Torch Run lights up June 8

TEMISKAMING SHORES — The Law Enforcement Torch Run has become the single biggest grassroots financial contributor and raises the public profile of the Special Olympics in Canada.

In Temiskaming Shores the run enjoys tremendous support and it should continue that tradition as the Temiskaming Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) prepares to host the 2023 Torch Run on Thursday, June 8.

Since the Torch Run began its partnership with Special Olympics Ontario, the number of registered athletes has grown from under 4,000 to greater than 26,000 athletes today.

And in excess of \$46 million has been raised from the Torch Runs for Special Olympic athletes and the competitions they take part in.

The June 8 run will leave the McDonald's Restaurant parking lot at 10 a.m. travelling to the Don Shepherdson Memorial Arena in New Liskeard.

Police officers, Special Olympic athletes and members of the public will be taking part in the run, said organizer Detective Constable Mike Au-

"This is my 13th year with the run and we hope to see lots of people supporting us, not only with the run but the t-shirt sales, the car wash and barbecue

after the run at the OPP detachment."

The red 2023 t-shirts are available from Audette for \$20 each.

All the money raised locally stays here to support athletes in the Temiskaming region, noted Audette.

Local Special Olympian athletes take part in bowling, swimming and track and field events.


The Bike Exchange is one of many Bike Month initiatives being promoted by Temiskaming Shores' Active Travel Committee.

What You Should Know About Lyme Disease

Lyme disease is a potentially serious infection that you can get if you're bitten by an infected blacklegged tick (also called a deer tick).

If you work outdoors or participate in outdoor activities such as golfing, hunting, camping, fishing, hiking, and walking in fields, you may be at greater risk for tick bites.

Cover up and wear:

- light-coloured clothing, so it's easier to see ticks
- · closed-toed shoes
- · long-sleeved shirts
- · long pants, tucked into your socks
- special clothing designed to repel ticks

Use insect repellent

Use an insect repellent, or bug spray, that says "DEET" or "icaridin" on it. Put it on your clothes and exposed skin. Always read the label for directions on how to use it.

Put clothes in the dryer

Kill any ticks that might be on your clothing by putting your clothes in a dryer on high heat for at least 10 minutes before washing them.

Check yourself and your children

After being outdoors, check for ticks on yourself and your children. I ook:

- · behind your knees
- · on your head
- in your belly button
- · in your groin area
- · in your underarm area
- on the back of your body use a mirror, or ask someone to check for you

It's a good idea to have a shower as soon as you can to wash off any ticks

Check your pets for ticks

After being outdoors, check your pets' skin and remove any ticks you find. Ask your veterinarian about options to help keep ticks off your pets.

If you have been bitten by a tick and develop fever, headache, muscle and joint pains, fatigue, and a skin rash, especially one that looks like a red bull's eye in the weeks after being bitten, promptly contact your primary care provider. Bring the tick with you to your medical appointment, if possible, as it may help your provider assess your illness.



EDITORIAL

Hidden in plain view

While we don't see it in quite corporations upon its citizens. the same numbers, it is a sight for people in our region to travel to other Northern communities and see people huddled in blankets on city streetscapes.

The tragedy that these homeless people are experiencing is not new to our region, despite the obvious visibility of the situation in other areas.

What is out of sight should not necessarily be put out of mind.

Those with knowledge of poverty and the housing crisis know full well homelessness and destitution are not limited to big cities.

Individuals and families in our region are feeling the realities of homelessness and poverty.

With high inflation, food banks across the region are reporting an increase in clients.

The issue of homelessness and poverty is felt by people in one of the richest provinces in the country.

It is all too easy to pretend this isn't our problem, and it doesn't exist in our region.

We can't see it, so isn't this problem non-existent?

The Ford government is at least partly responsible for dealing with addiction, mental illness, and a housing crisis and gouging by large

The provincial government instead downloads the social issues onto municipalities who do not have the means to fully address them.

The small municipalities in our region are already strapped for cash dealing with shrinking tax bases, aging populations, wage increases, fuel costs and liability issues.

The District of Temiskaming Social Services Administration Board (DTSSAB) is left to use its reserve funds to provide housing the best way it can.

While more and more people are excluded from the rental market and home ownership, the need for social housing is going to get worse.

Homelessness affects us all, whether it is visible or not.

The provincial government has to take its responsibilities seriously for the social burden placed on municipalities across the north through the DTSSAB payments that are not negotiable.

And it needs to fully support the social service agencies facing the tsunami of homelessness and poverty that exists in the north.

Don't bet on it!

Are your electronics and appliances ready for upgrades?

DISTRICT (NC) - How often should you be upgrading your home appliances and electronics?

