



City focusing on GHGs from municipal buildings

TEMISKAMING SHORES – The city wants to learn how it can cut greenhouse gas emissions created by its own buildings and at the same time save money.

Temiskaming Shores is applying under a Federation of Canadian Municipalities initiative for funding to conduct a greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction pathway feasibility study.

The study would identify ways the municipality could exceed its interim GHG reduction targets, said Matt Bahm, the city's recreation director, when council met in committee-of-the-whole last week.

A study would also make it eligible for further funding, he said.

"We feel we have a strong case for receiving this funding," he told council May 2.

The municipality is taking steps to mitigate its role in climate change.

It recently adopted a long-term plan to cut its GHG emissions over the next 10 years by 40 per cent from 2019 levels.

It has set a goal of net zero emissions – by either eliminating greenhouse gases or offsetting them by carbon-capturing measures – by 2050.

The study would look at energy use and GHG emissions in eight municipal buildings – its two arenas, public works garages in New Liskeard and Haileybury, city hall, the Waterfront Pool and Fitness Centre, Riverside Place hall, and the Dymond complex, which includes a community centre, fire

hall and offices.

Energy consumption and costs, size, and the level of GHG emissions based on square footage figured into the selection of buildings proposed for study.

A study would include, for example, lighting, insulation upgrades, door and window designs, HVAC systems, and the use of solar panels and renewable energy systems.

It could also look at ice plant systems in arenas and the possibility of heat recovery from pools.

The estimated cost of the study is \$200,000, with the city's share – if a grant is approved – anticipated to be \$40,000. Funding was included in the 2023 budget.

That the city is moving forward on GHG emissions is "excellent," commented Councillor Mark Wilson.

