Temagami anticipating tax increase for 2023

TEMAGAMI - Temagami council is heading into its 2023 budget meeting.

The council plans to meet Thursday, May 25, to discuss a possible eight per cent increase in municipal taxes.

Whether that will be the outcome will be discussed at the May 25 budget meeting.

Town chief administrator-treasurer Craig Davidson stated in an email following the May 11 council meeting that, after the last budget session, he will "be including information on an eight per cent increase as that was the budget included in the circulated documents. There has been no direction received from Council after documents were circulated and we await direction from Council regarding the 2023 tax levy."

The need to help ratepayers understand why

costs are rising was discussed at the May 11 council meeting.

Davidson noted at that time that information regarding the municipal costs has been provided to ratepayers, with a breakdown of the town functions and costs.

"I think with projects we have, this trend of higher rates is looking to happen for years to come," Councillor Jamie Koistinen commented.

"That trend will continue as the town works on getting its infrastructure to the level needed," she suggested.

Councillor Robin Koistinen encouraged communication and education to help ratepayers understand why increases in costs are occurring.

Council also noted that much of the taxes raised go to pay for costs over which the municipality has no control, such as the District Services Administration Board, policing, and the health unit.

If the council were considering any change in tax ratios, that had to be done before the end of March, Davidson explained, so if the council still wants to see tax ratios changed, they could now only be implemented for 2024.

- Call 911 if you see a driver you suspect is impaired.

CAMPAIGN 911

The Victoria Day long weekend marks the annual start of MADD Canada's Campaign 911 program.

This national awareness effort encourages people to call 911 if they see a driver, boater or rider they think is impaired. Partnering with police, municipalities, regional harbours,

marinas and other organizations, MADD Canada and its Chapters and Community Leaders bring the Campaign 911 message to communities across the country through signs and billboards, public service announcements, posters and community events.

Campaign 911 runs all year long, but is promoted more heavily during the spring and summer months when Canadians are travelling to and from cottages, enjoying road trips and vacations, and spending time on trails and waterways.

This weekend also marks the start of the Safe Boating Awareness Week, May 20-26. MADD Canada is partnering once again with Transport Canada's Boating Safety Contribution Program to raise awareness of the risks of boating impaired, and to encourage boaters to call 911 to report operators they suspect are impaired.

With financial contributions from the program, MADD Canada has produced and installed nearly 1,500 "Report Impaired Boaters" signs at harbours, marinas and boat launches across the country, and plan to install 100 more signs by the end of this boating season.

Where can you find fibre?

- Legumes such as dried beans, lentils, peas, soybeans

- Whole grains such as whole grain bread, cereals, crackers, brown rice, hulled barley and oats

How to increase your fibre?

- Choose whole grain options of pasta, bread and/or cereal
- Add beans, peas and lentils to soups and stews

