velvety skin.

Thyroid disorders for the most part are treatable; however, untreated thyroid disease can produce serious results in other parts of the body.

Each person's experience of thyroid illness will be different depending on a number of factors; a patient will not necessarily have all (or even any) of the above symptoms; some patients have the symptoms and no thyroid disease, perhaps due to other causes. A primary care provider should be consulted if a thyroid disorder is suspected. Early diagnosis and treatment are crucial.

Earlier this year the museum released its fourth volume of Claybelt Memories, which are family memoirs and stories recorded by other organizations, such as Women's Institute branches.

The museum is also planning to expand by constructing an outdoor exhibit space to both protect and display some of its larger artifacts.

They include the first seed drill used in the area, which was donated by the Peters family, as well as two sleighs donated by the Peters and Bumstead families.

The museum is open Tuesdays through Saturdays, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., until the end of August. It'll open in the off-season by appointment

cell boosters and an upgrade to a Wi-Fi integrated contactless fuel dispensing system.

The work is expected to create seven jobs during construction.

• The Haileybury Beach Motel is receiving \$96,250 to modernize its accommodations.

Work will include the completion of kitchen upgrades and renovations; the purchase of software to streamline reservations; and the installation of new flooring, insulation and siding.

Once complete, this work is

expected to create five jobs and maintain two more.

• Les Suites des Présidents Suites is receiving \$95,000 to improve its "glamping" operation – camping with some glamorous amenities – on Farr Island.

The project will help modernize the facilities and create an innovative tourism experience for a local and national audience in mind, while extending operations over three seasons.

Funding will be used to erect five new glamping structures; improve accessibility by building ramps, improving trails and modifying accommodations; add a teepee and platform for meditation and gathering; improve bathrooms and the public kitchen; and support a marketing and promotion strategy.

The project is expected to create two new jobs.

• Olive the Lake in Marten River is receiving \$50,000.

Funding will be used for renovations to comply with public health and safety protocols, to accessibility for mobility challenged guests, and to provide

an enhanced experience for domestic and international tourists.

Work will include an addition to one cottage to offer accessible accommodations; construction of a new set of stairs; improvements to the games room/community hall; upgrades to the internet/Wi-Fi system; and purchase of an outdoor projection screen for new entertainment activities.

The project is expected to create four construction jobs.

• Destination Northern Ontario, the regional tourism marketing organization, is receiving \$243,000 to undertake a pan-Northern accommodations sector recovery and development initiative.

The project will provide baseline data on accommodations in the region, highlight potential investment opportunities, and identify gaps that are hindering tourism product development.

It will include the development of a platform where information can be shared in an accessible and searchable manner.

To minimize the risk of fire and burn injury, the fire service recommends the following cottage fire safety tips:

Install smoke alarms on every storey and outside all sleeping areas. It's the law for all Ontario homes, cottages, cabins and seasonal homes to have working smoke alarms on every storey and outside all sleeping areas.

- Test smoke alarms at least monthly or each time you return to the cottage.
 Pack a new smoke alarm and extra smoke alarm batteries in case they need replacement.
- Install and ensure carbon monoxide alarms in your cottage if it has a fuelburning appliance.
- Develop and practice a home fire escape plan to ensure everyone knows what to do if the smoke alarm sounds.
- Know the telephone number for the local fire department and your cottage's emergency sign number, in case of emergency.
- Clean barbecues before using them. Keep an eye on lit barbecues and ensure all combustibles, as well as children and pets are kept well away from them. Fires can happen when barbecues are left unattended.
- Keep barbecue lighters and matches out of sight and reach of children.
- Remember to bring a flashlight with extra batteries.
- Check heating appliances and chimneys before using them.
- Check with your local fire department, municipality, or Ministry of Natural
 Resources to determine whether open air burning is permitted before having a
 campfire or burning brush. If open burning is allowed, fires should be built on
 bare soil or on exposed rock. Remove leaves and twigs from around the fire to
 keep it from spreading. Always keep a bucket of water, sand, or even a shovel
 close by and supervise the fire at all times.
- If you must smoke, do so outside. Keep a large can with water nearby so cigarette butts can be safely discarded. If you drink, do so responsibly.
 Tobacco use and excessive alcohol consumption are contributing factors in many fires and can lead to serious injuries.
- Burn candles in sturdy candleholders that will not tip and are covered with a glass shade. When you go out, blow out!




