Market offers products from Harvest to Home

EVANTUREL – In one stop on the weekend, shoppers could pick up fresh produce and baking, pet treats, bath products, home decor, and children's toys.

A wide variety of goods was available at the first Harvest to Home market of the year July 29 in Evanturel Township.

Its 11 vendors, who came from as far away as Charlton and New Liskeard, were up from the usual turnout, said Barb Beachey, a township councillor and market coordinator.

The market began in 2016 beside the former Coffee Time on Hwy. 11 in Englehart.

When that business closed, it moved further north in 2019 to the Englehart and Area Business Centre.

It relocated again in 2021 to its present location on Bryan's Road. The building had been part of Robertson's Sales, but the entire property is now Evanturel Township's new municipal headquarters.

Harvest to Home is not a weekly market. Instead, it opens when local produce becomes available, and only five Saturday morning markets will be offered this season.

The market serves a number of purposes, said Beachey, who also chairs the township's commun-

Planning volunteer stepping down after 40-plus years

TEMISKAMING SHORES – For more than four decades, Florent Héroux has sifted through requests to sever lots and building plans that don't quite meet municipal zoning requirements.

He's the longest serving member of the city's committee of adjustment, which makes decisions on applications for minor variances from the zoning bylaw and applications for consent to sever land.

The New Liskeard man says

a physical impairment has forced him to resign from the committee.

“It has been a privilege to serve for 45 years, 27 of which were with the Town of New Liskeard and 18 with Temiskaming Shores,” wrote Héroux to city council last month.

“It has been a pleasure to work with the many dedicated volunteers serving on the Committee as nominated by

successive Councils.”

When council met June 20, Deputy Mayor Danny Whalen extended the city's thanks for Héroux's work.

“His exceptional commitment to the development of the community over the years is greatly appreciated and his contributions around the committee table will be missed by both staff and the other committee members.”

Summer Safe Food Handling Tips

Picnic and BBQ season bring lots of opportunities for outdoor fun with family and friends, but with the warm weather also comes opportunities for foodborne bacteria to thrive. As food heats up in the summer temperatures, bacteria can quickly multiply.

Pack and Transport Food Safely

- **Keep cold food cold** – place it in a cooler with ice or frozen gel packs.
- **Organize cooler contents.** Pack drinks separately, that way as you open and reopen the drink cooler, the perishable foods won't be exposed to warm temperatures.
- **Keep coolers closed.** Limit the number of times the cooler is opened. This helps to keep the contents cold longer.
- **Don't cross contaminate.** Be sure to keep raw meat, poultry, and seafood securely wrapped. This keeps their juices from contaminating prepared/cooked foods or foods that will be eaten raw, such as fruits and vegetables.
- **Clean produce.** Rinse fresh fruits and vegetables under running tap water before packing them in the cooler. Dry them with a clean cloth towel or paper towel.

Safe Grilling Tips

- **Marinate safely** in the refrigerator – *never* on the kitchen counter or outdoors. **Don't reuse marinade.**
- **Cook food thoroughly.** Have your food thermometer ready. Always use it to be sure your food is cooked thoroughly.
- **Don't reuse platters or utensils.** Using the same platter or utensils that you previously used for raw meat, poultry or seafood allows bacteria to spread to the cooked food. Instead, have a clean platter and utensils ready to serve your food.
- **Check for foreign objects in food.** If you clean your grill with a bristle brush, check to make sure that no detached bristles have made their way into your food.

Outdoor Hand Cleaning

If you don't have access to running water, use a water jug, some soap, and paper towels or consider using moist disposable towelettes for cleaning your hands.

Protect yourself and your family and practice safe food handling!

She was a lightning bolt

I watched a black ominous storm cloud move across the lake while I was preparing to photograph lightning coming from it.

It is a daunting task to capture a bolt of lightning with a camera. It's a hit and miss and mostly a miss kind of scenario.

This is when I heard the news that Ireland's Sinéad O'Connor had died at age 56.

I had goosebumps and tears in my eyes.

She was a lightning bolt wasn't she?

She was wild, untamed and brilliantly gifted as a musician and singer.

With her buzzed haircut and big beautiful eyes, she demanded that you look straight into them as she spoke her truth. Her voice was amazing especially in the song Nothing Compares 2 U.

