Keepers of the Circle **outlines** plans for the future

DISTRICT - Keepers of the Circle, which provides programs and services to support Indigenous women and their communities, met with DTSSAB to thank them for their support over the last two decades, and outline their plans for the future.

The District of Timiskaming Social Services Administration Board (DTSSAB) has had a major role in supporting the Keepers of the Circle, said executive director Arlene Hache in her presentation to the board June 15.

She was accompanied by Keepers of the Circle program coordinator Carol McBride, who Hache said has been with the organization from the beginning and has always provided leadership in the work it has been doing.

In 2005, DTSSAB provided funding to Keepers to establish hubs in Kirkland Lake and New Liskeard, said Hache. Prior to that the organization had been working in a small office with one phone.

"We really grew from there," she said.

The organization recently completed a five-year plan.

Over the past 25 years, Keepers of the Circle has reached 35 Indigenous communities across Northern Ontario. Its Indigenous health team, Mino M'shki-ki, established in 2018, has reached 1,000 members. Currently, Keepers has 174 daycare spaces for children and is looking to expand that number, said Hache. The organization also has 104 employees, making it a major employer in the district, she added.

Through its training program it has trained 630 Indigenous women in non-traditional trades.

"Of those, 76 per cent secured permanent meaningful employment that brought them out of poverty," said Hache.

Keepers has established 51 partnerships in order to do that.

She gave credit to DTSSAB CAO Mark Stewart for his support, encouragement and investment through DTSSAB in those accomplishments.

"Mark has been a constant," Hache said.

"Our goal is to ensure that Indigenous communities are equipped to survive over the long-term and to grow and develop," she stated.

"We have partnerships across Ontario, Canada and globally."

She said the organization is looking to strengthen its board of directors, and has a council of Wisdom Keepers who provide guidance.

The organization is also looking at succession planning, with the goal of employing a local Indigenous woman to take over the position of executive director, said Hache.



"We're looking at expanding the training centre and expanding partnerships."

With training, women have been streamed into jobs in mining, welding, construction and green jobs, she said.

Employees are also being encouraged to learn their own languages, and Keepers of the Circle will support them with that goal.

The organization is also seeking to help women with training for positions in the community, such as early childhood educators, or personal support workers, Hache outlined.

Keepers also has the goal of strengthening daycare locations to be able to accommodate employees doing shift-work, she explained.

The organization is also taking steps to ensure food security at key locations across the district.

New housing projects are also being planned, she told the board.

She said she wanted to demonstrate to the board what their support has meant.

"Part of the purpose in meeting today is to thank you for two decades of support."



CABIN FIRE

A cabin on Anima Nipissing Road south of Latchford owned by Dave and Mara Horie of Barrie was destroyed by fire June 16. National Indigenous Peoples Day

digenous Peoples Day (NIPD) on June 21, and are celebrating Indigenous People's History Month (June).

In our region, there was a Pow Wow held in North Cobalt on June 21, hosted by Keepers of the Circle.

There has been much discussion about truth and reconciliation these last few years between Indigenous and non-Indigenous people.

The NIPD offers us an opportunity to become part of the change needed to recognize racism and to stop it in its tracks.

There are three First Nation communities in South Temiskaming: Temagami First Nation, the Timiskaming First Nation and the Matachewan First Nation.

As the school year is about to end, and as part of the truth in truth and reconciliation, we must acknowledge there are still far too many children who don't know the true history of Canada.

Without the sacrifices of Shawnee

Canadians celebrated National In- warrior Tecumseh during the war of 1812 and the efforts of the Assignack and Pontiac peoples, we might be flying the stars and stripes instead of the Maple Leaf-adorned flag.

The teachings of the war of 1812 must include the valiant efforts of Indigenous peoples.

We must learn the whole truth of our history, not the whitewashed one where settlers were viewed as heroes and Indigenous people villains.

Our First Nations brothers and sisters are survivors of horrific abuse from the '60s Scoop, stolen lands, racism, violence and the residential school experience.

But they are a benevolent race and are making great strides in putting the past behind them and moving forward in positive ways as leaders and achievers.

It is time that non-Indigenous people take the time to understand who Indigenous people are and take the proper steps toward truth and reconciliation.

In my adulthood, I look back on those carefree summer days with extreme fondness.

We were totally free to use our imaginations, to develop our sense of selves, our intellect and to learn to solve problems.

We did not have the distraction of tablets, cellphones and computers robbing us of a sense of wonder about the natural world.

Childhood is important and

it has to have a level of freedom for children to fully develop a sense of who they are in this big wide world.

As a feral child, summer was all about the sky, wind, water, insects, birds and oh yes, ice cream. There was nothing comparable to a soft ice cream cone sourced from Charlie Ferris's Boston Grill.

I knew the flora and fauna around Cobalt intimately. I knew where every chokecherry, lilac and crab apple tree



was and still do.

I have loved nature all of my life, but it all started in my own backyard and in my neighbourhood.

Things you learn in childhood, good or bad, stay with your forever.

Bring those kids outside to develop a sense of wonder for the universe and how they fit into it.

TEMISKAMING SHORES — June is Pride Month, a time when LG-BTQ2+ people celebrate who they are and raise awareness about the issues facing the community.

