Connecting employers and workers at September job fair

TEMISKAMING SHORES - People seeking a better job, or a new job, or employers seeking new employees will all have a chance to get together at a job fair being planned in Temiskaming Shores for September 27.

The Far Northeast Training Board and Employment Options in New Liskeard, with the City of Temiskaming Shores and other partners, are currently gathering names of potential employers who will be present at Riverside Place in New Liskeard that day from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. to meet potential new employees.

Far Northeast executive director Julie Joncas said in a telephone interview that there will be a second job fair in Kirkland Lake on September 28.

"The last couple of years, like everyone else, we've done everything virtually," she said, but the job fairs held in that way were not the same. She said community partners have advised "that there is an appetite to come back to the in-person job fairs."

She said it is well known that there are workforce shortages in almost every industry right now, and this fair will provide employers an opportunity to meet job seekers, and for job seekers to meet potential employers one-on-one.

Invitations to employers to participate were sent out in June with a reminder sent out in August, after which a final list will be compiled and published on social media.

"So far the response has been good," said Joncas. Approximately two-dozen employers are registered for Temiskaming Shores.

representatives there because they are currently recruiting and have openings in the area, noted

She said it was determined from a survey conducted of job seekers over one year across the region that about 50 per cent of potential employees visiting a job fair are already employed and are looking for a different or better opportunity.



- The Northern Ontario Hockey Association (NOHA) is hosting a number of events and providing financial incentives for new officials to enter the game of hockey.



EDITORIAL

No to elimination of Northern riding

In the next federal election, Northern Ontario could lose a seat because of proposed changes to Ontario's riding boundaries.

This errant move is slated to take place by 2025.

Under the riding redistribution proposal, Northern Ontario and Toronto would lose one riding each.

The Federal Electoral Districts Redistribution Commission has as its mandate to ensure that all federal ridings across this country have roughly the same populations.

In an ideal world, voices at all levels of governments need to be heard and taken into account when decisions are being made.

Rural regions are affected by huge geographical areas and limited resources financial and otherwise.

Urban voices can dominate the floor at Queen's Park and the federal parliament, but rural voices need to be heard too.

As ridings across Ontario become more urbanized due to expanding populations, the voices of rural Northern Ontario become less prominent.

Rural communities have different issues to deal with than urban regions and providing services to those remote regions can be expensive for governments.

It is time for all Northerners to band together and let the governments know that we are opposed to less representation, and that one less riding will not be good.

Timmins-James Bay MP Charlie Angus had this to say about the changes: "The proposed changes ... represents a major diminishment of the North's ability to have adequate representation on the national stage."

And Northern Ontario must not have less representation at the federal lev-

Anxiety in Children

Does any of this sound like your child or teen?

- Clinging, crying and/or tantrums when you separate
- Excessive shyness, avoiding social situations
- Constant worry
- Avoiding situations or places because of fears
- Complaints of frequent stomach aches or headaches
- Experiencing sudden and frequent panic attacks

If you answered yes to any of these statements your child may be experiencing anxiety.

As a parent of an anxious child, you are not alone.

Anxiety is one of the most common mental health concerns for children and adults, affecting upwards of 20% of children and adolescents over the lifespan. Anxious youth are often quiet and well behaved, and thus frequently go unnoticed by their parents, teachers, and coaches. Alternatively, others can be disruptive and act out, being labeled as having attention deficit disorder or being a "bad" kid. Both scenarios result in children failing to receive the help they desperately need. Sadly, untreated anxiety can lead to depression, missed opportunities in career and relationships, increased substance use, and a decreased quality of life.

Pointers for Helping Children Escape the Cycle of Anxiety

1. The goal is not to eliminate anxiety, but to help a child manage it

The best way to help kids overcome anxiety isn't to try to remove stressors that trigger it. It's to help them learn to tolerate their anxiety and function as well as they can, even when they're anxious.