I am a regular reader of the Irish Times because some of the world's greatest writers are

Irish. I found it rather interesting that the Times is now all over the death of O'Connor praising her for this, that and every other thing.

In reality, they have been less than kind to her in editorials, columns and reviews over the years.

After all, she was no Bono or Frank McCourt.

It's always more convenient to glorify an outspoken woman when their obituary comes out.

Sinéad was messy, defiant, outspoken and brilliant.

She refused to let the music industry, the patriarchy and religious orders exploit, silence and negate her.

I cannot imagine the pain she endured when tragically her 17 year-old son Shane ended his own life in 2022.

No parent should have to bury a child, ever. She said her son was the "lamp of her life."

When Sinéad defiantly ripped

up the photo of the Pope on Saturday Night Live in 1992, it was a turning point in her music career as the recording industry unfairly black listed her.

They did the same thing to the Dixie Chicks when they sang about President George W. Bush and the war in Iraq.

Sinéad spoke out about the sexual abuse of children by priests that later became a huge scandal in the United Kingdom and elsewhere.

Perhaps many women wished they had the bravery to speak up like Sinéad did.

I loved her shaved head, which was a symbol of defiance. I wished I had the guts to shave my head when my world got messy.

And our worlds do get messy don't they?

To everyone who isn't feeling great about their lives, listen up— we are all challenged at times in our lives.

We all stumble to our knees. We are hugely imperfect, but we cannot ever compromise who we are for anyone else's view of ourselves.

Sinéad's death teaches us that. The world needs authentic

people who truly stand fearless in their power.

May she rest in the arms of the angels.

ity events and activities committee.

She said home gardeners, for example, may simply be looking for an outlet to get rid of surplus vegetables.

But the market can also serve as “a really inexpensive way to get a small business started,” she said.

Vendors anonymously submit tallies of their sales after each market.

By that tally, she said more than \$6,000 was kept in the community in 2022 “just by having it here.”

Jackie Heavens has been a vendor at the market since it launched, offering her line of soaps, personal care products and candles.

“I just love the community feel. You get to see everybody,” said Heavens, who lives nearby on Wendigo Lake

Road.

Also enthusiastic was first-time vendor Suzanne Crick. The Ingram Township resident had a variety of products available for sale, including decorative hand towels.

“I love it,” she said, “It’s the people. I get to meet people and be friendly.”

The market was an opportunity for Rosemary Graham of Charlton to introduce her line of freeze-dried pet treats to new customers.

She was looking for a product for her own three dogs, and when she acquired a freeze dryer she began experimenting using raw beef heart and liver.

Customers could pick up packages of Sunday Creek Pet Treats at the market or just try a sample.

Will Eby described the season’s first Harvest to Home as “a great market.”

The Englehart craftsman was pleased with sales of his wooden decorative items, all burned by hand. He was also taking orders for custom work.

The market is “always willing to welcome new vendors and new customers,” Beachey said.

Four more markets will be held – August 12 and 26 and September 9 and 23 – from 8:30 a.m. to noon.

Keeping your pets safe in "ruff" times

DISTRICT (Special) - While no one is immune from the devastation of a natural disaster, preparing before a storm hits is key to keeping everyone in your family - including your pets - safe.

"What's good for us is good for our pets," said Kris Kiser, President of the TurfMutt Foundation, an environment education and stewardship program, and President and CEO of the Outdoor Power Equipment Institute (OPEI), an international trade association representing manufacturers and suppliers of power equipment, small engines and battery power, utility and personal transport vehicles, and golf cars.

Here are six ideas from the TurfMutt Foundation to help you include pet safety when mapping out a disaster preparedness plan:

- Have pets microchipped. In the event of an emergency - natural or otherwise - you want to ensure your pet can get back to you if you're separated. Collars and ID tags, though important, can break or detach. Microchips - computerized and scannable implants about the size of a grain of rice - are more fool-proof since they're inserted under your pet's skin.
- Bring pets inside at the first

sign of danger. Disasters can be disorienting for pets, and they could run away or hurt themselves reacting to loud noises and strange changes to their landscape.

- If you have to leave, keep pets with you. Leaving your pets behind during a natural disaster is never a good idea because they could escape or become exposed to a number of life-threatening hazards.

- Determine where you'll go. You need a Plan B if you are advised by government officials to leave your home. Not all emergency shelters will accept pets and physical distancing guidelines may reduce capacity in public shelters. Make a plan and develop a list of pet-friendly hotels open for business and outside your immediate area that you might evacuate to.

