Inspections make safe seating a priority

TEMISKAMING SHORES - What's the one piece of advice that Rebecka Mayne would offer anyone preparing to install a car seat or booster seat?

"They need to read their manuals," said Mayne, a certified inspector and instructor with the Child Passenger Safety Association of Canada (CPSAC).

They'll find that the how-to guides can answer most of their questions and resolve their struggles, she said.

Mayne, who is from New Tecumseth north of Toronto, joined volunteers and trainees in the Dymond Community Hall parking lot April 28.

They were available to inspect existing seats, help caregivers install new seats, and offer advice. Ten people booked inspections, and volunteers were ready to assist drop-ins.

Help is needed, according to a 2015 roadside survey cited by CPSAC.

It found that 99 per cent of kids were buckled in. However, 73 per cent of car seats were found to be used or installed incorrectly.

Just over half of children wearing seatbelts should still have been in booster seats, and 30 per cent of kids in booster seats were under the 40-pound minimum weight for their use.



TEMISKAMING SHORES (Staff) — On Wednesday, May 10, McDonald's restaurant in New Liskeard and Kirkland Lake will be celebrating McHappy Day.

It's important that children not be transitioned into new seating too fast, said Crystal Gorman, a public health promoter with the Timiskaming Health Unit.

A rear-facing car seat offers more protection for a young child's neck and spine than a forward-facing one, she said.

She said caregivers should

also review the law and guidelines – taking into account their child's size, weight, age and maturity, and the seat's design – when it comes to moving from a car seat to a booster seat and eventually a conventional seatbelt.

"Don't rush the child through the stages," she said.

She acknowledged that installing the appropriate child seat can be complex, because every model of seat and every vehicle is different.


She said CPSAC offers a

wide array of resources to the public on its website, cpsac.

A number of local organizations – including the health unit, Timiskaming Child Care, and EarlyON Child and Family Centres – have trained personnel who can perform free inspections by appointment, she added.

The service is available to not only parents but any caregiver, such as grandparents, other relatives and child care providers.

Dangerous Plant Species in the Area

Giant Hogweed

The stems and leaves of this plant are covered with small hairs coated with poisonous sap. Even the slightest touch can cause painful blisters and severe skin irritation. The symptoms can take a couple of days to develop with the skin becoming highly photosensitive producing large watery blisters; however the effects can be long lasting, with contact resulting in recurrent dermatitis. This is a particular concern for small children who may use the stems as pea-shooters or pretend telescopes resulting in horrific injuries.

What does Hogweed Look Like?

- · very tall, 8-14 feet
- · Stems have rigid hairs, purple blotches and are hollow
- · Flower clusters up to 2 ft across occurring from mid-June to late July
- Has a reddish-purple stem with fine spines that make it appear furry

Wild Parsnip

Is another weed that should also be avoided. The effects are similar to those associated with Giant Hog Weed. Irritation can occur if your skin contacts the plant's fluids and is then exposed to sunlight. Contact with the eyes can cause temporary blindness and in rare cases permanent blindness.

Wild parsnip can be found within uncultivated land, roadside ditches, parklands, nature trails and sports fields as well as on and around residential properties.

What Does Wild Parsnip Look Like?

- · smells like parsnip
- · stands 20-60 inches high, branched, hollow stem
- small yellow clustered flowers
- · flowers from late June into late fall (resembles dill)

Being able to readily identify wild parsnip and giant hogweed will minimize accidental exposure to these plants and the painful results that follow.

Anyone having information on specific locations where these weeds are posing a public risk should contact the Invading Species Hotline at 1-800-563-7711. You will be asked to send in photos for identification. **DO NOT touch, cut or collect parts of the plant**.

EDITORIAL

It's time to face up to the problem

The most prevalent call to law enforcement in the district of Temiskaming every month remains those related to domestic violence.

Women and girls in the Temskaming region are not safe in light of the current statistics reported by police.

Police release the number of calls they receive each month related to domestic violence, along with the number of charges resulting from those calls.

On average, the numbers range from 20 to 30 calls a month, which rounds out to a minimum of 240 calls or more per year.

Out of those 240 calls only a fraction of the incidents result in criminal charges against the abuser.

Nearly 200 women and girls were killed by violence in Canada in 2022, says the Canadian Femicide Observatory for Justice and Accountability.

In the last five years, the Femicide Observatory has recorded 850 deaths of women and girls in Canada, one every 48 hours.

experience violence also.

Isn't it time our criminal justice system runs on prevention, rather than reaction? It is unfornate because people are being hurt and families are being torn apart from the violence.