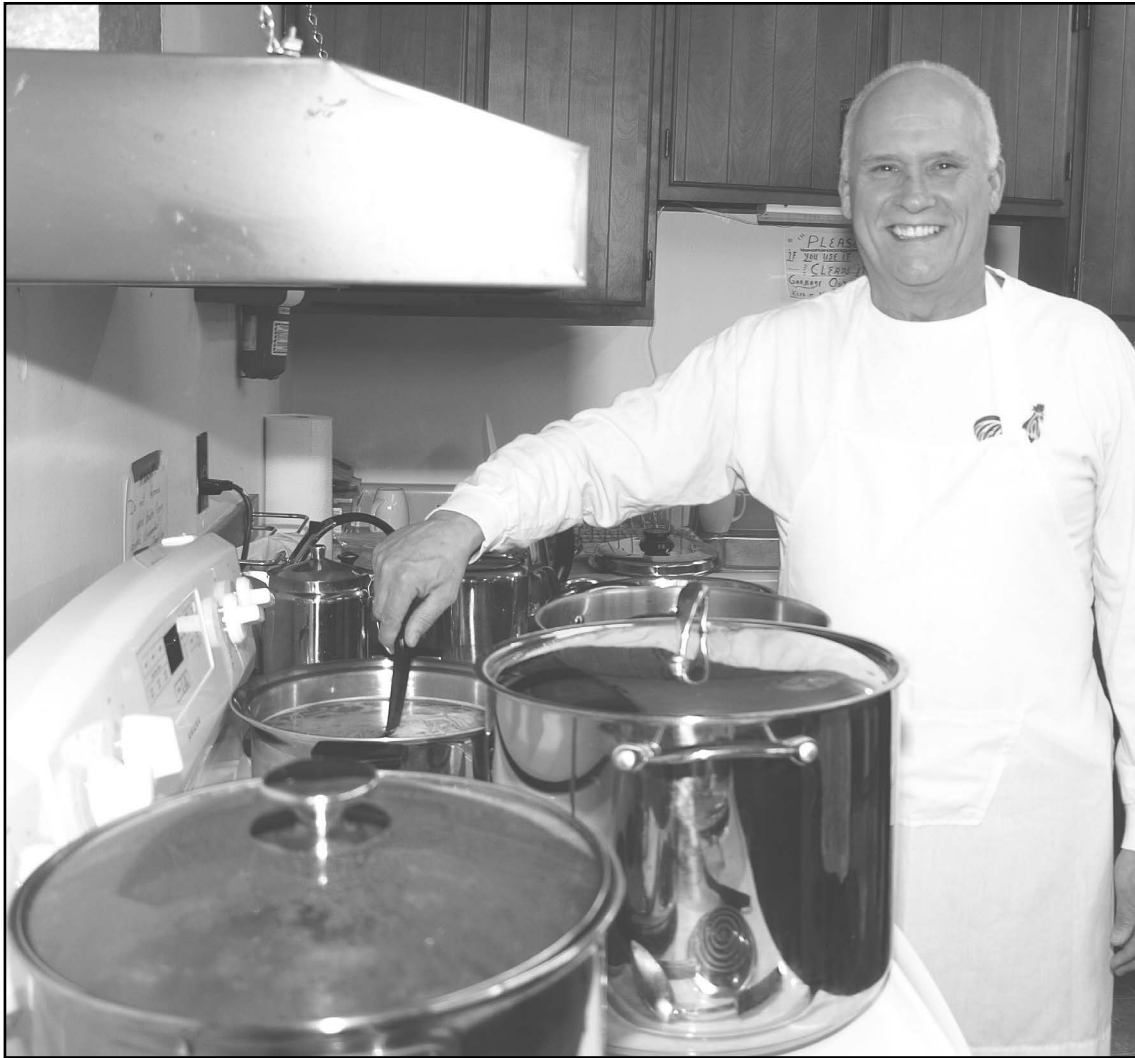

May is Bladder Cancer Awareness Month

DID YOU KNOW?

- There are more than 80,000 Canadians living with bladder cancer
- Bladder cancer is the fifth most common cancer in Canada
- 12,500 Canadians will be diagnosed with bladder cancer this year
- The biggest warning sign of bladder cancer is blood in the urine
- Smoking is a common risk factor, as is age and work related exposure to specific chemicals

SYMPTOMS:

The most common symptom of bladder cancer is blood in the urine. The colour may vary from pale yellow-red to bright or rusty red. Blood may always be in the urine, or it may come and go. Sometimes the blood can only be seen with a microscope or found with other urine tests.

Other symptoms include:

- The need to pee often (also called urinary frequency)
- An intense need to pee (also called urinary urgency)
- Trouble peeing
- A burning sensation or pain when you pee
- Back, pelvic or groin pain

Because the disease may have progressed unnoticed, it is critical to see a health care provider once you begin to experience symptoms. Since many symptoms are similar to other medical conditions, bladder cancer is often misdiagnosed as, for example, a urinary tract infection. If you are concerned, ask your health care provider for a referral to a urologist to rule out bladder cancer.

If you are a patient of the Temagami FHT and are having symptoms, please call to schedule an appointment with your primary care provider— (705) 569-3244. It may very well **not** be bladder cancer, but these symptoms could be the result of a urinary tract infection which also needs to be diagnosed and treated accordingly.

Having grown up as part of The War Amps Child Amputee (CHAMP) Program, I am now committed to spreading the Association's PLAYSAFE message. With lawn cutting season upon us, I want everyone to know that kids should not ride, operate or play near lawn mowers.

Though I've learned to accept and appreciate who I am today, I want to use my experience to help prevent others from going through what I did. Please make sure children are always at a safe distance from lawn mowers. And don't underestimate the importance of safety when operating any machinery. I urge you to take the necessary precautions to protect yourself and those around you.

Canada Summer Jobs season underway

DISTRICT (Special) – Funding for almost 500 summer jobs will be coming to Timmins-James Bay and Nipissing-Timiskaming this season.

Timmins-James Bay is receiving about \$940,000 under the Canada Summer Jobs program, which will create 240 jobs in the region, said Timmins-James Bay MP Charlie Angus in a news release.

