Pedal power

Festival offers new rides and all things cycling

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff) - They came, they saw, they rolled away.

The third edition of the community bike festival in Temiskaming Shores saw more than 100 bikes and helmets given away to riders of all ages.

"The weather was on the cool side but that didn't seem to affect attendance," said Erika Aelterman, event coordinator and public health promoter at the Timiskaming Health Unit, in an email.

"It was heartwarming to see the kids cruising around on their new-to-them bikes with big smiles on their faces."

This year's tally brings to an estimated 225 the number of refurbished, donated bikes that have found new homes with area residents.

But the event offered more than the bike giveaway.

Volunteers made minor adjustments on site to the new rides and also ensured riders had properly fitted helmets.

The manufacturing and design class at Timiskaming District Secondary built two additional bike stands for use by the volunteer bike mechanics.

The OPP Auxiliary was on hand to engrave identifying numbers on bikes to enable their return to owners if they're ever stolen.

Participants could brush up on their cycling skills and safety knowledge at a bike rodeo.

There was a bike decorating station run by Open Studio Libre, an opportunity to try an adult tricycle that's available for borrowing, and even a stationary bike where pedallers powered a blender to make fruit smoothies.



Continued from Front gram, which provides financial help enabling children to take part in sports and recreation.


The festival "is only possible through the help of fantastic volunteers," Aelterman said.

The Campbell Family Story

At the time of the Great Fire the Campbell family resided in Heaslip. Georgina (Campbell) McRoberts was just eleven years old. She remembers how hot the air was that day. Her father had commented on the ashes blowing in the sky, but this was usual for that time of year as many farmers were clearing land.

Later that afternoon it became so hot that they could hardly breath; the fire was on its way. Mrs. Campbell gathered up the valuables and some clothing for the children and deposited them in their well. After this her husband rounded up all eight children, ranging from age two to thirteen, and the family headed for the root cellar. However, they did not stay long in the root cellar. Mr. Campbell lit a match between the double doors and when it wouldn't burn, he realized there was no oxygen, so he told the family to go down to the end of the lane.

The family of ten headed for the river which was four miles away. They never did make it to the river because the fire caught up with them. Mr. Campbell instructed his family to lie face down in the grass and breath in. If it were not for this, they may never have survived.

When the family all got together, Johanna Campbell, was missing. She was frightened and had run back to the cellar. Mr. Campbell's eyes were burning with smoke and it was dark as night. However, he ran back for this thirteen-year-old daughter only to find the cellar on fire. The rest of the family narrowly escaped. Within 20 minutes everything was lost, their house, their livestock and their furniture.

Georgina suffered major injuries. Her father was carrying her and with the roaring fire all around, she grew afraid and fell out of his arms landing on a burning log. She injured her spine and was sent to Toronto Sick Children's Hospital as a result. She received treatment there for eighteen months. A heated freight car transported her to Toronto. The car was filled with stretchers of other individuals also hurt due to the Fire of 1922.

Due to the fact Georgina had just lost a sister, her mother did not accompany her to Toronto. Even if her mother could have gone, there was no room. Before Georgina left, however she remembers the wild animals which came out of the bush with burns all over their bodies. Many had to be shot. However there seemed to be a common bond between man and beast; both left with nothing.



The June 2 provincial election is now in the books and congratulations to all the candidates who put their names forward to represent the Timiskaming-Cochrane riding at Queen's Park.

The New Democratic Party's John Vanthof was re-elected to serve another four-year term in office.

He has served the people of this riding in a variety of roles with the NDP over the years.

While we can rejoice that the political election is over with, let us take a look at some of the statistics surrounding the vote.

We see that only 40 per cent of eligible voters in the Temiskaming region actually took the time to cast a ballot.

What a privilege it is to be able to cast a vote in a free and democratic country like Canada.

While Ukrainians fight for their freedom and the right to live in a free society, the people of Ontario may have taken for granted their privilege to vote.

It was reported to be the lowest voter turnout in the province since the vote began in 1867.

provincial parks reinforce values of diversity and inclusion, especially in their marketing strategies.


As right wing ideologies





Rota announced the recognition initiative in a news release.



Dangerous Plant Species in the Area

Giant Hogweed

The stems and leaves of this plant are covered with small hairs coated with poisonous sap. Even the slightest touch can cause painful blisters and severe skin irritation. The symptoms can take a couple of days to develop with the skin becoming highly photosensitive producing large watery blisters; however the effects can be long lasting, with contact resulting in recurrent dermatitis. This is a particular concern for small children who may use the stems as pea-shooters or pretend telescopes resulting in horrific injuries.

What does Hogweed Look Like?

- very tall, 8-14 feet
- · Stems have rigid hairs, purple blotches and are hollow
- Flower clusters up to 2 ft across occurring from mid-June to late July
- Has a reddish-purple stem with fine spines that make it appear furry

Wild Parsnip

Is another weed that should also be avoided. The effects are similar to those associated with Giant Hog

Weed. Irritation can occur if your skin contacts the plant's fluids and is then exposed to sunlight. Contact with the eyes can cause temporary blindness and in rare cases permanent blindness.

Wild parsnip can be found within uncultivated land, roadside ditches, parklands, nature trails and sports fields as well as on and around residential properties.

What Does Wild Parsnip Look Like?

- · smells like parsnip
- stands 20-60 inches high, branched, hollow stem
- · small yellow clustered flowers
- · lowers from late June into late fall (resembles dill)

Being able to readily identify wild parsnip and giant hogweed will minimize accidental exposure to these plants and the painful results that follow.

Anyone having information on specific locations where these weeds are posing a public risk should contact the Invading Species Hotline at 1-800-563-7711. You will be asked to send in photos for identification. DO NOT touch, cut or collect parts of the plant.

U urges smokers to butt out

DISTRICT - Not only are rates of smoking among young people a concern, and the obvious health risks from tobacco use concerning, but also the environmental footprint of the tobacco industry is cause for concern, says the THU and the World Health Organization (WHO).

"We don't have to go far to see the environmental impact that tobacco and vaping litter causes in our community, it is prevalent on our streets, beaches, community parks and trails," said Tihealth promoter Laurel Beardmore in an email message.

The THU recently marked World No Tobacco Day. According to WHO, roughly six million people around the world die from tobacco-related ailments per year.

Not only is tobacco use costly for people's health, it is also hard on personal budgets as the costs of using tobacco are estimated to be about \$4,000 per year, according to WHO.

"Tossing lit cigarette butts is also a significant forest fire risk. I don't understand why smokers consider tossing

Thank you to those who properly dispose of your cigarette butts and vape pods," said Beardmore.

In a press release, the THU says globally there are 3.5 million hectares of land given over to grow tobacco which contributes to deforestation of 200,000 hectares a year and soil nutrient degradation.

But cigarette litter is also concerning as discarded butts release thousands of chemicals into the air, water and soil.

The emergence of e-cigarettes brought additional health risks.

Vaping devices contain plastics,
