Housing proposal presented for former school property

COBALT - Cobalt council has asked for more detailed information, including drawings, for a proposed housing development on the former Cobalt Public School property.

At Cobalt council's committee-of-the-whole meeting January 10, property owner Mike DeSilva, along with two associates, presented the proposal to council.

DeSilva also asked council for assistance in removing the building materials that remain on the site. The building had been vacated, then burned, and DeSilva recently had it brought down to prevent people from entering the structure, which was deemed unsafe.

Before proceeding further with the housing development proposal, DeSilva told council he first wanted "to get your blessing."

Lots with 33-foot frontage are being proposed, with houses ranging from 800 square feet in size to 1,100 square feet, he outlined.

"That makes it affordable," he said.

He envisions the homes would be of interest to first-time buyers in particular, he told council.

Councillor Angela Hunter, who is a realtor, requested more details in the proposed outline.

She also noted the importance of consulting with the town public works and town manager regarding existing waterlines on the property.

"There are very essential waterlines that go through there," she said, noting that development must be done in a way that public works will be able to have access to the waterlines if needed.

She also advised that the town has some sewer upgrading plans in the area, and that has to be con-

sidered in the development.

Mayor Mita Gibson asked DeSilva to bring more information to council.

"I think every councillor here would agree that seeing the next step. That's very important."



EDITORIAL

Temiskaming the good!

Good things happen in the Temiskaming region.

There are incredible amounts of money being raised from a finite group of people in our area.

This indicates the type of people who live here and their willingness to pitch in with money, time and various resources to help others.

Examples of that goodness are found in the Temiskaming Hospital Foundation's Care Close To Home fundraising campaign which raised \$5.5 million in just six years for much needed equipment at the hospital.

The hospital has just launched its new fundraising campaign called Your Health-Our Mission.

The Salvation Army Christmas Kettle campaign reached its fundraising goal over the holidays.

The Christmas Wish Campaign raised over \$90,000 to help local families in need.

The Rotary Club of Temiskaming Shores and Area has raised a great deal of money towards the creation of a splash pad to be built near the tennis courts in New Liskeard, giving children and adults an outdoor water-based recreational experience.

And the North On Tap Craft Beer Festival might just be the biggest summertime fundraiser giving \$231,500 so far to not-for-profit groups in South Temiskaming.

Who can forget the New Year's eve fireworks that resulted in \$24,770 being donated to the Community Cancer Care program?

The Ladies Night Out event has given the Bikers Reunion over \$100,000 for cancer care in our region.

And what Barry Phippen and the Bikers Reunion committee have given to the Community Cancer Care program and the Temiskaming Hospital over the years is staggering.

The Englehart Nordic Ski Club has just completed its fundraising campaign for a new groomer for its scenic cross-country ski trails.

In Temagami, people willingly support the Temagami Foundation's annual Truck Draw, which in turn gives monies back to groups in the community to support arts and cultural projects.

It might be safe to say that the phrase, "We are all in this together," is not just a cliché.

Because "Temiskaming the good" is a great place to live, work and play.

Wetland protection

There are less than 50 days until spring and my return to the water and my true love, my canoe.

But another love I have acquired is observing various species of birds at backyard feeders this winter.

It is a tricky thing this warm winter weather we've seen because it is affecting wildlife.

Canada gray jays are on a steady decline, noted ornithologist Dan Strickland, who has been studying the birds for 40 years in Algonquin Park.

Gray jays, blue jays, blackcapped chickadees and other birds stash food in the bark of evergreen trees during winter months.

The freezing and thaw process destroys their food stash.

We saw temperatures of 5 C or higher in this region when the Christmas Bird Count took place.

Putting suet out is a great way to help birds get through the winter months. Seeing birds at the feeders is good for us, too, as visual pleasure.

Woodpeckers depend on suet for survival in winter but they also chisel out holes in trees to find insects.

It's not enough that we put food out for the birds - they must have an ecosystem that provides homes for the insects on which they feed. They must have waterways and forests to provide homes so they can nest and raise their young.

This is why I was so impressed with Coleman Township's recent denial of herbicide spraying along its roadways.

Herbicide spraying not only kills vegetation, it kills insects, birds and may even get into our water table.

We need to start thinking about our environment from a grassroots perspective.

Basically, our yards and lands need to be protected as natural native ecosystems.

It might escape many, but if the birds fail, we fail too and everyday practices such as the use of herbicides affect all of

As we celebrate World Wetlands Day on February 2, let us realize that wetlands such as marshes, ponds, creeks, lakes and rivers are the unsung heroes of the climate crisis with an ability to sustain life.

I often observe wildlife near a small marsh along Highway 11. It is fascinating to see the life this tiny marsh supports: the grackles, red winged



blackbirds, great blue herons, eagles, beavers, moose, snakes, turtles, bats, dragonflies and so on.

This is a natural free system that has been perfected over

We need to protect these resources, not squander them.

Wetlands and forests are one of our key weapons in our fight against climate change.

Protecting and preserving our natural resources is a nobrainer.

What is Celiac Disease?

