## Air quality monitors in circulation at library

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special) – With every breath you exhale, you're releasing carbon dioxide.

In Temiskaming Shores, library cardholders can now borrow monitors to measure levels of carbon dioxide (CO2) in their homes and offices.

In a news release, the library explained that indoor CO2 levels can increase if there's not enough outside air coming into the space.

"High indoor CO2 levels can cause various symptoms including tiredness and headaches and indicate that a space is not well ventilated. High CO2 levels can also facilitate the spread of airborne pathogens," it said.

The monitors do not detect carbon monoxide and are not life safety devices.

Libraries in Toronto and Peterborough have made CO2 monitors available to their users.

Temiskaming Shores library learned of the program though the city recreation direction Matt Bahm, said library CEO Rebecca Hunt.

"We thought it was a unique and useful tool to use in the home or at the office for people to get a sense of how well ventilated a space is," Hunt said.

"If people know ventilation is poor they can take measures, such as opening a window or increasing the amount of fresh air coming from their HVAC system."

The library worked with the recreation department to secure the donation of three Aranet4 Home Indoor Air Quality monitors from Rise.

Rise is an online home improvement store focused on sustainability.

"Many families are concerned about their indoor air quality, whether they have allergies, asthma, environmental sensitivities, or chemical sensitivities," said Rise CEO Matt Daigle in the news release.

"We spend most of our time indoors (about 90 per cent), and the indoor air we breathe can often be three or four times as polluted as outdoor air. So, pri-

oritizing indoor air quality is of utmost importance in the journey to a healthier home," Daigle continued.

The devices monitor CO2, temperature, relative humidity, and atmospheric pressure.

Borrowers pick up a package that includes the device, a fact sheet and a quick start guide. The devices can be checked out for a period of three weeks at no

# New 683 area code popping up

OTTAWA (Special) – When 705 isn't enough, 683 is stepping up.

Starting June 18, the new 683 area code was introduced in the region currently served by area codes 249 and 705 in Ontario.

In a news release, Canada's Telecommunications Alliance explains that the new area code responds to the increasing demand for phone numbers in the region, ensuring residents and businesses con-

tinue to have enough numbers to meet demand well into the future.

"The new area code will be introduced gradually starting on June 18," said Kelly T. Walsh, program manager of the Canadian Numbering Administrator.

"After this date, consumers and businesses requesting a new phone number may receive one with the new area code."

Important information:

• Existing numbers keep the same area

code.

- Local calling areas remain the same.
- All local calls will require 10 digits (area code plus local number).
- Special numbers such as 911, 211, 311, 411 and 611 will still be dialled using only three digits.
- Business customers using communications systems that restrict long distance calling will need to add 683 as a local area code.

# Off-Road Response Unit formally presented to public

TEMISKAMING SHORES
- EMS and DTSSAB proudly introduced their Off-Road Response Unit to the public July 5 and thanked all the sponsors who made the unit possible.

In just the past year, the unit has been used seven times to reach people who were in remote areas which were inaccessible by most motorized vehicles, Emergency Medical Services (EMS) chief John McCarthy explained.

There is only one other similar unit in the province, he noted.

Mark Stewart, chief administrative officer of the District of Timiskaming Social Services Administration Board (DTSS-AB), commended the EMS team, noting the "wealth of passion and work ethic that drives the EMS team."

DTSSAB chair Derek Mundle said that the project was completely funded through sponsors. He added that it was quickly evident that the need for the unit was critical. Its presence can give the public peace of mind in knowing that it is available, he said.

McCarthy told the gathering that approximately 12 years ago, he and EMS superintendent Trevor Neddo began working on a plan to bring it to a reality.

He credited Neddo's hard work and dedication as he worked on the project.

In order to raise the funds needed, it was necessary to go door to door soliciting support for the project, McCarthy said, even though that is not what a paramedic expects to end up doing in the course of their career.

The first donation came from TC Energy (Trans Canada)

which started the fundraising campaign. Just as it was seeming to be an overwhelming task, he said, Bridget Grant, a director of the Frog's Breath Foundation, reached out and advised that the Foundation would be making a donation equal to the remaining amount that was needed.

Along with many paramedics, family members and friends, several of the sponsors were also present.



It is fair to say the burden of her missing daughter has weighed heavily on Celine.

But not only Celine, the entire community feels the weight of this missing person's case and the tragedy of the loss of one of its promising youth.

Hopefully, approaching the 26th year of the disappearance of Melanie Ethier, this will be the year her missing person case is solved.

The people who know something about this teen's disappearance should immediately come forward and help a grieving mother, sister, grandmother and other family members and friends solve the case of what happened to Melanie Ethier.

# The apology

It was in 2013 when white smoke rose from a Vatican chimney indicating a new pope had been chosen for the Roman Catholic Church. Pope Francis stepped out onto the balcony and bowed his head in St. Peter's Square.

It was a genuine, humble gesture indicating that this newly minted Pope was cut from a different cloth than his predecessors.

It was the first time a Pope had bowed to the people asking to be blessed by them.

The 266th pontiff is on Canadian soil this week to offer an apology to our Indigenous brothers and sisters concerning the massive abuses by the Catholic Church with the residential school experience.

I give him credit for coming to Canada, and perhaps finally giving an acknowledgment of the truth of the harms done through the residential school experience.

