Great Fire 100th anniversary this year

TEMISKAMING SHORES - It's an important year for the district, and the Haileybury Heritage Museum is raising awareness and planning a celebration for the 100th anniversary of the Great Fire of 1922.

There were 18 municipalities impacted by the fire of October 4, 1922, which reached from the Charlton area and eastward across the Quebec border, and southward past Haileybury. Lives were lost, homes and farms razed, and even communities were levelled. A large part of Haileybury was consumed. Many people left what had been a thriving region with

dreams and opportunities. But others stayed, and the region survived and grew.

Already, in the Temiskaming Speaker/Weekender and on Facebook there have been many stories recounted by survivors about that time when many

small slash pile fires across the region managed to be driven together on the hot day, and came together to be the Great Fire of 1922.

Tiffany White is the project coordinator of the an-

Malfunctioning valve suspected as cause of water breaks

TEMISKAMING SHORES – A malfunctioning valve at the Niven Street reservoir in Haileybury is suspected as the cause of a series of water line breaks in North Cobalt last week.

Low water pressure and the potential for contamination prompted a boil-water advisory for residents serviced by the North Cobalt water system.

The malfunction caused pumps to cycle too fast and enabled air to get into the system, explained Steve Burnett, Temiskaming Shores' manager of environmental services, earlier this week.

By the time the problem was identified, multiple water breaks had occurred late in the week, said Burnett July 12.

To avoid the risk of more breaks, pressure within the system was lowered.

Over the weekend, Burnett said air was released from the system, and operations had returned to normal.

The Temiskaming Health Unit issued precautionary boil-water advisories early last week, and an actual boil-water advisory on July 7.

A series of consecutive tests showing no contamination must be completed before the advisory can be lifted. As of the deadline for this issue at noon July 13, the advisory remained in place.



EDITORIAL

Failure to communicate

As many of us disconnect, put our phones away and enjoy time spent in the outdoors this summer, a big problem occurred last Friday in terms of connectivity in Canada.

On July 8 a service outage left 10 million Rogers customers offline.

This outage was dangerous and crippling to local businesses that could not operate their cash registers or even sell lotto tickets as their systems were down.

The Interact debit machines went down and the ability to pay with a debit or credit card was impossible.

If you had cash in your pocket you were okay, but how many people carry cash these days?

Service Canada reported their services were affected and some Rogers customers could not access 911 services and medical appointments were also affected.

People who work from home were left without internet service and scrambled to go to the nearest coffee shop for Wi Fi.

This is a wake-up call for all of us because it tells us our economy and our daily lives rely on being connected to the internet.

Politicians need to be asking tough questions about this debacle and asking tech giants to have a Plan B in place when outages happen.

They should also stop giving wide latitude to Canada's telecommunications sector, represented by a scant few companies.

No longer should we view internet service as a luxury, it is a necessity just like essential services like water and electricity.

Having reliable access to the information highway is critical to daily life in the North and elsewhere.

Regulatory bodies like governments need to step up and oversee the tech giants' operations.

We need a wireless revolution in this country in which Canadians receive affordable, equitable and reliable internet services.

Successful politicians are interested in people and they love them.

I think of New Zealand's Jacinda Arden when I think of a model politician.

She led her country with kind leadership, minus the bullying and aggression that all too often characterize the political arena.

I feel for the City of Temiskaming Shores council and staff as they deal with the controversial decision to award a contract for animal control services.

Politics is a two way street. While people demand a great deal from their politicians, they themselves must model the behavior they wish to see at the council table.

Otherwise, that would be massive hypocrisy.

While I was on holidays I watched the political world explode for U.K. Prime Minister Boris Johnson, Progressive Conservative leader candidate Patrick Brown and the assassination of Japan's former prime minister, Shinzo Abe.

And it was not an easy week for Assembly of First Nations (AFN) national chief RoseAnne Archibald either as her leadership was called into question.

Great leaders possess certain qualities and this region needs leaders who have integrity and are in it for the right reasons.

I spent a decade in municipal politics alongside good leaders, questionable leaders and leaders who were continually harassed and harangued simply because they were women.

In 2022, it is long overdue that we put aside the assumptions about minorities and their leadership capabilities.

We desperately need more diversity at council tables across the region.

I think effective leaders have these qualities: they must be skilled communicators, have integrity, are able to delegate tasks, have a sense of gratitude and empathy for people and are at the table not for their own personal agendas,

but equally for all of the people they represent.

If you are running in the latest municipal election, are you aware of the Municipal Act, which is your bible?

Are you aware of the obligations of the oath of office and pecuniary interest?

I'd say it takes at least four years, one full term, before a person fully understands how councils work and how important the process of public policy is.

I want to emphasize that even if you bring an issue to the table and your motion is defeated, it is best to accept the majority-voted outcome.

It is equally important to challenge assumptions and ideas to get the best deal for the ratepayers.

Finally, people love to complain, but complaining is negative and it is certainly not solutions-oriented.

As corny as it sounds, be the change you wish to see in the world.

Great Fire 100th anniversary this year

Continued from Front anniversary. Working at the museum, through the City of Temiskaming Shores, she is coordinating the delivery of stories about survivors' memories, and also advertising as the actual anniversary date draws closer.

White reflected that there are "a lot of different stories about where the fire started. Everybody at that time was burning slash piles. There were a lot of fires everywhere. That was a standard thing for them to do at that time."

