## **Temagami** preparing a haunting event

TEMAGAMI - The spirit of Temagami is alive and well, and will be coming fully to life on Saturday, October 29, with The Haunting of Caribou Mountain Fire Tow-

The Temagami Recreation and Parks committee, with the help of community volunteers, individuals, service groups and businesses, are creating a series of community-built horror scenes with live actors.

Admission to the event will be a cash donation to the Temagami Food Bank, or a donation of a non-perishable food item.

In case of rain, the evening's event will be moved to the Temagami arena which will be transformed into a haunted house.

John Shymko stated in an email that he came upon the idea for the Halloween community activity when he and his wife lived in Burlington and were exploring the surrounding area. They came upon Elora and discovered the Twilight Zoo established in 1996 by resident Tim Murton, a film industry scenic artist.

"He created a number of little ghouls and put them on the corner of his house. The neighbourhood response was wonderful and each year he continued to add to the display," Shymko said.

The Twilight Zoo has since expanded with a number of Elora community activities now taking place throughout October.

Shymko related that he called Murton and asked if he would mind if Temagami did something along the same lines, and Murton gave him his support, but urged Temagami "to remain yourselves. Give it your own twist."



site where there will be Zombie Territory signs, Go Back warning signs, and strobe lights. No other vehicles will be allowed on the road to the Fire Tower Hill after 4 p.m., but the shuttle bus will be making continuous loops between the two sites. Those arriving at the train station by vehicle are asked to park at the train station or a municipal parking lot. Living Temagami will have the train station open where there will be a Halloween display. Washrooms will be available at the train station. There are two outhouses at the tower but there is

no running water, noted Shymko in a press release.


"Be prepared to walk the 750-metre length of the trail," he stated. "This may be a frightening experience, so we do not recommend young children and those who frighten easily attend."

When visitors return to the parking lot, the shuttle bus will be available to return them to the train station in downtown Temagami. Guests are welcome to snap their own pictures while there.

Earlier in the day, at 2 p.m., there will be a daylight walk at the site, "where we will be happy to show the little ones what we are doing and how everything works," Shymko added. At that time the Temagami Public Library will have someone to read spooky stories to children at the tower museum level parking lot, he added.

Shymko envisions a future regional activity where neighbouring communities might participate and monsters might roam the entire area, going from town to town to share the spirit of Halloween.

## **Hubris or helpful?**

The opportunity for Temiskaming residents to give serious consideration to the people who will represent them over the next four years as their municipal representatives is an important decision.

Everything from taxes, to the quality of life, to infrastructure projects and working for the betterment of the community is at stake.

Like never before, Temiskaming communities need relevant, authentic, forward thinking leaders who understand the complexities of setting public policy and governing during challenging times.

A number of candidates in the Temiskaming region for the upcoming October 24 municipal election seeking the reeve and mayoral positions have no previous council experience and, for some, that's a good thing.

Three out of four candidates for Temiskaming Shores council have no previous council experience and two out of four candidates for the mayor's seat in Cobalt have no previous council experience.

In Elk Lake, three out of the four reeve candidates have never sat at the council

Do candidates running for the top job in a municipality and who have no previous municipal experience understand the complexity of municipal governance?

What should voters look for in a candidate?

Certainly relationship building is a key component of successful leadership, along with being a team player and understanding the needs of the many, not the few or the one.

Sometimes the social media keyboard candidates might not always present the best options in terms of professional communication skills.

Local leaders must present a level of emotional maturity enabling them to withstand criticism and not over-react to

A mayor or reeve must be approachable and willing to listen to all sides of an issue while being accessible to members of the community.

Having good critical thinking skills is an asset that cannot be overlooked in a municipal candidate's profile.

Perhaps the most important attribute a mayoral or council candidate can possess is financial acumen.

Policy makers need to understand complex financial statements and or financial proposals and decisions.

Having the best leaders in a community requires candidates to possess qualities that will create short and long term wellbeing for any community over the course of the next four years.

I can paddle that shoreline a million times and never tire of it because I know my mother is with me in spirit.


She will always be with me and it gives me comfort to know this.

## Tourism gets helping hand from FedNor

DISTRICT - To mark the **United Nations World Tourism** Day September 27, the federal government announced it is investing over \$9 million to protect, strengthen and grow Northern Ontario's tourism sector.

Across the North, 74 projects are being supported through investments being made by FedNor through the

Tourism Relief Fund and Fed-Nor's Northern Ontario Development Program.

"As demand returns to pre-pandemic levels and enthusiasm picks up steam, the future looks bright for tourism here in Nipissing-Timiskaming and across the region," said Nipissing-Timiskaming MP Anthony Rota in a press release.