- Create a pet-friendly resource list. Research a list of veterinarians in the area should your pet need medical care (your regular vet may have some recommendations).

- Pack an emergency bag. Pack emergency provisions for pets well in advance of a catastrophe so you can evacuate your home quickly if needed.

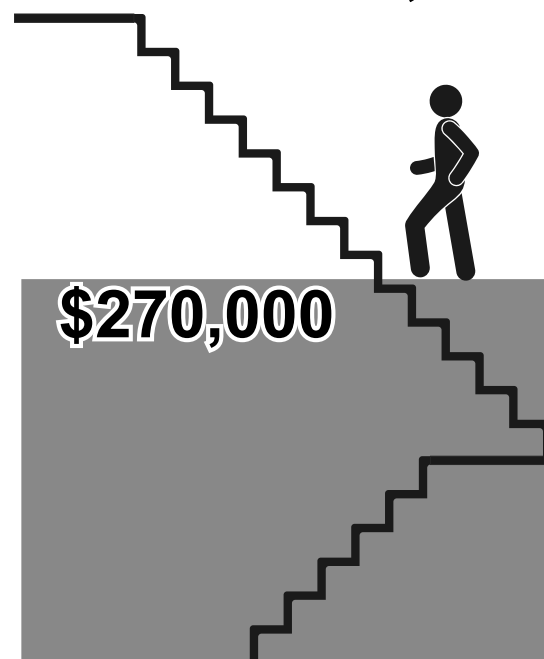

Two seniors' projects in city awarded \$50,000

TEMISKAMING SHORES (Special) – Two initiatives to support seniors in the Temiskaming Shores area have been awarded federal funding.

Paroisse Sainte-Croix in Haileybury received \$25,000 from the New Horizons for Seniors program to help renovate the facility.

The renovations “will make it easier for seniors to serve hot meals for a variety of activities designed for seniors,” said spokesperson Denis Lacroix in a news release.

The renovations will include

a commercial dishwasher, enabling an end to the use of polystyrene packaging.

“In short, this will make things easier and more enjoyable for our seniors while helping to protect the environment,” said Lacroix, who expressed thanks for the funding.

ACFO-Témiskaming also received \$25,000, which will be used to provide active living and social activities for seniors.

“This grant will benefit our seniors first,” said ACFO-Témiskaming president Domi-

nique Nackers.

“What we would like to do is create an intergenerational link. We want to organize activities that could use the knowledge of our elders and share it with youth.

“We thank the Department of Seniors for this grant.”

The funding was announced July 5 by Nipissing-Timiskaming MP Anthony Rota.

Helping seniors in the riding “stay active and connected is a priority” for the federal government, said the Liberal MP

in a news release.

“Seniors have made and continue to make great contributions to our communities here in Nipissing-Timiskaming and right across Canada,” Rota said.

Funding was also announced for two projects in North Bay – just under \$17,000 for North Bay Pride and almost \$23,700 for the Near North Palliative Care Network.

The four projects “will provide seniors an opportunity to participate in meaningful

activities which nurture their personal growth and foster community vitality,” he continued.

They will, he said, “help us build a strong foundation for our future to meet the needs of an aging population.”

Seniors are one of Canada’s fastest-growing population groups.

By 2051, they’ll represent almost 25 per cent of the population and could number close to 11 million people within 15 years.

THE BASICS

The City of Temiskaming Shores is initiating a process to investigate the potential sale and development of the New Liskeard Marina property. The property is located at 199 Riverside Drive in New Liskeard. It is approximately 3.57 acres in size, is zoned C1 in the City's zoning by-law and designated Recreation Area in the City's official plan.

The property has been underutilized by the City while the building is also in need of \$270,000 in renovations in the near future to maintain current service levels. To best understand the community's desires, City Council has directed staff to open a public consultation asking for input on the property's potential development by the private sector to better inform an Expression-of-Interest (EOI) process.

Regardless of any development, the City intends to maintain ownership of the boardwalk along the water's edge and any submissions from developers must have provisions for maintaining public access to the marina docks and boat launch.

THE PROCESS

The City is first gathering the public's input on the property to better inform potential developers about the needs and desires of residents. Following the public consultation process, City staff will create a report summarizing all the public comments received and release the EOI.

