Sunrise ceremony Friday brings message of Coming Home

TEMAGAMI (Staff) - Remembering the children lost to the horrors of the Indian Residential Schools, healing, and what reconciliation could look like in the town of Temagami, are the focus of the "Coming Home" event Friday, September 30, organized by Living Temagami, the local arts and culture organiz-

The event is called "Coming Home" to keep focus on the over 120 Indian Residential School sites that have yet to be searched for unmarked graves.

"The Truth and Reconciliation Commission estimated that as many as 6,000 students are unaccounted for due to poor records keeping, including undocumented deaths and unmarked graves," says Living Temagami board member Mary Laronde.

The keynote address is centred on what truth and reconciliation would look like in Temagami and will be given by Donna and Reverend Jim Sinclair, who have worked nationally and internationally on healing and reconciliation. Time and space are then provided for participants to share their thoughts on healing and reconciliation in the local context.

IT'S ABOUT LAND

"We believe that there is a path forward to true reconciliation, and that the shared arts and culture taking place with Living Temagami is a beautiful and important beginning to that vision. 'We are all connected to this land, both say. 'The land and our care for it is at the centre of any attempts to overcome the past," she explained.

Donna Sinclair, author and retired journalist, has written about Indian residential schools in Canada, and events in other places around the world (Central America, Africa, East Germany) where healing and reconciliation are required. She reported from Kahnesatake 30 years ago during what is often referred to as the Oka crisis in Quebec.

Jim Sinclair is a United Church minister and former General Secretary of the United Church of Canada. He was in Esgenoôpetitj (Burnt Church, New Brunswick) during the conflict between non-Indigenous and Mikmaq fishers in 1999, and he served as an election observer in the first free elections in post-apartheid South Africa.

In retirement both have been involved in efforts to care for the land and water locally, and to be allies in Indigenous solidarity actions nationally. They both lived in North Bay for more than 40 years.

The event begins at 7 a.m. with a sunrise ceremony to give thanks and the program for the day

were born and raised in Northern Ontario, and have begins at 9:30 in the Temagami Welcome Centre. All are welcome.



City expanding voting options

TEMISKAMING SHORES – City voters won't have to come to the polls to cast their ballots for municipal council next month.

Temiskaming Shores voters will have the option for the first time of voting by phone or online, in addition to traditional inperson voting by paper ballot.

Letters containing more details are expected to begin arriving in voters' mailboxes the first week of October. The municipality will also be providing a helpline number for anyone who requires further information.

City council approved a hybrid system combining voting in person, by phone and via the internet earlier this year.

At that time, Mayor Carman Kidd hoped that offering alternatives would boost voter turnout.

Numbers have been declining. In 2010, 45 per cent of eligible voters in the municipality cast ballots. That dropped to 42 per cent in 2014 and to 33 per cent in 2018.

This year, electors will be able to vote online or by phone beginning at 9 a.m. October 14 until 8 p.m. on election day itself October 24.





EDITORIAL

Hunger is real

As many of us scan the local grocery flyers for the best prices on foods and other items near and dear to us, there are many among us who do not have that luxury.

Millions of Canadians, and many people living in the Temiskaming region, are struggling to make ends meet and keep food on the table.

Almost six million people in Canada were food insecure last year, with a third of them living in Ontario, says Statistics Canada.

Food insecurity means people have to limit their food choices or go without food entirely because they can't afford to buy it.

They are strapped financially to pay the rent, keep the heat on, pay the hydro and internet costs that most of us take for granted.

In Ontario in 2021, 249,000 households missed meals or reduced their food intake or went without eating on some days.

And with the rising price of gas, food and other commodities, there are likely going to be more people missing meals and going without food.

Food prices are the only item that has seen a significant increase in the overall Consumer Price Index.

Meat prices are up, along with milk, pasta, eggs and bread.

Hunger and prolonged poor nutrition make people get sick quicker and this in turn puts pressure on our already overburdened health care system.

And besides that, it is simply unacceptable that children, teens, adults and seniors are going without food and not living their best lives.

There are ways to prevent food insecurity that include a basic income for everyone, social assistance rates that match the real cost of living and realistic wages and benefits for working people.

According to the Timiskaming Health Unit, 17.5 per cent of families in Temiskaming live with low incomes.

Thank goodness for the area food banks which are manned by wonderful volunteers.

Let us support our local food banks as much as we can in the coming weeks.

Food banks tell us that they can buy much more food if they receive cash donations.

So please be generous, donate money, food and volunteer time to help those less fortunate among us.