More resources must be put into place to prevent violence against women and girls.

Resources in the form of mental health counseling for the abuser, financial help for the abused, protection via law enforcement for the victims and stiffer penalties for abusers.

Intimate partner violence means thousands of women and their children sleep in shelters because being at home isn't safe.

And there are women and children who are turned away from shelters because those safe havens are beyond their capacity limits.

Ending domestic violence is evervone's responsibility. If we cannot name misogyny and confront or prevent it, we will never eradicate it.

A better world exists for all who It must be said that boys and men stand up and speak out against violence.

Two accidents in one week at busy Englehart corner

ENGLEHART - Englehart council discussed a growing issue regarding the impact of transports pulling off Highway 11 onto 4th Avenue and turning up 7th Street to park in a large lot behind a complex of businesses at that site on the north end of town.

The discussion took place at council's regular meeting April 26.

Recently, there have been two separate incidents at the site, within one week, which drew the public's attention.

In one incident a school bus and transport encountered each other resulting in the school bus entering the ditch in the 7th Street area near the site.

In another incident a transport ended up in the same ditch.

Mayor Jerry Mikovitch noted the two incidents had occurred in a short period of time and at the same ditch.

Town public works superintendent Ryan Vickery was present at the council meeting and said "finding a solution is going to take time." However, "the more work we do there, the more trucks we bring in," he noted.

The area is receiving a growing amount of heavy traffic, and "the roadways are taking a hit on the corners," he said.

Vickery questioned whether an extended culvert and a wider entrance would resolve the problem, and then added that it would be worthwhile for the town to have a conversation with the owners of the property where the trucks are parking.

While there are several businesses in the area, along with a couple of churches, there are also some homes.

Mikovitch said some complaints from residents have been received about the truck traffic.

Englehart chief administrative officer Malorie Robinson added that there is a plan for still more development in that area.

"That corner is open for business now," said Mikovitch, and the town is now facing growing infrastructure needs.







Police warn public of potentially lethal substance

ORILLIA (Special/Staff) – Police advise anyone receiving a package of a white crystalline substance in the mail to be vigilant.

In a province-wide news release, the Ontario Provincial Police say packages containing a potentially lethal substance may have been mailed to individuals at risk of self-harm.

Police say the packages contain sodium nitrite, a food additive commonly found in processed meats.

Intentional consumption of excessive amounts of sodium nitrite can reduce oxygen levels, impair breathing and result in death.

The OPP say the product in question was sold online and distributed by mail.

They advised anyone receiving a package from the following businesses – Imtime Cuisine, AmbuCA, Academic/ ACademic, EscapeMode/esc-

Mode and ICemac – to contact police immediately.

Earlier this week, Peel Regional Police charged a 57-year-old Mississauga resident with two counts of counselling or aiding suicide.

The charges follow an investigation launched March 31 into a sudden death, in which police suspect the chemical substance was consumed.

In a news release, Peel Regional Police say it's believed that the materials were marketed and distributed online to target people at risk of harming themselves.

At a news conference posted online, Deputy Chief Marc Andrews said police know 1,200 packages were shipped to more than 40 countries.

But police cannot say whether they all contained sodium nitrite, he continued.

He said the packages could also contain other items used to administer suicide.

The OPP say the investigation to date has found that packages may have been sent to more than a dozen communities across Ontario.



What does "best before" mean?

(NC) – We've all had that moment when you reach into the fridge for the container of yogurt, jar of pizza sauce or bottle of mustard and notice that the "best before" date on the package has passed.

Does that mean you need to toss it in the garbage?

No, not necessarily.

Best before dates appear on most food products that have a durable life of 90 days or less. There are some exceptions, including fruit and vegetables.

You should be aware that there is a key difference between a "best before" date and an "expiration date."

Simply put, a best before date indicates the timeframe when a product will be at its tastiest and freshest. After that date, the product may still be edible, but might not look or taste quite as good.

By contrast, an expiration date is the last day that something can safely be consumed. Expiration dates only appear on a small number of products, including infant formula and meal replacements.

It's important to note that best before dates only apply to products that have been stored properly, such as refrigerating dairy products and avoiding extreme temperatures for pantry items.

Other products, such as canned goods or dried pasta, may also have best before dates, but those are not actually required, and they're usually a year or more out from the packaging date.

An unopened container of yogurt might be safe to eat days or even weeks after the best before date if it has been properly refrigerated. But a month or more after that date, maybe not.

When you do open the package, look for signs such as a funky smell or the presence of mould.

By doing this instead of immediately tossing the product out, you can help reduce food waste.