#### **TEMAGAMI CHALET**

Locally, the Municipality of Temagami is receiving \$434,593 to retrofit the Temagami Chalet on Jack Guppy Way, located on the popular Caribou Mountain Fire Tower Hill.

Equipment will also be purchased for the building to create nature-based programs and experiences.

Temagami deputy-clerk Sabrina Pandolfo said in a telephone interview that the municipality has started the work on the project, installing insulation and electrical work, heating and upgrading to make the building safe and efficient. The objective is to have people come in to teach outdoor skills, such as how to start a fire, or build a shelter, she said.

Currently work is taking place on the exterior of the building and through the winter months work will continue on its interior, with a completion date at the end of March, and opening next season. The new facility will also have

mountain bikes available to rent, along with skis and snowshoes for the winter months. said Pandolfo.

The funding received through FedNor will cover 90 per cent of the project's cost.

The building had been unused for several years and Pandolfo said the community is excited about the project. It's expected to attract people to the town, which will in turn help to support local businesses.

#### **FONOM VIDEO**

FedNor has also invested \$74,790 in the FONOM Video Project 2022 which will develop video segments highlighting the attractions of the region represented by FONOM (Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities).

Federation president Danny Whalen stated in a telephone interview that work is just starting to set the project up.

"We're starting to get ideas from each of the seven districts," he said.

The video will illustrate the benefits of doing business in the North, he added.

FONOM will be using the Temiskaming Shores production company Good Gauley Productions.

#### **GARDEN ISLAND LODGE**

Garden Island Lodge is receiving \$100,000 from FedNor to install solar panels and batteries, to upgrade the water system, and to construct two housekeeping cottages.

The fishing lodge, owned by Mike McNamara, is located on Lady Evelyn Lake.

#### **GREAT FIRE ANNIVERSARY**

The City of Temiskaming Shores received \$90,000 to host a series of activities to commemorate the Great Fire of 1922, culminating with the centennial weekend celebrations October 1 to 3.

#### ROSBOROUGH'S FUNNY FARM

Rosborough's Funny Farm Ltd., located on Elliott Road in Ingram Township, has received \$82,500 to expand and upgrade its facilities for safe and accessible year-round tourism activities.



### **Eye Damage and Diabetes**

Many people living with diabetes have some form of eye damage or "diabetic retinopathy". Diabetic retinopathy can lead to vision changes or blindness.

#### How diabetes affects the eyes

Having too much sugar in your blood can damage the blood vessels in the part of the eye called the retina. The retina is the tissue lining the back of the eye. High sugar levels cause the blood vessels to swell and leak into the retina and cause blurred vision or blind spots. If left untreated, new blood vessels may grow and cause further damage to your vision.

#### When to get an eye exam

Once a year, unless your ophthalmologist or optometrist has suggested something different. Remember, you may not be aware of changes to your vision and many problems can be treated when caught early.

If you notice any of the following changes to your vision, see an eye doctor immediately:

- · blurred vision
- · flashes of light in the field of vision
- · sudden loss of vision
- · blotches or spots in vision

#### Reducing your risk of diabetic retinopathy

To prevent retinopathy or prevent it from getting worse, keep your blood sugar, blood pressure, and blood cholesterol within a healthy range

Follow the ABCDEs of staying healthy with diabetes to reduce the risk of eye damage:

- **A A1C** Most people should aim for an A1C of 7%\* or less by managing blood sugars well. A1C is a blood test that is a measure of your average blood sugar level over the past 120 days.
- B Blood pressure Control your blood pressure to less than 130/80\*
- C Cholesterol The LDL (bad) cholesterol target is less than 2.0\* mmol/L.
- **D Drugs** to protect your heart Speak with your health-care team about
- **E Exercise & Eating** Regular physical activity, healthy eating, and maintain a healthy body weight.
- **S Screening for complications** Ask your health-care team about tests for your heart, feet, kidneys, and eyes.
- **S Smoking cessation** Stop smoking and seek support for help with
- **S Self management**, stress, and other barriers Set goals for yourself to reach the targets and live well with diabetes, such as managing stress effectively.

### Elmer the Safety Elephant remembers vaccines

DISTRICT (Special) - While information is more readily accessible to us than at any other point in history, it also brings the side effect that misinformation is just as accessible.

Worse, in many cases, and especially within the context of COVID-19 and the continuing push for vaccination, messages are not so easily discernable from one another for those seeking to confirm an existing belief rather than weigh the balance of information.

As National School Safety Week draws to a close October 23, the Canada Safety Council seeks to help teachers and educators cut through the noise and deliver credible, well-researched information to children who may otherwise lack the ability to seek it out themselves.

