Construction underway for **Zack's Crib**

TEMISKAMING SHORES - The couple that has been working since 2018 to get a local homeless shelter set up in New Liskeard are now happy to announce that construction is underway.

Yves and Lianne Paillé envision an October opening for the shelter at 183 Broadwood Avenue, a short distance from Lakeshore Road. The location, a former dry-cleaning facility, is being prepared for renovations including the construction of showers, examining rooms and new plumbing and heating.

Zack's Crib has brought people together from across the district with a board of volunteers, as well as the District of Timiskaming Social Services Administration Board (DTSSAB), and important volunteer support such as former Timmins shelter manager Jason Serada and project manager Josh Kacur of MaJIC.

The project encountered delays due to the COVID pandemic.

Speaking at their business Yves' Prime Cut Meats in New Liskeard, the couple reflected on the challenges in getting the project to this point.

"It was hard to find a contractor and then with the prices, the budget was blown because of the cost of the material, so we stepped back and re-assessed everything and that's why I did a new blitz,"

Corporate Temiskaming was approached in an effort to raise the additional funds to keep the project going. Now having reached \$270,000, the project is back on track, but fundraising continues to meet future and ongoing costs once the operation begins.

TBK Construction is the contractor for the project, and MaJIC has been providing the engineering needed in the project.

Businesses and individuals across Temiskaming have been providing support.

Miller Paving and TIME Ltd. have each donated \$20,000. There have also been donations from many individuals who wish to remain anonymous, he said. Elk Lake Interfor will be supplying all lumber, he added.

Earlton TimberMart is also donating building ma-

terials, and Nor-Arc has donated \$10,000, including metal products that contractors are going to need.

The New Liskeard Lions Club has kicked-in \$5,000 and EastLink has donated five years of internet, telephone and cable service.

Gutter Man has donated material and installed an eavestrough on the building as well.



Volunteers are being requested to assist at both events.







Call 1-844 POISON-X number to reach poison centres

OTTAWA (Special) – Each year in Canada, more than 1,500 people lose their lives and nearly 8,000 are hospitalized due to unintentional poisoning from medications, cleaners, cannabis products, and many other household items.

Health Canada has launched a new toll-free number –1-844 POISON-X, or 1-844-764-7669 – to make it easier for people in Canada to access critical medical advice for poisonings.

"Through this new toll-free number, it will be easier to reach a poison centre when it is most needed and help prevent severe illnesses and death," said Health Minister Jean Yves Duclos in a news release. "As a result, this will also add a layer of resilience to the health care system by reducing unnecessary visits to emergency rooms, clinics, and the doctor's office."

The federal agency said there are currently nine different phone numbers to access five poison centres in Canada.

But many Canadians don't know the phone number for their local poison centre or even that the service is available.

Callers can now use the new number and be rerouted to their local poison centre regardless of where they are calling from.

The current provincial numbers remain in service and Canadians can continue using them.

Health Canada encourages everyone to save the number in their phones, and include it in their action plans in the event of a poisoning.

"Accidental poisonings can happen to anyone at anytime – including from over-the-counter medicines, prescription drugs, illicit substances, alcohol and cannabis," Carolyn Bennett, minister of mental health and addictions.

"This new toll-free number will help to save lives, while also helping more Canadians access quality, timely, and evidence-based poison prevention education and related health care expertise."

"A single toll-free number to access the essential services of poison centres across Canada has been a long time coming and has been the vision of the Canadian Association of Poison Centres and Clinical Toxicology for over 20 years," said the association's president, Dr. Margaret Thompson.

"Health Canada has embraced our vision and has made this possible for all Canadians with funding and hundreds of hours of work. We are grateful and excited to see its institution."

Poison centres are 24/7 access points for medical professionals and the public to access treatment advice for exposure to drugs and chemicals.

They manage almost twothirds of cases remotely without the requirement to enter a health care facility.

In 2020, they handled 215,589 cases. More than one-third involved a child aged five or younger.

The most common substances involved were medications for pain relief (analgesics) and household cleaning products, such as bleach.

The federal government is working with all provinces and territories for the implementation of 1-844 POISON-X.

Quebec will continue using its current provincial toll-free number. If a caller indicates that they are accessing the national toll-free service from Quebec, they will be instructed to contact the Centre antipoison du Québec (1-800-463-5060).

it in a digital wallet. Each type of cryptocurrency has its own value and is held separate from others.

Generally, cryptocurrency holdings are not taxed.

However, you need to keep records on the cryptocurrency that you buy and hold so that you can report them on your income tax return when you dispose of them.

You may sell your cryptocurrency for a profit or loss.

Selling cryptocurrency is called disposing of it. And when you do, there can be tax implications.

The profit that you earn from its sale or trade is taxable as either capital gains or business income, and you need to report that income on your tax return. To ensure correct reporting, you must keep accurate records of your purchases and sales of cryptocurrency.

If you didn't report your income or capital gains from transactions in cryptocurrency, you may have to pay tax, penalties and interest on that income or capital gain.

You can avoid or reduce penalties and interest by voluntarily correcting your tax affairs. To correct your tax affairs (including corrections to GST/HST returns) and to report income that you did not report in previous years, you may:

- Ask for a change to your income tax and benefit return.
- Adjust a GST/HST return.
- Apply for a correction through the Voluntary Disclosures Program.

The CRA is currently updating the Guide for cryptocurrency users and tax professionals. Make sure to stay informed by checking in for the most up-to-date information.

Information on how to report your income or capital gains from cryptocurrency transactions in your tax filings can also be found in CRA guides T4037 Capital Gains and T4002 Self-employed Business, Professional, Commission, Farming, and Fishing Income.

March is Liver Health Month

The liver is the largest internal organ in the body. It's located in the right upper quadrant of the abdomen, immediately under the diaphragm. It is divided into lobes; a large right lobe and a smaller left lobe that tapers to a tip.

It is estimated that 20% of Canadians have non-alcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD). NAFLD often has no symptoms and may be living silently in your body until it reaches an advanced stage, where cirrhosis, liver cancer and liver failure can be developed.

Nutrition

 A change in diet plays a significant part in how NAFLD may be treated and certainly how it can be prevented. Consuming too much sugar and saturated fat in your diet can have a similar effect as too much alcohol—fat build-up in the liver.

Added Sugar

 The World Health Organization (WHO) guideline recommends adults and children reduce their daily intake of added sugars to less than 10% of their total energy intake. That's less than 50 grams of added sugars per day!

Physical Activity

Recognizing the difference between physical activity and exercise
is the first step to living a lifestyle filled with more movement!
While exercise is something best done with a moderate to high
intensity and a structured routine, the goal of physical activity is
do anything you can that gets you moving and can be physically
demanding.

Sleep and Your Overall Health

 If you were to weigh how important sleep is to your liver health, how far high up or down would it fall on the list? Prevention is the best way to ensure your liver is functioning at peak performance. Be sure to see your health care provider for regular checkups so she/he can identify potential problems before they start. Take extra care by asking your provider for a liver test if you have any concerns.






