Christmas kick-off in **Englehart**

ENGLEHART (Staff) - The holiday season in Englehart kicks off Friday, with lots of opportunities to find that perfect Christmas gift and even snap a photo with Santa.

The November 18 event also sees the return of the Parade of Lights, the first since a pre-pandemic 2019.

As word has spread, the response to the Holiday Markets event has been "overwhelming," said Natalie Perron-Boddy, fundraising coordinator for Royal Canadian Legion Branch 104 in Englehart.

Interest is coming from people who want to take in the event and from downtown stores taking the opportunity "to have a little more business during the holiday season," she said.

Activities are concentrated on Friday, and run from noon to 9 p.m.

They include a vendors' market at the Legion, where admission is a donation of cash or nonperishable food to the Englehart and Area Food Bank. (It's the only event that continues Saturday, and proceeds from table rentals over the two days will support the Legion's building fund.)

There's also a vendors' market at the Northern Beacon Rebekah Lodge.

The Englehart Public Library hosts a display of sweet creations entered in the Englehart Rotary Club's annual gingerbread house contest and auction.

The library will also offer face painting and serve as the drop-off for kids' scavenger hunt passports. They'll be entered in a draw for a basket of childfriendly prizes.

Perron-Boddy said the library reports that some new memberships have been taken out, as people saw the line-up of upcoming activities.

In the evening, Timiskaming Hospice Palliative Care will host its annual celebration of life service at Holy Trinity Catholic Church, beginning at 6 p.m. It'll be followed by the lighting of the Tree of Life

at Centennial Park.


DID YOU GET The Speaker THIS WEEK? Here are some November 16, 2022 stories...

Holocaust education

The Ontario government has recently announced they are taking action against anti-Semitism and hate.

They are introducing mandatory learning requirements on Holocaust education into the Grade Six school curriculum.

This new curriculum will be introduced into the 2023 school year, beginning in September.

There has been an alarming rise in anti-Semitism in Canada and around the world of late.

The Holocaust was a genocide perpetrated by the German Nazi regime against European Jews between 1941-1945. Six million Jews were murdered in death camps, concentration camps, ghettos, killing fields and elsewhere.

The fact that six million Jewish people were murdered during the Second World War cannot be refuted.

The fact that they were killed was an attempt at ethnic cleansing by the German Nazi regime in power at that time.

Recently, we saw National Basketball Association star Kyrie Irving of the Brooklyn Nets suspended for five games without pay because of a Twitter link to a documentary having an anti-Semitic mes-

When he was called out as being racist, initially Irving refused to apologize.

He has since posted an apology on his Instagram page acknowledging his remarks hurt people.

A report by the Jewish Ant-Defamation League (ADL), says seventy plus years after the liberation of Auschwitz, twothirds of the world's population still don't know the Holocaust happened, or they deny it.

As the history of the Second World War becomes fainter in the minds of the current generations, it is important that we speak about the horrors of the Holocaust and never forget them or the conditions that led up to them.

Today a younger group of Holocaust deniers is active on Facebook and Twitter and alt-right websites.

The Doug Ford government deserves a good a big thumbs up for their awareness of Holocaust denial.

Carrying hate, spewing hate and strutting hate is unacceptable.

Let us remember what connects us is our pain, our sorrows and our faith in humanity's goodness.

Pancreatic cancer may not cause any signs or symptoms in its early stages. Signs and symptoms often appear as the tumor grows and causes changes in the body. Other health conditions can cause the same symptoms as pancreatic cancer.

Securing sharps safely in Englehart

ENGLEHART (Special) Englehart will have a new location where sharps - used needles, syringes and lancets – can be safely disposed of.

A community sharps disposal bin will be installed outside the emergency department entrance at the Englehart hospital site of Blanche River Health (BRH).

"This is a great asset for our community," said Dianne Peplinski of the Englehart Family Health Team in a media re-

The family health team worked with the Timiskaming Health Unit and the hospital on the new initiative.

The health unit is providing the bin, and the hospital and family health team will share the costs and be responsible for its maintenance.

"The sharps bin is a large, durable, weather- and tamper-proof steel container that is well secured," said Jamie Swartz of BRH.

"It is clearly labelled and will be emptied regularly by trained staff."

Sharps are medical devices with sharp points or edges. They're used by many people, including individuals with cancer, diabetes or other medical conditions; pet owners; and people who use substances.

they can inadvertently puncture or cut the skin, leading to injuries or infection.

Making safe disposal available is part of efforts in Temiskaming to address drug and alcohol use and the harm it causes.

"A harm reduction approach works to reduce the negative

If not disposed of properly, effects of substance use," said Kerry Schubert-Mackey, cochair of the Timiskaming Drug and Alcohol Strategy.

Province announces 2023 municipal support

TORONTO (Staff) - Allocations to municipalities from the Ontario government's primary general assistance grant have been announced for 2023.

Overall funding under the Ontario Municipal Partnership Fund (OMPF) remains at \$500 million, as it has for the past several years.

It's distributed among 389 municipalities, mainly rural communities and in the North. The funding is unconditional and can be spent as each municipality sees fit.

The OMPF targets funding to municipalities facing challenging fiscal circumstances and supports areas with limited property assessment.

In the South Temiskaming area, most municipalities will see slight drops from their OMPF allocations in 2022.

In two – Cobalt and Englehart – allocations are unchanged, while allocations will increase for Coleman, Latchford and Temiskaming Shores.

The accompanying chart lists the region's municipalities, their allocations for 2023 and on a per-household basis, and their 2022 allocations.