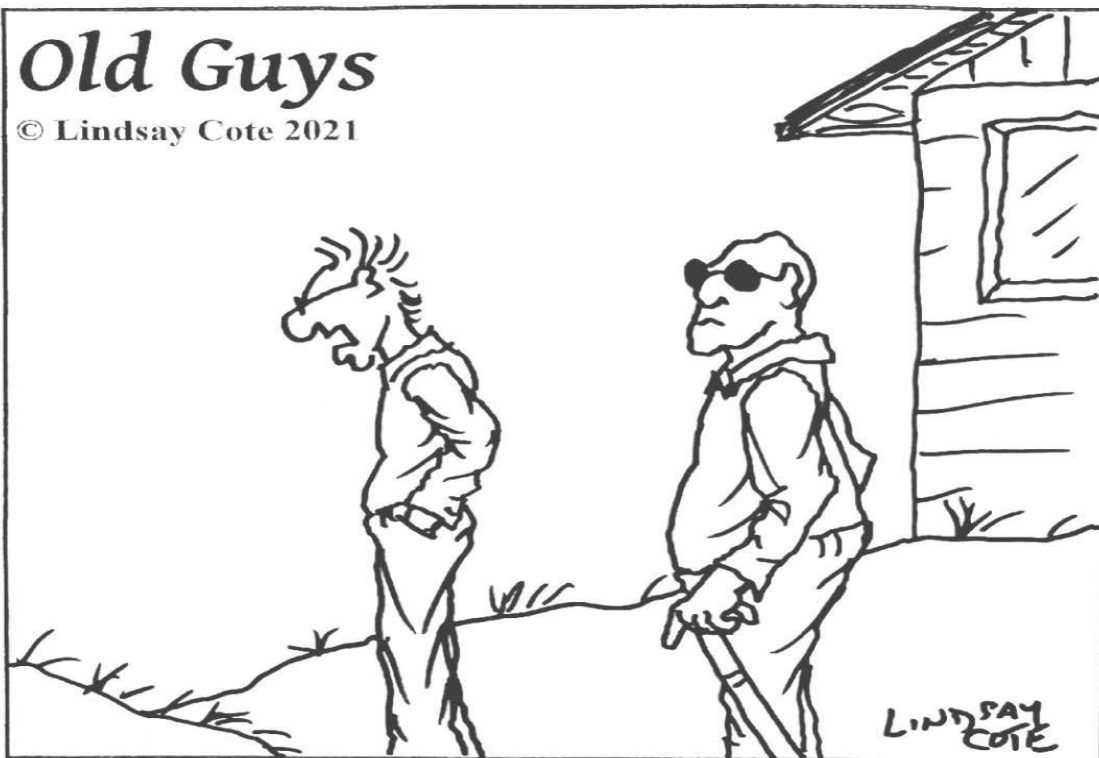

EDITORIAL

Does she have to go blind?

A New Liskeard woman, Lise La-croix, has been battling a rare eye disease that is affecting her vision for the past two-and-a-half years.

She has had to receive eye injections in Ottawa that will help reduce inflammation and bleeding of blood vessels behind her eye.

These injections are not paid for by OHIP or by any insurance plan she can access.

Nor are the costs for travel and accommodations to have those injections covered.

The cost is \$1,800 per injection and they happen several times a year.

Who could afford to have those

treatments?

Lise and her husband are just two people trying to live their lives as best they can, with modest financial means.

To their credit, the couple have done fundraising events in the community to help pay for her injections and the support they have received shows the kindness that our region is known for.

But, does she have to go blind before a government official or someone speaks up and makes those injections free for her and others like her, or covered under some type of health care plan?

We hope not!

A Canadian icon

If you could read my mind lately, it is lamenting the loss of the late, great Gordon Lightfoot.

He was one of the most iconic Canadian musicians this country has ever known.

My appreciation for Lightfoot goes beyond his endearing music to a whole other level. He was a wilderness seeker.

I was paddling on my favourite lake last week when some of his songs came into my head.

Lightfoot said, “I love Canada. I’ve travelled all over the North in various canoe expeditions. Fortunately, I fell in with a group of people about 30 years ago who were into canoe trips. I got into it and over a period of about 15 years I did ten trips. I’ve done a lot of the major rivers in Northern Canada — the Coppermine, the Back River, the Nahanni, the Churchill.”

He said whenever he needed to get his life under control he’d head for the wilderness on a canoe trip.

This speaks to the healing powers of nature, water and canoes.

Apparently, Lightfoot penned his song “Shadows” while on a canoe trip. The lyrics came to him on a quiet morning while trout were leaping all around him.

He openly admitted to having a problem with alcohol. When the songwriting ran dry he would head to the wilderness to refresh his senses.

He understood the magic of the canoe could take you to places where peace, solitude and empowerment are found.

I understand that magic also. Canoeing is about much

more than getting from point A to B. It’s about spirituality and connecting with nature on a deeply personal level.

It’s about the earth, being close to her, being part of something larger than yourself.

Maybe you are seeking more aliveness or connection in your life?

I have found when you slow down, unplug and connect with nature you align with your natural centre.

Lightfoot donated three canoes to the Canadian Canoe Museum in Peterborough.

One of them was his favourite, a canary yellow canoe.

He joined other high profile Canadians like Farley Mowat and Pierre Trudeau who also donated their canoes to the museum.

A while back I brought my daughter to Peterborough for her first year at Sir Sanford Fleming College when I stopped in at the canoe museum.

I could have spent hours and hours in that museum, save for my daughter mentioning we had other things to do that weekend.

I hope the sun is shining on Lightfoot’s face and the wind is at his back as he paddles along that carefree highway in his canary yellow canoe in the sky.

World No Tobacco Day is time to butt out

DISTRICT — Every year on May 31, the World Health Organization and local health units mark World No Tobacco Day by highlighting the health risks associated with tobacco use.

