Hospital not expecting summer staffing shortfall

TEMISKAMING SHORES - While staffing shortages have forced temporary closures of some rural emergency departments, Temiskaming Hospital is not anticipating problems as it heads into the summer.

"It looks good, it looks like we'll be in good shape," said CEO Mike Baker in an interview earlier this week. Baker credited a couple of factors with easing concerns over emergency department service.

"We have a very strong physician complement," he said.

The hospital has also made "very significant investments" in temporary agency nurses who work in the emergency department and care for in-patients, he said.

He's grateful for their presence, but said the temporary staff are costly.

"In the longer term, we want to try and have people who are committed to our community and committed to our patients as much as we are," he

"We've been pretty successful in hiring new registered nurses and registered practical nurses (RPNs) as well. We are able to start to reduce the number of agency nurses that we have, and that's a focus for us."

The hospital is continuing to experience high occupancy rates.

At the beginning of the week, it had 70 in-patients, which represents 120 per cent of its base occupancy.

By that point in June, it was averaging more than 66 patients a day, which is "very, very high for us," he

Alternate-level-of-care patients – typically those waiting for a place at a long-term care facility - numbered 34 or 35.

Visits to the emergency department had slowed in recent days, but for several days the previous

week's traffic had reached pre-COVID levels.

"That hasn't happened in a long time," he said.

A variety of concerns were reported by emergency department users.

About 37 per cent of visits in the previous four weeks had been for respiratory-type illnesses.

But doctors did not indicate that recent visits were related to forest fire smoke, he said.

At the time of the interview, the hospital also had

four patients who were admitted with COVID-19. (They were not admitted because of illness associated with the virus.)

That's more than the hospital typically sees, he said, and is a reminder that the virus is still present in the community.

That too has an impact on staffing, he explained, because the need to take infection control steps such as gowning require more time.

BRH seeking feedback as it plots its future

ENGLEHART (Special) Blanche River Health wants to hear from you.

It's kicking off the planning process with a public survey.


"This feedback is crucial to ensuring the priorities of local residents are addressed in the five-year strategic plan we are developing."



Elder Abuse Awareness

Elder Abuse is one of the most underreported crimes in Canada affecting hundreds of thousands of people every year.

Elder abuse comes in many forms:

- · Psychological abuse in the form of threats, insults, or humiliation
- Financial abuse in which a trusted individual steals or misuses an elderly person's money, forges their signature, or pressures them to make or change legal documents. An example might be sharing an older person's home without paying a fair share of the expenses when requested.
- Physical abuse such as hitting, pushing, or restraining an elderly person
- Sexual abuse including sexual harassment and nonconsensual sexual activity
- **Neglect** of an elderly person who requires care. Seniors most vulnerable to neglect, include those who are socially isolated and those with serious health conditions.

The truth is elder abuse is any action taken by someone in a relationship of trust with an elderly person that causes harm or distress.

People can engage in abusive behaviour without realizing it. Sometimes seemingly innocent or well-meaning actions cross the line. For example, someone might open an older relative's mail to save them stress of bill-paying, but if done without the elderly's person's permission, that breach of privacy could be a form of psychological abuse. A caregiver who gives more than the prescribed dosage of medication to keep an elderly patient calm could be engaging in physical abuse.

There is no definitive list of everything elder abuse is and is not. We must be mindful of how elder abuse can take on different forms and be cautious of how our actions could cause harm.

Make sure to listen to your elderly parents, friends, or other family members and take their concerns seriously. If you suspect abuse, report it immediately to health care providers. social services, police, legal professionals and/or members of faith communities.

If you are an elder who is being abused, neglected, or exploited, tell at least one person. Tell your doctor, a friend, or a family member whom you trust. Other people care and can help you.

There is no excuse for abuse! If you or someone you know is experiencing abuse, help is available call the seniors safety line at 1-866-299-1011 Free to call - 24 hours a day - 7 days a week

EDITORIAL

Turtles are on the move

Ontario's eight species of turtles are on the move as the weather warms, often travelling to roadside gravel sections to lay their eggs.

The largest Ontario turtle, the snapping turtle, is a species of special concern. Snapping turtle moms are crawling out of wetlands and area lakes looking for gravel beds to bury their precious eggs— and crossing roads in the process to find suitable nesting sites.

Female turtles will lay their eggs anywhere from mid-May until July.

If you are driving along and see what looks like a rock in the middle of the road it might just be a turtle.

