City disposing of blue box duties

TEMISKAMING SHORES – In two and a half years, responsibility for residential recycling in Temiskaming Shores and area shifts to producers.

Temiskaming Shores council has said it's not interested in continuing to provide blue box collection after the transition, which takes effect January 1, 2025.

But council has been assured that residents should see no reduction in the types of materials collected curbside.

"My understanding, after 12 years of arguing this, is that the average resident should see no change in service," commented Danny Whalen, a city councillor and president of the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities, when city council met July 12.

It's in the regulation that any change would be positive, in that additional materials could be added to the list of what's accepted for recycling, said Steve Burnett, the city's manager of environmental services.

The city will continue to be responsible for solid waste and garbage collection, said Mayor Carman Kidd after the meeting.

But he said the provincial shift to producer responsibility takes the municipality "right out" of recycling.

The city currently operates a transfer facility on Barr Drive in New Liskeard where recyclables from blue bins are stored until shipped to a North Bay processor.

A number of area municipalities have agreements with the city to store their recyclables at the city's

transfer station, and will be informed of Temiskaming Shores' decision.

The changes are part of a provincial move to overhaul responsibility for blue box programs.

The transition also takes effect in Englehart and Evanturel at the start of 2025. Other municipalities

in the district will make the shift over the course of that year.

In a report to city council, Burnett said most producers of paper and packaging have signed on with "producer responsibility organizations."

The organizations will take over the collection and processing of recyclables on behalf of producers.

It could mean that an organization buys and manages transfer stations like New Liskeard's, and contracts with current companies that now pick up recyclables, Kidd said.

By no longer providing recycling-related services, savings to the city are estimated at \$250,000 to \$300,000.

But Kidd anticipated that producers will try to recover their costs.

"The consumer's going to pay it one way or another," he said, whether through taxes or additional product fees.

In his report, Burnett noted

that the city will have to discuss options for collection of recyclables from commercial establishments. It currently picks up from some.

Under the current provincial plan, he said producers are not responsible for materials from commercial sources.

The Jim Harman Family Story

I am the daughter of James and Lavina (Mills) Harman. They lived in Evanturel Township at Heaslip with my three brothers, Walter (born in 1914), William (born in 1916), and Victor (born in 1918). Dad said there was an awful wind the day of the fire. They and many other survived by going into the nearby river.

My dad helped to find the bodies after the fire. The bond family had taken refuge in a root house that was made from cedar posts. The door caught fire and so they did not stand a chance. They thought maybe Mr. Bond had been working in the field as his team of horses was tied to a fence post in the yard and was not touched by the fire. The Bond family was all buried in one coffin as there were only small parts of them left after the fire was put out. Dad said it was terrible. They are in the Englehart cemetery.

There was also a father and son living in the bush [Joseph & Stanley Fleming]. They left their house and were both found perished by the railroad tracks. Their house in the bush was not touched.

The school kids at Heaslip were send to Heaslip Hall a mile away and this building was not touched. Others went down wells and were not so lucky.

Mum was sent to relatives who lived near Strathroy with her three sons while Dad stayed in Heaslip to help other families rebuild his home.

My parents lost everything but their Model T Ford, and because they had a car they were not eligible for relief. They had saved the car by driving it into a shallow part of the river. The canvas top burned off but the rest of the car was alright.

Hot Weather Safety for Physical Activity

Hotter weather has arrived in most parts of Canada. We look forward to this time of year, but too much heat is not good for anyone. It can be riskier as we get older. When we are active, our muscles produce heat. This causes a rise in body temperature.

Our bodies do two things to manage the increase in body heat:

- Our heart rate increases to help deliver blood to the surface of the skin for heat release
- We start to sweat, which helps with cooling

Both of these functions are reduced as we get older. That raises the risk of heat-related illness when we are physically active in the heat, either outdoors or in hot conditions indoors.

Heat-related illness includes cramps, dizziness, edema (water retention and swelling) and exhaustion. There is also a more severe condition known as heat stroke.

Should we stop being active when it gets hot?

Older Canadians do tend to be less active when the weather gets hot and humid. But it is important to stay physically active all year round. In fact, older adults who are more physically fit can adapt better during exercise in the heat.

Hot weather tips

- Older adults should not participate in **strenuous** physical activities in hot/humid conditions outdoors, especially if they are not used to the conditions or are not used to being physically active.
- Take it easier when you exercise and be active during the cooler times of the day -- early morning or late evening, if you are not able to be active in an air-conditioned environment.
- Wear loose fitting, lightweight, moisture-wicking clothing. Cotton clothing can be cooler.
- Stay hydrated. As we get older, we do not notice thirst as much. That increases the risk for dehydration. Don't wait until you feel thirsty. Drink lots of fluids, especially during exercise.

If you are taking medication or have a health condition, ask your doctor or pharmacist if it increases your health risk in the heat and follow their recommendations.

Why do you need your COVID-19 booster dose?



Pourquoi avez-vous besoin d'une dose de rappel ?

Vaccines are effective at protecting you against severe illness, hospitalization, and death related to COVID-19. However, effectiveness decreases over time.

A booster dose will help protect you from more severe outcomes from COVID-19.

Everyone aged 18+ is now eligible for a 4th dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. At this time, 4th doses are recommended for anyone with underlying health conditions, such as lung or heart conditions. Speak to your health care provider about whether getting a 4th dose now is right for you. Your health care provider can help you make an informed decision based on your personal circumstances.

A new bivalent COVID-19 vaccine, which may offer more targeted protection against the Omicron variants, is expected this fall.

The recommended timing between your third and fourth doses is 5 months. If you have had COVID-19, you should wait 3 months after infection for a booster dose.