2. Don't avoid things just because they make a child

Helping children avoid the things they are afraid of will make them feel better in the short term, but it reinforces the anxiety over the long run. If a child in an uncomfortable situation gets upset, starts to cry and parents whisk the child out of there, or remove the thing the child is afraid of, he/she has learned that coping mechanism, and that cycle has the potential to repeat itself.

Express positive but realistic expectations

You can't promise a child that his/her fears are unrealistic but you can express confidence that the child is going to be okay, he/she will be able to manage it, and that, as the child faces his/her fears, the anxiety level will drop over time. This gives the child confidence that your expectations are realistic, and that you're not going to ask him/her to do something he/she can't handle.



Inspection of MNRF-Approved Prescribed Burn Plan for Slash Pile Burning Temagami Forest

The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) invites you to inspect the MNRF-approved prescribed burn plan for slash pile burning that will be carried out in the **Temagami Forest** (see map).



As part of our ongoing efforts to regenerate and protect Ontario's forests, some recently harvested areas have been selected to be burned under the guidelines of the MNRF's *Prescribed Burn Manual.* The prescribed burn will reduce the area covered in slash piles while increasing the area available for regeneration and reducing the fire hazard. The burn is scheduled for ignition between **October 1**, **2022** and **December 24**, **2022**

The approved prescribed burn plan for slash pile burning, including specific locations and maps, is available electronically for public inspection by contacting **Temagami**Forest Management Corporation and on the Natural Resources Information Portal at https://nrip.mnr.gov.on.ca/s/fmp-online until March 31, 2023, when the Annual Work Schedule expires.

Interested and affected persons and organizations can arrange a remote meeting with MNRF staff to discuss the prescribed burn plan. For more information, please contact:

Stay Clear, Stay Safe this Labour Day weekend

DISTRICT (Staff) — Many families are eager to enjoy the last long weekend of summer before everyone settles into routines at work and school. The waterways will be buzzing with people out having fun. Ontario Power Generation (OPG) reminds you the dangers around hydroelectric stations and dams are real - stay clear, stay safe.

They advise people to heed all warning signs posted for safety reasons around power dams.

You may feel you understand the risks, but if you choose to swim, boat or fish near a hydroelectric station or dam, your life is on the line. Calm riverbeds below dams may look inviting but they can quickly change into rapidly flowing waterways with dangerous currents.

- OPG operates 66 hydroelectric stations and 241 dams on 24 Ontario river systems.
- Despite continued warnings, some people disregard signs and barriers, putting themselves at risk.
- OPG works with Ontario Provincial Police to enforce these warnings and police could lay charges.

"The message is simple, stay clear, stay safe," said OPG senior vice president, renewable generation, Paul Seguin.

"Enjoy this last long weekend of the summer safely, by paying attention to water levels, warning signs, and fences and other barriers."



Dans le cadre de nos efforts soutenus pour régénérer et protéger les forêts de l'Ontario, des endroits où des coupes ont eu lieu récemment ont été sélectionnés pour faire l'objet d'un brûlage dirigé conformément aux lignes directrices énoncées dans le *Manuel sur le brûlage dirigé* du MRNF. 

the influence of drugs or alcohol:


- They're making wide, abrupt or illegal turns





How do I keep **myself** and **my loved ones** safe?

- To prevent cooking fires, you must be alert. You will not be alert if you are sleepy, have consumed alcohol, drugs or medicine that makes you drowsy.
- Always stay in the kitchen while cooking. If you must leave, turn off the stove.
- Keep anything that burns—oven mitts, cooking utensils, dish cloths, paper towels and pot holders—a safe distance from the stove.



Keep a **proper-fitting pot lid** near the stove when cooking. If a pot catches fire slide the lid over the pot and turn off the stove. Do not move the pot until it has cooled completely.

Loose-fitting clothes can come into contact with stove burners and catch fire. Wear short sleeves, tight sleeves or roll them up when cooking.