Laurel Beardmore, health promoter with the Timiskaming Health Unit (THU), says tobacco use and nicotine addiction remains an important health issue in South Temiskaming.

Taking a look at the local picture of smoking in the Timiskaming region, Beardmore noted in an average year, "there are 80 deaths, 367 hospitalizations, 912 emergency department visits were attributable to smoking in people ages 35 and older."

She says big tobacco companies own many vaping product companies and they are trying to attract youth and young adults to get them addicted to vaping, which she says is not as harmful as smoking, but still has harmful chemicals and health risks, some yet unknown.

"The biggest issue is the addiction to nicotine," says Beardmore.

Tobacco use is the single most preventable cause of death globally and is currently responsible for killing one in 10 adults worldwide.

Tobacco use not only kills smokers, it harms others through the effects of second-hand smoke.

World No Tobacco Day is about health care professionals and people coming together to help each other get healthy and stop tobacco use.

Across Ontario the smoking summary numbers reveal there were 16,673 deaths, 68,046 hospitalizations, 125,384 emergency department visits attributed to smoking in people 35 and over.

NDP promise to deliver on dental care for seniors

DISTRICT (Staff) — New Democratic Party Member of Parliament (MP) for Timmins-James Bay, Charlie Angus, has declared that his party is endorsing a national dental care plan for senior citizens.

In a press release earlier this week, Angus said his party made the promise of a national dental care plan during the 2021 federal election and that they intend on keeping that promise.

He said his party has been in tough negotiations with the minority Liberal government to “make the plan a reality this year.”

“When I go door to door, seniors tell me how they can’t afford to get their teeth fixed,” said Angus in Parliament.

“Dental care is fundamental for health, dignity and well being. Seniors deserve this. New Democrats made a promise that we would establish a national dental care plan. And this year, this promise will be made a reality.”

But Angus wants more support for seniors because he says, “seniors are falling behind. Their pensions are not keeping up. The government has created a two-tiered status for senior citizens. We say that those under 75 deserve as much support as those over 75.”

Earleton fair puts the focus on self-sufficiency

EARLTON - Homesteaders from across the Temiskaming region came together to network, to learn, to shop, to hear presentations on homesteading and to mingle among friends.

The Canadian Homesteaders Life-Skills Conference and Fair was held May 6 at the Earleton Recreation Centre.

The parking lot at the arena was the first indication that something big was happening in Earleton as it was overflowing with vehicles.

Newbies and seasoned homesteaders exchanged ideas, kids laughed and giggled, women worked on a homemade quilt, someone explained how to do canning and all you could see around the event was people who cared about the same things.

Organizer Denis Trudel estimated between 1,200 to 1,500 people attended the one-day event.

He and his wife Sylvie came

up with the idea for the conference after they had a personal interest in homesteading.

“We are just trying to catch our breath, it was amazing, absolutely amazing,” said Trudel in a telephone interview the next day.

“We are very, very happy it all went well. The feedback we received was so positive and many people asked if we would do it again.”

It was a first time event for Trudel who mentioned it took 11 weeks to plan the conference and fair.

There were 60 vendors and exhibitors at the conference from across the Temiskaming region set up inside the arena.

The conference was geared to people who wanted to learn to be more self-sufficient.

“We received positive feedback from vendors who said they didn’t realize how many other people did things like canning and who wanted more information on home schooling,” noted Trudel.

Above all, the Trudels want-

ed the conference to be an educational experience where people could go away with a more informed approach to homesteading and self-sufficiency.

The education sessions took place upstairs at the arena featuring a presentation by the Trudels themselves, who own an eight-acre homestead on Highway 65 East.

“One change we will make moving forward is to make sure people are aware that there were speakers and presentations happening upstairs besides what was happening on the arena floor. We hooked up a speaker to let people know to come upstairs but in all the hustle and bustle, perhaps it wasn’t heard.”

Children could learn about homesteading from “mini-steaders” classes held downstairs in one of the arena change rooms designed to teach them about farming, gardening and livestock.