“Every year, we do extremely well. This year is no exception,” the New Democrat said.

In neighbouring Nipissing-Timiskaming, the tally is 251, said Liberal MP Anthony Rota.

“Summer jobs are critical to the well-being of our local economy. The pool of capable, dynamic and diverse talent available to employers increases during summer months, allowing many businesses to meet their seasonal staffing needs,” said Rota in a news release.

He encouraged job seekers to apply at jobbank.gc.ca/ youth or through the Job Bank’s mobile app.

“Visit the website regularly because new jobs will be posted over the coming months,” he said.

“With the dollars received this year, we ensured several organizations got to take advantage of the program,” Angus said. “But more importantly, students can get jobs to build work experience.”

But even with the funding received, he said some groups were not approved again this year.

“We always take note of those who don’t get students to try and make sure the dollars continue to be spread evenly and fairly in the future.”

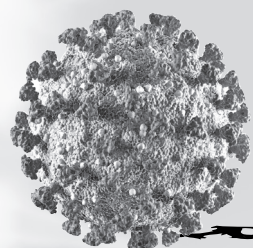

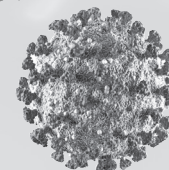

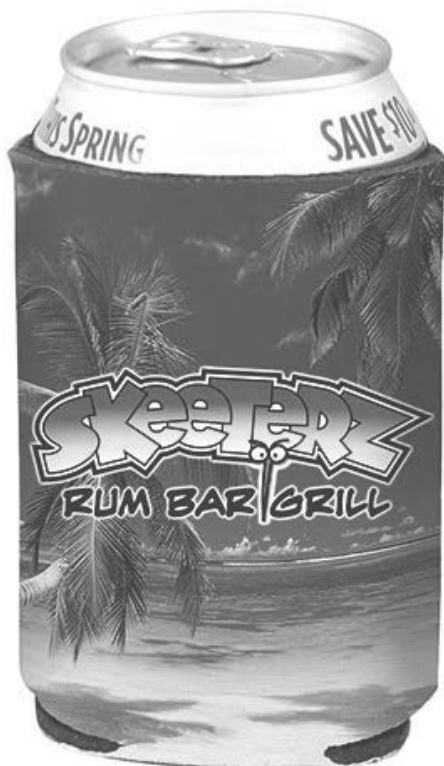

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

In most cases, the best thing to do in a home fire is to get everyone out of the home immediately and call the fire department from outside:



- Make sure working smoke alarms are installed on every storey of the home and outside all sleeping areas.
- Everyone in the home should practice a home fire escape plan so everyone knows what to do BEFORE a fire occurs.

Many people who decide to purchase a fire extinguisher might not know how or when to use them.

Fire extinguishers should be used only by people who have been trained to use them. People are encouraged to contact their local fire department if they would like fire extinguisher training or have any questions.

The following tips can help people who are thinking about buying a fire extinguisher for their home:

- Consider purchasing a fire extinguisher that has an ABC rating. This type can be used for most types of fires.
- Choose a fire extinguisher that has the logo of an independent, accredited product safety testing agency such as ULC.
- Follow the manufacturer’s instructions regarding where the extinguisher should be placed in the home.
- Inspect the fire extinguisher once a month and have it serviced by a certified technician every year.
- Fire extinguishers should be used only on small, contained fires. Never let the fire get between you and the exit.

To operate a fire extinguisher, remember the acronym PASS:

- Pull the pin;
- Aim the nozzle at the base of the fire;
- Squeeze the trigger;
- Sweep the extinguisher from side to side until the extinguisher is empty.
- Know when to go. If the fire does not go out after using one fire extinguisher, back out of the area, close the door if possible, and safely get outside and call 9-1-1.
- Remember that many stovetop fires can be safely extinguished without the use of a fire extinguisher. If a pot on the stove starts on fire, slide a lid over the pot to smother the flames and turn off the stove. Leave the pot in place until it has cooled completely.
