Airport continuing search for more funding

EARLTON - The Earlton Airport Authority is exploring opportunities for increased revenue for its operations.

At its May 18 meeting in Earlton, the Airport Authority received a marketing presentation from Lumex Group, which is contracted by the Airport Authority for management and business development.

Lumex Group noted potential opportunities for the airport due to its proximity to agriculture, mining, forestry and manufacturing operations in the region. Fly-in tourism in the region was also noted. The presentation touched on various infrastructure upgrades that could assist the airport. Improvements to the website and social media were also suggested, as well as having a presence at local events.

Prior to the presentation, airport manager James Smith noted that new military Hercules C-130J aircraft have been in the area where they are being tested.

"They like working around this area. It's a quieter space."

He noted that one recently landed and refuelled, which was appreciated because the sale of fuel assists the airport.

Most of the airplane fuel users are corporate, Smith noted.

The airport is also seeing air ambulance movements on par with last year, he said. The Lumex Group presentation stated that the airport is seeing over 300 air ambulance flights annually, assisting area patients who need to reach larger medical centres.

Private aircraft also use the airport.

Airport Authority board member Kerry Stewart, reeve of Chamberlain Township, reported that he met with Ontario Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing Steve Clark at the recent meeting of the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities in

Parry Sound. Stewart spoke to him about the airport and whether the province could provide funding to assist with operations.

The airport obtains funds from supporting municipalities and is seeking support from those not currently providing funds. Recently a per capita levy to the municipalities was increased by five per cent, with the per capita factor revised to reflect the 2021 census.

Following the Lumex presentation, Airport Au-



thority board member Pauline Archambault, reeve of Harley Township, said that the point needs to be reinforced in future planning that the airport needs to find more funding.

Airport Authority chair Jeff Laferriere, mayor of the City of Temiskaming Shores, commented that the district "can't afford to lose the airport." The airport provides vital assistance for the district's health services and as a base for fighting forest fires, he said.

Individual charged following lockdown at TDSS

(Staff) – A 20-year-old from Temiskaming Shores has been charged after Timiskaming District Secondary School reported receiving a threat that prompted a lockdown at the school.

An individual was taken into custody May 23 and charged with uttering threats to cause death or bodily harm.

In a letter to families, school principal Gavin Date said the school received a threat by phone that day and entered a lockdown from 12:20 p.m. to 1:34 p.m.

He said Temiskaming OPP conducted "a thorough search"

TEMISKAMING SHORES and determined that there was (Staff) – A 20-year-old from no threat to the safety of stu-Temiskaming Shores has been dents or staff within the school.

> During a lockdown, schools and classrooms are locked, lights are turned off, and students are away from any windows or doors, explained Stephanie Shaw, communications officer at District School Board Ontario North East, in an email.

> As the investigation continued outside the school, Date said students were in a "hold and secure environment."

"During a hold and secure, students continue learning as usual inside the building, although no one is allowed to enter or exit the school," he explained.

"At approximately 1:30 p.m., an arrest was made by OPP and under advisement from OPP, our school exited the hold and secure," he continued.

"All students and staff are safe, and at no point was there a safety concern within the school," he said.

In a news release, Temiskaming OPP said other schools in the area were alerted and put under hold and secure conditions as a precaution.

Police reported an individual at a residence in New Liskeard was taken into custody.



EDITORIAL Wildlife danger

Roads are a factor of human activity.

There is an axiom circulating that says a northerner is more likely to be killed by a moose than a terrorist attack.

There is some truth in the sentiment.

There have been two fatalities in less than 10 days on a stretch of Highway 11 between Temagami and North Bay.

Two people lost their lives because of collisions with wildlife, specifically moose.

We know there are wildlife fences installed along Highway 11 south heading out of North Bay going to Toronto.

Why can't those fences be installed along that high-risk section of Highway 11 between North Bay and Temagami?

The word fence originated in Old English from defens, meaning defense.

They are used to protect property, individuals and wildlife. The highway fencing is designed to keep large animals like moose, deer and bears away from highways and to protect both drivers and wildlife.

Of course fencing is not a reason to completely let your guard down when driving on northern highways where wildlife is present.

