Sites to see

Busy season expected for Heritage Silver Trail

COBALT/COLEMAN TOWNSHIP - Visits to the Heritage Silver Trail in Cobalt and Coleman Township are expected to pick up again after two years of the pandemic and the reconstruction of the Larose bridge.

The Cobalt Mining Museum also is offering tours into the Colonial Mine Adit.

Cobalt Historical Society president Maggie Wilson said in a telephone interview that a revised map and guide for the trail are now available on the Cobalt Historical Society website. Paper copies of the map are available at some downtown locations, and paper copies of the guide will be available by early July at the latest.

New and improved signage has been erected at the Right-of-Way site beside Cobalt Lake.

The site is currently off-limits to the public, so the signage has been moved so the public can read it while standing outside the property boundary, explained Wilson.

The Townsite headframe and nearby Glory Hole, and the Right-of-Way site, all owned by Ontario Northland and currently being inspected for hazards, continue to be off-limits to the public, but they can be viewed from a safe distance, said Wilson.

Signage has also been added at the Cobalt Lake Mill (Hellens Mill) at the south end of Cobalt Lake which is now officially on the trail, she said. Agnico Eagle, which owns the site, has plans for its remediation to make it safer, and there is the possibility of the addition of a viewing platform, she added.

"That will be exciting to have happen."

A few sites have been removed from the Heritage Silver Trail.

Wilson said Agnico Eagle had one of its employees visit the trail and look at the sites as a visitor would view them, and then came back with recommendations "for sites that probably no longer make sense."

The Agnico Refinery near the Larose Blacksmith Shop is one of those that has been removed. Trees were obscuring the property, and it was unclear to visitors what the site was supposed to be about, Wilson explained.

Agnico has also asked that the signage be removed from the side of the road near the open cut by the

July 6, 2022 stories...

- After a pandemic-induced dry spell, North on Tap is back. The fourth edition of the one-day festival returns July 9 to the Haileybury waterfront.
- The location of a sewage lagoon in Armstrong Township came as a surprise to some neighbours. Even the municipality did not know about the proposal until after the province approved it.
- Amid the smell of sawdust and with dozens of people watching, a ceremonial plank was sawn to officially open the Daki Menan Lands and Resources Forestry Initiative June 30. The day had been more than two decades in the making.
- Wednesday, July 6, is the first in a summer of Art in the Park evenings organized and presented by the Temiskaming Art Gallery. The Haileybury waterfront pavilion will be the place to be to soak up the art, music and food.
- The Bikers Reunion continues to donate on an annual basis to the Community Cancer Care (CCC) program and the Temiskaming Hospital in the form of medical equipment purchases.
- Approximately 200 people attended the first annual Pride Parade that took place along the New Liskeard boardwalk on June 29.
- The year-end sports awards were handed out at Ecole secondaire catholique Ste-Marie to honour the school's top athletes.



Nipissing Hill. While the site is significant to the heritage, the presence of the signage is creating a traffic safety hazard, she said. The open cut is still evident.

"You can't help but see it when you go by."

The Meyer Vein, the 73 shaft, located behind the former Cobalt arena, collapsed about three years ago, Wilson said. That has been taken off the trail also.

The Mile 104 Mill near the highway northeast of Cobalt, is also being taken off the trail, as requested by Agnico Eagle.

The McKinley-Darragh Mine and the Little Silver Vein off the Coleman Road still remain.

The Cobalt Historical Society is currently seeking quotes for renovating the Larose Blacksmith Shop.

There are strong concerns that the walls of the building are going to collapse, Wilson explained.

While the trail has been shortened, the sites that remain could all be accessed in one afternoon of walking, said Wilson.

"It also makes it more manageable for us."

The Cobalt Historical Society is responsible for the maintenance of the trail. It is assisted by volunteers and with input and financial assistance by the Town of Cobalt and Coleman Township.



It's one of nature's greatest shows.

I watched an osprey drop from the skies in a death-defying dive at roughly 40 miles-per-hour into a lake and come up with a fish in its mouth.

I saw this incredible scene while paddling around a green shoreline in the early morning hours during my week's holidays.

The osprey is a perfect example of patience and perseverance.

I also saw a Great Blue Heron fly overhead and then an eagle shortly thereafter.

A loon was preening its feathers in front of my canoe and I heard the distinctive short, cursory sound of a belted kingfisher.

The magic of the lake at the beginning of July is mesmerizing.