He asked for forgiveness several times in his apology, but perhaps none will be offered.

That is for the survivors to decide and their fami-

lies.

But acknowledging the mistakes of the past and taking responsibility is what is important at the moment.

He is on a pilgrimage of penitence, repentance, contrition, remorse and regret for the wrongdoing of the church in relation to the crimes committed against so many.

Penitence implies a humble realization of, and regret for, one's mistakes.

Pope Francis is willing to shoulder the blame for what happened and he is willing to suffer for the horrid wrongdoings of his church and its clergy.

The Pope's apology is the bare minimum that should be offered to help Indigenous people heal and move forward.

For some Indigenous people, the apology will never be enough to erase the horrors of the residential school experience and the missing children.

For others it might be a step forward on the path to healing, truth and reconciliation so badly needed when such extreme trauma has taken place.

But after the apology has been issued, it is up to the Pope to hold his church accountable for the wrongs and, in effect, change the culture of the church that has led to such gross abuses.

Why was there no talk of rescinding the Doctrine of Discovery, a legal principle used to exploit non-Christians?

Our government must also walk its talk concerning the archaic Indian Act and adopting the 99 recommendations from the Truth and Reconciliation Report.

The Pope's apology was Number 45 of the 99 recommendations.

It was government mandates that ordered residential schools to take the "Indian out of the child."

We must change our thought processes to offer respect and inclusion to all Canadians.

We are all one drum, one song, one energy and we need each other.

### **Melanoma Skin Cancer Awareness**

Melanoma skin cancer often starts as an abnormal mole on the skin. A mole is a common non-cancerous growth. It's normally a small, round, or oval spot that is usually brown, tan or pink. It may be raised or flat. Melanoma is most frequently found on the back of men and on the back and legs of women. It is the least common, but most serious, type of skin cancer.

#### Risk Factors:

- Personal or family history of melanoma.
- · Presence of moles--especially if there are many, or if they are unusual or large.
- Sun sensitivity--sun burning easily
- · Light colored skin, eyes, and hair.
- · History of excessive sun exposure.
- · Diseases that suppress the immune system.
- Occupational exposure to coal tar, pitch, creosote, arsenic compounds, or radium.

### The ABCDE rule below can help you look for the common signs and symptoms of melanoma skin cancer:

A is for asymmetry – one half of a mole does not have the same shape as the other half.

**B** is for border – the edge of a mole is uneven (irregular). It can look jagged, notched, or blurry. The colour may spread into the area around the mole.

**C** is for colour – the colour of a mole is not the same throughout. It could have shades of tan, brown and black. Sometimes areas of blue, grey, red, pink, or white are also seen.

**D** is for diameter – the size of a mole is larger than 6mm (1/4 inch) across, which is about the size of a pencil eraser.

**E** is for evolving – there is a change in the colour, size, shape or feel of the mole. The mole may become itchy or you may have a burning or tingling feeling.

### Other signs and symptoms of melanoma skin cancer include:

- · an area that does not heal
- · a mole or sore that oozes or bleeds
- broken skin with an open wound (ulceration)

Melanoma is an aggressive form of cancer that can be lifethreatening. Schedule an appointment with your primary care provider if you have any of these skin changes.

### Be Bear Wise while camping

DISTRICT (Special) - When enjoying Ontario's campsites, lakes, forests or hiking trails, remember you are in natural bear habitat.

Bears have a keen sense of smell, and are attracted by the odour of all food and garbage. Avoid conflicts with bears while camping by being prepared and aware.

Here are some tips to prepare:

- Plan your trip with safety in mind by learning how to avoid attracting a bear.
- Teach children how to be Bear Wise and never approach or run from a bear.

- Keep children between adults while hiking.
- Think about how to safely store your food and garbage while on the campsite.
- Pack food with special care. Once you're out there, remember to:
- Look for signs of bear activity near your campsite.
- Keep dogs on a leash. The bear may follow the dog back to its owner.
- Follow the advice set out by Ontario Parks or the private campground.
- Use bear-resistant containers or sealed plastic bags to

- store food when camping or in back country.
- Hang food at least four metres (13 feet) above the ground and three metres (10 feet) from tree limbs.
- Never eat, cook or store food, cooking equipment or toiletries in your tent.

Always remember to clean up at your campsite:

- Clean fish away from your campsite.
- Burn scraps and fat droppings.
- Drain dish water.


### SKI SUPPORT







The number of impaired driving collisions dramatically increases over the holiday season. Here are a few tips to make sure neither you nor the people you care about get behind the wheel while under the influence.


### Attending a party



### Tips for the road

When driving home from a holiday shindig, keep an eye out for the following warning signs that another driver might be under the influence of drugs or alcohol:

- They're making wide, abrupt or illegal turns
- They have a slow or delayed reaction time to traffic lights and signs
- They're driving unreasonably fast, slow or at an inconsistent speed
- They're continuously weaving, swerving or drifting out of their lane

If you suspect you're driving behind an impaired driver, slow down, stay behind them and, when it's safe to do so, pull over and call 911.

Additionally, impaired driving accidents that result in fatalities are more likely to happen very late at night or early in the morning. Therefore, try to avoid being on the road between midnight and 3 a.m.