There are also wildlife gates designed to allow animals to exit a highway area.

To their credit, the Swedes have miles and miles of fencing protecting citizens and wildlife.

Do we just shrug our shoulders and say that in the spring it is inevitable large animals will leave the bush because of flies and to eat vegetation on the sides or roads and that we could potentially die from a collision with them?

How does that attitude save lives?

It's time for action, not platitudes about road safety and wildlife encounters.

Safety must come first.

Warblers galore

Ouch, I've got warbler neck!

It's from looking up into the trees to spot the yellow, orange, black, white and green warblers returning to the region.

Yes, there is such a thing as "warbler neck" in the birding world as folks stare up into trees looking for yellow, chestnut, pale blue cerulean, blackburnians and Nashville warblers.

Warblers are small and medium sized songbirds with slender beaks adapted for primarily eating insects.

The spring migration brings these delightful birds to the Boreal Forest from the tropics.

The warblers sport their finest songs and beautiful spring plumage for all to see.

For birders it is the most exciting time of the year.

I am fairly new to the warbler world and I am certainly no expert on warblers. The folks who are the experts are busy banding warblers as we speak at the Hilliardton Marsh Research and Education Centre.

The student birders come from all over North America to have the unique experience of banding birds at the Marsh.

It's really difficult to identify the 35 species of Ontario warblers if you are new to the game. However, once you see one and identify the bird then you will know it when you see it again.

Case in point, after being at the Marsh this past weekend observing warbler banding, I was paddling around my favourite lake when I spotted a Nashville - a black and white and yellow warbler - flitting amongst the trees.

I was proud of myself for identifying these birds correctly because when I got home I looked at the photos I had taken and compared them to my Birds of Ontario guidebook. Identifying birds is not an easy feat but the good news is there are also apps for that.

The Merlin ID app, created by the Cornell Laboratory, is free to download and is the leading app identifying birds across the globe.

Merlin is powered by ebird, the largest database of bird sightings.

The very active warblers, with their sharp bills, are a

welcome sign that spring has arrived in our north country.

I love birding because there's always something new to learn and learning can help you in ways you never expected.

Problem solving, observation skills and a deeper connection to nature are some of those benefits.

What's my favourite warbler you ask? Mine is the luminous



lemon yellow warbler with the pointed black beak. In the Celtic culture the yellow warbler was a symbol of joy and happiness. The Celts believed the birds represented the light of the sun.

And last weekend with the skies dark and grey and rainy, observing a yellow warbler was indeed a ray of sunshine.

Almost 70 per cent of Ontarians ride bikes

DISTRICT (Special) - The Share the Road Cycling Coalition, Ontario's cycling advocacy and policy organization, recently released province-wide polling data that shows biking is growing in popularity.

The data says there is a high prevalence of cycling amongst Ontarians, that the majority of Ontarians want to cycle more often, and that increased investment by governments in cycling infrastructure is something that a majority of Ontarians support.

The findings show:

- 68 per cent of Ontarians (9.8 million people) ride their bike at least monthly.
- Of those, 22 per cent of Ontarians (3.2 million) say they ride a bike frequently (daily or almost daily) and an additional 46 per cent report riding occasionally - weekly or monthly.
- Ontarians are both cyclists and drivers: 87 per cent of Ontario's 3.2 million frequent cyclists say they also drive frequently, while 85 per cent of Ontario's 9.8 million occasional cyclists say this is the case.
- The top two reasons for cycling are recreation, with 72 per cent of individuals cycling for this purpose, and exercise, with 65 per cent using bicycles for this activity.



- Shopping and running errands are the reason 16 per cent of Ontarians cycle occasionally (33 per cent for frequent cyclists), with visiting friends also at 16 per cent (34 per cent for frequent cyclists).
- Commuting to work and school is the choice of 11 per cent of occasional cyclists, with frequent cyclists at 20 per cent.
- 8.5 million Ontario residents (59 per cent) live in a Bicycle Friendly Community, as designated by Share the Road's Bicycle Friendly Communities program.

"This data confirms what we know through our work in communities - that Ontarians are cyclists, and that they want to cycle more often, given the numerous benefits cycling brings in terms of healthy, safe and active communities," said Ed McMahon, board chair, Share the Road Cycling Coalition.

