

Prevention tips to bear in mind

PETERBOROUGH (Special) - Spring alternatives, such as flowers, nesting boxes brings melting snow, the potential for flooding, and the return of some wild residents as black bears come out of hibernation.

The provincial government and OPP are advising the public to exercise caution.

Bears waking from hibernation face a lack of natural food sources, leading them to look for food in garbage cans and bird feeders.

They can also remember their last source of food and return there when hungry, sometimes travelling over 100 kilometres.

In a news release, the public is reminded of tips to prevent bears visiting their homes and neighbourhoods:

- Storing garbage in waste containers with tight-fitting lids, and indoors if possible.
- Wait until collection day to put out gar-
- Take away bird feeders for the spring and summer. (You can offer birds natural

and fresh water.)

- Clean food residue and grease from outdoor barbecue grills, including grease traps, after each use.
- Keep pet food indoors.


Provincial officials say that bears entering a community are not necessarily a threat, but it is important to know who to call if you encounter one.

Ontario's non-emergency, toll-free Bear Wise reporting line – at 1-866-514-2327 – is open 24/7 from April 1 to November 30.

If a bear is posing an immediate threat by showing threatening or aggressive behaviour, remain calm and call 911 or your local police department.

Visit Bear Wise online to learn more about how to avoid attracting bears and what to do if you encounter one.

Parkinson's Awareness

Parkinson's is a neurodegenerative disease. Movement is normally controlled by dopamine, a chemical that carries signals between the nerves in the brain. When cells that normally produce dopamine die, the symptoms of Parkinson's appear.

MOST COMMON SYMPTOMS

- Slowness and stiffness
- Impaired balance
- · Rigidity of the muscles

OTHER SYMPTOMS

- Fatigue
- Soft speech
- Problems with handwriting
- Stooped posture
- Constipation
- Sleep disturbances

A diagnosis of Parkinson's can take time. You may be referred to a neurologist – a specialist who deals with Parkinson's. There are no x-rays or tests to confirm Parkinson's so the neurologist will check your medical history, do a careful physical examination and certain tests to rule out other conditions that may resemble Parkinson's.

Currently there is no cure. You can live with Parkinson's for years. The symptoms are typically treated with medication, but some people with Parkinson's may benefit from surgery. The following therapies can also help manage the symptoms:

- · Physical therapy helps mobility, flexibility, and balance
- Occupational therapy helps with daily activities
- Speech therapy helps with voice control
- · Exercise helps muscles and joints and improves overall health and well-being

Every Parkinson's experience is unique. The symptoms and progression will vary from person to person. Living with Parkinson's requires an individualized approach.

If you are experiencing the symptoms noted above and are concerned you might have Parkinson's, schedule an appointment with your primary care provider to discuss your concerns. It is important for you to be an active participant in your health care.

1931 Census of Canada to be released on June 1

new resource will soon be released for genealogists and LAC website. historians.

Library and Archives Canada (LAC) has announced that, after the legislated 92 years in the vault, the 1931 Census of Canada will be made available to the public on June 1.

In a news release, LAC noted that the data was collected during the Great Depression and at a time of significant immigration.

The census provides a snapshot of the more than 10.3 million people living in Canada in 1931.

It recorded more than 40 fields of personal information.

These include typical questions found on previous census returns, such as family names and relationships, age, gender, and racial origin. There were also five new questions, touching on matters like unemployment and radio ownership.

On June 1, Canadians can expect to browse the digitized

> Following the initial release, LAC will work collaboratively with Ancestry and FamilySearch International to create an advanced searchable database for Canadians and those with Canadian heritage who wish to look for their ancestors.

> In this collaborative effort to increase access to the 1931 Census of Canada, LAC has digitized all 234,687 pages of the census.

> Ancestry will apply its stateof-the-art handwriting recognition technology to the digital images to create a full index of the entire census.

> FamilySearch will then review the computer-generated index to ensure a complete and accurate index of all fields at a level never achieved before.