Celiac disease (CD) is a common disorder that is estimated to affect about one percent of the population. It is a condition in which the absorptive surface of the small intestine is damaged by a substance called gluten. Gluten is a group of proteins present in wheat, rye and barley and their cross bred grains. The damage to the intestine can lead to a variety of symptoms and result in an inability of the body to absorb nutrients such as protein, fat, carbohydrates, vitamins and minerals, which are necessary for good health.

Symptoms

Common (typical) symptoms include:

- Abdominal pain
- Chronic diarrhea
- Malabsorption
- · Weight loss

Less common (atypical) symptoms include

- Anemia
- Osteoporosis
- Extreme fatigue
- · Mouth ulcers
- Liver enzyme abnormalities Infertility
- Constipation Dental enamel defects
- Neurological problems
- *Children can present with short stature, irritability and vomiting

Diagnosis

(1). Screening

The IgA-tissue transglutaminase (TTG) antibody is the currently recommended test for screening. You must be on a regular (glutencontaining) diet at the time of testing to make the results valid.

(2). Biopsy

The definitive diagnosis of CD is made by a small intestinal biopsy. The biopsy is performed via endoscopy. Again, it is important that gluten not be removed from the diet before the biopsy is completed as it may impair the confirmation of the diagnosis.

At present, there is no permanent cure for CD but it can be effectively treated with a gluten-free diet. Gluten-free eating can be challenging and complicated. A consultation with a registered dietitian with expertise in gluten-free diet would be beneficial. Careful label reading each time when buying food items is important.

If you think you may have celiac disease and your primary care provider hasn't raised the possibility, don't be afraid to bring it up yourself. You are an important member of your health care team.

Roads and bridges main focus in Chamberlain

CHAMBERLAIN TOWN-SHIP - Chamberlain Township will be focusing on the completion of two bridge projects in 2023.

The Krugerdorf Bridge in the northeast part of the township was approximately 100 years old when it was dismantled in late 2022. The unique single-lane truss bridge was becoming unsafe though, and a new bridge spanning the Blanche River in that location is expected to be installed within the next month or so, said Chamberlain Township Reeve Kerry Stewart in a telephone interview.

"Getting that bridge started was a big thing," he said of the accomplishments of 2022.

"When (the construction firm) tore the other one down it was in pretty rough shape so it was a good thing it was done."

Stewart said the township council is also "hoping to get the Aidie Creek Bridge finished this summer so we can reopen that road from (Highway 11) into Aidie Creek

Gardens." Aidie Creek Gardens is a major regional attraction and after the nearby Aidie Creek Bridge was closed in the late winter of 2021, a long and indirect alternate route over country roads has had to be used by customers coming off Highway 11.

Stewart said the Aidie Creek Bridge had to be closed to traffic because "the foundation had cracked and it was spreading, so we have to jack the whole bridge up and replace the concrete footing and put new support bearings under both ends."



Roads and bridges main focus in Chamberlain

The township council is hoping it can continue to use its Gas Tax money to put extra gravel on its roads, said Stewart. Maintaining the 57 kilometres of gravel roads is "an ongoing process." He said getting "a good coating of gravel on some of the roads" was one of the main projects for 2022.

"We were quite pleased with the amount of work that was done on the roads. We're hoping to continue on with more ditching as well."

Chamberlain Township's municipal park on Road 5, close to the intersection of Highway 11, has now been upgraded with a ball diamond, bleachers, a playground, and picnic area with a small shel-

Stewart said the township hall on the opposite side of the road has been renovated with new siding and interior renovations. Work is currently taking place on the installation of audio-visual equipment.

The hall is available for rental, and Stewart said the audio-visual equipment will

be available for those renting organizations. the hall.

The council is "looking at the possibility of creating washrooms off the front of the hall that will be accessible from the outside, so they'll serve our ballpark and playground as well," he said of goals for 2023.

"We have to apply for a change of focus on our grant before we can go ahead and do that, but that process is underway," he said.

Stewart heads up a council of four with incumbents Gerry Guenette and Kelly Osborne and two new councillors - Tracey Giesen and Bruce

The township is in a shared services agreement with the Municipality of Charlton and Dack, and shares administrative and public works services.

Stewart noted there are some expenses impacting the township over which it has no control, such as payments to the Timiskaming Health Unit and the District of Timiskaming Social Services Administration Board, and other similar

He added that the township is "waiting to see what is going to be happening with the airport committee." The Earlton-Timiskaming Regional Airport provides a site for air-ambulance service to the district, and also has a milelong runway for large aircraft landings and takeoff, as well as hangars for small aircraft owners to lease. The airport is governed by a local authority comprised of some area municipalities who have agreed to provide funding and support to the airport. However, not all area municipalities are on board with providing their support, he pointed out.

"We don't have the support of all the municipalities in the district, so it means the ones who do support the airport have to step up and make sure the funding is there."

A new airport board has been selected and Temiskaming Shores Mayor Jeff Laferriere is the new chair, filling the seat formerly held by past Temiskaming Shores Mayor Carman Kidd.