"In addition, the fact that the data shows that Ontarians are both motorists and cyclists, points to the fact that a false narrative has developed, and that somehow cycling is a divisive issue. This is simply not the case. With Ontario motorists also cycling regularly there is a clear imperative that we all focus on making our roads and our communities safer with investments that will save lives - and lessen congestion."

Englehart affirms no chickens allowed

ENGLEHART - Englehart council has decided to continue its prohibition on hens within town limits.

A resident had requested that the town change its animal control bylaw so that Englehart residents would be allowed to keep hens.

"Urban small scale chicken farming is a way

to enhance urban agriculture, increase food security and provide greater access to local food," Tyler Fletcher wrote in a letter early in April.

Town chief administrator Malorie Robinson later explained in an email that "when this topic has been brought up and discussed at Council, the main issues were how to enforce the by-law and the extra costs of by-law enforcement."



Safety council summer reminder

DISTRICT (Special) - Though the seasonal warmth of summer isn't yet being felt everywhere in the country, there's certainly no better time to become acquainted - or re-acquainted with tips to keep you and your family safe during the dog days of summer.

The Canada Safety Council is calling attention to two potentially fatal summer safety concerns, with risks that can have serious consequences if left unaddressed.

HEAT-RELATED ILLNESSES

Heat-related illnesses, including heat

exhaustion and heat stroke, are silent killers. According to the British Columbia Coroners Service, an estimated 619 heat-related fatalities occurred in summer 2021 in British Columbia alone, the result of what we now know as the western heat dome - the deadliest weather event in Canada as of this writing.

As temperatures rise, and even more so in the context of the steady increase climate change continues to bring to our temperatures, it's essential to take precautions to stay cool and hydrated. This includes avoiding outdoor activities during the hottest part of the day, wearing lightweight and loose-fitting clothing, and drinking plenty of water.

Staying cool could also involve taking a dip in a pool, but beware of water-related fatalities.

WATER DANGERS

The second summer safety issue of note is the risk of water-related injuries, particularly among children. Drowning is a substantial cause of death in Canada, with the Lifesaving Society of Canada reporting approximately 460 people fatally drowning every year. Many of these incidents occur in lakes or ponds (34 per cent), rivers (29 per cent) and pools (nine per cent).

Additionally, more than nine in 10 drownings involving children occur during absent or distracted supervision. Parents and guardians should always supervise children near water with undivided attention, ensuring that they have appropriate flotation devices. In public swimming areas, they should ensure the presence of a trained lifeguard.







RVS, TRAILERS AND CAMPERS: PROPANE AND BARBECUE SAFETY TIPS

When Transporting Cylinders:

- Ensure propane cylinders are upright and secure during transport.
- Keep cylinder valves closed and protected during transport.
- Plug or cap cylinder outlets during transport. When Using Cylinders:
- Ensure cylinders are upright and secure on a firm footing.
- Check cylinder connections and hoses for leaks by brushing a 50/50 mix of liquid soap and water onto all connections and hoses. Rising bubbles when you turn on the valve indicate a leak. Tighten connections or repair the hose until there are no bubbles.
- Keep cylinders away from flame, heat, and exits.

Using Propane in your RV or Camper:

- Keep all combustion exhaust vents on the exterior wall of your RV or camper clear of obstructions.
- Use stovetop burners or ovens only for cooking and not as a source of heat.
- Propane appliances require an adequate supply of fresh air for proper combustion. Ensure your RV or camper is properly ventilated to prevent build-up of carbon

monoxide.

• Install a carbon monoxide alarm and propane leak detector.

Barbecue Safety:

- Ensure barbecues are on firm, level footing.
- Keep barbecues well away from the side of your RV, camper or tent, and other combustibles.
- Make sure igniter buttons work properly before turning the gas on. If there is no igniter, insert a long match or barbecue lighter through the side burner hole before you turn on the grill controls.
- Keep barbecues clean of grease to prevent flare-ups.
- Stay by the grill when cooking and keep kids and pets at a safe distance.
- Turn off all burner controls and tank valves after each use.