A Pride Parade will take place in Temiskaming Shores on Wednesday, June 29, beginning at the New Liskeard boardwalk near Tap That Bar and Kitchen.

A group of gay and queer activists in Temiskaming Shores is taking great pride in organizing the city's first Pride Parade.

The walk begins at 6 p.m. and follows the boardwalk, ending at the Algon-

quin Regiment Memorial Beach Park soccer fields.

Pride Temiskaming parade organizing members are Sabrina Crawford, Peter Landers, Hailey Cole and Kailey Kennedy and Gabby.

"We have found our community and we have reached over 3,000 people so far through social media," said Cole in an interview at the New Liskeard waterfront. "We are marching along the boardwalk and will finish at the soccer fields in New Liskeard. We understand about 60 people so far have pledged to take part in the parade."

The Pride Temiskaming members say their activism goes way beyond the Pride Parade itself. They are seeking to establish a solid presence in the community where LGBTQ2+ people can get together to feel safe and know they have a community behind them.

They say Pride Temiskaming is for everyone who identifies as queer, gay, bisexual, non-binary and transgender.

"I came out as a not straight girl at my high school and I was the only one," said Gabby. "It is so nice to meet like-minded friends in this region and I have not found a community anywhere else."

Many of the committee members expressed sentiments about telling their family members about their identity and being ostracized by those family members, saying the hurt runs deep.

They are concerned about the level of homophobia they see in the Temiskaming region and around the world.

"I have confidence now and finding friends in this group has been important," said Landers.

He credited his mother Laura Landers for helping him to feel comfortable about his definition of himself.

"Mom knows quite a few people in the arts community and she is very supportive. I understand that is not the case with others."


The organizers want people in this region to know they have support and can feel good about themselves and who they are.

"More and more youth are coming out and maybe this parade will help them," said Kennedy.

The Pride Parade will not exclude anyone, say organizers, and when it ends at the soccer field there will be a get together with light refreshments and some free door prizes.

First, second and third prizes will be given out for the Best Pride outfit at the parade, say organizers.







Vaccines are effective at protecting you against severe illness, hospitalization, and death related to COVID-19. However, effectiveness decreases over time and two doses is not

enough. A booster dose will help protect you from more severe outcomes from COVID-19 and the Omicron variant. All Timiskaming residents are strongly encouraged to get a booster dose as soon as eligible.

Third doses (booster doses) of the COVID-19 vaccine are recommended for everyone aged 12 and over if at least 84 days (approximately three months) have passed since your last dose. Fourth doses (booster doses) are recommended if it has

been five months since your third dose. Currently, fourth doses are available for people aged 60 and over and First Nation, Inuit & Métis individuals and their non-Indigenous household members aged 18 and over.

The current Omicron surge is increasing the likelihood that people will come into contact with a COVID-positive person and will become ill with the virus. Vaccination and maintaining public health measures, like masking, physical distancing, and staying home when sick, remain our strongest defense.



Elder Abuse Awareness

Elder Abuse is one of the most underreported crimes in Canada affecting hundreds of thousands of people every year.

Elder abuse comes in many forms:

- Psychological abuse in the form of threats, insults, or humiliation
- Financial abuse in which a trusted individual steals or misuses an elderly person's money, forges their signature, or pressures them to make or change legal documents. An example might be sharing an older person's home without paying a fair share of the expenses when requested.
- Physical abuse such as hitting, pushing, or restraining an elderly person
- Sexual abuse including sexual harassment and nonconsensual sexual activity
- Neglect of an elderly person who requires care. Seniors most vulnerable to neglect, include those who are socially isolated and those with serious health conditions.

The truth is elder abuse is any action taken by someone in a relationship of trust with an elderly person that causes harm or distress.

People can engage in abusive behaviour without realizing it. Sometimes seemingly innocent or well-meaning actions cross the line. For example, someone might open an older relative's mail to save them stress of bill-paying, but if done without the elderly's person's permission, that breach of privacy could be a form of psychological abuse. A caregiver who gives more than the prescribed dosage of medication to keep an elderly patient calm could be engaging in physical abuse.

There is no definitive list of everything elder abuse is and is not. We must be mindful of how elder abuse can take on different forms and be cautious of how our actions could cause harm. Make sure to listen to your elderly parents, friends, or other family members and take their concerns seriously. If you suspect abuse, report it immediately to health care providers, social services, police, legal professionals and/or members of faith communities.

If you are an elder who is being abused, neglected, or exploited, tell at least one person. Tell your doctor, a friend, or a family member whom you trust. Other people care and can help you.

There is no excuse for abuse!

To be recognized as Kennedy has "is an outstanding moment for any student," she said.



Accessories such as pipes, papers and bongs are unique to every shop, he said.

"We have a huge selection and accessories come in every day," he commented.

The owners and their staff have all been receiving the Cannsell certification required in the cannabis retail industry, and to provide the shop with the Cannsell Gold Status.

The two partners intend to give ten per cent of their profits to Cobalt and Temiskaming Shores area charities.

The business is also setting up an outdoor router to provide people in the immediate area with free Wi-Fi and internet access.

The building has been completely renovated, said Cadeau, with re-levelling and the installation of a new floor and a new roof by Ingleton Construction.