Now that hunting any turtle in Ontario is illegal, all eight species of Ontario turtles are still designated species at risk.

The greatest threat to turtles is vehicles on roadways that do not see the turtles crossing the road or stopping in the middle of the roadway.

So, slow down drivers and keep an eye out for turtles on area roadways.

Every Ontario turtle is precious and a slow moving snapper won't reproduce until it is 20 years old, according to the Ontario Turtle Conservation Network website.

In short, human activity has made life difficult for turtles.

As more and more of their natural habitat disappears to development, turtles must navigate increasingly dangerous landscapes to find suitable nesting sites.

If you come across a turtle on a roadway, don't move them to another area. Always move turtles in the direction they are headed even if it doesn't make sense to you.

Snapping turtles can whip their heads around quickly and bite so be careful when moving them. A gentle prod with a shovel would work in the direction they are going.

If a turtle has nested and laid its eggs in a roadside shoulder of the road, put up a box-type barrier or cones around the nest to protect the nest until the turtle offspring hatch some three to four months from when they were laid.

Incubation times vary depending on the summer weather, but the eggs most often hatch in late summer or fall.

Less than one in 100 turtle eggs will hatch and grow into an adult turtle.

However, if a turtle reaches adulthood, it has few predators and enjoys a high survival rate, says the Ontario Turtle Conservation Network.

So let's help them reach maturity and be aware of the slow moving turtles on area roadways.

Pride month

June is Pride Month and rainbow flags are being raised all over the region.

Inclusivity can be a steep learning curve for many people and with a wee bit of understanding and compassion, we can accept people for who they say they are.

Someone said as soon as the month of June arrives, everyone wants to be gay.

Thumbs up to the Elementary Teachers' Federation of Ontario which has a downloadable pronoun tips sheet on their website to help people with pronouns.

Kudos to District School Board Ontario North East for proudly flying Pride flags at all their schools across the north.

It is important for children to know they can identify in a safe and welcoming place at school.

I agree with this message I read on social media: "Pride is important because somewhere out there is a confused teenager who still thinks maybe being dead is better than being gay and that's not okay."

We have come a long way as an accepting society when we





Welcome to another fabulous boating season. I've gone on one boating trip already and have several more planned. We went up the Wabi River a week ago. Old maps show it as Wahbe's Creek. The mosquitoes were quite bad out at the cottage so we decided to go for a ride without bugs. The Wabi is much prettier by boat that it is on a snowmobile. The navigable parts of the river aren't really long but still a fun little ride – we took a side trip up the South Wabi creek as far as the railway bridge – it gets quite small after that point. Our depth gauge indicated that there really can't be much water in the river in the winter when the ice is way down. It is easy going to Uno Park Road bridge - I presume that was about as far as the steamboats went in the old days. After that the river gets twistier and we had to slow down quite a bit. A pair of Sea-Doos went by us and they were nimble enough to keep going at speed. Once we got to the railway bridge we decided to head back having gone far enough – I still can't believe that the train showed up just as we got there to put on a show for us. Since the banks of the Wabi are so soft, don't take a big boat with big waves.

On our trip Mrs. Boating and I wore our inflatable PFD's. It was a hot day so regular PFD's would have been a little warm. Inflatable PFD's only count in the boat if they are being worn – you must be at least 16 to wear one and they don't count on personal water craft. We have an old one that doesn't automatically inflate - we never use it because you would probably sink before it you were aware enough to inflate it. From what I've been reading PFD's are going to be mandatory on a lot more boats by next summer – Ontario has been averaging 16 boating deaths a year and the thought is that a lot of them would have been avoided through PFD use -

why not get ahead of the game and get yourself some good PFD's and wear them.





- Avoid running cords under rugs which can damage the cord and cause a fire.
- Avoid overloading a circuit with "octopus outlets". If additional outlets or circuits are required, have them installed by a licensed electrician.
- Extension cords should be used only as a temporary connection. If permanent wiring is required, have additional

outlets installed by a licensed electrician. **Extension cords should not be linked together**—use an extension cord that is long enough to do the job.



- Air conditioners and other heavy appliances should be plugged directly into an outlet.
- Ground fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs) should be installed in bathrooms, kitchens, and garages.
 GFCIs shut off an electrical circuit when it becomes a shock hazard.
- Check electrical cords for damage such as fraying or nicks. A damaged cord can expose wires and result in a potential shock or fire hazard.