The EOI process is expected to conclude in late October with Council ultimately deciding if the City will then enter into negotiations with any potential developer. The EOI process does not tie the City to the sale of this property and any potential development will still be required to complete the necessary public consultation processes for zoning and official plan changes (if required).

A key component of the whole process will be consultation with stakeholders, and the general public. Anyone with an interest in providing their input to Council has the opportunity.

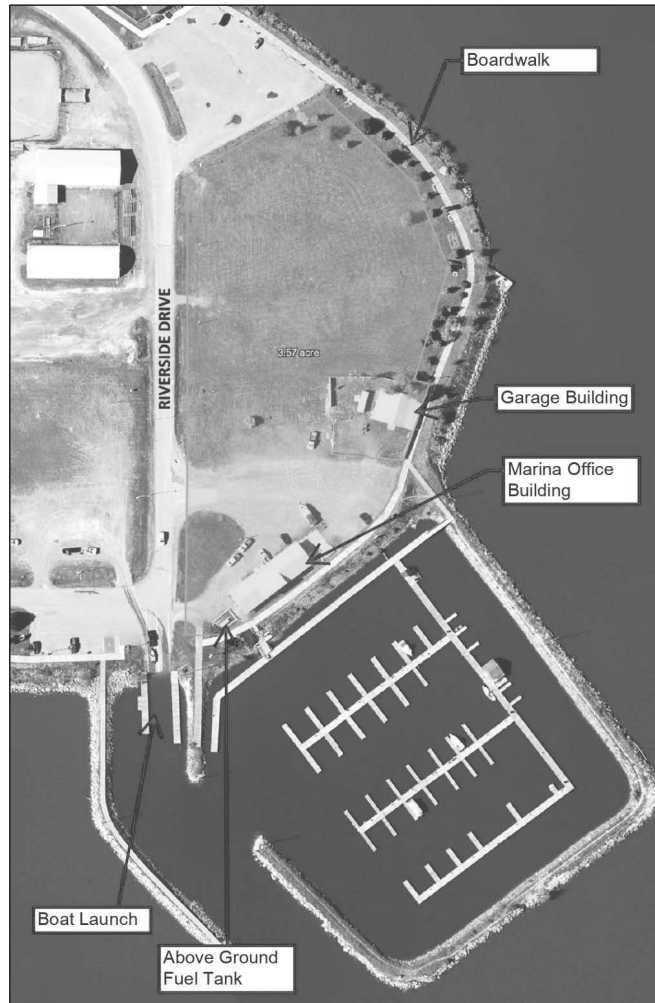

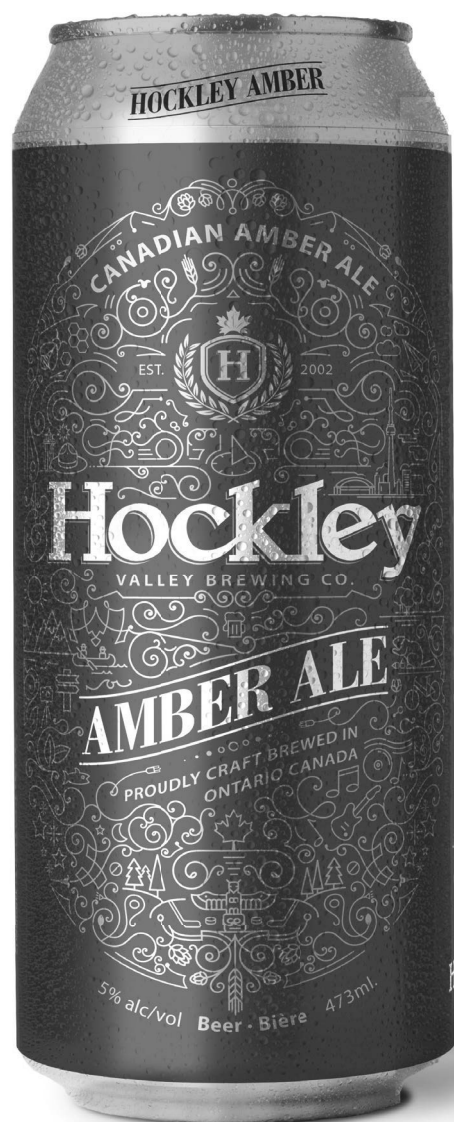
PFC Family Pool Passes for Loan
