# Wild foods topic of local conference

TEMISKAMING SHORES - Ni Dakinan, the Natural Resources and Heritage Department of the Timiskaming First Nation, will be presenting a twoday conference at Riverside Place in New Liskeard March 23 and 24.

Planting the Seeds of Cultural Forest Knowledge will allow participants to learn more about plant identification, and about local habitats for plant species and the symbiotic relationships that happen in the forest with plants and soils, and with trees and fungi.


Ni Dakinan administrator Tara Dantouze said in a telephone interview that the event will also be an opportunity to hear about sustainability for forestry practices and to network with a view to building networks and partnerships.

There will also be a showcase dinner prepared by award-winning Anishinabe chef Cezin Nottaway of Kitigan-Zibi, Quebec, who will be using many of the wild foods that are being harvested in the forests, said Dantouze.

"We are always trying to build our program and bring in experts to teach ourselves and also to teach the community members," she said of this and similar events that have been presented by Ni Dakinan.

"We are trying to encourage people to reconnect with the forest and learn about the forest in terms of what the wild foods can contribute to our diet." She said Ni Dakinan is looking to grow a network of harvesters who may be interested in working together, or may be interested in selling their products to the Wild Basket, which is a project of Ni Dakinan.

The Wild Basket is a selection of wild foods harvested and transformed into ready-to-eat

products that are sold on the market at select stores in the region, Dantouze said.

"We're looking for choice edibles which are really delicious food products," she explained. She said DNA results will be shared of truffles that were found locally this past summer.

The conference presentations will be made by



people who have built the Wild Basket over the past years, she said. A certified forester will also be there to talk about trees and the symbiotic relationship between trees and fungi, she continued.

The event is open to the general public for both Indigenous and non-Indigenous people. Tickets are available through EventBrite.

She spent time at Keepers of the Circle New Liskeard for tea and bannock to celebrate the day with other Indigenous women of the area.


"This year's theme for International Women's Day is Embrace Equity," said McBride in a news release.

"To embrace equity is to recognize the unique challenges Indigenous women and girls face and to work together to create a society where we can thrive. I strongly believe equitable inclusion in all decisions about our people is paramount to reconciliation.

"We must listen to and learn from Indigenous women and girls. We must work to eliminate the systemic barriers that prevent Indigenous women and girls from fully participating in Canadian society. We must be inclusive of all voices to ensure true representation.

# EDITORIAL Profits over people?

One of the most talked about topics these days at the water coolers and on the street is the high price of groceries.

The billionaire president of Loblaw, Galen Weston Junior, told MPs recently that he is not making excessive amounts of money from selling food items.

But by the company's own admissions it earned a profit available to common shareholders of \$529 million. Its fourth quarter revenues rose 10 per cent to \$14.1 billion.

He and others spoke in front of a parliamentary hearing in Ottawa on March 8.

MPs wanted the big grocery chains to answer questions about why they are allegedly driving up food prices to make record profits.

The big grocery chains say suppliers are raising prices and costs are going up so their prices have to follow suit.

They claim the record profits grocery companies are making come from the sales of non-grocery items like cosmetics, clothing and pharmacy items.

The big grocery chains can spin it any way they want, the facts are that prices are way up and they are making billions in profits after expenses.

This is no different than the bread fiasco a few years ago.

Loblaw was one company among others that was found guilty of price fixing bread prices in 2019.

Many people shuddered when our federal government gave Loblaw \$12 million of our hard earned tax dollars to purchase energy efficient freezers in 370 stores in 2019.

The bread fixing company says it is not making excessive grocery profits off the backs of ordinary Canadians.

Canada's food price index predicts Canadian families (average of four people in the family) will spend \$1,065 more on food in 2023, says Canada's Food Price Report.

What about the people on fixed incomes, social assistance, disability pensions and on and on?

In order for people to remain healthy and vibrant, they need to eat a well-balanced diet that includes fruits and vegetables.

Poor diets will result in illness and this will place stresses on our already overburdened health care system.

The number of Canadians accessing food banks has risen by 20 per cent, says a national survey from the University of Saskatchewan.

Is this the Canada we wish to live in where the rich get richer and the poor get sicker because they can't afford to eat well?

#### March is Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month

Colorectal cancer (CRC) is the second most common cause of cancer deaths in Canadian men and women. Colorectal cancer incidence and mortality rates in Ontario are among the highest in the world.

#### Early Warning Signs:

If you notice any of the following, be sure to inform your doctor as soon as possible:

- Unexplained changes in bowel habits, such as constipation or diarrhea
- Change in size/shape of stools, such as being narrower than usual
- The urge to have a bowel movement but nothing passes
- Rectal bleeding
- Blood in or on the stool, ranging from bright red to dark black
- Persistent abdominal pain/discomfort including bloating, fullness, cramps, gas pain
- Unexplained weight loss
- Weakness and fatigue
- · Anemia, caused by iron deficiency

Many of these signs may also be caused by other less serious gastrointestinal conditions, such as ulcers, Crohn's disease or hemorrhoids, but they should always be discussed with your doctor to receive the correct diagnosis.

The good news is that there is now a simpler colorectal screening test!! The fecal immunochemical test (FIT). FIT replaced the fecal occult blood test (FOBT) for people at average risk of getting colorectal cancer. Average risk is defined as people ages 50 to 74 with no first-degree relative who has been diagnosed with colorectal cancer. First degree relative refers to a parent, brother or sister or a child.

FIT offers several advantages over FOBT:

- FIT is a more sensitive screening test, which means it is better at detecting colorectal cancer and pre-cancerous polyps;
- There are no medication or dietary restrictions (including anticoagulants and vitamin C);
- FIT is simple to use and helps reduce contact with stool; and
- Only one stool sample is needed compared to the previous 3 sample requirement

#### What do You Have to Do?

Your primary care provider will fax a requisition to LifeLabs for you when you are due for this screening test and LifeLabs will mail a FIT kit to you directly.

Once completed, it's important to either drop it off or mail it to Lifelabs within two days of collecting it. It's that easy!