It has been a cool, wet spring and the lake is just beginning to warm up.

The farmers are relishing the rain and the cooler temperatures as their crops are thriving.

With the high price of gas, I am sticking close to home this week.

Last Sunday I booked a wagon tour at the Bison du Nord bison ranch in Earlton.

It was amazing to see those massive bison up close and hear how the meat is highly sought after for its nutritional content and low fat levels.

The bison are raised free of antibiotics and hormones and they are grass fed, said Pierre Belanger on the tour.

We know the bison had a tremendous impact on the history of Canada and Indigenous peoples' survival.

The bison provided Indigenous people with everything they needed to survive: hides for warmth and shelter, meat for eating, muscle for sinew and bones for tools.

Certainly the Belanger family has great respect for their 300 or so herd and that is perhaps why their business has thrived.

A bison does not operate alone but rather the entire

herd works together to protect each other.

That might describe the Belanger family as they celebrate their 50th anniversary of bison farming in the north.

Sometimes we are unaware of what's in our own backyards and now is a perfect time to explore Wild Temiskaming.

I couldn't help but think it's so easy these days to throw up your hands and walk away from living your best life. Don't. Keep caring about what goes on in the world and keep looking for beauty. And never forget to say thanks for life's many gifts.

Despite the harshness of life, I find spirituality in the beauty of the natural world.

My goal is not to get something but rather to see the world in a different way, almost in a childlike way.

Children automatically see the wonder in the world and that's the way I wish to be.






Cobalt Artists Colony returning

COBALT - The Cobalt Artists Colony is returning to Cobalt July 11 to 15.

The colony has not been in town since the last gathering in 2019.

This year, people are once again descending on the colourful little mining town to capture it in art.

People will be coming from North Bay, Sudbury, Timmins, the Englehart area and the Tri-Town area, said convenor Karen Pilch in a telephone interview.

"It's a good group," she said.

The lead artist will be Brian Atyeo of Killarney.

He will be leading artists as they build their skills in watercolour and acrylics.

The group will be using the Golden Age Club on Argentite Street as their base, and will be there daily from 9 a.m. to sometime between 3 p.m. and 4 p.m. Interested visitors are welcome to drop by any day after about 10:30, said Pilch. The

earlier morning will be reserved for sessions between Atyeo and the participants as he leads them with demonstrations.

Some artists will be working in the hall throughout the day, but there are others who can't wait to get out into the streets

of the town where they will set up easels and paints and let the scene inspire them.

The Cobalt Artists Colony has long been an annual event, which has followed the interest in the town by some members of the Group of Seven.

Optimizing Snacking

Food not only provides us with the energy and the fuel we need but also produces enjoyment, identifies culture, holds tradition and creates community. Every time we eat offers an opportunity to nourish our bodies and enrich our lives.

Snacks are an important part of our daily eating habits and can help us to receive all of the nutrients we require. Incorporating delicious, nutrient-dense snack options can therefore help us to meet our daily nutrition needs and provide us with adequate energy. Below is a list of tips to help improve snacking as well as some snack ideas.

Tips for Snacking:

- **Choose a "Veggie Song".** Cutting up vegetables and fruits ahead of time allows for easy 'grab and go', nutrient-dense, snack options. This task however can feel cumbersome. Choosing a 2-4 minute song, that you enjoy, allows you to set a couple of minutes aside to accomplish the task while listening to a favourite tune.
- **Store individually.** Pre-portioning non-perishable items such as whole-wheat crackers, roasted chickpeas, rice cakes and trail mix, increases the convenience of these high-fiber or protein packed options. Consider storing muffins, and/or pancakes individually in the freezer for an easy 'grab and go' snack to enjoy later.
- **Incorporate what you love.** This will look different for everyone and may include exploring new flavours, including cultural favourites, sharing ideas with family and friends or finding creative ways to modify old-time favourites based on health motivators.

Snack Ideas. A whole grain muffin and an orange; a hard-boiled egg and a pear; pumpkin seeds and berries on yogurt; apple slices and cheese; egg salad or labneh spread (a soft Middle Eastern cheese made from strained yogurt) on whole grain crackers.



- Not disqualified under the provisions as outlined in Section 90(3) and 91(1) of the MEA.

However, if they still hold membership to those bodies as of Nomination Day their nominations shall be rejected Under Section 30(1) of the MEA.






BUT HE DOES!