FedNor funding Northern Ontario mining showcase in Montreal

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff/Special) - FedNor, the federal economic development agency for Northern Ontario, has announced a \$412,000 investment to expand the Northern Ontario Mining Showcase at the 2023 Canadian Institute of Mining, Metallurgy and Petroleum (CIM) Convention and Expo in Montreal.

The investment will enable the City of Temiskaming Shores to establish the Northern Ontario Mining Showcase (NOMS) pavilion at the CIM convention and Expo.

"The continued expansion of NOMS demonstrates the importance of the project and the need to keep it growing so we can include more businesses and help them increase sales and exports and attract new investment to our region," said Temiskaming Shores Mayor Carman Kidd in a press release issued by FedNor.

"Since 2015, the City of Temiskaming Shores has led the charge on this strategic initiative and I am thrilled to say the return on investment has been incredible for all involved."

Taking place in Montreal from April 30 to May 3, the 2023 CIM EXPO is expected to attract over 5,000 industry professionals, experts, and decision-makers, and feature more than 450 exhibitors.

Nipissing-Timiskaming MP Anthony Rota made the announcement virtually, in company with Kidd, on August 31 on behalf of Minister of Indigenous Services and Minister Responsible for FedNor Patty Hajdu.

"NOMS continues to grow its presence at CIM Expos, building upon its continued success at the Prospectors & Developers Association of Canada (PDAC) convention held each year in Toronto," said FedNor in the release.

"Spanning an impressive 5,000 square feet and featuring up to 60 mining supply and service companies from across the region, the FedNor funded pavilion at CIM EXPO 2023 has nearly doubled in size and scope so it can include more businesses and maximize opportunities for networking and sales. As one of the largest pavilions at CIM 2023, NOMS

will provide a unique opportunity to showcase Northern Ontario innovation, including some of the latest in mining equipment, tools, products, services and clean tech. In 2023 alone, NOMS at CIM is expected to help participating businesses increase sales and exports by more than \$1.5 million, creating 30 high-quality jobs in Northern Ontario and maintaining 30 more."

Hajdu stated in the press release that since 2015 the showcase "has created over 750 jobs and generated more than \$85 million in direct economic benefits for Northern Ontario. Through FedNor, we are helping local businesses, municipalities and Indigenous communities thrive in this flagship initiative. It is exciting to see the expansion of this work, creating even greater reach and positive impacts for our region."

Rota commented that he is "pleased that FedNor is stepping up to support the continued growth and success of the Northern Ontario Mining Showcase. By expanding the role of NOMS to include CIM Expos, I am confident that even more businesses and communities will reap the benefits this important project delivers for all of us here in Nipissing-Timiskaming and across Northern Ontario."

FedNor added that "with a wealth of mines and one of the largest concentrations of mining supply and service companies in Canada, Northern Ontario is primed to capitalize on the rising global demand for critical minerals and materials that will power the transition to clean energy and advanced manufacturing."

Northern College commits to sustainable development

TIMMINS (Special) - Northern College is joining other Canadian post-secondary institutions in committing to the sustainable development goals outlined by the United Nations.

Dementia is an overall term used for a set of symptoms that are caused by disorders affecting the brain. Symptoms may include memory loss and trouble with thinking, problem-solving or language, severe enough to make it hard for a person to carry out everyday activities. A person with dementia may also experience changes in mood or behaviour.

Dementia is progressive, which means the symptoms will gradually get worse as more brain cells become damaged. Dementia is not a specific disease. Many diseases can cause dementia, the most common being Alzheimer's disease and vascular dementia (due to strokes).

Some treatable conditions can produce symptoms similar to dementia, for example, vitamin deficiencies, thyroid disease, sleep disorders, or mental illness. It's very important to arrange for a full medical assessment as early as possible. Getting a timely diagnosis can help you access information. resources and support, benefit from treatment, and plan ahead.

NORMAL AGING

- Not being able to remember details of a conversation or event that took place a year ago
- Not being able to remember the name of an acquaintance
- Forgetting things and events sometimes
- Sometimes have difficulty finding words
- You are worried about your memory, but your relatives are

DEMENTIA

- Not being able to recall details of recent events or conversations
- · Not recognizing or knowing the names of family members
- · Forgetting things or events more frequently
- · Frequent pauses and substitutions when finding words
- Your relatives are worried about your memory, but you are not aware of any problems

If you are worried about your memory and are a patient of the Temagami Family Health Team, talk to your primary care provider about a referral to our Memory Clinic. The goal of the clinic is to provide early diagnosis and treatment for problems associated with memory loss.

Friend Pete Gilboe noted that a fund has been set up "to honour Isaac's love for the outdoors."


Gilboe said that Isaac often went out fishing with him.