If you've lived in the same home for more than a decade, you could be right on schedule. Many household essentials have a 10-year lifespan, so here are five to keep an eye on to ensure optimal performance.

REFRIGERATOR

The average refrigerator can last 10 to 12 years, so its technology may be out of date when it comes time to replace it. If yours is older, upgrading to a newer model can make for more efficient energy consumption and help lower your bills.

WASHER AND DRYER

You can expect your washer

and dryer set to last for 10 to 13 years, but if your laundry machines are leaking, making strange noises or taking a long time to dry small loads, it's time to upgrade. While these appliances are an investment, you could be saving money in the end, as efficient use of water and electricity are a concern for older models.

MICROWAVE

High-usage kitchen appliances tend to wear out faster, and your microwave is no exception.

The average microwave lasts about seven years with normal use. If your food is burning or the plate isn't rotating correctly, head to your local appliance store.

LAPTOP

The average laptop in Can-

ada is four years old, but a well-maintained laptop has a lifespan of about three to five years. If your laptop is slowing down and struggles with basic tasks, it's time for a replacement. If you're in the market for a new laptop and not sure where to start, look for a model that has the Intel Evo sticker. It's a quality assurance badge that can help take the guesswork out of buying.

TELEVISION

The industry standard for an LED television set is 100,000 hours, or about 10 years, however, the higher you set your contrast and brightness, the more power your TV uses. Over time, this decreases your TV's longevity, meaning you'll need to replace it sooner.

Still not sure whether you should repair or replace? Here's a good rule of thumb to follow when something goes wrong with your home technology: if it's more than halfway through its lifespan and will cost half as much to repair

as to replace, it usually makes sense to go for the replacement. You may save headaches, more costly repairs and money in the long run. Just be sure to recycle your old devices to help reduce your carbon footprint.

Enjoy the outdoors without a tick

DISTRICT (Special) - You can enjoy the return of warm weather and outdoor activities by preventing tick bites that can cause Lyme disease and other infections like anaplasmosis.

Before your outdoor activity, Health Canada (Ontario Region) has tips so you can take the following precautions to prevent tick bites:

- Wear light coloured long-sleeved shirts and pants to spot ticks more easily
- Tuck your shirt into your pants, and pull your socks over your pant legs
- Use bug spray containing DEET or Icaridin on your skin and clothing (always follow the directions on the label)
- Walk on cleared paths or walkways

When you return, take time to specifically inspect these 10 areas of your body (favorite tick hiding spots):

- head and hair
- in and around the ears
- under the arms
- around the chest
- back (use a mirror or ask for help)
- waist
- belly button
- around the groin
- legs and behind the knees
- between the toes

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

You may not notice a tick bite because ticks are tiny and their bites are usually painless. Feel your skin for bumps and see if there are any tiny black dots. Most people get Lyme disease after being bitten by:

- a nymph, which is about the size of a poppy seed (1.15-millimetres)
- an adult female tick, which is about the size of a sesame seed (3 mm)

Found a tick? Remove it immediately to reduce the risk of infection. To do this properly, watch the Lyme disease video: How to properly remove a tick.

Don't forget to also check your pets.





Safety Authority offers tips for dealing with power outages

TORONTO (Special) – The organization that administers provincial safety regulations cautions Ontarians to be aware of some specific hazards when the power goes off.

The Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) says when key energy infrastructures can be temporarily out of commission, it's tempting for residents to turn to alternatives that may be unsafe.

The TSSA outlined some of the dangers in a recent news release.

- Portable, fuel-fired appliances designed for outdoor use are never safe to use indoors. They can cause carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning, fires and other harmful risks.
- Generators used outside must be situated away from open windows, doors and vents. CO produced by a generator can seep into these openings.
- CO gas can also accumulate in car ports, garages and covered patios. Never use portable, fuel-fired generators, propane BBQs or other fuel-burning outdoor appliances in these areas.
- Drying a basement with commercial ventilating fans can create a negative pressure environment. This can cause CO from appliances in the home to spill back into the home, so ensure there is proper ventilation during the procedure.

"CO is a leading cause of accidental poisonings in Ontario," said Sam Sadeghi, director of the TSSA's fuels safety program.

"That's why it is so important that Ontario residents do not compound a hazardous situation, such as a flood, by exposing themselves and their families to CO by using fuel-fired devices in poorly ventilated areas."

• Using an elevator in a flooding building is a safety hazard. Water can accumulate in elevator shafts or adversely affect an elevator's operation leading to entrapment or injury.

The TSSA regulates the safety of a wide range of equipment and personnel, from amusement devices, boilers and pressure vessels, to elevating devices, fuels, operating engineers, and ski lifts.

Its range of safety services include public education authorization, engineering design review, inspections, investigations, compliance support, enforcement, and prosecution activities.