People were used to the haze of fires burning at that time of year, she said, and it wasn't until about noon that it was realized that there was a conflagration of serious intensity that was building. The sky had become black, White said. "Throughout the day it just took over the entire area."

Across the district the fire, which had combined into one

great conflagration, drove through the region with fireballs and horizontally shooting tree-trunks while people and animals sought shelter. Many people died, while homes, churches, business sections and farms were burned to the ground.

On the shore of Haileybury, individuals and families took shelter in the water while they watched much of their town reduced to blackened timbers and ashes.

The day of October 4 had been a hot day and people had been wearing light clothing when they were forced to flee for their lives. On October 5 the temperature had dropped and it snowed.

HERITAGE MUSEUM

Through the summer, visitors will be welcomed into the museum to learn more about that event, but also about the history of the town of Haileybury.

The Haileybury Heritage Mu-

seum will be officially opening its doors to the public on July 18.

The museum will be open Monday through Sunday for the months ahead from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Visitors will be able to explore the town's history, enjoy a model train display, read and do research.

Activities commemorating that date will be taking place from September 30 to October 2.

"We're going to use the entire weekend to celebrate the survivors and the resilience of the area," she said.

Plans for that weekend include music by Indigenous performers on Friday, September 30, including Temagami musician David Laronde and Indigenous musical group Nimkii and the Niniis (who are Juno nominees). That will be taking place at Northern College.

There will be a Saturday parade from the ball park to the Harbour Front Pavilion, where there will be cake and cupcakes to mark the date. There will be a remembrance dip in the lake. Firefighter competitions will be held, and there will be interactive opportunities for children and their families with the firefighters. Later in the day a gala dinner will be held at the Haileybury Curling Club and musical entertainment will be provided by Steve Benoit, and also the Grievous Angels (with Charlie Angus).

On Sunday morning a farewell breakfast will be held, also at the Haileybury Curling Club.

White said that there have been booths in place at various area events already, and people have been expressing their interest in the plans.

"They are very excited about what's coming up."

Should you get the Pneumococcal Vaccine?

What causes Pneumonia?

There are two main kinds of pneumonia, one caused by viruses and the other caused by bacteria. One type of bacteria is called *Streptococcus pneumoniae* (or pneumococcus). When these bacteria invade the lungs, they cause bacterial pneumonia. Most cases of bacterial pneumonia are caused by pneumococcus.

Why is Pneumococcal Vaccine important?

Pneumococcal vaccine can prevent pneumonia and other infections caused by 23 types of the *Streptococcus pneumoniae* bacteria. The vaccine protects about 50 to 80 per cent of people against pneumococcal infection. Vaccination also makes the disease milder for those who may catch it.

Who Should Get the Vaccine?

Anyone 65 years of age and older, as well as adults and children two years and older who have the following high-risk medical conditions

- Cancer
- Chronic heart, liver or kidney disease
- Chronic lung disease
- Nephrotic (relating to the kidneys) syndrome
- Cirrhosis of the liver
- Alcoholism
- Diabetes
- HIV infection and AIDS
- No spleen or a spleen that does not work properly
- Sickle cell disease
- Now also recommended for asthma

When should the Pneumococcal Vaccine be given?

The vaccine is offered routinely for adults at 65 years of age, but you should be vaccinated sooner if you have a high-risk medical condition (see above). An **additional** dose is recommended 5 years after the first dose if you have any of following medical conditions:

- Asplenia or sickle cell disease
- Hepatic cirrhosis
- Chronic renal failure or nephrotic syndrome
- HIV
- Immunosuppression related to disease or therapy

After you get any immunization, make sure your primary care provider updates your personal immunization record.

Fire Extinguishers

In most cases, the best thing to do in a home fire is to get everyone out of the home immediately and call the fire department from outside:

- Make sure working smoke alarms are installed on every storey of the home and outside all sleeping areas.
- Everyone in the home should practice a home fire escape plan so everyone knows what to do BEFORE a fire occurs.

Many people who decide to purchase a fire extinguisher might not know how or when to use them.

Fire extinguishers should be used only by people who have been trained to use them. People are encouraged to contact their local fire department if they would like fire extinguisher training or have any questions.

The following tips can help people who are thinking about buying a fire extinguisher for their home:

- Consider purchasing a fire extinguisher that has an ABC rating. This type can be used for most types of fires.
- Choose a fire extinguisher that has the logo of an independent, accredited product safety testing agency such as ULC.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions regarding where the

extinguisher should be placed in the home.

- Inspect the fire extinguisher once a month and have it serviced by a certified technician every year.
- Fire extinguishers should be used only on small, contained fires. Never let the fire get between you and the exit.

To operate a fire extinguisher, remember the acronym PASS:

- Pull the pin;
- Aim the nozzle at the base of the fire;
- Squeeze the trigger;
- Sweep the extinguisher from side to side until the extinguisher is empty.
- Know when to go. If the fire does not go out after using one fire extinguisher, back out of the area, close the door if possible, and safely get outside and call 9-1-1.
- Remember that many stovetop fires can be safely extinguished without the use of a fire extinguisher. If a pot on the stove starts on fire, slide a lid over the pot to smother the flames and turn off the stove. Leave the pot in place until it has cooled completely.