"Regardless of choice in terms of the use of vaccination, the evidence within the scientific community is overwhelming clear that it works," said Gareth Jones, president and CEO of the Canada Safety

Council.

"A high vaccination rate is among the main reasons why schools have been operating in-person as opposed to virtually, and the resulting impact at an individual level and more broadly with communities in Canada and around the world cannot be overstated."

#### **Qualification of Electors**

A person is entitled to vote in a DTSSAB election if he or she or they on voting day,

- Resides in one of the above-listed unincorporated townships, or is the owner or tenant of land in the township, or the spouse of such owner or tenant;
- · Is a Canadian citizen;
- · Is at least 18 years old; and
- Is not prohibited from voting by law or under the Municipal Elections Act 1996.

On election day, each voter must bring official documentation such as a driver's licence or a passport indicating the qualifying address the voter is residing at in one of the above townships. If the official documentation is a Health Card, or another government identification which does not show the qualifying address, then the documentation must be accompanied by a utility bill, bank account statement, tax bill or any documentation that can confirm the residency at the official address.

work, and what anxieties can be addressed through research and data. While the presentation discusses vaccines as a whole, there is a particular focus on COVID-19 and its global impacts.

This program, developed in partnership with the Public Health Agency of Canada, is targeted at the Primary (Grades 1-3), Junior (Gr. 4-6) and Intermediate (Gr. 7-8) levels. The language in each level of the program is adapted to best reach the child in a language they can easily understand.

The Canada Safety Council firmly believes in science, in data, and in using the best tools available to keep as much of the population safe from harm as possible. These best tools include vaccines.

Program materials are available for teachers across Canada to use and include a video presentation, accompanying teacher guide, a psychological and social appendix, and various posters for display in the school. The program is entirely optional and voluntary.




#### CO, Sensor Lending Program

Curious about the air quality in your indoor spaces? The library has a new CO<sub>2</sub> Sensor lending program, thanks to a donation by Rise of three Aranet4 Home Air Quality monitors. CO<sub>2</sub> is a gas that is produced when people exhale. As more people remain in a room, CO<sub>2</sub> levels increase quickly if there is not enough fresh air coming into the space. High indoor CO<sub>2</sub> levels can cause tiredness, headaches and other symptoms, and indicate that a space is not well ventilated. High CO<sub>2</sub> levels can also facilitate the spread of airborne infections. The devices are not CO (Carbon Monoxide) detectors and are not life safety devices. Contact the library to learn more!

#### **Gadget Helper**

The library's gadget helper program provides one-on one help to people in learning to use their tablets, cellphones and laptops. Contact the library and let our staff person know what you would like to learn. Currently we offer weekly 45-minute timeslots on Thursdays. In the past, the gadget helper program has helped patrons with topics from learning to navigate the basics of a new device to downloading ebooks and accessing online resources and even troubleshooting hardware and software issues.



## How do I keep **myself** and **my loved ones** safe?

- To prevent cooking fires, you must be alert. You will not be alert if you are sleepy, have consumed alcohol, drugs or medicine that makes you drowsy.
- Always stay in the kitchen while cooking. If you must leave, turn off the stove.
- Keep anything that burns—oven mitts, cooking utensils, dish cloths, paper towels and pot holders a safe distance from the stove.



- Keep a **proper-fitting pot lid** near the stove when cooking. If a pot catches fire slide the lid over the pot and turn off the stove. Do not move the pot until it has cooled completely.
- Loose-fitting clothes can come into contact with stove burners and catch fire. Wear short sleeves, tight sleeves or roll them up when cooking.





## BREAST CANCER MYTHS

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month in Canada. Although more people are surviving a breast cancer diagnosis than ever before, it's still the most common cancer and the second leading cause of cancer death among Canadian women. Therefore, it's important to know the facts. Here are five breast cancer myths.

- 1. Only people with a family history of breast cancer are at risk. Only about five to 10 per cent of breast cancers are considered hereditary.
- 2. Breast cancer only affects women. Although rare, men can get breast cancer too. In 2022, researchers estimate that 270 Canadian men will be diagnosed with breast cancer and that 55 will die from the disease.
- 3. Antiperspirants and deodorants cause breast cancer. There's no conclusive evidence linking the use of antiperspirants or deodorants and the development of breast cancer.
- 4. Breast cancer always causes a lump you can feel. Although regular breast self-exams can help detect lumps, breast cancer doesn't always manifest itself this way. Other symptoms include pain, swelling, redness and thickening of the skin.
- 5. All breast cancers are treated the same way. Breast cancer treatment plans vary widely depending on the characteristics of the tumour, the stage of cancer and the patient's preferences.