The images and indexes will be available and searchable online for free through Census Search, LAC's new one-stop

shop for national census records. The images and indexes will also be available on Ancestry.ca and FamilySearch.


LAC has been working in collaboration with external organizations including Ancestry and FamilySearch for over 20 years to help preserve, and provide access to, its genealogically significant historical records.

LAC said collaborations between private organizations and public institutions are the meeting ground of cutting-edge technology and subject-matter expertise.

It described the collaborative partnership as key to meeting public demand and ensuring that the 1931 Census of Canada can be viewed and searched online more quickly than previous censuses.

Users can bookmark LAC's Preparing the 1931 Census web page to stay up to date on the project's status.

Before you call CRA..

OTTAWA (Special/Staff) -Every year, the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) tracks the questions people ask and uses that information to design new services and improve its pro-

Before calling the CRA, it suggests the following to save time this tax season.

Deadlines

The deadline for most Canadians to file their 2022 return is April 30, 2023.

Since this falls on a Sunday, your return will be considered filed on time if it's received by the CRA or postmarked on or come Tax Program (CVITP). before May 1, 2023.

If you or your spouse or common-law partner are self-employed, you have until June 15, 2023, to file.

Filing before the deadline will allow you to avoid interruptions to any benefit or credit payments.

If you owe money, your payment is due on April 30, 2023.

Your payment will be considered on time if the CRA receives it, or a Canadian financial institution processes it, on or before May 1, 2023.

The CRA has taken steps to deliver the services that Canadians expect over the phone, including:

• Automated callback ser-

This service lets you ask for a callback instead of waiting on hold. It is available only at certain times of the day and when wait times reach a certain length. It applies to phone lines for individual tax enquiries, benefits enquiries, and business enquiries.

• Community Volunteer In-

Community organizations host free tax clinics for people with relatively straightforward returns and modest incomes.

Volunteers may be able to complete your taxes in person or virtually by videoconference, phone, or a document drop-off.

In Temiskaming Shores, CVITP clinics are being held in two locations:

• Don Shepherdson Memorial Arena in New Liskeard, Mondays and Wednesdays, 2 p.m. to 4 p.m., until April 26 (closed on Easter Monday);

• Shelley Herbert-Shea Memorial Arena in Haileybury, Tuesdays and Thursdays, 1 p.m. to 3 p.m., until April 27. Before you call

• Check Canada.ca.

The personal income tax section of Canada.ca is now easier to use. It offers detailed information on how to file your return, including information on COVID-19 benefits and your taxes and how to report them on your return.

• Check benefit payment dates online.

You can view benefit payment dates on Canada.ca. If you're registered for direct deposit, you should receive your benefit payment on the dates listed online.

If you aren't registered, you should receive your benefit payments within five to 10 business days of the scheduled payment date.

Please allow this time before contacting about a payment.

• Try Charlie the chatbot. If you need a quick answer to a question, Charlie is at your service.

Look for Charlie on the CRA homepage and many other web pages on Canada.ca.

• Take advantage of digital services, including My Account and direct deposit, to manage your tax-filing information and payments from the CRA.

You can also track your refund, view or change your return, view your notice of assessment, receive email notifications, and more.

• Check CRA processing times.

To find out how long it takes to handle a request, use the "check CRA processing times" tool on Canada.ca.

This tool gives you a target completion date and can calculate completion times for the various services. It often provides the same information that a CRA contact centre agent will give you if you call to ask about the status of your file.

• Check telephone wait times.

Estimated wait times are

available on the contact information page and can also provide them when you're on hold.

• Create a personal identification number (PIN) to authenticate yourself on the

You can create a PIN in My Account before you call, or a contact centre agent can create one for you.

• Find answers using the FAQs - frequently asked questions.

You can check out the "questions and answers about filing your taxes" page. It's updated regularly during tax season to include changes that may affect you.

- Make the most of "tax tips," which provide specific information about a variety of topics.
- Paper filers can download a copy online at "Get a T1 income tax package."

Even with these measures, the CRA receives a large volume of calls. Unfortunately, this means callers may experience long wait times to speak with an agent.