“We turned one of the change rooms into a mini classroom

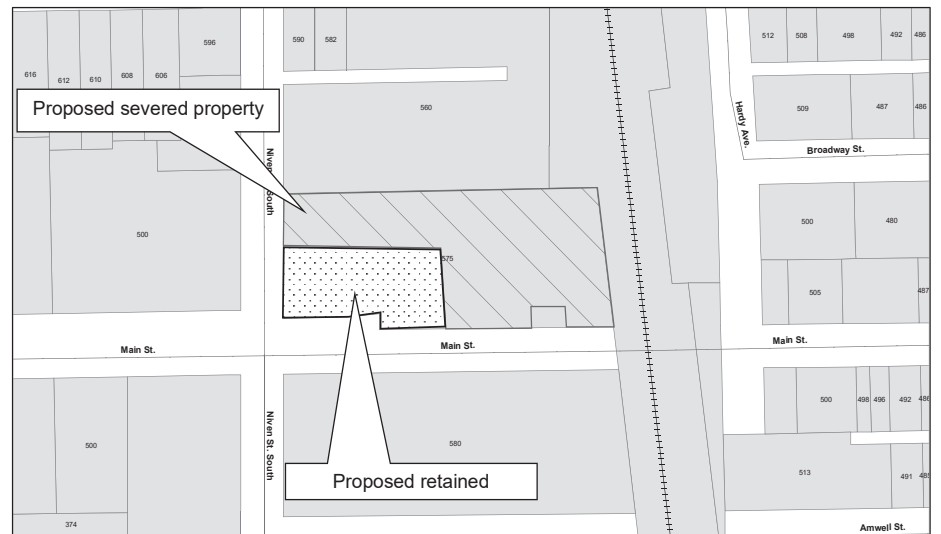

Getting a safe, sizzling start to the long weekend

DISTRICT (Special) - The countdown to the summer season is on and BBQs will be making their seasonal debut this May long weekend. As you prepare to light it up, make sure you light it right; the only fireworks you should be seeing are those in the sky.

To get sizzling keep these Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) BBQ safety tips in mind:

TEST FOR LEAKS

- Clean burner ports and tubes. Use a pipe cleaner or wire to ensure burner ports are free of rust, dirt, spider webs or other debris.

- Check the hose leading from the gas tank to the burner and replace it if cracked or damaged.

- Test for leaks with a 50/50 water/dish soap solution on propane cylinder connections and hoses. If bubbles appear, it could mean gas is leaking out so tighten the connection and/or replace the damaged parts and re-test.

LIGHT IT RIGHT

- Before lighting, make sure the BBQ is on level ground, far away from any flammable material, with the lid open.

- Turn the tank's gas valve on, then the grill controls or heat setting and push the igniter button.

- If there is no igniter button, insert a long match or BBQ lighter through the side burner hole first, then turn on the heat control knob.

- If the burner does not ignite right away, turn the gas off and wait five minutes, keeping the lid open, before repeating the procedure.

- Never lean over the grill when you are lighting it.

KEEP IT OUTDOORS

- Always barbecue outside in a well-ventilated area - BBQs are approved for outdoor use only. They emit carbon monoxide, a poisonous gas that

can lead to unconsciousness and even death.

- Propane cylinders may not be used or stored inside any structure.

STAY SAFE

- BBQs are intended to be attended. Never leave your cooking/grill unsupervised. Keep kids and pets away from the BBQ.

- Keep any flammable items/liquids away from the BBQ. This includes the use of hand sanitizer, whose 60-80 per cent alcohol-based content makes it highly flammable. While hand sanitizer is safe when used correctly it can be a dangerous combination when barbecuing. Keep this in mind, exercise caution and opt for thorough hand washing when getting ready to grill.

- Never throw water on a grease fire.

Ontarians living in apartments and condominiums should be aware of additional safety restrictions and potential hazards related to barbecue

use on balconies. Barbecues may be prohibited by the municipality or in the condominium bylaws of your building or prohibited by the building owner or property manager, so be sure you are aware of any restrictions in place for your building.

Don't BBQ on a balcony if:

- Prohibited in the bylaws of your municipality and/or condominium.

- Prohibited by the building owner or property manager of a rental property.

Do BBQ on a balcony but only if:

- Permitted in the bylaws of your municipality and condominium.

- Permitted by the building owner or property manager of a rental property.

- The balcony is open (no enclosures or walls have been erected).

- A propane cylinder is transported in a service elevator; when there are no service elevators, you may use the pas-

senger elevator, but you must be alone.

- The cylinder is kept on the balcony and connected to the BBQ.

- The BBQ is kept clear of combustible material as listed

on the BBQ's rating plate or in the certified instructions.

- The propane cylinder relief valve is at least one metre horizontally from any building opening below it, and three metres from a building air intake.
