## **Englehart's Day in** the Park June 24

ENGLEHART - Englehart's Day in the Park is on track for Saturday, June 24.

The town is presenting a full slate of activities for residents and visitors from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Hydro One will be working on installing some hydro poles in the area, and it is uncertain whether there will be a power disruption in the area of Centennial Park, where the event will be centred, but the town staff and volunteers are making plans to work around that if the park is affected.

"Most of the activities don't require power anyway," said coordinator Johanna Paradis, who is the town's community services director. Speaking in a telephone interview, she said the scheduled power disruption will be concluded at 1 p.m.

The Senior of the Year recipient will be announced between 1 p.m. and 1:30 p.m.

The province encourages municipalities to nominate people for the award, Paradis explained. Nominations for Englehart were made in the spring and council considered those and selected the recipient, she explained.

There will be a dog demo by Border Gem Ability about 1:30 p.m.

Rosborough's Funny Farm will be bringing some animals to the park from their Ingram Township location on Elliott Road. Archie, the fainting goat, bunnies, chicks and guinea pigs will be among those who will take the trip into town to see old friends and make new ones.

Climb N' Fun from Timmins will also be there with a gyroscope and stuffed animals that can be ridden along the closed streets around the park.

Jill Plaunt, a certified yoga instructor, will be providing a yoga demonstration at 11 a.m.

#### Anne Marie Desjardins February 9, 1927 – May 31, 2023

It is with profound sadness that we announce the peaceful passing of Marie Desjardins (née Tourigny) at 96 years of age.

She was a much loved and widely respected lifelong resident of the New Liskeard area, revered elder in the Francophone community, 50-year choir director at Église Sacré Coeur, and cherished mother and grandmother.

She is now reunited in joyful love with her mother Fleurette Pinard Tourigny (1930), her father Arthur Tourigny (1938), her son Raymond (Lefty) Desjardins (1997), and her husband Gérard (Jerry) Desjardins (2004), with Cleo by her side as well as her many brothers and sisters, Thérèse (Bouley Haskett), Roger, Fernand, Magella (Leroux), Lucille (Paquin) and Bernard.

Marie is survived by her children Louise Edmunds (Peter), Michel Desjardins (Pierre Désy) and Joanne Desjardins; grandsons Marc Edmunds (Amandeep) and Bernie Edmunds (Myrte) and two grand-children she sadly never met (the children of her deceased son Ray-mond); as well as her many beloved nieces and nephews.

After losing her mother tragically when Marie was just three years old, she then lost her father when she was 11.

By the time she was 13 years old she was a very independent and hard-working young woman, supporting herself by working as a livein maid, wrapping butter at Eplett's Dairy, and playing music for local dances.

Music, singing and dancing provided her with much joy. She was still playing her accordion until very recently. Marie lit up any time she received a compliment but she especially loved being told that she was a good dancer.

Throughout her life she held many leadership roles: Présidente des Filles D'Isabelle, Directrice Diocésaine des Femmes Chrétiennes, Présidente du Club de L'Âge D'Or, et Associée des Sœurs de L'Assomption de la Sainte Vierge.



She established Jerry's Meat Market with her husband in 1946 and it became a landmark on Whitewood Avenue for 25 years.

Marie was especially proud of completing her high school diploma at 61 years of age.

She enjoyed wintering at her condo in Florida and each year looked forward to spending time with her many friends and family.

She continued to contribute to her community in many ways, especially musically but was always generous with her time.

People recognized her on the boardwalk by her beautiful smile and, if you were lucky, her warm and loving hugs.

We are very grateful for the love and support provided by her caregivers over her final years.

A funeral mass will be celebrated on September 2, 2023, at 11 a.m. at Église Sacré Coeur in New Liskeard. A Celebration of Life will follow in the church hall.







### Temagami Family Health Team Submitted by Ellen Ibey Optimizing Snacking

Food not only provides us with the energy and the fuel we need but also produces enjoyment, identifies culture, holds tradition and creates community. Every time we eat offers an opportunity to nourish our bodies and enrich our lives.

Snacks are an important part of our daily eating habits and can help us to receive all of the nutrients we require. Incorporating delicious, nutrient-dense snack options can therefore help us to meet our daily nutrition needs and provide us with adequate energy. Below is a list of tips to help improve snacking as well as some snack ideas.

#### Tips for Snacking:

- Choose a "Veggie Song". Cutting up vegetables and fruits ahead of time allows for easy 'grab and go', nutrient-dense, snack options. This task however can feel cumbersome. Choosing a 2-4 minute song, that you enjoy, allows you to set a couple of minutes aside to accomplish the task while listening to a favourite tune.
- Store individually. Pre-portioning non-perishable items such as whole-wheat crackers, roasted chickpeas, rice cakes and trail mix, increases the convenience of these high-fiber or protein packed options. Consider storing muffins, and/or pancakes individually in the freezer for an easy 'grab and go' snack to enjoy later.
- Incorporate what you love. This will look different for everyone and may include exploring new flavours, including cultural favourites, sharing ideas with family and friends or finding creative ways to modify old-time favourites based on health motivators.

**Snack Ideas.** A whole grain muffin and an orange; a hardboiled egg and a pear; pumpkin seeds and berries on yogurt; apple slices and cheese; egg salad or labneh spread (a soft Middle Eastern cheese made from strained yogurt) on whole grain crackers.




